Such stories seem to have been the standard fare of the Hull City, sorry Daily Mail of late. Indeed dealing with the press is the most frustrating aspect of the job and not just with the local newspaper. Already this season I have had to reprimand a rugby league publication for quoting me when their reporter has not even had the courtesy to speak to me. Most of the time the made up quotes are innocuous but it is lazy journalism and plain bad manners. Equally annoying is when the reporter gets the emphasis of an interview all wrong. In their haste to fill up the allotted space the essence of the message you are trying to convey can get totally lost. Of course it is not always the reporter's fault. On the whole my relationship with John Fieldhouse was good and that certainly looks like continuing with James Shield now.



Unfortunately with a sports editor who is primarily a football fan it is difficult for our voice and James' articles to get any kind of prominence at the moment. This it would appear, is a microcosm of the problem rugby league has as a whole. Certainly the national press seem to have forgotten the route to East Hull with most of the dailies failing to carry a report of our efforts against London.

With this attitude it makes it doubly vital that our efforts to resurrect our famous club, from the supporters group through to the boardroom, are given the oxygen of publicity locally. It isn't about what Dave Harrison says, it is about the supporters forum, the local sponsor who donates a few hundred quid and the community work with youngsters that tells the story of Hull Kingston Rovers 1999. In the meantime if you are not happy with the amount of coverage we are getting in the Hull Daily Mail, either now or at any time in the future, I urge you to write to the editor to voice your concerns. Only by recognising how much you contribute to their profits and the potential loss should you withdraw your custom will they listen to what you have to say.

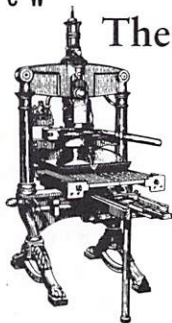

CRAIG BARKER

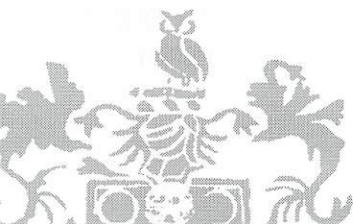
Local half-back or hooker who was not always a first choice in '98 but never lets the side down when selected.

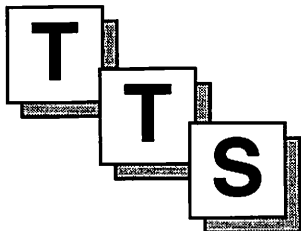

Colin Hutton - 55 years in the game

Continuing the story of Club Director - Colin Hutton's involvement in Rugby League, a really tremendous record:-

A brief summary of Colin's playing career is:

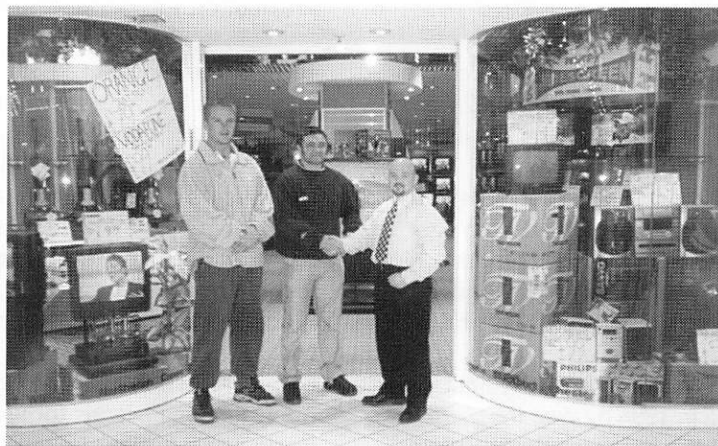

Colin retired from playing rugby league in October 1957. He remained in East Yorkshire, having then been appointed coach to Hull Kingston Rovers. He remained in this position until 1970 when he stood down to become the General Manager at the club. In 1964 during his club coaching career he steered the first Hull Kingston Rovers team ever to play in a Challenge Cup final at Wembley, playing against his old club Widnes.

Between 1959 and 1970 he was also the staffcoach at Lilleshall and Bisham Abbey.

Colin Hutton

In 1972 Colin was appointed a Director of Hull Kingston Rovers, a position he still holds to this day.

He became the club Chairman in 1982 and held that position until 1990.

During his illustrious Rugby League career Colin has held many positions both within the governing body of the game and within the International scene.

