

AFI LEUILA

Only member of the Bears Super League squad to join the 'new' Oldham team. Of Tongan origin Afi is a strong running three-quarter who likes nothing better than to attack the opposition.

MICK FARRELL

21 year-old utility back was outstanding for Rochdale in 1997 but had a disappointing 1998. The ex-Waterhead amateur has just broken into the first team and is playing centre for his hometown club.

JOE McNICHOLAS

This young winger is one of the most exciting prospects in the new first division. Having turned down an offer from Bradford Bulls loe was unfortunate to miss most of 1998 after breaking his leg in the early season. Rochdale born, he is armed with pace and a great side-step.

PAUL CROOK

Half back who previously played with Dewsbury, Oldham Bears and Hull Sharks. Creative player who is happy at either stand-off or loose forward.

LEO CASEY

Now at the veteran stage. Leo has returned to Oldham in the close season. Has represented Ireland at international level. This tough prop forward was delighted to be named as Captain for this seasons campaign. His performances in '99 have been outstanding and he has certainly led by example.

French Fullback signed from Villeneuve. Courageous tackler and good under the high ball. Known as 'Mins' to his team-mates.

EMMANUFI PERALTA

Came to Oldham with his team-mate Laurent. "Maun' is no stranger to England having previously played for Keighley.

A warm welcome to our supporters and all the Oldham officials, players and supporters who have made the short journey for today's Northern Ford Premiership game.

Hopefully, from a Hornets point of view the game will be as satisfying as the AJ Law Cup game on New Years Day. That match seems an age away now but all Hornets supporters will allow the memory to linger for a little while longer. Because the game went ahead as a tribute to the memory of Karl Marriott and Roy Powell it was a very emotional day for everyone concerned and I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the fans from both sides who observed the minute's silence before the kick-off so immaculately. We did not expect it to be any other way, but thank you once again.

Since that game our fortunes on the field have been erratic, to say the least. Excellent performances one week followed by poor the next. Consistency is something we must strive hard to achieve if we are going to be anything like successful in what is a very tight, competitive competition. Deryck Fox is as frustrated about the situation as the most ardent fan and we will continue to support him in whatever way we can.

By all accounts, like ourselves, Oldham have struggled a bit this year. It was always going to be a difficult for them. A new ground away from the Town, less funding than many of the other clubs in the League and the ongoing team building necessary following the demise of the Oldham Bears, probably always meant this was going to be a year of consolidation for our good friend Chris Hamilton and his colleagues. Like ourselves, injuries to key players have hit hard. In particular the loss of Josh Bostock was a major blow.

There have been a few bright spots though, including an ex-Hornet, Leo Casey inspired win over Dewsbury in the Silk Cut Challenge Cup. Oldham also held table toppers Hull KR to a very creditable draw earlier in the season. Hopefully today will not be seen as another bright spot when they look back over their season.

Apart from the weather and the state of the pitch resulting in the postponements both of us have suffered, the ground sharing arrangements with Oldham have gone as smoothly as could reasonably be expected. It's a little difficult to come to terms with having your nearest rivals in your own backyard, so to speak, but we have got on with it. We are all in this game together and local rivalries always add spice to the fixture list.

From a financial point of view we can hopefully look forward to one of our best gates of the season but we will be very happy if we can pay out a large chunk of the takings on win bonuses.

Today's game is the last one Brad Hepi is scheduled to play under the terms of the short term contract he signed when he joined us a little over a month ago. Brad is a class player who most observers would agree has added a missing edge to our play with his all action style. He has also scored several important tries in the past month and seems to have become an instant hit with the fans.

We are keen to sign him for the remainder of the season and negotiations have been going on for a couple of weeks to try to clinch the deal. Brad has made it known that he would ideally like to join a super League club and Castleford have been reported to be interested in signing him. By the time you read this things should have been sorted out, hopefully in Hornets favour, if however, Brad does decide to go elsewhere we wish him well.

Step back in time with some of the stories covered over the past 50 years

1952...APR 26 - 'WHITEHAVEN'S NEW MAN'

'WHITEHAVEN have agreed by cable on terms with Neville Emery, an Australian Rugby Union international centre, and a contract has been despatched by air mail. Emery has promised to sail by the first available boat.

1960...MAR 25 "ON THE LIST"

'HULL KR have placed forward Doug Holland (£1.500) and Ron Rowbottom (£500) on the transfer list. They have also permitted Albert Thompson, Alan Holdstock and Peter Banks to play in junior football as they can't gain a regular place in Rovers' team."

