Chairman's View

When I dictated this column last, a little short of a month ago, we had lost our opening two fixtures and struggled to a less than convincing win against Workington. Since then we have thrashed Barrow and laid to rest our away 'Hoodoo' by convincingly beating Lancashire Lynx and Doncaster. No-one can doubt that we are now serious promotion contenders. My colleagues and I believe that this side is possibly the best York team for 10 years and I know that Dean is certain that the best is yet to come. Today we are entertaining promotion candidates Oldham who will undoubtedly regard today's fixture as being extremely important.

It is clear that the standard of rugby being played in the second division this year is higher than in recent years: it is probably the case that on the day virtually any team is capable of beating any other and it will be the most consistent three teams that win the coveted promotion places. Certainly Dean and the players are doing their job and we will shortly know whether their reports will be rewarded by an upturn in support. Once again, thank you all for your faith in the club.

THE MEN BATTLING FOR THE ROUGHYEDS

KEITH ATKINSON

The Stalwart. This is Keith's 8th comeback! Signed for Oldham in 1985 and hung up his boots for what everyone thought was the final time in 1992. Little did we know! Back come forward who has probably played in every position with the possible exception of scrum half. Broke more bones than a butcher (his own that is!). Superb attitude.

CRAIG BARKER

Young stand-off half and a product of the Waterhead amateur RL club. Signed as a pro for the former Bears club and joined the Roughyeds as a free agent. Captained the Bears Academy side and graduated to the Alliance side, which he also led on occasions.

JASON CLEGG

Big Prop. Started in Union with Littleborough, moved into League with Littleborough based North West Pioneers and turned pro with Bradford Northern, (as they were then called), after being spotted by a Northern scout playing in a BARLA cup tie at Redhill (Castleford). Played several senior games with Bradford and later had a spell on loan with Batley.

SEAN COOPER

Former Saddleworth Rangers star, who was taken to Bradford in the Peter Fox ere. Captained the Alliance side at Odsail, won numerous Alliance player of the year awards and joined Oldham as a free agent when the Bulls decided to scrap their reserve team. Impressive so far in the Roughyeds early games.

RICHARD DARKES

Former Huddersfield, Bradford and Dewsbury utility back. Ex-paratrooper. Signed after impressing in a pre season match at Castleford. Played wing in his early days with Huddersfield and Bradford, but has since acquired considerable experience in the centre and in the back row of the pack.

CRAIG DIGGLE

A Rochdalian, Craig played with Rochdale Hornets when Roughyeds boss Paddy Kirwan was Alliance team coach at Spotland. Best position, wing. Scored two tries in Oldham's first competitive match against Heworth in the Silk Cut Challenge Cup.

CHRIS ECKERSLEY

Former schoolboy sprint champion, who signed for the old Oldham clubs as a 15-year-old on a club record contract for a teenager. A lun armining contract dispute ended with his move to Warring to before he returned to his new home town club as a free agent after a major shake up of personnel at Wilderspool.

MICHAEL EDWARDS

St Helens born, Michael first joined the old club as a 15-year-old scrum half. Was a regular in Alliance rugby lor two three seasons before Oldham coach Tony Barrow took him to Swinton. Now playing in the pack, he had a spell on loan with Salford last season and was delighted to return to Oldham when the opportunity arose.

NEIL FLANAGA

Club skipper and an influential leader. A produce of St Anne's, Neil turned pro for his home town club and became its youngest captain at the age of 19. Eventually moved on to Huddersfield, where he also had leadership responsibilities before joining Rochdale Hornets. Proud to be back in his home town and even prouder to be the skipper.

JOHN HOUGH

Made his name as the first player to be signed by the Roughyeds shortly after the new club was formed. A product of the Oldham schoolboy and youth game, John is a determined little hooker, who gained considerable experience from his 30 senior games for Warrington. Expected to have a big season in division two.

AFIL FIII A

Played 22 Super League games for the Bears last season after coming close to representing Tonga in the 1952 World Cup. First played for St Helens. This strong, tough South Sea Islander, born in Tonga, raised in Auckland, will probably figure in the centre this season, although he is equally at home on the flank.

MARTIN MADERS

Young prop, who joined Huddersfield from Saddleworth Rangers

as a club record buy for a teenager. Had a spell in Australia and later played with local amateurs Waterhead before joining Oldham for an undisclosed fee. His father Dennis played for Oldham in the sixtles and seventies.

MICK MARTINDALE

Clever ball handler. Represented Oldham schoolboys on tour in Australia with Iain MacCorquodale. Eric Fitzsimons and Fred Laughton 1988. Turned pro with Halifax, moved to Wakefield as part of a swop deal and joined his home-town club in January. Made his debut in the cup defeat at Widnes. Loose-forward or stand-off.

JOE MCNICHOLAS

Out and out winger. Fast, elusive and good on his feet. Still only 18, signed for the Bears as a boy, but played only one senior game, at Leeds in the Premiership play-off last season. Rejected Bradford Bulls in a bid to make his name with the Roughyeds.

AIDRIAN MEAD

A Wiganer, Aidle first played in the Bears Academy side as a winger, but he switched to centre last season and impressed as a strong and pacy runner who could score tries. Keen to improve further and build on the success he enjoyed in the Bears 'A' team in 1997.

MIKE PRESCOTT

Back-row forward, also from Wigan. Made a big name for himself as a strong-running forward in the early days of Academy rugby. Since served his apprenticeship in the Alliance side and capable of doing well for the new Oldham club at prop or in the back-row.

