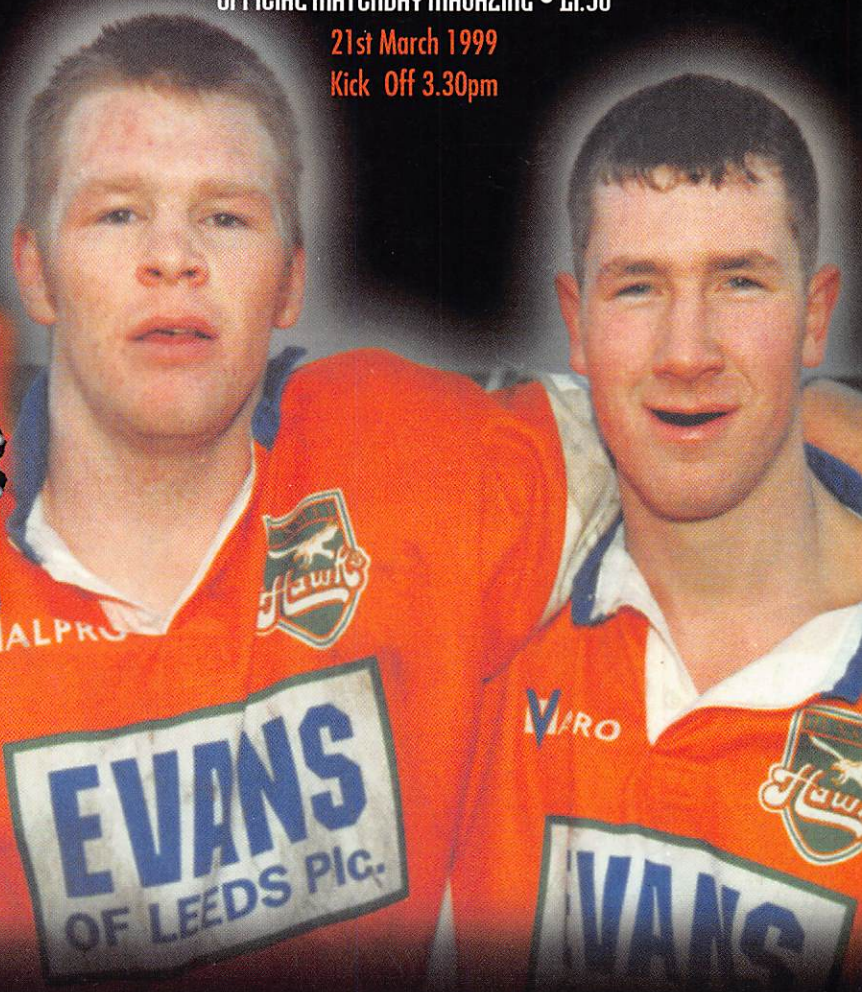

Welcome to Oldham and all associated with this club which has a long and distinguished heritage. Like Hunslet it was one of the teams which formed the Northern Union in 1895-1896 season. Two years later Oldham were winners of the Lancashire Senior Competition and in that season Hunslet were triumphant in the Yorkshire Senior Competition.

Oldham fielded many Great Britain players over the decades including Terry Clawson, Alan Davies, Bernard Ganley, Andy Goodway, Frank Pitchford, Derek 'Rocky' Turner and many others. Those are names for 'Golden oldies' to savour.

We have made an encouraging start to our campaign in the Northern Ford Premiership and we are entitled to view the next few months with a modicum of optimism. It would be easy to get carried away with our performance but we must not be over confident. TV pundit and former England goal poacher Jimmy Greaves never tires of describing soccer as "a funny old game" and Rugby League can be just as unpredictable as association football. We can never take things for granted but when I reflect on our recent display I am a contented and rather proud chairman.

The weather and muddy ground at Batley demanded courage and stamina. We were strong in both departments and should improve when the sun shines and the grounds are faster. Brian Cartwright and his staff do a tremendous job and the quality of our pitch is a tribute to their industry and dedication. When you consider how often the area is used - not only for rugby - the surface is in superb condition and one of the best playing arenas in our great game.

Summer rugby has been voted 'a hit' by fans who responded to a survey conducted throughout the Rugby League Supporters' Association. The game has changed dramatically in recent years. It is faster with a demand on extra fitness. Super League status has to be the outstanding target for Northern Ford Premiership clubs and this is our ultimate aim. We have to be with the elite to survive and that means we must boost attendances. Coach David Plange has already intimated in the rugby press that we require regular home gates of 2,000 or more. David has voiced what we all think. We must prove to Leeds City Council and the general public that we are capable of attracting attendances of that magnitude.

If every current supporter succeeded in recruiting one fan we would hit the 2,500 maximum. The long-term Council plan is to increase seating facilities. We have to prove we are worthy of this vital improvement to the stadium. However that's enough of the game's politics...We hope to have a cracking game today and may the better team win.

