



#### PLAYER PROFILE

#### NICKY RENDER by Steve Hunter

Nicky was born in 1972 in Castleford and attended Temple Street Junior School and Castleford High School. At the age of 9 Nicky was playing Under-11's rugby for Half Acres as they did not have a younger age group. He went on the represent Yorkshire & Humberside at Under-16's level and won the Yorkshire Schools Cup with Castleford High School and played in the All England Schools Final when Castleford lost to St. John Patricks of Wigan 14-8.

At the age of 17 Nicky turned professional with the York club where he stayed for two seasons before joining Leeds in 1991, he also stayed with Leeds for two seasons before joining Halifax in 1993. Nicky suffered a badly dislocated shoulder which disrupted his professional career and for a couple of seasons he played as an amateur for Bradley Arms Pirates before returning to the professional game by joining Bramley in 1997.

Nicky quotes the biggest influence on his career as his family, Gary Stephens and Bobbsie Price.

Nicky is a utility player who won't let the side down wherever he plays but when asked, said that he did not enjoy playing on the wing.

His most memorable time in the game was when he toured Russia with York and the worst time was his shoulder injury whilst with Halifax.

Nick's message to supporters is "if you see me in the bar, pint of lager please", but more seriously he says "stick with us and we will get there (quote borrowed from Mr Bill Clift esq.)".

Today we welcome to Headingley the Oldham Roughyeds, a club who much like ourselves have a long history in the game but have been going through a transitional period just lately. Oldham are now based at Spotland in Rochdale for a couple of seasons whilst their proposed new stadium is finalised but they have managed to keep a good supporter base and will no doubt have brought plenty of fans to today's game.

# Oldham Roughyeds

Oldham's recent history must have been hard for the club and supporters, as members of Superleague under the guise of Oldham Bears they tried so hard to keep their heads above water but with limited finances and a crumbling stadium they succumbed and the club folded only to be reborn the following season in the Second Division and playing at Boundary Park, without the benefit of any money from the Rugby League they did a magnificent job and this season have consolidated and strengthened the side. I wish them all the luck in the world in their efforts to put the fine name of Oldham firmly on the rugby league map.

Coached this season by Mick Coates, Oldham started the season well with a great win over Dewsbury Rams in the Silk Cut Challenge Cup and at the time these notes were written were just one point better off than Bramley, their best result in the league so far must be the point they took from Hull Kingston Rovers, a very tough nut to crack on their own ground. Oldham have a good mixture of experienced players and youth in their squad, the more well know players are Mark Perrett, Alf Leuila, Leo Casey, John Hough and Jason Clegg, they also have two Frenchmen in the squad in full back, Laurent Minot and forward Emmanuel Paralta. The club have been very unlucky with the injury to their big signing from Wakefield Trinity, John Bostock, who will be missing for the rest of the season. Also in Oldham's squad is Brian Quinlan who had a spell here at Bramley a couple of seasons ago, so it will be good to have him back.
