

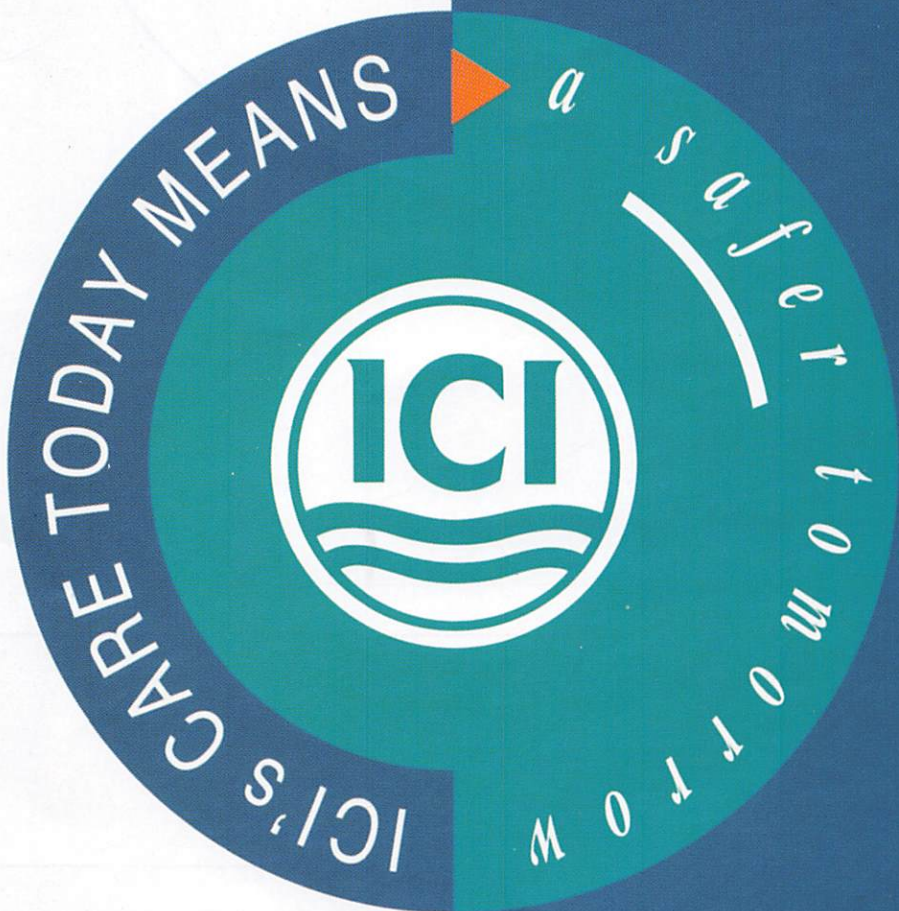

AN INTERVIEW WITH VIKINGS' HEAD COACH GRAEME WEST...

Q. How would you sum up the pre-season just gone?

A. It was excellent. We asked a lot of questions of the players, their commitment and their ability and the majority of them have come through with flying colours - I'm proud of them. We've been training five days a week since the end of October and that is a lot of time that we've asked the squad to put in, especially given the fact that the contracts certainly aren't on the Super League scale.

At the end of the process I've had to select my first team squad and it wasn't easy. One or two who were on the fringes but who missed out are understandably upset but they know that the door isn't closed to anyone. If they do the job in the reserve grades and give of their best they'll put pressure on the players above them and, hopefully, give me a few more tough decisions to make before the season's over.

Q. We seemed to play quite a bit of football in the game against Leigh - is that how you want the team to operate this season?

A. Well I'm all in favour of playing an open game, but I'm emphasising patience to the team. They have to set up the positions through the forwards first before they look to put on a backline shot. And if they do come up with an error I want them to settle things down for a while and give themselves a break from tackling - there's nothing worse than trying to rectifying a mistake by playing basketball stuff only to turn the ball over to the opposition straight away again. No team can afford to do nothing but tackle. So yes, football is great, it entertains the fans, but if we are going to win games we have to walk before we can run.

Q. What do you make of the new set up, with the extra games and the end of season play-offs?

A. It's a great thing. Maybe there are one or two too many league matches, but nothing we can't cope with. And everyone should have something to play for in the last few weeks of the season, whether it's aiming for the play-offs or trying to avoid the drop. From our point of view I'm hopeful that we can move up the table compared to last season's showing. The last couple of months in 1997 we beat quite a few of the fancied teams for this season and should have beaten a few more. So we could do well.

Q. Oldham are a bit of an unknown quantity today, aren't they?

A. I watched them at Hunslet a few weeks back and although they struggled, they showed plenty of spirit and I expect more of the same today. They'll also have a few faces who weren't on show when I saw them. The thing about Oldham, no matter who's in the side, is that they have a great cup fighting tradition and they won't lie down and die today. I remember playing

for Wigan at Watersheddings at a time when we were winning everything, and that little git Paddy Kirwan popped up and scored a try in the last minute to knock us out!