Facts Fancies

Radio Leeds has another Rugby League fan on the staff in addition to John Boyd and recently-returned Harry Gratton. Martin Kelner, who fronts the new afternoon broadcast, is a long-serving Rochdale Hornets' supporter. He has followed the fluctuating fortunes of the famous club since he first stepped on the terraces as a boy. Martin is also familiar with the South Leeds Stadium facilities. His teenager son plays tennis there and no doubt keeps an eye on Hunslet Hawks activities.



We are at home to Rochdale on April 25 and play them again on August 29 the last match of the league programme. It is a safe bet that Martin will be at both games cheering his favourite side. Another Hornets' fan is the television producer Barrie Cockcroft who made his name when he discovered and filmed the life of hermit Hanna Hawkswell. When he was at YTV we often shared a pint or two in the station bar and talked Rugby League. He was the man who produced the award-winning programme, "Another Bloody Sunday" based on Doncaster RL Club's long losing sequence. One of the most surprising facts of that epic was the appearance of champagne behind the club's bar within minutes of the team ending a protracted spell of defeats.

Doncaster RL Club was the last place you would have expected 'bubbly' to be on offer or even in stock. Our match next Sunday is against Doncaster Dragons when Hunslet-born Garry Schofield is expected to be in the opposition line up. We can recommend the 19th edition of Rothman's Rugby League Yearbook (published by Headline Books and on sale at £17.99). It is compiled by Raymond Fletcher, a former Yorkshire Post RL reporter, and he maintains the excellence always associated with this seasonal treat. One of the major talking points in the splendid publication is the plea by Sheffield Eagle's coach John Kear for homegrown coaches to be given more credit for their ability. He suggests that the appointment of an Australian coach to a British club should count on the overseas players' quota. John writes: 'I would like to see this rule in operation by the year 2004 and clubs would have to decide between an overseas coach and a player'.



We are fortunate to have one of the Northern Ford Premiership top coaches in David Plange. No doubt David and other up and coming stars on the coaching scene will favour Kear's policy. John's feat in taking Sheffield Eagle's to Wembley last year was a brilliant achievement. Guiding them to a glorious triumph over Wigan was simply incredible.

Hopefully the Silk Cut Challenge Cup will again be won by a Yorkshire club on May 1- even if the successful team is our old enemy Leeds Rhinos'.



Props Craig Richards started his career with Oldham and also played for Bradford. Hooker Richard Pachnuik wore the Oldham strip before moving to Rochdale. Centre Chris North was on Oldham's books and also figured in Dewsbury ranks. Shaun Irwin had a spell with Oldham, Castleford and Featherstone before returning to Hunslet. Our nomadic lads certainly put themselves about don't they? At the start of the season Oldham were quoted at 250 to 1 to win the Northern Ford Championship. But rampant Hunslet Hawks will pay due respect to the Lancashire lads. No team can afford to be complacent in this highly competitive league.

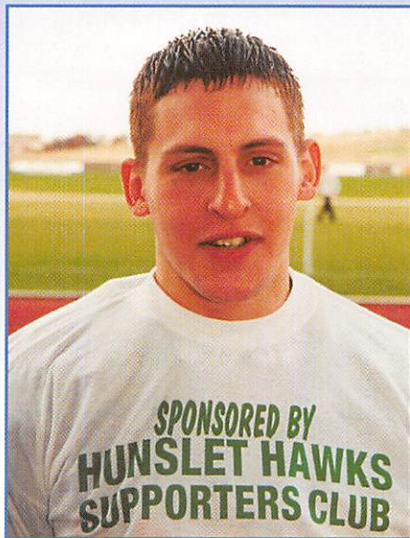

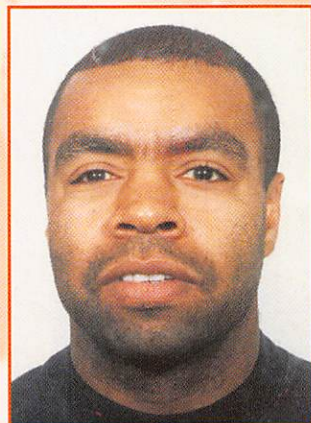

WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

One of the greatest success stories attributed to Hunslet Rugby League is told with justifiable pride by Cec Thompson. Cec arrived in South Leeds from his native Cumbria and concedes that he was different. The teenager lacked even a basic education. He was lonely and he knew that he was different to the majority of Hunslet residents.

Cec said: "I am black and we were few and far between in those days. I was something of a curiosity and didn't know why". What Cec does not say is that he was tall, dark and handsome. He still is although his healthy growth of hair and his moustache are now flecked with grey.

Cec made a passionate speech a few years ago at the Hunslet Parkside Ex Players Association

Annual Lunch. We listened with wrapt attention. We were enthralled when the story unfolded with a mixture of sadness and joy. Cec recalled: I had a job as a window cleaner and rugby didn't even enter my life until I was invited to attend Parkside. "I saw the ball for the first time and within weeks I was playing for the club". "It changed my life, rugby gave me a start. I was part of a team with friends, I had respect".