In 1962 he was the coach of the Great Britain Team which toured Australia, New Zealand and South Africa. This was followed in 1968 by Colin becoming the assistant manager of the Great Britain team which took part in the World Championships in Australia.

In 1975 Colin was appointed to the Council of the Rugby Football League which is the games governing body and he is proud to still hold that position even to this day.

In 1978 Colin was appointed the manager of the England Rugby League Team and between 1980 and 1982 he was the manager of the Great Britain Rugby League Team.

Throughout his 55 year involvement in the sport he loves Colin's passion has always been in youth rugby and the development of young players and the sport in general. Between 1990 and 1995 he was the Chairman of the Academy section of the Rugby Football League and in 1994 he was the Manager of the Academy Great Britain Team which toured Australia.

In 1994 the Rugby Football League honoured Colin in two ways, firstly he was appointed to be the President of the Rugby Football League and

secondly he was made a Life Member of the rugby Football League.

These honours were to followed in 1997 when Colin was made an Honourary Life President of the Rugby Football League.

In 1997 the University of Hull bestowed the honourary Degree of Master of Arts upon him for his services to the game of Rugby League.

Colin Hutton also holds a unique record relating to the Rugby League Challenge cup final which is played at Wembley. He is the only person to have attended this occasion in all of the following positions:

Player	- 1950
Team Coach	- 1964
Club Director	- 1980-81
Club Chairman	- 1986
President R.F.L.	- 1995

Throughout his life in Rugby League Colin was also minehost at the Zetland Arms in Hull. Although both he and his wife Majorie make little of the fact, over many years they welcomed as their resident guests many Australian and New Zealand players who had travelled to this Country in order to play for Hull Kingston Rovers. The personal financial cost to Colin and Marjorie is never considered as this has brought them many life long friends throughout the world and it is clear Colin is held in such high esteem, second to none, wherever the game of Rugby League is played.

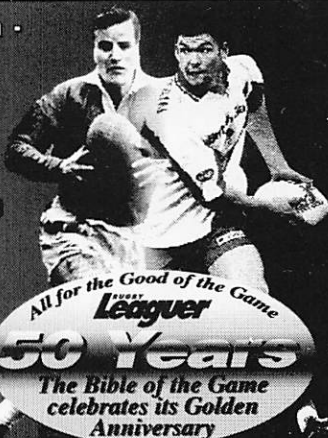

50 YEARS OF RL STORIES



Step back in time with some of the stories covered over the past 50 years

1957 FEB 15 - 'TOMMY HARRIS'

'Percival Thomas Harris, signed by Hull in December 1949 from the Welsh RU club Newbridge. He has already achieved almost every honour in the game and would last year's Wembley winners' medal to add to last season's Championship one. There's not much of this "Pocket Hercules" but what there is is very good!

1963 FEB 8 - 'NEW STAND-OFF FOR WIGAN'

'Big News for Wigan during the week has been the signing of the Fijian stand-off Kaiawa (Kia) Bose which marks the end of a three month trial for the Central Park club. Bose, who is 24 years old, 5ft 9ins and sturdily built is a speedy player, prolific try scorer and also kicks goals (barefooted).

1966 FEB 4 - 'SUPPORT FOR "BAN TV" CAMPAIGN'

Looking back

The 1967 Yorkshire Cup Final

Forty -seven Years Later

Carrying on the theme of local derby finals where Rovers beat their archrivals Hull FC, we once again look to the Yorkshire Cup final. On 14th October 1967, Rovers met Hull FC in the final of the Yorkshire Cup at the Headingley ground, Leeds. The two clubs had last met in the final forty-seven years earlier when Rovers were the victors by 2 points to nil. At this time Hull KR were the leagues "in form" team and had won thirteen consecutive games including the famous win over the Australian tourists a week earlier. This was Hull FC's twelfth Yorkshire Cup final with only one success to show. The Robins were defending the cup having beaten Featherstone 25-12 in the 1966 final.

Attacking Style

Hull KR were the strong favourites to retain the cup. The day before the encounter the Hull Daily Mail reported, "They (HKR) have developed during the past few years into one of the game's most formidable outfits, with an attacking style which goes on yielding an average of 20 points a match, and a defence which has become the despair of opponents.

