David Ward - Head Coach and Director

As a player David had a distinguished career with Leeds as a hooker and Captain. He also has twelve caps for Great Britain. He started his coaching career in 1986 with Hunslet and during his spell there they became Champions of Division 2 and were beaten finalists in the Division 2 Premiership. He was then Coach at Leeds before taking up his first spell at Batley between 1991 and 1994. His last appointment as Coach was at Featherstone Rovers before commencing his present spell in time for pre-season training this year. As a Batley lad he is a popular choice of Coach among players and supporters alike and is well respected such that he has been invited onto the Board of Directors at the club.



Roy Powell - Prop/Second Row

Roý has joined the Club this season from Featherstone Rovers and was immediately made Club Captain which he appears to be relishing. He played on 29 occasions for Featherstone last season and also had a long and distinguished career with Leeds. Whilst at Leeds he won a total of 19 caps for Great Britain as well as 5 caps for Great Britain Under 21's. He is well known for his defensive qualities and is a Batley lad.



Roger Simpson - Centre/Winger/Stand Off/Full Back

Roger signed for Batley in January 1996 as part of a deal which saw Glen Tomlinson transferred in the opposite direction to Bradford Bulls. He has recently had a testimonial as recognised long service at Bradford Bulls during which time he received one cap for England against France in 1995. He has now played some 40 games for Batley scoring 21 tries and is still capable of going the length of the field.



Simon Jackson - Full Back/Centre

He signed for the Club in June 1995 having previously played Junior and Amateur Rugby League for St. John Fisher. He is a product of the Academy Team at Batley. He broke into the First Team last season and has now established himself as a regular member of the First Team Squad at the age of 21.



Lee Bargate - Wing/Centre

He is in his second spell at the Club having initially signed from Middleton Amateurs in 1990. He then went to Featherstone Rovers being persuaded back to Batley by David Ward.



Carl Gibson - Centre/Winger/Full Back

Carl is another player in his second period at the club. He initially signed as a junior before transferring to Leeds in 1990 for a record £50,000.00. He then moved to Featherstone Rovers before re-joining Batley in 1996. He has played eleven times for Great Britain as well as some 144 times for Batley scoring 86 tries. He is a Batley lad born and bred.



Paul Gleadhill - Winger

Paul came to Batley with David Ward at the beginning of this season having previously played at Featherstone Rovers. As a speedy and elusive Winger he is already making his mark at the Club by getting on the score sheet. Last season he played 22 times for Featherstone scoring 13 tries.



Steve Walker - Centre/Winger/Full Back

Steve signed from Dudley Hill Amateurs in 1992 and since then prior to this season has played 103 times for Batley scoring 48 tries and 16 goals. Last season he played on 22 occasions and scored 11 tries and 10 goals.

Nick Simpson - Centre

A tall and strong centre who came to Batley for a trial when he moved into the area as a student. Has had a chance in the First Team. He is learning the game in the Alliance, may feature again in the First Team squad this year and is a name to look out for in the future.



Andy Wray - Prop/Second Row

Andy is on loan from Featherstone until the end of July 1998. He is another player persuaded to join Batley by David Ward and having impressed in the early Alliance gamed has now broken into the First Team Squad.



Grant Miers -Second Row

Grant played for Oulton ARLFC when we played them in the R.L. Cup this year and had a fine game. He came to Batley for a trial and due to his high work rate now established himself as a regular. An Australian by the way.



Richard Price - Stand-Off/Goal Kicker

Richard signed from Sheffield Eagles in 1996. Last season he broke the Clubs point scoring record in 31 appearances scoring 22 tries and 110 goals making a total of 308 points. He has also previously played for Hull during which time he played twice for Great Britain Under 21's.

Gary signed from Bramley in 1995 and by the end of last season had played on 61 occasions scoring 16 tries. He was one of the most consistent players last season playing in 25 games and scoring 9 tries.