Q. Not counting any chickens, but if we do win today, would you fancy Wigan down here in the next round?

A. Well, as you say, we've got this one to get through first, but I've never been one to spend time wondering who we might draw in a later round. You get who you get and you make the best of it, and that's all there is to it.

Q. Finally, what do you make of the new twinning arrangements between Super League and lower division sides?

A. I'm very wary of it. So long as the loan periods don't go beyond the current one month, then I don't suppose it makes much difference. But I suspect that the big clubs might have their hidden motives, and what they give with one hand they might take away with the other. I don't suppose the lower clubs will be too happy if their best players are whisked away.

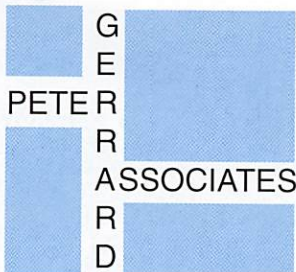

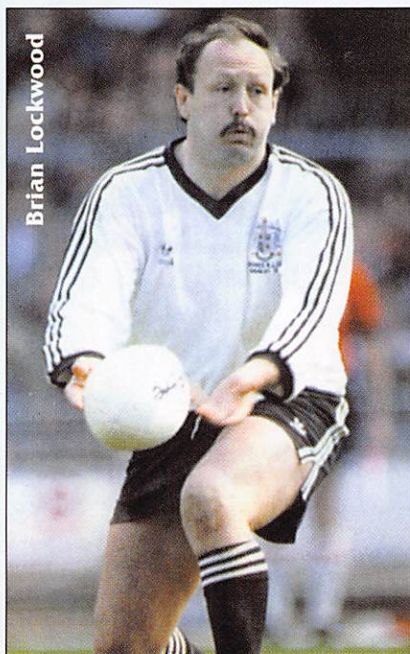

brewery (or an Oceania Cup in, well, Oceania).

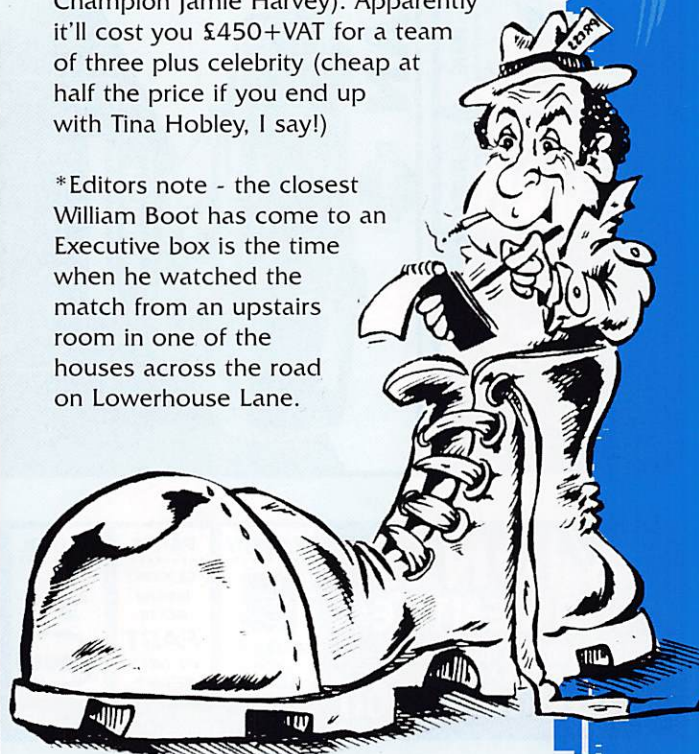

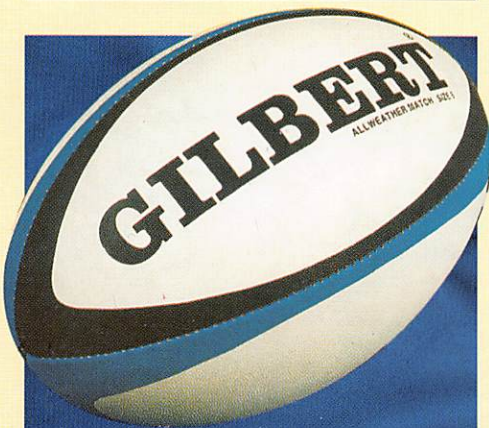

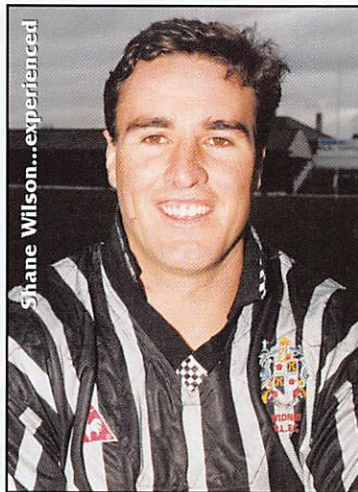
Up Close... & Personnel

It has been a bewildering off season in Rugby League with every club seemingly having wholesale changes of personnel. To help you keep track of events here at Widnes, we've summed up our transfer activity, and have included the comments of Graeme West on some of the players who have come and gone.

