#### IN TOWN TODAY ... OLDHAM

ADRIAN MEAD. A Wiganer, Aidi first played in the Bears Academy side as a winger, but he switched to centre last season and impressed as a strong pacy runner who could score tries. Keen to improve further and build on the success he enjoyed in the Bears 'A' team in 1997

CHRIS ECKERSLEY. Former Schoolboy sprint champion, who signed for the Oldham club as a 15 year old on a club record contract for a teenager. A long running contract dispute ended with his move to Warrington before he returned to his new home town club as a free agent after a major shake up of

personnel at Wilderspool.

AFI LEUILA. Played 22 Super League games for the Bears last season after coming close to representing Tonga in the 1995 World Cup. First played for St. Helens. This strong, tough South Sea Islander born in Tonga, raised in Auckland, will probably figure in the centre this season, although he is equally at home on the flank.

SEAN COOPER. Former Saddleworth Rangers star, who was taken to Bradford in the Peter Fox era. Captained the Alliance side at Odsal, won numerous Alliance player of the year awards and joined Oldham as a free agent when the Bulls decided to scrap their reserve team. Impressive so far in the

Roughyeds early games.

CRĂIG DIGGLE. A Rochdalian, Craig played with Rochdale Hornets when Roughyeds boss Paddy Kirwan was Alliance team coach at Spotland. Best position, wing. Scored two tries in Oldham's first

competitive match against Heworth in the Silk Cut Challenge Cup.

CRAIG BARKER. Young stand-off half and a product of the Waterhead amateur RL club. Signed as a pro for the former Bears club and joined the Roughyed as a free agent. Captained the Bears Academy side and graduated to the Alliance side, which he also led on occasions.

**NEIL FLANAGAN.** Club skipper and an influential leader. A product of St Anne's, Neil turned pro for his home town club and became its youngest captain at the age of 19. Eventually moved on to Huddersfield where he also had leadership responsibilities before joining Rochdale Hornets. Proud to be back in his home town and even prouder to be skipper.

JASON CLEGG. Big prop. Started in Union with Littleborough moved into League with Littleboroughbased North West Pioneers and turned pro with Bradford Northern, (as they were then called), after being spotted by a Northern scout playing in a BARLA cup tie at Redhill (Castleford). Played several

senior games with Bradford and later had a spell on loan with Batley.

JOHN HOUGH. Made his name as the first player to be signed by the Roughyeds shortly after the new club was formed. A product of the Oldham schoolboy and youth game, John is a determined little hooker, who gained considerable experience from his 30 senior games for Warrington. Expected to have a big season in division two.

MIKE EDWARDS. St. Helens born, Michael first joined the old club as a 15 year old scrum half. Was a regular in Alliance rugby for two or three seasons before Oldham coach Tony Barrow took him to Swinton. Now playing in the pack, he had a spell on loan with Salford last season and was delighted to

return to Oldham when the opportunity arose.

**GRAEME SHAW.** Son of former Oldham Athletic and West Brom soccer star David Shaw. Graeme played Union as a boy at Rakewood (Littleborough), but turned to amateur RL with Moldgreen when his family moved to Huddersfield. Represented the Young Lions against the Junior Kiwis and then signed for Bradford. Made a try-scoring Super League debut at Leeds. Second row forward.

IAN SINFIELD. Made a big impression so far. Another Oldhamer, a product of Waterhead. Turned pro with Salford who got an undisclosed fee when he signed for Oldham at Christmas. A natural backrower, he is the elder brother of England schoolboys star and now Leeds youngster, Kevin Sinfield.

MICK MARTINDALE. Clever ball handler. Represented Oldham schoolboys on tour in Australia with lain MacCorquodale, Eric Fitzsimons and Fred Laughton in 1988. Turned pro with Halifax, moved to Wakefield as part of a swop deal and joined his home-town club in January. Made his debut in the cup defeat at Widnes. Loose-forward or stand-off.

PAUL ROUND. Veteran of the squad at 34. Joined Oldham from St Helens in 1987. The fee, £65,000 set by tribunal. Enjoyed the best days of his career at Watersheddings. Since had further experience with

Wakefield, Halifax and Castleford. One of the 'old heads' in a young pack.

DARREN ROBINSON. 'Baby' of the squad at 18. Scrum-half, who can also operate at stand-off. A Leeds lad. Darren played for the Bears Academy and Alliance teams, but never signed on. Signed for the Roughyeds as a free agent and has since caught the eye in warm-up matches, particularly in the 27-26 defeat at Castleford.

NATHAN VARLEY. A go-go forward, who excelled with his all-round performance on attack and defence in the friendly at Wheldon Road. Not the biggest of forwards, Nathan has a big heart. He won Yorkshire youth honours before rejecting Keighley to sign for Bradford. One of several ex-Bradford men in the Oldham camp.