BRIAN QUINLAN

Raised at St Anne's, Brian was one of the three Oldham amateurs taken to Bramley by Maurice Bamford. The others were Jon Perks and Roy Jewitt. A strong prop or second-row, Brian is a useful goalkicker. He also plays, during the winter, for Oldham RU but he is the first to admit that RI. is his real sporting love.

PAUL ROUND

Veteran of the squad at 34. Joined Oldham from St Helens in 1987. The fee, £65,000 set by tribunal. Enjoyed the best days of his career at Watersheddings. Since had further experience with Wakefield, Hallfax and Castleford. One of the 'old heads' in a young pack.

DARREN ROBINSON

Baby of the squad at 18. Scrum-half, who can also operate at standoff. A Leeds lad Darren played for the Bears Academy and Alliance teams, but never signed on. Signed for the Roughyeds as a free agent and has since caught the eye in warm-up matches, particularly in the 27-26 defeat at Castleford.

GRAEME SHAW

Son of former Oldham Athletic and West Brom soccer star David Shaw. Graeme played Union as a boy at Rakewood (Littleborough), but turned to amateur RL with Moldgreen when his family moved to Huddersfield. Represented the Young Lions against the Junior Kiwis and then signed for Bradford. Made a try-scoring Super League debut at Leeds. Second-row forward.

IAN SINFIELD

Made a big impression so far. Another Oldhamer, a product of Waterhead. Turned pro with Salford, who got an undisclosed fee when he signed for Oldham at Christmas. A natural back-rower, he is the elder brother of England schoolboys star and now Leeds young-ster. Kevin Sinfield.

NATHAN VARLEY

A go-go forward, who excelled with his all-round performance on attack and defence in the friendly at Wheldon Road. Not the biggest of forwards, Nathan has a big heart. He won Yorkshire youth honours before rejecting Keightey to sign for Bradford. One of several ex-Bradford men in the Oldham camp.

STEVE WILDE

Utility back. Strong and pacy. Started with Saddleworth Rangers. Signed by Brian Gartland for the Bears. Prominent member of the Bears Alliance side last season. Played with Waterhead when the Bears folded, but was keen to sign for the new club when opportunity knocked.

A high five is being sought by York Rugby League Club from today's visit of Oldham. Victory for the Wasps in today's second versus third clash would complete a five match winning streak for the club and could see them installed as Second Division leaders. York fans will have to cast their minds back to the 1992/3 season for the last time the club managed such an unbroken stretch of success.

A squad including Nick Pinkney, Stewart Horton, Steve Craven, Rich Hayes and Mick Ramsden, the only current squad member, won six consecutive games between August and October before eventually finishing fourth.

They kicked off their brilliant sequence with a 23-13 victory over Chorley, going on to beat Batley, Whitehaven, Highfield, Nottingham and Doncaster. The six pack of success ended with an 18-12 defeat at Batley.

However, that period featured a record breaking individual performance from dual code international Gary Pearce.

In the 84-0 thrashing of Nottingham, Pearce claimed the club record for most points scored in a match, his one try and 12 goals setting a new best of 28 points.

Since those heady days the Wasps have enjoyed two unbeaten five game stretches of four wins and a draw, in 1994/5 and 1995/6.

In December 1995 they beat Chorley, Bramley, Barrow and Hunslet but drew with Highfield and the previous season they beat Highfield, Batley, Barrow and Leigh, with a draw coming from Keighley.

However, the Wasps must overcome the re-born Oldham club if they are to maintain their winning run and the Roughyeds are also aiming to take top slot this afternoon.

I didn't realise until the journey home from Lancashire Lynx, quite how far back you had to go for York's last winning run away from home, since then, I've been told it was 4 years ago. So, as a bit of a trip through time, lets reminisce for a minute or so.

Travel back through the mists of time to the era when the club was still called Ryedale York, with home crowds comfortably over 1000. Rugby League was a winter sport, London had just been renamed the Broncos, and fighting for promotion in the second division. Some things didn't change though, as Highfield were propping up the rest of the table, and York struggled to beat them on their own ground.

Other results weren't that bad though, Roger Milward's team did the double over the Broncos, and also beat Huddersfield at the Ryedale Stadium.

The challenge cup run ended with a fifth round defeat by Leeds at Headingley, after knocking out Barrow Island and Rochdale.

Elsewhere, Doncaster were in Division 1, and the result of the season must have been Barrow beating Hull KR by the narrowest of margins. In fact, it was so narrow, it was a drop goal that won it for them, 1-0.

The stars of the time were a relatively unknown couple of Australians. Jason Laurence was the regular full back, and in the centre, or occasionally stand off, was a chap called Brad Davis. What ever happened to him?

Coincidences start with 1998, when you look at the names of the regulars in the team for the away wins. On the wings were Chris Hopcutt and Leigh Deakin, Mick Ramsden was in the second row, and Andy Precious was at loose forward, sharing goal kicking duties with Hopcutt, Alan Pallister and Lea Tichener also made it on the team sheet that season.

After last weekend's win at Doncaster equalled that run, I don't suppose too many will care about the coincidences, as long as it's not another four years before it happens again!

The intensity and spirit that is being generated can only be for the good of York RL.





ACADEMY & YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

At last we have started the season, now the amateur competitions have finished, our squad is looking very impressive. 