IN...

Anthony Samuels - released to comply with quota limit; "A tough decision because he'd had a great off season but when Tane Manihera arrived, someone had to go. We're trying to help him find another club."

"Jim Cassidy and Paul Gartland are in the same boat. They both struggled to stick with our training schedule during the winter due to other commitments but are now back on board. Steve Boscoe hasn't been seen all winter and Phil Kendrick has a contract dispute - both will be allowed to move on if the terms are right. John Harrison is still on the books but didn't train pre-season. Shaun Richardson is back in training after his bad break and may be available in the summer but he still has a lot to do both physically and mentally to get himself right again for match action."

Hello, again.

After the traumas of last season, I guess the long close-season has been a good thing. It has helped us to forget the sinking titanic that was Widnes Vikings last year and left us without rugby for just long enough to miss it and want it back again (we're fools to ourselves!).

In between Widnes signing and losing a player, there was of course Christmas. I hope you all had a pleasant Christmas. In my family, somebody was bought the Star Wars trilogy and I have spent much time watching it since. I wonder what Luke Skywalker thought the first time he saw his father, Darth Vader, at the throne of the evil empire and ruthlessly chopping down Obe Wan Kenobe. His first impression of Vader must have been so different to what Skywalker eventually thought and knew of his father.

That's the great thing about science fiction - it's an escape - a fantasy world. In real life, of course, we judge people by first impressions all of the time, especially sportsmen. I remember writing a column two or three years ago in which I was writing of my first impressions of then new Widnes payer - Tim Russell. I said that he was too light-weight and would never become a favourite. How wrong I was.

For this reason I went to our pre-season friendly with Leigh with an open mind and determined not to be too critical or praising of our new signings on the strength of the one game. That soon went out of the window.

Widnes coach of last year, Doug Laughton, is renowned for his eye for talent and shrewd bargaining. On the

basis of two weeks ago, Graeme West also has the unique God-given ability.

Most people have said that new centre Shane

Wilson did not look fit enough.

Personally I cannot understand how anybody expects to be able to judge a man's fitness level from the stands. The thing that did shine through in Shane's performance for me, however, was that he has definite talent. The two clean breaks he made were due to his size, speed and skill, a formula that we have been missing in the three-quarters since Andy Currier left us last term.

The signing of Jim Salisbury could prove to be a master-stroke. The ability that separates outstanding full-backs from good ones is that of being able to join the attacking line with precision timing and running at a gap. It was evident on Sunday that Salisbury has this ability in abundance and this could make him a potent force in rugby league.

I knew a little about Neil Measures before Widnes signed him in that I had seen him play and was aware that he was a tough customer; and so it proved two weeks ago as he tore into the Leigh pack like a raging bull. His sheer presence seemed to give Craig Makin the confidence to do the same, and Makin had an outstanding game.

Paul George clearly has a great rugby brain. He was creating gaps left, right and centre and it is just a shame that the players around him were not always taking full advantage.

So a hugely promising display against Leigh.

Roy Litherland and Tane Manihera are yet to get their chance to impress (Litherland did not play for very long and Manihera not at all against Leigh) but let's hope they give us a good first impression.

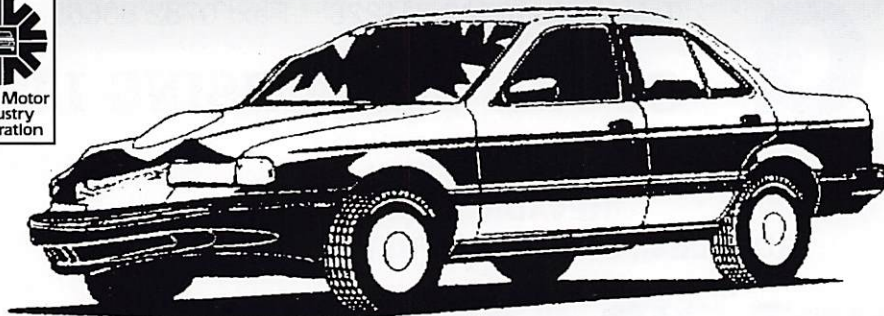

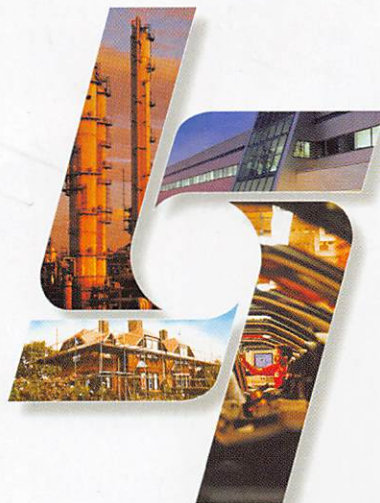
