



CLUBS in the Northern Ford Premiership, which met this afternoon for what was expected to be a lively and provocative debate on key issues affecting next season, are bracing themselves for tough times ahead.

Many changes are already taking place in the boardrooms of several clubs – and finance, or a lack of it, is the key issue.

The casualties include some of the biggest names in the game, notably two Hull KR directors in Colin Hutton and Phil Lowe.

In total, five directors of the Craven Park club have been ousted by the administrators, but it will be the loss of Hutton and Lowe, two men who have devoted years of service and hard work to the Robins, which will be felt most by those of us who have been in and around Rugby League for the past 30 to 40 years.

I don't know Phil Lowe as well as I know Colin Hutton, a sincere and true gentleman of Rugby League who, quite by chance, helped to shape the destiny of professional rugby league in Oldham in the late 1950s and early 1960s.

As Hull's full-back in the 1957 championship final at Odsal he missed an all-important penalty which gave Oldham a narrow one-point win – and the championship trophy.

Seven years later he was coach of Hull KR when the red, red Robins went bob, bob bobbing along to Wembley courtesy of that controversial cup semifinal replay at Station Road when the tie was abandoned for bad light with Oldham ahead in the first period of extra time.

Colin and I recalled that crucial turning point in Oldham's history only a few weeks ago when the Rovers were here at Spotland.

Little did we know then that this elder statesman with a lifetime's experience and know-how would soon be lost to the game.

To many of us Colin Hutton WAS Hull KR in much the same way that we probably find it hard to imagine a trip to Widnes without bumping into Frank Myler or big Jim Mills.

They were still there, as large as life, when the Roughyeds took something of a hammering at the Autoquest Stadium last Sunday – two great servants of club and game who have seen the good times and the bad times and who, somehow, continue to represent the very foundations of the club to which they have devoted much of their lives.

To the new, younger breed of club administrators, whose business, academic and professional skills are essential at a period of the game's evolution when the balance sheet is perhaps more important than the tackle bag, the old-timers are worth their weight in gold as sounding boards on rugby matters.

Anyway, that brings me back to where I came in - balance sheets.

York Wasps may be the subject of a takeover bid by a former chairman of Halifax, Ron Dobson, and Keighley Cougars are looking for a new chairman after the resignation of Howard Carter.

It's all to do with money. Well, not quite all. Listen to what Dobson has to say about his proposed bid for York.

"I would run a tight financial ship and I would have my accountants look through everything first. I would want to be hands-on and I would want Maurice Bamford involved, not as a coach, but as a football-type manager. His experience and knowledge would be invaluable."

Maurice Bamford . . . another Colin Hutton, another Frank Myler, another Jim Mills. Food for thought, yes?



The Frank Pitchford

BARELY stone, just five foot four the fifteen year old was a trainee miner at Leigh's Bickershaw colliery. exactly every mothers dream but this was Frank Pitchfords lot! In 1950 that was life. It was in industrial and pit towns like Leigh. Oldham Wigan.

Whilst he had captained the

school rugby side the skinny scrum half had taken many a buffeting and understandably when leaving school turned his attention to soccer. For a season and half he played inside right for the local technical college, talented enough to attract the attention of pro side scouts.

A footballing brain combined with a turn of speed you had to see to believe, a jink and sidestep that was the envy of every other half back, Pitchfords love of rugby soon had the better of him. Having put on a few pounds he was back in his favourite scrum half spot with amateur outfit St Joseph's of Leigh.

Within the next 6 months offers to turn pro came in from both Swinton and Salford. Selected for Leigh towns amateur side to play Leigh 'A' Frank's potential was spotted by Oldham scout Jack O'Neil pipping both the Manchester sides for Frank's signature.

Pitchford arrived at Watersheddings at the beginning of the 1952-53 season and by Christmas was making his debut in the senior side at Liverpool forming a half back pairing with the mercurial Frank Stirrup. The team that day was:-Ratchford, Platt, Mitchell, Davies, Emmitt, Stirrup Pitchford, Anthony, Keith, Day, Winslade, Tomlinson, Goldswain.

The two half back spots were contested for by Pitchford, Stirrup and Frank Daley and it was season 1954-5 before Frank could claim the scrum half spot to be his own. The famous 1950's side

was now taking shape and in turn the speedy scrum half was drawing attention from journalists and League hierarchy alike. That season Oldham won the Lancashire League (the club's first trophy for over 20 years) were runners up to Barrow in the Lancashire Cup and reached the League Championship Final at Maine Road narrowly losing 7-3 to Warrington. Pitchford scorer of Oldhams only try that day was proclaimed by Warrington's international scrum half Gerry Helme to be "the most promising, fastest and intelligent scrum half in the world".

