

SLOWLY but surely the decision-makers for the future of the game outside Super League appear to be heading back towards winter rugby.

First we had the idea of APC chairman Bob McDermott to start next season on Boxing Day with three chief objectives – to allow clubs to play traditional Christmas and New Year fixtures, to test the popularity of winter rugby in January and February without going all the way and to create a season in which Northern Ford Premiership clubs had at least two months without Super League competition.

While clubs were getting their heads around that little lot, it emerged that RFL chief Neil Tunnicliffe was preparing a strategy document with proposals on several issues designed to safeguard the future of Premiership clubs over the next few years.

This official 16-page document appears to have replaced McDermott's suggestions . . . and, lo and behold, it calls for next season to start on December 1.

My view – and I have expressed it before in this programme – is that if we are going to tinker about once more with the timing of our season we MUST take advantage of the three best months for rugby in the UK calendar, namely September. October and November.

I can sympathise with those who will inevitably argue that it is inviting trouble to start a new season on December 1, just as the worst of the winter is about to hit us.

I wonder, however, if this is a clever move which could be the forerunner of a gradual return to a full winter season over the course of the next few years.

Given anything like a hint of encouragement by attendances in December, I'm sure the winter-rugby lobby would push to start on November 1 in 2000, October 1 in 2001 and September 1 in 2002, by which time we would be back where we said farewell to the traditional winter season in 1995.

Oldham chairman Christopher Hamilton, incidentally, also had a major input on Tunnicliffe's strategy document, which was due to be discussed by APC clubs in Dewsbury today.

Tunnicliffe also wants to abolish the top-five play-off system in the Premiership and replace it with a conventional and truly English-style top-eight play-off to be decided by a straight knock-out format.

That makes sense, too, because as we know only too well from the experience of the Roughyeds, this season for far too many teams in the Premiership was effectively over little more than half way through the programme.

Tunnicliffe was also proposing a fixture formula which would require all clubs to play each other home and away, giving a 34-match league programme.

For the first eight weeks of the season the clubs would be split into two geographical groups of nine, based on a split between Yorkshire as one group and Lancashire and Cumbria as the other.

The clubs will play other clubs in their region and the top club from either side of the Pennines would play a Trans Pennine Cup final some time in late January.

Also proposed is a NFP knock-out tournament and plans to limit clubs to part-time professionals apart from one overseas player, whom clubs would be allowed to put on a full-time contract.

Apart from that, NFP players would be limited to a maximum winning bonus of £175 a match, falling to £100 in the 2001 season as the clubs income from News Corporation begins to run out.

It all makes sense . . . but I'll bet it was some meeting in Dewsbury today!



# Rough Roughyeds Roughyeds

"SUPER League in crisis...Crisis Management...Our game is dying on its feet...No direction...No leadership...No plan." These were the themes of the callers to G.M.R. as I drove back from Oldham's defeat at Leigh. O.K., so R.L. followers are well known for knocking their own sport, but given that there was yet another 'big meeting' last Tuesday (the outcome of which was not known before going to press), at which the goalposts might be moved yet again, can we really be surprised?

High on the agenda at the meeting will have been the question of mergers and the financial incentives for same. So let us look at what merger really means. Huddersfield - Halifax? The former has the stadium and the latter has the team, so any merger in effect means Halifax playing at the McAlpine. It might be as well to think of Swinton at Bury and Oldham at Rochdale before rushing into that one! Sorry, but I don't see Halifax fans travelling to Huddersfield. All a merger achieves is to kill the professional game in one of its strongholds.

So, how about Wakefield - Sheffield? Now where do these two play? Neither has an entirely satisfactory stadium. If you go to Don Valley another stronghold loses its representation and the biggest centre of the Wakefield Metropolitan Borough has no team, while two of its smaller centres, Castleford and Featherstone, survive. If you play in Wakefield the consequence will be to abandon development in Sheffield after twenty years of endeavour. Where's the sense in that?


Salford and Swinton? This one could be a runner. Swinton are already off their territory, but it could mean a move into Manchester. A Malcolm White led super club could make sense here if people are prepared to grasp the nettle.

To the outsider two other mergers make eminent sense. Hull Sharks and Hull K.R. is obvious, but a century of cross-town rivalry is a big hurdle to jump. Meanwhile Whitehaven - Workington has already begun with the formation of the West Cumbrian alliance side. Further development to create a Cumbrian Super League club makes sense to everyone except, apparently, the leaders of S.L.E.

Mergers, however, should ALWAYS be enacted between consenting and equal partners.

Does anyone seriously think that Barrow Border Raiders is anything other than Barrow signing a few Carlisle players and the game being closed down in Cumbria's biggest city? So far it's our only example of a 'merger' and the warning signs are clear enough.

Just because mergers are the order of the day in Australia does not mean they are the future here. Without having an intimate knowledge of Sydney's geography it is clear that there is a world of difference between clubs from suburbs of the same city merging and those from proud, independent towns coming together. And if mergers are such a great idea why is it that a St. Helens - Wigan combination is never mentioned? After all they are as close geographically as Huddersfield and Halifax or Warrington and Widnes. But then, we all know whose interests are not served by such a merger, don't we?