1962...APR 23 - 'OLDHAM WON...BUT SAINTS WENT VERY CLOSE

OLDHAM 10-7 ST HELENS: The long awaited clash between Oldham and St Helens at Watersheddings attracted a crowd of about 11,000 which is a reflection of how both clubs have fallen from the top of the table this season. With nothing at stake except prestige, there was not the same incentive for followers to make the trip to Oldham. so the attendance was quite satisfactory under the circumstances."

1964...APR 20 - 'TERRIFIC TAYLOR'

'AFTER John Taylor had touched down for his third try against Barrow I turned to a Hull KR official and asked, "Is it £20,000 you are asking for Taylor?" Back came the reply, "No, and he's coming off the

1967...MAR 24 - 'SUPPORT IS STILL THERE'

'LEEDS UNITED may have taken over from Leeds RL team as the biggest crowd-puller in the city. But there is still plenty of support for the latter game in Leeds, of which it was always said until recent years that it was a Rugby League minded city. Proof of this came on Saturday when 58,397 people watched football in Leeds - 34,366 the Leeds United match with Manchester City; 20,031 the Leeds - Swinton RL cup-tie and 4,000 Hunslet's game with Bradford Northern."

1971...APR 24 - '£2,500 PRICE TAG'

'A £2,500 price tag has been placed by Wakefield on emigrant player, Ken Batty. It follows his arrival in Sydney and immediate interest by two clubs in acquiring his services. St George and Canterbury Bankstown are the clubs - both having been in touch with Trinity about the 26-year old winger who proved a star man in the 1967-68 season.'

1973...MAR 21 - 'SIGNINGS - VINCE IS HAPPY'

'THE worried frown is beginning to leave Vince Karalius' brow. Widnes, usually not big spenders. have lashed out £10,000 on signing Doug Laughton and Tommy Warbuton, and Vince is certain it is money well spent...'



He's keen to stay in the squad now he's got there and it is obviously a step towards achieving his ambition of playing professional Rugby League, ideally for his beloved Hornets.



There is one great mystery surrounding postponed games. Who does get to eat all the Pies?



News From Around The World Of Rugby League

WORLD CUP

More details have been released about the Lincoln Financial Group World Cup whose draw is duet to take place at the Savoy Hotel on Tuesday 25th May.

The tournament involving 16 teams split into four pools of four will kick off on Saturday 28th October next year. The World Cup Final itself will be played on 25th November although the venues for the opening game and final have yet to be decided. Old Trafford is the most likely venue for the final but possible redevelopment work may make that impracticable.

It is hoped that the games from the quarter final onwards will be sold out. They are all likely to be based in the "northern heartland". Some of the poor games will be spread around the country with Scotland and Ireland sharing a group and another group's games being played in Wales.

Neil Tunnacliffe has confirmed "we are running the World Cup this way to raise awareness of the game to unprecedented levels which should then boost participation. We want to generate big revenues to re-invest into the game which will give Rugby League a big boost well into the 21st century."

"Our primary building blocks of sponsorship, broadcasting rights and grant aide should net around £4.75 million, not taking into account gate receipts."

The RLF is hoping to announce a World Cup Co-ordinator this week. Hot tip is that the job is going to go to self confessed "Rugby League nut" Jason Harborrow, the Head of the Leisure Division of JJB Sports, who has been overseeing the development of the new JJB Stadium at Robin Park, Wigan



WHEN MO GOES

On the subject of appointments, Super League Europe are to advertise for a successor to Managing Director Maurice Lindsay, who is due to retire this year. Perhaps more worrying (or reassuring dependent upon your viewpoint) is SLE Chairman, Chris Caisley's contemplation of a year of no change. He thinks the fans are fed up with change whether it be promotion, relegation, fixture changes (tell me about it - Ed/) the salary cap, overseas quotas, and the number of teams in the Super League. "We should maintain what we've got and look to raise standards across the board" he said.

It sounds a little bit like the drawbridges are about to be lifted to me.

REFEREE ACCLAIMED

Most fans probably feel their team rarely gets a fair deal from referees. Long suffering Hornets fans probably feel they have as much to feel aggrieved about as most. (Although I have it on very good Authority from someone who is as committed to the Hornets cause as anyone and has seen the Hull KR game on video that the Referee and Touch judge may have got the disallowing of the Jon Aston "try" right).

Nice then that the media down under was unanimous in it's praise for English referee Stuart Cummings who took charge of the recent Australia v New Zealand Test. He was full of praise for the technology that allowed him to communicate effectively with the other officials and kept things running much more smoothly. Something for the RFL to think about, perhaps, particularly if a sponsor can be found to meet the cost.