Mark Cass - Scrum Half/Hooker

Mark signed from Hull in 1992 having previously played amateur Rugby League in Middleton, Leeds. A past Batley Player of the Year, up until the beginning of this season he had played 139 games for Batley and scored 35 tries and a drop goal. Last season he played on 27 occasions scoring 10 tries and a drop goal.



Chris McWilliam - Prop

Chris is an Australian of Scottish descent who signed for Batley in 1994 having previously played for Ovenden Amateurs and Keighley Cougars. Due to injury and a dispute with the previous Board he did not play last season but has now returned to the Club under the new regime and coaching staff and no doubt will now lead from the front. He has previously played 57 games for Batley scoring 8 tries and a drop goal.



Graham Middleton - Prop/Second Row

Graham joined Batley from Leeds in 1993 and prior to the start of this season had made 60 appearances scoring 7 tries. He is another player who due to a dispute with the previous Board did not play last season but under a new Coach and Board he has now re-joined the Club and has immediately made his presence felt in the First Team Squad.

The Rebirth of a Great Club

On Monday 27th October 1997 I was the last person to speak from the floor to recommend that the shareholders vote to wind up Oldham Bears R.L.F.C. as the club's dept at that time was £1,198,908 the shareholders bowed to the inevitable. I was wearing a black tie at the time as a symbol of the loss that all Oldham supporters naturally felt.

Also present at the meeting was Christopher Hamilton and group of Oldham businessmen comprising Melvyn Lord, Sean Whitehead and Stuart Hardacre. Little were those shareholders present that day to know that within weeks they would be attending another meeting celebrating the launch of a new Oldham Club. A turn-out of over 600 at this meeting and shortly there after at a fund raising dinner gave grounds for optimism. But the question was: Could Oldham put together a team in time to meet their targets of a Law Cup match against Rochdale Hornets on New Years Day and entry into the Silk Cut Challenge Cup later that month?

The first step was the appointment of a coach. Paddy Kirwan was a universally popular choice, being a former Bears Alliance Team coach, the head of Oldham's Challenge Cup defeat of Wigan in 1987 and a member of the family which, like a good stick of rock, has Oldham running right through. Paddy appointed as his assistant Mick Coats, a coach highly respected in local amateur circles and one with a track record at Saddleworth Rangers which was second to none.

But what of players? First to sign was local lad John Hough, a hooker out of Waterhead with considerable experience of Super League football at Warrington Wolves. Again the Houghs have Oldham in their veins. Uncle Mick having given stalwart service Waterhead and, late in his career, having seen professional service with Mansfield Marksmen where, I am led to believe, a young John Hough had been known to sell programmes with much burning of midnight oil, by the turn of the year Chris Hamilton, his directors and dedicated secretary Michele Fitzpatrick and honorary marketing man Brian Walker had signed up enough players to take on the

Hornets at Spotland.

Would the team be good enough? The answer was a resounding 'yes' as Oldham, playing on pure adrenaline, defeated their First Division neighbours 36-16 to lift the Law Cup, thereby winning a trophy in their first match. What was even better was that in an attendance of 3,097 over 2,000 were Oldham fans. There followed entry to the Challenge Cup and a preliminary round victory over Heworth by 36-14. But before anyone could get too euphoric defeats at the hands of Hunslet in a friendly and Widnes in the cup soon restored a sense of reality.

Further shrewd recruiting followed in time for the start of the Second Division season.

Due to open with a home fixture against the powerful Lancashire Lynx on Good Friday, fate in the form of torrential rain caused the post-ponement of what would have been a glorious re-birth. Instead it was to be at Workington on a snowy Easter Monday that the 'new' Oldham made their league debut. Over 700 fans journeyed to Derwent Park to see their heroes register a 22-18 victory. Oldham were back!

The season since has had its inevitable ups and downs, but considering that to have a team at all is a bonus the ups out number the downs, especially considering that an appearance today against Batley in a Cup Final is beyond the wildest dreams of any Oldhamer contemplating the Rugby League scene in November 1997.