AN unequal and unfair share of News Corporation cash, poor training facilities, a small squad hit by injuries culminating in poor results all keyed to the side playing outside the Borough, have resulted in this season's disappointing attendances. Who would have believed at the beginning of this campaign that from a full Northern Ford Premiership weekend's fixtures Oldham's 'home' game, albeit against Doncaster, would provide the lowest attendance of the weekend (676)?



Sign of the times? A new phenomenon? Not if recent history is anything to go by. We need to go back no further than 1978 to find the last time the club struggled in the lower reaches. A squad that included players of the calibre of Mike Elliott, Phil Larder, Martin Murphy, John Patterson, John Blair, Geoff Munro, Bob Blackwood, Brian Hughes, Colin Hawkyard and Roger O'Mahoney could finish only ninth from fourteen.

The average home attendance that season was 1368 and is almost identical to attendance levels so far this season, 1332. So, playing winter football at Watersheddings with a side that would probably blow the gasket out of the current Ford Premiership failed also to attract the audiences. The following season the side was promoted and attendances doubled. Oldham supporters are no different than any others; they will support success in far greater numbers than they support

mediocrity.

So, just what is the size of the support in and around the town? Well since the formation of the Roughyeds there have been the 3,000 crowds who turned out for last season's Heworth and Bramley matches and the 3,000 who turned up for this season's Charter Day Rochdale game, all of course at Boundary Park. Oldhamers too made up the mass of the 3,000 attendance at last season's Law Cup Spotland, I think therefore that its fair to say that if the team is producing the goods in the Premiership they could

expect support along those lines.

Does winter or summer rugby make a significant difference? Probably not. True, the 3,000 attendances at the Heworth and Bramley games were at the 'winter end' of a summer season, but after the heavy defeat by Bramley 1,000 of those spectators didn't turn out for the next home game or for that matter the rest of the season. The club still averaged 2,000 over a mediocre season.




I think that 3,000 Oldham supporters is a fair estimate of the maximum levels we could expect turning up week in, week out to support a successful second layer team and they would probably turn out regardless of a winter or summer season. However, the vast majority almost certainly would prefer to attend the game in Oldham.

The Club's most successful campaign was in 1985 when it finished fifth in the first division with an average gate of 4.100. The most successful season for support was 1988 (5693) and we were relegated! The truth of the matter is, after allowing for the increase in the number of visiting away team supporters, the advantage of playing in the higher flight is that the club would attract the majority of the 3,000 core home support by the increased standard of fixtures. But again we come back to that figure, 3,000.



Super League in summer at Boundary Park with all its razzamataz failed to increase gates over the previous three season's top flight winter rugby at Watersheddings. Then again it didn't fare any worse! So we are back to the 3,000 turning up to support a successful second division side, or are attracted by the higher standard of rugby in the first, winter or summer. But at home in Oldham!

And if we were a really, really, really successful top flight side? Forget it! God bless the 3,000 and bring them forth to multiply!



SUPPORTING Bramley must be something akin to voting for the Liberal Party. You may celebrate the odd result but you have no chance whatsoever of leading the Nation. In order to maintain some form of credibility the Liberals have established a series of uneasy alliances with other political parties and Bramley have adopted a

vaguely similar approach. They have thrown in their lot with rugby league neighbours Leeds, sharing their training and medical facilities and using their stadium on match days.

Last season they went even further by borrowing a few Leeds players who were signed on short-term loan contracts. At the time cynics said that only those players who needed a run-out as they recovered from injury or suspension turned out for the Villagers. During the 1998 campaign Bramley made 23 signings, fifteen of whom came from Leeds.

These signings enabled Bramley to climb steadily up the Second Division table. Towards the end of May the Villagers shared top spot with York, another club who had developed a loan agreement with a Super League club — in their case Castleford. These loan agreements added further spice to the top-of-the-table clash between Bramley and York who met at Headingley on the last Friday in May. Unfortunately, despite the importance of the game, the crowd at Headingley numbered only 771. The teams for this match were as follows:

The appearance of Leroy Rivett in Bramley colours caused a little controversy as Rugby League regulations prohibit clubs from signing more than three loan players at any one time and at that time Bramley's loan register was full. Rivett's transfer therefore, was made permanent although the move was 'subject to Leeds retaining the right to recall him at any time'. If that is not the definition of a loan transfer then I don't know what is

Anyway, Rivett played against York in what proved to be an entertaining match. The loan players from Leeds made a significant contribution in that match. Centre Marvin Golden put Wayne Freeman in for the first try of the match and Barrie McDermott was outstanding throughout, putting centre Dan Potter in for try number two as well as scoring himself late in the game. On the half-hour Leroy Rivett scored a sensational 80 yards solo try which put Bramley 16-2 in front and well on the way to victory. York did fight back; it was 18-8 at the interval, but they could not match the speed or power of Bramley who went on to win 36-14.

