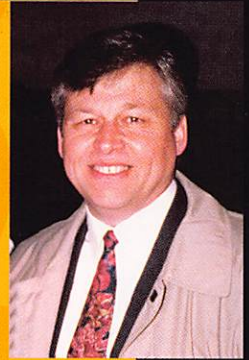
I would like to welcome the Oldham Roughyeds to Headingley tonight and I look forward to a very competitive game.

That's all for now - support the lads!

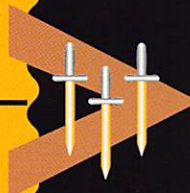

from veterans, Paul Round and Keith Atkinson. Both played for Oldham with Kirwan and will give, what is basically a young side, a lot of experience.

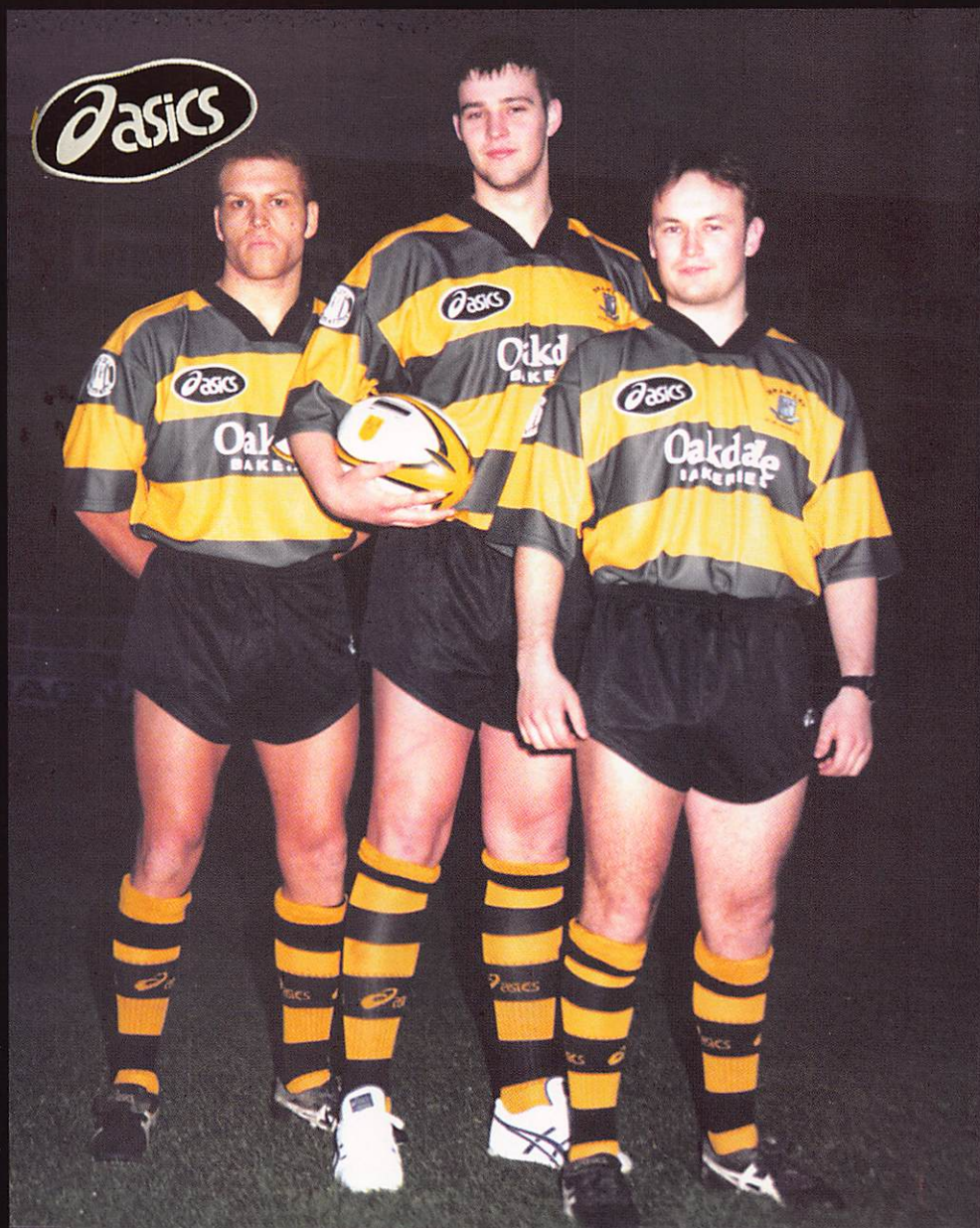

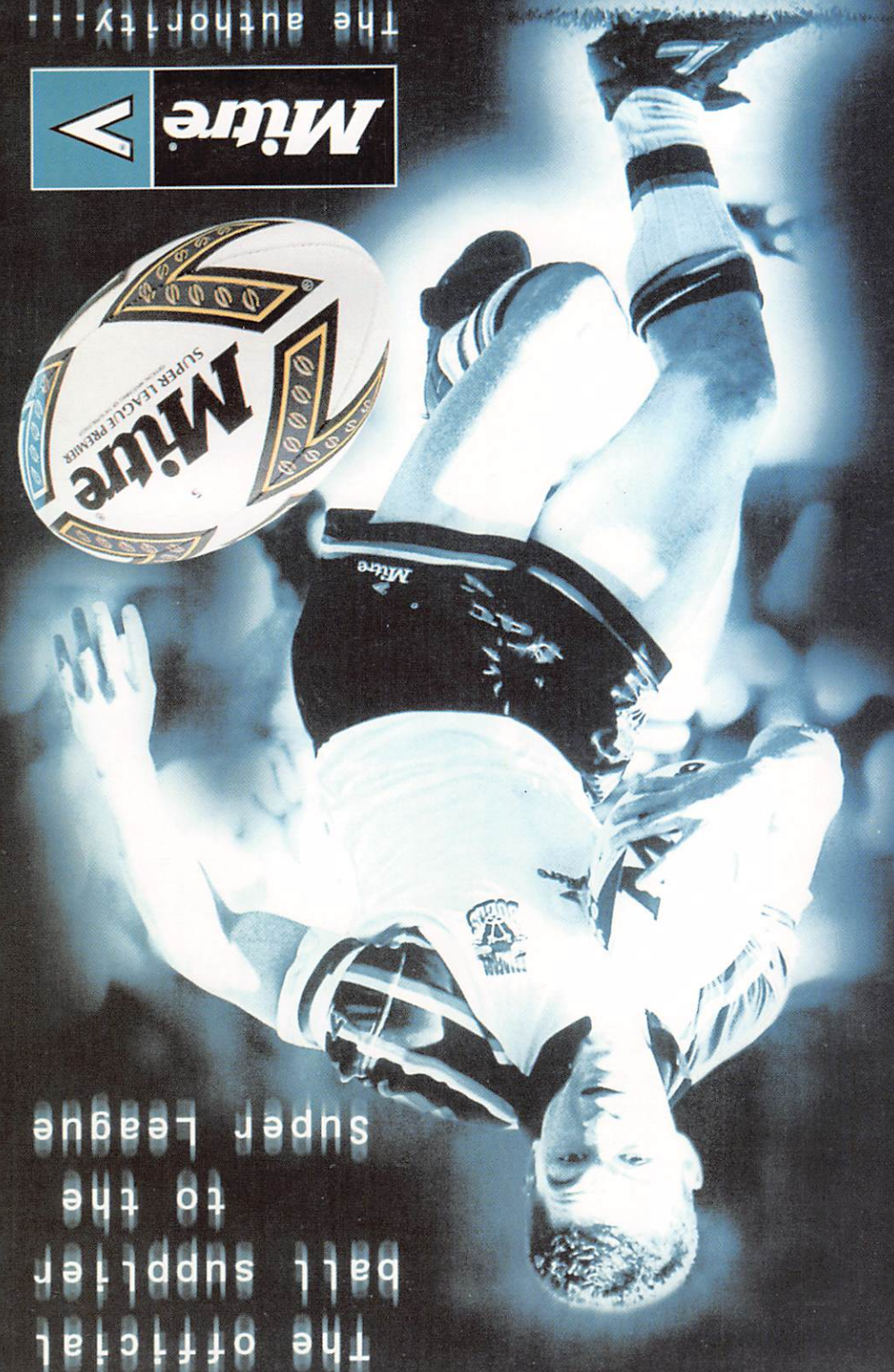

## Over the hill, but not far away.

Oldham, our visitors today, have been through the excitement of Super League and the despair of oblivion in a matter of months. Whilst the fans of many clubs in the game have seen their favourites under financial threat, few could have imagined the speed at which the club went off the rails. Equally few would have predicted that a new club would bounce back so quickly in this Pennine hotbed of rugby league, and it is all credit to the energies of the new board.