Cec opted for education. He progressed quickly and gained a degree at Leeds University. He blossomed in business with the window cleaning round developing into an industrial cleaning firm employing a strong work force.

Cec short for Cecil was appointed a lecturer at Chesterfield Polytechnic and his

popularity with students was evident from the start. He founded Varsity Rugby League and he is still associated with the game at this level. Cec wrote his life story and part of it was condensed into a Readers Digest feature. He is entitled to be proud of his never-ending achievements but he is a modest individual and expresses eternal gratitude to life and the game he played so well.

We hope to invite Cec to speak at one of the Hunslet Hawks functions. He has a compelling tale to tell. He lives in quiet retirement but he retains business interests and he will never lose his passion for Rugby League.

Cec can still sing with the best of us: "We've swept the seas before boys - and so we shall again!"

BRIAN QUINLAN

Local born goal kicking centre or second row. Missed most of last season through injury.

MICK FARRELL

21 year old utility back was outstanding for Rochdale in 1997 but had a disappointing 1998. The ex-Waterhead amateur will be looking for a big season with his hometown club.

JOE McNICHOLAS

This young winger is one of the most exciting prospects in the new First Division. Having turned down an offer from Bradford Bulls Joe was unfortunate to miss most of 1998 after breaking his leg in the early season. Rochdale born, he is armed with pace and a great side step.

PAUL CROOK

Half Back who previously played with Dewsbury, Oldham Bears and Hull Sharks. Creative player who is happy at either stand off or loose-forward.

CRAIG BARKER

Local half -back or hooker who was not always a first choice in 1998 but never lets the side down when selected.

LEO CASEY

Now at the veteran stage, Leo has returned to Oldham in the close season. Has represented Ireland at International level. This tough prop forward was delighted to be named as Captain for this season's campaign.

JASON CLEGG

Formerly a Bradford Bull this prop has opened this season in barn-storming form. Scored a typical rampaging try in the Law Cup against Rochdale. "Cleggy" is becoming a favourite with the Oldham spectators.

PAUL ROUND

Now in his second spell with Oldham, Paul is a real veteran of the game. Formerly a back rower he now tends to lead from the front row. Former clubs include St Helens and Castleford.

Good afternoon and a very warm welcome to our visitors Oldham.

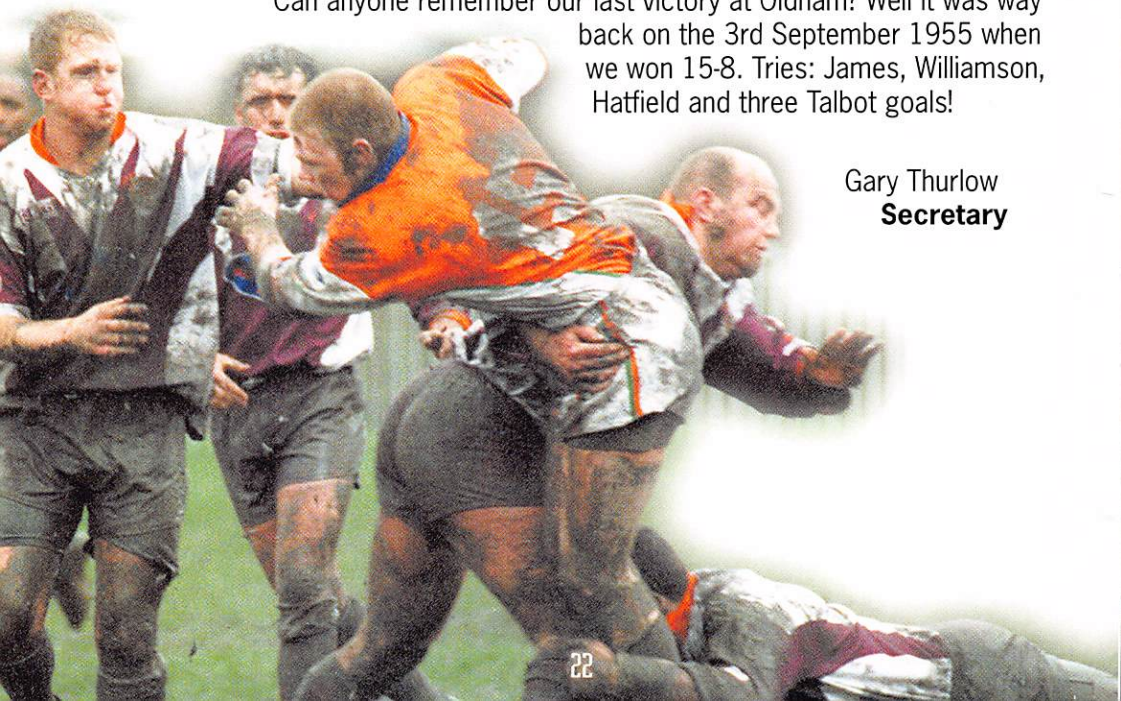