The players who have made this possible and who are likely to feature in today's game include, at fullback, Steve Wilde a former Saddleworth Rangers and Waterhead player who is always likely to burst through strongly from the back. On one wing will be Richard Darkes, one of a contingent of Bradford Bulls players to join Oldham after the Bulls disbanded their Alliance side, a forthright and powerful player who takes a lot of holding. On the other wing you can expect to see leading Chris Eckerslev. Another scorer Saddleworth Junior, Chris originally signed for the previous Oldham club who, being unable fulfil his contract, released him to Warrington Wolves, Like John Hough, Chris

was a victim of the Wolves wholesale clearout at the end of last season. It speaks volumes for the player after his bad experience with the former club that he was prepared to sign with his home town club under the new regime. Chris is a real flyer with the ability to score long range tries.

At centre Afi Leuila, the only former Oldham Bear to sign for the Roughyeds, will be hoping to have recovered from injury after his three try performance against Workington. Now striking his best form, Afi is a very exciting attacker. Leuila's partner in the centre will be Bradford Bulls former Alliance team captain, the cultured Sean Cooper. A classy centre who reads the game expertly Cooper is also an ex-Saddleworth man.

At halfback ex-Leigh goalkicking stand-off Chris Wilkinson has recently displaced former Oldham Bears Academy star Craig Barker. Vastly experienced, Wilkinson actually played Colts football with Oldham a decade or so ago. Scrum-half Neil Flanagan bears a name forever associated with Oldham teams and is an inspirational captain who leads from the front. Starting with St Anne's, Flanagan signed first for Oldham before moving to Huddersfield and then Rochdale. Targeted by Paddy Kirwan to lead his fledgling side, Flanagan is ever present this season and has fully justified his coaches' confidence.

Vying for places at prop will be Andrew Proctor, Paul Round, Jason Clegg and Mick Edwards. Proctor is a recent acquisition from Wakefield Trinity. He usually gets through a mountain of work in both attack and defence and has already proved a valuable addition to the squad Paul Round is a living legend in Oldham. The most expensive player ever to sign for an Oldham team (£65,000 in 1987) Round made 111 appearances after signing from St Helens. Gaining further experience at Wakefield, Halifax and Castleford, Round was semi-retired (he was actually playing with Oldham RU) when he volunteered his services to the new Oldham Club. An inspiration to his younger colleagues and enormously popular with the fans. Round tends to be used as an

'impact' player. Jason Clegg is another ex-Bradford player who has actually had trials at Batley. Signed to add weight and 'presence' to Oldham's pack. Clegg can be devastating when used in short bursts. Never-say-die Mick Edwards, who started life as a scrum-half, has played above his weight all season and has carried off several man-of-the-match awards. A barnstorming attacker and tenacious defender, Edwards loves nothing better than scoring tries, another player who has returned to play for Oldham after spells with Swinton and Salford.

As already mentioned the wily John Hough will feature at Hooker where his duel with Mark Cass will be a highlight of today's game.

Oldham's second row will comprise, at various stages, Graeme Shaw, Ian Sinfield and Nathan Varley. Shaw, whose father was part of a magnificent goal-scoring strike force with Jimmy Fryatt at Oldham Athletic, came to the Rugby Club via Moldgreen and Bradford Bulls. A willing worker he has all the hallmarks of a player from a Super League background. lan Sinfield is another local lad proud to sign for his home town club, lan is a former Waterhead and Salford player who is a model of solidity and reliability. Nathan Varley has the unique distinction of appearing in all of Oldham's League fixtures but of only actually starting in one. Coming off the bench Nathan, another ex-Bradford Bull, has a steadying influence on the team with his masterful tackling.

Loose-forward is Mick Martindale an Oldhamer who played for Halifax and Wakefield before re-turning home. A ball-handler in the manner of the loose-forwards of yesteryear, watch out also for his work at acting halfback in hunting down the first receiver.