RICHARD DARKES. Former Huddersfield, Bradford and Dewsbury utility back. Ex-paratrooper, Signed after impressing in a pre season match at Castleford. Played wing in his early days with Huddersfield and Bradford, but has since acquired considerable experience in the centre and in the back row of the pack.

LET me start this new regular column in the Dragons' programme by wishing the club more success at Belle Vue than their Third Division soccer counterparts Doncaster Rovers have enjoyed.

It has been a most traumatic season for the football club with Rovers winning just three home games this season. Hopefully there will be better news to report in the next five months.

Stainforth's Meadow Court Stadium served the fledgling club well and had the money to develop the stadium been available, rugby league could have had a future there.

But there was always going to be a problem attracting big crowds to Stainforth because of its location and most fans will welcome a return to a more central base.

Having campaigned for a return to the town it is to be hoped that the fans turn up in greater numbers than they did at Stainforth.

If the club is to have any future, crowds have got to show a significant improvement on the last couple of years.

Yet it won't be easy tempting back the stayaway fans during a summer packed with high-profile events such as the football World Cup which is set to capture the nation's heart in much the same way as Euro '96 did. Colin Maskill's side will need to produce not only winning rugby, but also entertaining rugby, if they are going to pull in four-figure crowds this season.

Despite there only being eight clubs in this season's Second Division, it promises to be a most competitive campaign and I wouldn't like to have to put much money predicting the likely champions.

With Prescott Panthers finally dropping out of the league (and not before time), Dragons started the season as one of the favourities to land the wooden spoon. Certainly defeats in their opening games at Bramley and Lancashire Lynx will have done little to change that view.

But the situation could change dramatically were Dragons to cash in on successive home games against Oldham and Batley. Certainly player-coach Colin Maskill, who has made some excellent acquisitions on a very limited budget, remains optimistic of better things as do the players.

I saw first-hand the team spirit in the camp when I travelled over to Deepdale on the team bus on Sunday.





### IN TOUCH

#### **FARRELL 500 SUPER POINTS**

ANDREW FARRELL of Wigan Warriors became the first player to total 500 Super League points with six goals in the 40-6 home defeat of Halifax Blue Sox. The loose forward's 501 points have come from 12 tries and a Super League record 228 goals, including three drop goals.

Farrell is the only player to have been in the starting line-up in every round since Super League was launched in March 1996, a total of 47 matches - and he has failed to score in only four. After being third in the inaugural 1996 Super League points chart with 226, Farrell finished at

After being third in the inaugural 1996 Super League points chart with 226, Farrell finished at top last year with 243 points. He also headed the goals chart in 1997 with 109, including three drop goals.

Farrell has twice equalled the joint record for most goals in a Super League match, kicking II in successive matches against St. Helens and Paris St. Germain in May 1997.

#### FRIDAY SKY-TV: Leeds Rhinos v Salford Reds

Salford have won only once at Leeds in the League since the scrapping of the old one division in 1973. That victory was 28-13 in 1976-77. Since then Leeds have won 15 successive home matches against Salford in the top division.

Salford's last League victory over Leeds was 23-18 at home, followed by a 21-12 Regal Trophy home win, in 1993-94. Since then Leeds have won all five home and away League matches plus a Regal Trophy home win.

#### POINTSCORING RUN

ANDREW FARRELL of Wigan Warriors has the longest club pointscoring run of 24 successive Cup and League matches. The run began with three goals in the 56-22 World Club Championship defeat at Canberra Raiders on 22 June 1997 and has brought the loose forward 272 points from six tries and 125 goals, including two drop goals.

STEVE McNAMARA of Bradford Bulls has the current longest Super League pointscoring run with a sequence of 20 matches bringing him a total of 202 points from 91 goals and five

tries.

#### WINNING RUN

WIGAN WARRIORS have the current longest winning run of 13 successive victories against British\* clubs, including three Super League and three Premiership matches last season plus four Silk Cut Challenge Cup-ties and all three League games this year. Their last defeat was 14-21 at home to Salford Reds on 17 August 1997.

They are the only club to have won all their Cup and League matches this season.

\*They lost 18-22 at home to Australian club Hunter Mariners in the World Club Championships at the end of last season.

#### LOSING RUN

**ROCHDALE HORNETS** have the current longest losing run of seven matches, all in the First Division. Their last victory was 20-16 at home to Keighley Cougars on 3 March.

Huddersfield Giants and Doncaster Dragons are the only clubs without a win this season. Huddersfield have lost a Silk Cut Challenge Cup-tie plus three JJB Super League matches and Doncaster have lost a Cup-tie and both Second Division matches.




