Last week I was excited with the pack before the game, I had that feeling they were going to climb into 'Widnes' and they never let me down.





resilience that has characterised Whitehaven's progress through to the last 16.

They were far from convincing in their

home win over enterprising amateurs Eccles, but stuck to their task doggedly to complete a 26-7 victory at Spotland. Winger Adrian Meade scored a brace of tries and ex-Hull KR halfback Daniel Brown was a worthy man-of-the-match. If Oldham were less than convincing in eliminating Eccles, they showed tremendous character in causing an upset with their richly deserved 18-10 victory over Neil Kelly's fancied Dewsbury.

Inspired by skipper Leo Casey, they defended as though their lives depended upon the result.

The signs are that, despite an unexpected 0-30 opening day league reverse at Batley, coach Mick Coates and assistant Graham Bradley, will steadily turn things around.

#### CHALLENGE CUP HISTORY

The Haven and Oldham are two clubs which have never appeared at Wembley and they are meeting in Challenge Cup football for the first time.

But there have been six previous Recreation Ground clashes in knockout football - incorporating the now-defunct Lancashire Cup, John Player and Floodlit

Trophy competitions and honours are even. with three wins apiece in cup meetings staged at Whitehaven.

Whitehaven's last knockout victory over

OLDHAM have shown the same sort of Oldham was a 5-0 victory in the first round of the first ever John Player Trophy competition in 1971.

> Oldham's cup victories at the Recreation Ground include an 11-2 Lancashire Cup first-round victory in September 1962 and a 31-10 success in the same competition two years later, when winger Malcolm Price scored four tries and Frank Dyson kicked five goals.

> But Oldham have not visited Whitehaven at all since claiming a 20-6 Second Division league victory on their way to winning promotion in 1987-88, with former Great Britain prop Hugh Waddell among their try-scorers in the first match of that season at the Recreation Ground.

#### LAST SEASON

After to all intents and purposes, Oldham Rugby League Club folded at the end of the 1997 season, after finishing bottom of the Super League. A group of businesses headed by solicitor Chris Hamilton rallied round and the Oldham club was reformed. Last season was one of rebuilding, though with arguably one of the best support bases in Division One, that should not be too difficult. Having sold their traditional home at the Watersheddings, the Oldham club are this season playing their home games at Rochdale pending the construction of a new stadium in Oldham.


## IN YER FACE DAVID SEEDS

A product of Kells ARLFC and a BARLA Youth International David signed for the club in September 1993 and made his debut later that month. He quickly established himself as a first team player, a pacy attacker who can score tries but at the same time a rock solid defender.

He played for Cumbria against Australia in 1994 and went on to be Whitehaven's top try scorer in 1996 with 10 touchdowns.

David currently stands high in the list of all time Haven try scorers with 90 career touchdowns, only Vince Gribbin and Bill Smith are above him.

Not only was this game a local derby, but also a semi-final in the ESRL Plate Competition. With the honours being shared evenly in the league campaign, here was the opportunity to show who was the 'best in the West'! On a bright sunny but very cold day, the two teams started off well, both completing their sets of possession, and tackling ferociously. It was Allerdale who opened the scoring in the 12th minute, when Whitehaven made their first mistake, when prop Daniel Young dropped the ball, but from the restart Whitehaven gathered possession and with quick handling centre Dave Green sprinted into the left hand corner to level the score at 4-4.

Again from the kick off, Whitehaven made huge drives into the Allerdale defence with props Carl Schofield and Daniel Young leading the way and when on last tackle scrum half Gavin Beasley decided on a power play which eventually led to left winger Liam (Nocker) Campbell driving in at the left hand corner again. Jason Mossop just failed with the conversion, 4-8. Now with the bit between their teeth, Whitehaven forwards started to lav the foundation which would lead them to victory. Again the two props, second rowers Scott McAvoy and Barry Garner ably supported by half backs Beasley and Mossop tore the Allerdale defence apart at will, resulting in captain Carl Schofield grabbing himself two well taken tries. Jason Mossop converting once, Whitehaven now leading 18-4. Just before half time against the run of play Allerdale hit back with a score, which gave them some hope of turning the result in their favour, half time score

Just like the first half, Allerdale where first to

score again, edging nearer to Whitehaven, the score 12-18, but as before this seemed to spark the visitors into their stride, again the forwards totally dominating. It was not long until Dave Green scored his second try, then came the try of the match when from a Allerdale kick deep into the Whitehaven 20, full back Craig Kirkbride collected the ball, ran it out eluding tacklers to run 50 yards up the field and when confronted with his opposite number, threw a pass inside to supporting player Jordan Buchanan, who then kicked the ball forward regathered to score underneath the posts. Jason Mossop converted to put the game Whitehaven's way, the score now being 12-28.

Unfortunately for Allerdale, centre Dave Green saved his best for last, when a set move from a scrum, Dave took the ball at pace, bumped off into two defenders, then used his speed to runround the full back for another spectacular score.

Kevin Tamati, Haven's head coach was an avid spectator and he was given the duty of picking the Man-of-the-Match Award. He found himself in an awkward dilemma with some 6 players to choose from, but in the end, he chose prop Daniel Young for his workrate and commitment, especially as he had made a costly mistake early on.

The U13s now await to see who they will play in the final, the opponents being the winners of the Oldham v. Leigh game.





#### 1999 SILK CUT PRIZES

PAUL CROOK: Half back who previously played with Dewsbury. Oldham Bears and Hull Sharks. Creative player who is happy at either stand-off or loose-forward.

CRAIG BARKER: Local half-back or hooker who was not always a first choice in '98 but never lets the side down when selected.

LEO CASEY: Now at the veteran stage, Leo has returned to Oldham in the close season. Has represented Ireland at International level, this tough prop forward was delighted to be named as: Captain for this seasons campaign.

JASON CLEGG: Formerly a Bradford Bull this prop has opened this season in barn-storming form. Scored a typical rampaging try in the Law Cup against Rochdale. 'Cleggy' is becoming a favourite with the Oldham spectators.

PAUL ROUND: Now in his second spell with Oldham, Paul is a real veteran of the game. Formerly a back rower he now tends to lead from the front row. Former clubs

Include St Helens and Castleford.

**DANIEL BROWN: Formerly of** Parramatta and Cronulla, Daniel played for Hull KR last season. A player with a big heart and a good rugby brain vear.

# TALKING POINTS Challenge Cup Review

The fourth round of the seasons Challenge Cup certainly threw up some great games and a few surprises.

Both last seasons finalists Sheffield and Wigan went out at the first hurdle, incidently the first time this has happened since 1965 and has only the second time in the history of the Challenge Cup. Favourites Wigan are already out and with four all Super League clashes this weekend, some more big names are going to fall.

And there is so much to look forward to at this fifth round stage with only Super League clubs and Northern Ford Premiership clubs left in the hunt for Wembley glory. There were some magnificent games in the fourth round, with both of

last year's finalists knocked out of the cup.

This year's Silk Cut Challenge Cup is as open as ever, with record-scoring Bradford Bulls strong favourites to make up one half of the Wembley equation. Other eagerly anticipated Super League clashes involve Leeds Rhinos, who face St Helens, and Warrington Wolves against Halifax Blue Sox.

There will also be some closely fought action between Northern Ford Premiership clubs, with at least two guaranteed to make it through to the quarter-finals and cause a potential upset against Super League opposition. Widnes Vikings take on Leigh Centurions and Whitehaven Warriors play Oldham.