Finally others who could feature today are Aidrian Mead, an Academy player with Oldham Bears, and Paul Crook, another Oldham Bear who left for Hull Sharks and is in the midst of negotiating a return to the new club. A clever ball-player Paul is the son of the former Wakefield 'Great' and now radio commentator Terry Crook.

Four years ago no-one would believe that today this famous old Mount Pleasant ground would be staging a cup final, that Batley would be facing Oldham in that final, or even that we would be playing rugby league in July.

The Super League revolution brought about summer rugby and it was on this day in 1996. Friday 19th July, that Oldham entertained St. Helens Boundary Park in Super League action. The Roughveds were only 18-14 behind at half-time but they were overrun after the interval and crashed to a 54-18 defeat. The only player who appeared for Oldham that evening and who is likely to appear this afternoon is utility player Paul Crook, substitute then and probably substitute today.

Oldham's two year stint in Super League proved difficult both on and off the pitch. Relegation last autumn was followed by liquidation. The newly born Roughyeds began life in Division Two, alongside Batley, and today both clubs hope to climb back to former glories via this inaugural Trans-Pennine Trophy.

Saturday 19th July 1958 was a glorious day in British rugby league history. For it was on that day 40 years ago that the British Lions met Australia at Sydney Cricket Ground in the decisive third test of that 1958 tour. The Lions had lost the first test 25-8 but recovered to win the second test 25-18 in memorable circumstances. Skipper Alan Prescott (St. Helens) broke his arm in the first few minutes of that second test and four other players accompanied him to Brisbane Hospital after the match.

There were no substitutes in those days so the British victory was quite remarkable. And so to July 19th, to Sydney Cricket Ground and the third test which attracted a crowd of 68.720. Britain played magnificently in this match, arguably the most complete performance in British test history. The Kangaroos were fortunate to be only 14-12 behind at half-time but the Lions ran riot in the second-half to win 40-17. Centre Alan Davies was the only Oldham representative in the team and he scored one try. His wing partner was Mick Sullivan, a native of the Heavy Woollen District, who crossed for another three of the eight British tries.

The British Lions were also in action eight years previously, on Wednesday 19th July 1950, although their performance on that occasion was far from glorious. That day they played the Southern Division Wollongong and were surprisingly beaten 18-11. despite scoring three tries to their opponents two. There were two players from the Heavy Woollen District in the winger Roy British line-up. Pollard and centre Harry Street, both of Dewsbury.

months Twelve ago British Super League clubs were involved in the disastrous World Club Championship and it was on Saturday 19th July that Perth Reds met Sheffield Eagles at the WACA cricket ground. The match ended in the same fashion as most of the other games. in а resounding Australian victory, the score in this particular match being 48-12.

In 1989 Australia made a short tour of New Zealand and it was on this day, Wednesday 19th July, that the Kangaroos defeated Wellington 28-10 at the Basin Reserve ground. At loose-forward for Wellington that evening was Mike Kuiti who was later to serve both Oldham

and Batley whilst in the centre was Charlie McAlister, another former Oldham player. On that very same day, Wednesday 19th July 1989, Oldham signed the versatile Richard Russell from Wigan. During his three seasons with the Roughyeds, Russell proved to be the ideal utility player. He scored 20 tries from 125 appearances in a variety of positions including full-back, stand-off, hooker and loose-forward.

Five years later, on Tuesday 19th July 1994, it was Batley who were in the transfer market. That day they signed the former Featherstone Miners Welfare iunior Paul Harrison from Huil. He proved to be a powerful and penetrative centre for the Gallant Youths before falling into dispute and moving to York. Harrison returned to Mount Pleasant earlier this season and he has regained both his form and first team spot, although he operates from loose-forward position.