The team for the 1954/5 Championship final was:- Stirrup, Barrow, Cracknell, Davies, O'Grady, Daley, Pitchford, Ogden, Keith, Jackson, Winslade, Little, Goldswain.

When Helme made those comments he could not have foreseen that the game he had played against France the previous Autumn was to be his last at international level being replaced against the 1955 touring Kiwis by Jeff Stevenson. The Leeds scrum half held the position until the 1958 tour of Australia.

Stevenson was selected for the 1958 tour but withdrew, Pitchford added in his place. The touring squad now included just two scrum halves both yet to make their international debut, Alex Murphy and Frank Pitchford. Murphy as expected got the nod for the first Test on Sydney Cricket Ground with the Lions (including Oldham's Alan Davies) firm

favourites but took a 25-8 mauling. Nineteen year old Murphy also took a hammering from Aussie

scrum half Holman.

There had been early disagreements on the tour between players and officials that came to a head after the first Test defeat. The second Test was at Brisbane and not just Oldham fans but the League fraternity now expected Pitchford to get his chance. The selectors probably influenced by fellow St. Helens players Alan Prescott (tour captain), Vince Karalius and Abe Terry included Murphy and to the further dismay of Oldham supporters excluded Alan Davies. The Lions won 25-19, Murphy had a blinder and was a cert for the third and deciding Test back at Sydney Cricket Ground.

Indeed Murphy kept his place but the softener was that Davies was recalled. Murphy again had a stunning match with Alan Davies scoring the try that turned the game. Australia 17, Britain 40. Alex Murphy had secured first shot at the scrum half berth for years to come.

Murphy being injured, Pitchford made his international debut on the second leg of the tour being selected for the First Test at Auckland against New Zealand. Britain lost 15-10, Murphy returning for the second and final Test with the British winning to square the series! Fate had played its hand and Murphy as far as international recognition was concerned, was now in the driving seat.

Franks only other full international came in 1962 losing to France 23-13 in Perpignan!

Prior to the 1958 tour the Oldham side had won three consecutive Lancashire Cup finals with Frank Pitchford playing a key roll in all three. They beat St. Helens at Wigan in 1956, Wigan at Swinton in 1957 and St. Helens in 1958 this time at Swinton.

Undoubtably Pitchfords most memorable moment (coupled with being a moment of sheer relief) was hearing the final whistle of the famous 15-14 Championship Final defeat of Hull before almost 70,000 spectators at Odsal in 1957.

The side had just won the Championship for the first time in almost 50 years. For seventy seven minutes Pitchford had played a blinder providing winger John Etty with pinpoint passes for both his tries. However, with just three minutes remaining and Oldham winning by just 4 points Frank put out a long pass interceptered by Hull's winger Cowan who scored just wide of the posts. Hull's Colin Hutton missed the conversion and Oldham scraped home 15-14. Pitchford had turned away unable to watch the conversion attempt until that is he heard the booming voice of loose forward Derek Turner "you only needed to die with the ball you bloody idiot - you WILL watch the bloody kick! and if I get losing pay YOU will bloody well make it up!"

The team that day: Ganley, Cracknell, Davies, Ayres, Etty, Daley, Pitchford, Jackson, Keith, Vines, Little, Winslade, Turner.

The Frank Pitchford Story (cont...)

There had been many salad days at Watersheddings between 1954 and 1959 so the events of October 1959 must have been all the more earth shattering. They certainly shook the club and for that matter, the world of Rugby League, to its foundations.

It started with the news that club official Jack Lewthwaite had resigned because of certain payments and promises made to players. Close behind came the resignation of high profile Oldham club and Rugby League Chairman Frank Ridgeway. After that the drama burst onto the national scene when ten Oldham officials were expelled from the

sport by the Rugby League!

They stood accused of making illegal payments to players but more was to come. One player (Frank Pitchford) was suspended until 'loans from the club' were repaid and others were given strict deadlines to pay back monies loaned to them. The issue went to court and the Oldham officials cleared of breaking the laws of the game, subsequently reinstated but the loans ceased!

Some, more knowledgeable of the times and circumstances than I, pinpoint this event as the beginning of the clubs decline. It seems more than coincidental that when the loans 'dried up' some players chose to leave. It hit Pitchford quite differently, most scrum halves are extrovert in character and would have brushed off any criticism and suspicion. Pitchford could not, just the opposite, a quiet and unassuming man, it hurt but he stayed with the club.