That victory took Bramley to the top of the table, but unfortunately they were unable to maintain their promotion challenge and by the end of the campaign had slipped down to fourth spot. It all became irrelevant when the First and Second Divisions amalgamated to form this season's Northern Ford Premiership.

This season Bramley have adopted a more conventional approach to recruitment. They currently lie in mid-table and, under the guidance of former Oldham skipper Mike Ford, will be fired up to make tonight's match another tough one for the Roughyeds.



### First Time-Last Time

TODAY, we welcome the players, officials and supporters of the Bramley club to Spotland for this our penultimate home game of the 1999 season. In the programme for last years match at Boundary Park we looked at our first ever encounter against the "Villagers", so in this issue we will look at the first meeting of the clubs after the second world war.

It so happened that Bramley and Oldham met in the very first game of the 1945-46 season. The match was played at Bramley's old Barley Mow ground on August 25th, 1945 and after a tight fought game Oldham emerged the winners by the narrowest of margins. Tries from Joe Turner and Cyril Sutcliffe with one goal from Dave Schofield were enough to secure victory by eight points to seven.



The return match took place the following month at Watersheddings when the Roughyeds completed the double with a 12-0 win.

Last season, as in the 1945-46 campaign, Oldham again played Bramley both home and away early in the season. The match at Headingley on April 24th was preceded by a torrential downpour that reduced the playing surface to a sodden mess. A late try by Darren Robinson gave Oldham a chance to share the points, but the conversion attempt by Richard Darkes, went wide and Bramley hung on for a 12-10 victory. The contrast for the return game

played at Boundary Park on "Bank Holiday" Monday (May 4th) was staggering. This time the game was played in sweltering conditions which made for a high scoring game with the advantage going to the pacy Bramley outfit who ran out convincing winners by 50-32. Again goal kicking let the Roughyeds down when only two of the seven tries from Paul Round, Craig Barker, Mick Martindale, Afi Leuila, John Hough, Mike Prescott and Richard Darkes. were converted (both by Darkes).





On This Day





A CLOSE match is in prospect this evening when Oldham entertain Bramley in a Northern Ford Premiership match, the outcome of which could so easily be decided by goal kicks.

That being the case, then both clubs would dearly love to field the kickers handed those duties thirty nine years ago on Saturday 13th August 1960. On that day Oldham met St. Helens at Watersheddings in a league match which the Roughyeds won 16-4. They scored two tries, from stand-off Alan Kellett and loose-forward Geoff Robinson, but it was full-back Bernard Ganley who scored the bulk of the points with five goals. That very same afternoon, Saturday 13th August 1960. Bramley were at home to Halifax and they lost 21-13. Hooker L. Kennedy scored a try for the Villagers with Maori full-back John Wilson also landing five goals. Wilson holds the goal kicking record for Bramley having landed 926 between 1953 and 1964. Ganley landed 1,365 for the Roughyeds between 1951 and 1961, more than any other Oldham player.

Wigan full-back Jim Sullivan landed a World record 2,867 goals during his career. He booted five of those goals on Saturday 13th August 1932 when Great Britain defeated New Zealand 25-14 at Monica Park, Christchurch.

Thirty years later Britain were back in New Zealand and included in their squad was another prolific marksman, Neil Fox of Wakefield Trinity. On Monday 13th August, Fox played centre and landed two goals for a depleted British side which closed their 1962 tour of Australasia with a 46-13 defeat against Auckland. The makeshift Lions line-up included stand-off Dave Bolton and looseforward Laurie Gilfedder on the wings, second-

rower Dick Huddart in the centre and hooker John Shaw in the second-row.

Four years ago, on Sunday 13th August 1995, the current British goal-kicker, Andy Farrell, landed eight goals for Wigan, and scored a try when the pie-eaters defeated Leeds 45-20 in the last Rugby League Charity Shield which was staged at the Royal Dublin Showground. Current Bramley player David Gibbons was one of the Leeds substitutes that day.

As a curtain raiser to that match, Ireland met Scotland and beat them 26-22. Former Oldham prop Hugh Waddell was a member of the Scottish pack whilst included in the Irish line-up were three players with Oldham connections. At stand-off was Des Foy (ex Saddleworth Rangers and Oldham), in the second-row was Tony Nuttall (ex Oldham) and at prop was the current Oldham skipper Leo Casey who scored one of the Irish tries.

Friday 13th August was a significant day in the career of former Oldham utility player and current Bramley hooker Richard Russell. That day Russell was transferred from Oldham to Castleford. He made 122 appearance for Castleford during the following six season, scoring 13 tries, before moving to Bramley during the close season.

Finally the prestigious Champions Challenge amateur pre-season tournament reaches its semifinal stage tomorrow. Five years ago, on Saturday 13th August 1994, the semi-final round produced two outstanding performances from Woolston Rovers and hosts Leigh Miners. Woolston defeated Thatto Heath 35-0 with stand-off Graham Smith scoring a try, five goals and a dropped goal. The second match of the afternoon was a fiery, action packed encounter in which Miners defeated the Leeds based Queens outfit 26-4. An equally entertaining day is expected tomorrow, so why not get along to Twist Lane, Leigh where the action starts at 1.30pm?