On the day that Harrison first joined Batley, Tuesday 19th July the Sydney Eastern Suburbs club appointed Phil Gould as coach for the 1995 season. Gould was a talented player and is an even more talented coach. He led both Canterbury and Penrith to Premiership success and New South Wales to State of Origin victory. Gould has always been an ally of the Australian Super League. Twelve months ago, on Saturday 19th July 1997, he indicated his belief that the Australian Rugby should go it alone and not amalgamate with the Super League. 'I'd tell Super League to go to hell.' he was quoted as

BATLEY - OLDHAM CUP TIES

This afternoon's historic cup final is the first final involving Batley and Oldham although these two founder members of the code have met in ten previous ties going back 100 years.

Their first cup meeting came in 1898, a Challenge Cup quarter-final at Batley which the home side won 3-0, stand-off Joe Oakland settling the issue with a try midway through the second-half. The Gallant Youths were cup holders going into that match and they went on to retain the trophy. Batley won the Cup again in 1901 and, once again, they beat Oldham en route to the final. The semi-final meeting at Fartown, Huddersfield attracted a crowd of 16,000 and it was stand-off Joe Oakland again who scored the only try of the afternoon in Batley's 9-2 victory.

Three years later, in March 1904, Oakland was at it again, his try easing Batley through a home first round Challenge Cup-tie 5-0. Twelve months later Oldham broke the Batley bogey when they won a second round Challenge Cup-tie at Mount Pleasant 14-10. Joe Oakland did score, but it was a goal and not a match winning try this time.

In February 1923 Oldham found themselves travelling over the Pennines again for a Challenge Cup-tie. The match at Batley ended scoreless but the Roughyeds made no mistake two days later when they ran in four tries in a 14-0 replay victory.

Oldham's biggest ever defeat against Batley came at the end of the 1923-24 season when they travelled to Mount Pleasant in the Championship semi-final. Batley were without loose-forward Frank Gallagher, en route to Australia with the British Lions, but Oldham were harder hit for they had Ernie Knapman, Sid Rix, Bob Sloman and Albert Brough on the same boat with Gallagher. There was a crowd of 9,500 at the Mount where the Gallant Youths completely outplayed Oldham to win 38-0. South African winger Herbert Murray and centre George Davidge each scored a brace of tries whilst stand-off Harry Rees directed operations and still found time to score a try and seven goals.

Fourteen years passed before the two clubs met again in cup football when it was much closer at Watersheddings in the first round of the Challenge Cup in February 1938. The Roughyeds led 7-6 as the match moved into injury time, stand-off Mick Downey having scored the only try of the afternoon. But then up popped Batley scrum-half Dicky Ralph to drop a goal and give the Gallant Youths victory by 8-7. Oldham and Batley have not met since in a Challenge Cup-tie but they have met on three occasions in the John Player Trophy, the first time at Watersheddings in October 1976. Batley put up a brace performance against their First Division opponents that afternoon but the Roughyeds came through to win 17-9.

In season 1987-88 both Oldham and Batley found themselves in the Second Division but they experienced contrasting fortunes. The Roughyeds finished top, the Gallant Youths finished bottom and their league placings were graphically exposed when the clubs met at Mount Pleasant in the second round of the John Player Trophy. Oldham won 44-0, their biggest ever victory over Batley, with second-row forward Paul Round leading the rout with three of the Roughyeds' eight tries.

Three years later Oldham again visited Mount Pleasant for a second round Regal Trophy tie. Batley were still in Division Two but Oldham were in the top division and favourites to win. The match was played on a snow covered pitch and, once again, Paul Round was amongst the Oldham try scorers. But Batley played with much more fire this time and were able to frustrate the Roughyeds. So much so that Oldham's Australian loose-forward. Cogger, lost his head and was sent off on the stroke of half-time after giving the Mount Pleasant crowd the V-sign. The second half was full of end-to-end, gripping action and it ended with prop-forward player-coach Keith Rayne crashing over in the last move of the match to claim a hattrick and give Batley a well deserved 20-16 victory.

Oldham will probably start today's match as slight favourites but Mount Pleasant has proved to be a slippery slope for them in the past so Batley will not be short of confidence. A great game is in prospect, may the best team win.