By some, the Oldham side of the mid/late 50's was deemed at the time to be the best in the world. I don't know. The fact that the club never graced the Wembley turf to me says something. Perhaps it lacked just a little bit of steel. I do think if we had managed to win the Challenge Cup it

would have been hard to argue. What I do know is that because we didn't and because the team only dominated the English league scene for a comparatively short period of time the side, whilst the most entertaining I have ever seen, can not be compared with the true greats Huddersfield around the time of the first world war. Wigan of the 1990'S.....

On the other hand whilst Frank Pitchford may have been eclipsed on the international front and. I, having had the advantage of talking over the years to many of his comtempories, including Alex Murphy, am convinced that he just had the edge over Murphy at club level. A good scrum half has got to play behind a good pack and both Murphy and Pitchford did. Frank though always seemed to

have 'the indian sign' over Murphy. much as did for instance. Oldham wingman John Etty over St. Helen's Tom Vollenhoven.

Frank Pitchford didn't leave the club until 1962 having had at least one more serious shot at the Challenge Cup (captaining the side against Hull in the 1960 semi defeat). He followed his great pal Alan Davies to Wigan both playing at the Twin Towers in Wigans defeat by Helens. Frank and retired.

Frank Pitchford played 305 games for Oldham scoring 105 tries! He died from a heart attack in 1989. His wife, Mary, still lives in the Leigh area and dotes on their six grandchildren (all football supporters!).



Down Memory Lane





THE ROUGHYEDS' aim to complete a rare league double this evening when bottom club Doncaster visit Spotland. Unfortunately for the Dons, being bottom of the table is not an unfamiliar position. Since being formed in 1951, Doncaster have ended a season at the bottom of the table 13 times, including five

consecutive seasons between 1956 and 1961. In fairness to Doncaster, during their 48 year existence, Super League giants Bradford Northern and Halifax have also ended a season in bottom spot. Oldham have never finished bottom, although in 1970 only scoring difference kept them above bottom club Blackpool Borough after both finished with 12 points.

Doncaster's history, however, has not been all doom and gloom. Indeed, during 1994 they enjoyed a short spell at the very top of the Championship table. The Dons had gained promotion to the top division with a last gasp win at Batley in April 1994 and four months later they opened their First Division campaign with an equally sensational victory. A 29-20 win over St. Helens at Knowsley Road. The following Friday, Doncaster entertained Widnes in the Sky TV match. The line-up for that game was as follows:

Workmen and inmates from the nearby Lindholme Prison had been working frantically all week on the stands and terracing at the Tattersfield ground in order to get the stadium passed by ground safety officials in time for kick-off. They just succeeded, for their efforts were only approved an hour before kick-off when queues had begun to form outside the ground. The attendance for that Widnes match was 3,221, modest by some standards but exceptional at Doncaster around that time.

The locals in the crowd were treated to another rarity as the Dons completely outplayed opponents who had been amongst the game's pacesetters during the previous decade. An early try from Dave Evans set Doncaster on course for a memorable victory. They led 13-2 at half-time and went on to win 21-6 with further tries from Jamie Bloem (2) and Alex Green who also landed two conversions and a dropped goal. Widnes could only reply with a Tyrer penalty and a try from Darren Wright.

That victory took Doncaster to the top of the table, a tremendous achievement even though the Dons only held that lofty position for 48 hours. Victories by Castleford, Wigan, Leeds and Bradford Northern later that weekend relegated Doncaster to fifth position and gave the top of the table a more familiar look. Seven days later Tattersfield housed its biggest ever crowd when 6,440 crammed in for the visit of Leeds. Doncaster lost that match and, in fact, won only three more matches throughout the rest of the season.

The Dons finished bottom of Division One and were duly relegated. Since then things have gone from bad to worse with Doncaster's very existence in doubt on a couple of occasions. But, like Oldham, they have pulled through and long may they continue to fly the rugby league flag in South Yorkshire.



First Time-Last Time

TODAY we welcome to Spotland the players, officials and supporters of the Doncaster club.

The 'Dons' were admitted to the Rugby League for the 1951/52 season. However, it would be twelve years before they played their first game against Oldham. That second division match was played at Watersheddings on October 12th 1963. The Roughyeds, who would go on to finish the season as champions, were in a rich vein of good form and emerged from the game with an impressive victory by forty five points to thirteen. Skipper, Frank Dyson kicked nine goals to supplement the nine tries from Mike Elliott (2), Peter Smethurst (2), Brian Lord, Trevor Simms, Jack Pycroft, Len McIntyre and Geoff Robinson.