The Game

Hull's plan for the game was to contain Rovers in a defensive ring. Keeping

the ball away from Rovers' faster backs and to destroy at its source every attempt by Rovers to get their attacking machinery into motion. This sabotage plan was not pretty and did not make for attractive football but it served its purpose. Hull was grateful for the early use of the strong wind and with the match only three minutes old, Hull's Chris Davidson went over for a try.

Unarmed Combat

Hull's destructive tackling, which sometimes gave the impression that the match was a lesson in unarmed combat, earned them many cautions and penalties against them. But for over sixty minutes it worked and denied Rovers their normally smooth and efficient attacking game. Hull rushed their defences around to close every gap although Roger Millward's spectacular interception try and a penalty goal each from John Maloney of Hull FC and Cyril Kellett left the score level at the end of an hour. The Airlie Birds managed to get one hand on the cup with a drop-goal which put them in front for a second time.

Refusing to Flap

With Hull in the lead Rovers refused to get into a flap at the way things were going. They took professional stock of the situation and did something about it. Frank Foster, whose inclusion at half-time brought extra stability in

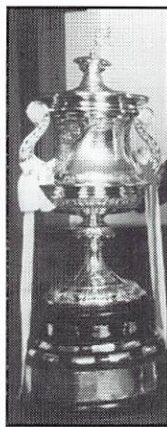


Rovers' pack helped Billy Holiday to lead a full-scale assault on Hull's line. David Elliot was hammered down after a sparkling dash by Millward. Colin Cooper then reached the line before being stopped. It was then that Rovers spotted a defensive gate not securely closed. Terry Major's wide pass to Alan Burwell put him over the line and Rovers were in front for the first time in the game. This was the deciding try and Rovers won the match 8-7.

From a footballing point of view the game was a disappointment for the 17,000 crowd but the closeness of the score always kept it at flashpoint with ruthless tackling and bitter physical clashes. The Rovers' wingers, Young and Burwell, had little chance, mostly as a result of Hull's deadly tackling but also because of the heavy going and blustery wind which prevented their middle backs from moving as quickly or as accurately to the attack. When the call came to defend, as it often did in the face of the short sharp bursts of the Hull trio Broom, Macklin and Edson, Rovers' work could not be faulted. Nobody worked harder in this respect than Millward, Moore and Kellett, who played on after the first three minutes with a broken nose.

Tribute

A tribute to Kingston Rovers for doing something never achieved before in the history of the club - winning the Yorkshire Cup two years in succession - was paid by the club chairman Wilf Spaven at a celebration supper at the Queen's Hotel. "We are not concerned about the closeness of the score," said Mr. Spaven. "All I am concerned about is that the cup again goes to Rovers."

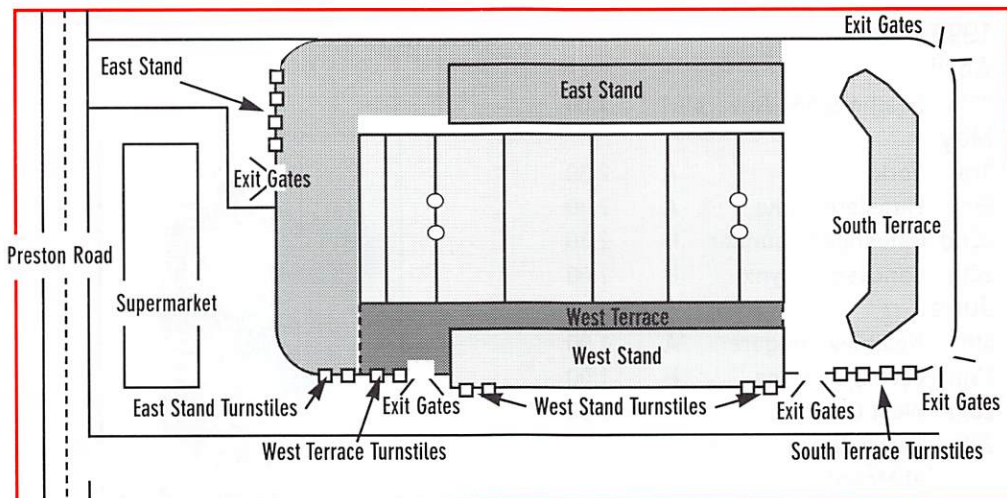