I never liked clubs "over t'ill" in Lancashire in my younger days, but Oldham were the exception. In the 1950's they were always in the top four, winning the Championship in 1957 and the Lancashire Cup three years running from 1956. Despite this they often seemed to miss out on their entitlement to silverware and clubs like Wigan and St Helens seemed to attract the glamour. In later years Oldham became a yo-yo club, their record score a 70-10 hammering of Bramley in February 1995. But Oldham's experience in Super League has reminded us of the demands of the new era both on the field as well as off. Too few points, too few fans and insufficient capital meant that the demands of Super League were overwhelming, despite the move from the much loved but inadequate Watersheddings. Workington suffered similar trauma and the message must now be clear for all existing or aspiring Super League clubs. Murdoch monies at current rates will not be there forever. So Super League clubs need careful

planning now to ensure that their projected income from all activities is capable of meeting the costs of full-time professionalism, including professional back-up staff as well as being capable of running stadia fit for the millennium. Where this prospect does not immediately appear realistic clubs should put more energy into promoting a high level, exciting competition outside of Super League, on the lines of the Nationwide Football League, rather than attempting to jump too quickly into the fiery furnace of the elite competition. If this means collaboration between Super League clubs and those outside, on the lines of the Leeds/ Bramley links, then this should not be rejected. An increase of nine clubs into the RFL by the millennium, including existing amateur clubs as well as clubs in newer areas such as Gateshead and Hemel Hempstead, will require support from leading clubs in terms of expertise but also perhaps playing resources. When Hull played A team games at Goole during their glory days of the 80's it was proposed that they became a Gool club but linked with Hull. This fell foul of the bye-laws yet it would have brought new fans to the game, a new town on the RL map with every likelihood of success. Surely any new second division club, say within striking distance of London, should have links with the nearest Super League club, the Broncos, to provide the opportunity for those players from London who do not become full-time. Conversely such a club could help the development of young players. At the end of the day we are all in this great game together, Super League, FASDA and BARLA.

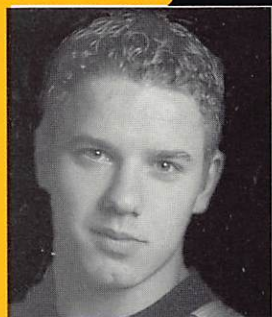

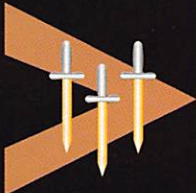

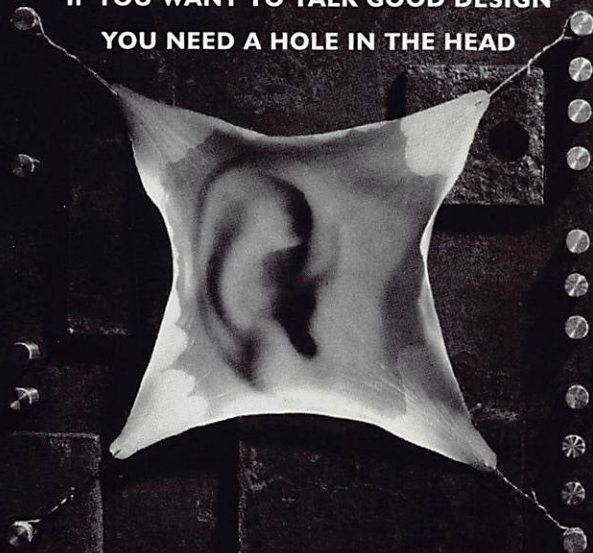