The attendance was 5,621

Oldham Team: F Dyson; M Elliott, B Lord, P Smethurst, T Simms; V Nestor, J Pycroft; C Bott, L McIntyre, K Wilson, G Robinson, H Major, D Parker.

The return match three weeks later at Tattersfield was a much more keenly contested encounter with Doncaster giving table topping Oldham a fright before going down by twelve points to six.

Prior to this season the last match between the two sides was a first division match at Tattersfield on February 15th 1995. Oldham approached this game with much caution due to the fact that exactly one year earlier they had suffered a humiliating 20 - 0 defeat in the Challenge Cup on the same ground.

The match proved to be another tough fixture but the Roughyeds eventually prevailed 22 - 14, thanks mainly to the superb goal kicking of New Zealander Wilson Marsh whose seven goals paved the way for the Oldham success. The try scorers were Mike Kuiti and Wally Gibson.



On This Day





TWO YEARS ago, on Wednesday 30th July, clubs outside the Super League were engaged in the Divisional Premiership.

Several players with Oldham connections were involved in those matches. Andy Proctor, ex Saddleworth Rangers and later to become a Roughyed before moving on to Bramley, was in the Wakefield Trinity pack which laid the foundations for a 31-22 victory over Featherstone Rovers. At loose-forward for Trinity was Sonny Whakarau, a member of the Doncaster team during their First Division days, whilst former St. Annes prop Steve Molloy appeared for Rovers in that match. Back-row forward Mike Kuiti, once of Oldham, was in the second-row for Batley who lost 18-14 at home to Dewsbury whilst the former Oldham utility back Jamie Bloem landed six goals for Widnes as they defeated Rochdale Hornets 50-10. At scrum-half for Hornets that evening was Richard Pachniuk. the ex-Oldham hooker who caused so many problems for the Roughyeds in the last home match when he was playing for Hunslet. One of the Rochdale substitutes against Widnes was Brian Quinlan, now on Oldham's books although currently staying away from the club. That match, incidentally, was switched from Widnes to Runcorn because of reconstruction work at Naughton Park and the attendance was a disappointing 893.

Four years previously, on Friday 30th July 1993, the Great Britain under 18s met Australia in the final match of their tour 'down under'. The Aussies won 15-8 with the British points coming from a couple of Cumbrians, both of whom have since turned professional. Centre David Seeds, Kells but now at Whitehaven, grabbed the British try,

with Jonathan Roper, Hensingham but now at Warrington, adding a couple of goals. The pick of the British team, however, was hooker Jon Clarke, then of East Leeds but later of Oldham before moving on to Hunslet and then his current club, Batley.

It was on this day in 1910, Saturday 30th July, that Great Britain registered a remarkable victory over New Zealand in the only meeting between these countries during that first ever British Lions tour of Australasia. The match was staged at the Domain Cricket Ground, Auckland and the Kiwis led 15-10 at half time. After the break, however, Great Britain staged an amazing recovery and went on to win 52-20 with the speedy Oldham back-row forward Bert 'Slosher' Avery crossing for three of the twelve British tries.

Four years later the Lions were back in New Zealand where they won all six matches. On Thursday 30th July 1914 they beat Wanganui 57-12 with Oldham full-back Alf Woods landing nine goals.

The British Lions registered another high scoring victory over Kiwi opposition in 1958. That day, Wednesday 30th July, they beat Wellington 62-20 and, in so doing, crossed for 16 tries. Three of those touchdowns were credited to winger Ike Southward who also landed seven goals for a total of 23 points.

Wellington were also involved in a notable match exactly 21 years later, on Sunday 30th July 1989. That day Wellington entertained Canterbury in a Provincial Championship match. Canterbury led 16-4 at half-time but Wellington fought back during an extraordinary second half to win 22-18. Leading the recovery were Mike Kuiti (ex-Oldham), who scored a try, and Sonny Whakarau (ex-Doncaster), two players who greatly impressed during successful campaigns playing here in Britain.

On the field the highlight was the return to Oldham colours of big prop Danny Guest whose performance was good enough to catapult him into the senior side at Widnes. Early on Oldham were overwhelmed by the Centurions, but hit back in the last ten minutes to give the scoreline some respectability. Tries by Duckett, Guest, Fitzpatrick and Farrell. Goals by Farrell and Davies.


