



# SWINTON VS O L D H //

#### **KEITH BRENNAN**

A late entrant into the pro ranks, Keith played for Higginshaw and Shaw Rhinos before impressing as an amateur for Oldham towards the end of the 1999 season. Did enough to be offered a contract for 2000 at the age of 25. An extremely accomplished scrum half who is expected to push player-coach Mike Ford all the way for the No 7 jersey.

#### MARK CAMPBELL

One of the 16 new boys brought to the club by Mike ford during the first two months of the player-coach's reign. Formerly with Leeds Rhinos and Keighley Cougars, this 24 year old hard working back-row forward is studying at Leeds University for a degree in chemical engineering.

#### **LEO CASEY**

Tough prop, who played with the former Oldham club, Featherstone Rovers, Swinton and Rochdale Hornets before signing for the Roughyeds for the 1999 season. Captained the side and, at the age of 32, became a firm favourite of the crowd. An Irish international, he was the first and only Oldham player to

command a transfer fee of £100,000 when Peter Fox took him to Featherstone.

#### **JASON CLEGG**

A product of Littleborough RL Club, this heavyweight prop turned pro for Bradford Bulls and had a stint with Batley before signing for the Roughyeds shortly after the club was formed. Made a first-team place his own property in 1999 and earned selection for the West of Pennines side against an East side coached by Mike Ford. Received an approach from France, but chose to re-sign for Oldham for the year 2000.

#### MIKE FORD

#### **ANTHONY GIBBONS**

One half of the twin combination which played for Leeds Rhinos and Bramley before joining Oldham at the start of the 2000 season. A utility back, 23 year old Anthony is earmarked to play right centre. Signed a two year contract after impressing Ford with Bramley in 1999.

#### DAVID GIBBONS

The other twin, like brother
Anthony, David turned pro with
Leeds Rhinos as a 17 year old to
follow in the footsteps of their uncle,
Neil Hague. Both became
household names at Headingley and
played more than 20 senior games,
including several in the first Super
League season on 1996. Formerly
captain of Bramley, David will be a
key figure for the Roughyeds at
stand off half.

#### **JOEY HAYES**

A young winger who has crammed a lot into his relatively short spell as a pro. Made his name with St Helens for whom he played in a Regal Trophy Final and a Super League premiership final to earn a place on the Great Britain tour squad which went to New Zealand, Fiji and Papua New Guinea in 1996. Suffered a setback with a serious knee injury, but fought back to play 11 Super League games with Salford Reds in 1999.

#### **IOHN HOUGH**

Will go down in local RL history as the first player to sign for the new Oldham club when it was launched in the autumn of 1997. Has had two cracking seasons in 1998 and 1999. When he took the club's player-of-the-year award. A native of Oldham, John played more than

30 senior games for Warrington before returning "home" to hook for the Roughyeds.

#### **KEVIN MANNION**

Another Wiganer, 22 year old Kevin is a ball-playing loose forward, who made his senior debut with Rochdale Hornets when only 16. Starred for the Hornets Academy and Alliance sides, but then concentrated on his studies at Lancaster University. Played for England and GB Students, for whom he has toured Australia and played in France.

#### **IOE McNICHOLAS**

Played his first senior game in the Bears last match at Leeds. Broke his leg for the Roughyeds in the new club's first league game at Workington and missed the rest of the 1998 season apart from a brief spell as sub in the final match. A pacy winger, Joe bounced back to hold down a regular spot on the right flank in 1999.

#### TOM O'REILLY

An international for Papua New Guinea, 25-year-old Tom is an Aussie with an Irish passport. Can play stand off or loose forward equally well, but will be earmarked by Ford for the No 13 jersey. In line to play for PNG in next year's Lincoln World Cup. First

recommended to Ford by Darryl Van de Velde. Ford, then coach of Bramley, was not disappointed.

#### ANDY PROCTOR

Named captain of the club by Ford for the 2000 season. This former Saddleworth, Wakefield Trinity, Oldham and Bramley prop forward, now aged 30, won a man of steel award while with Trinity, as the club was then called, and has built a reputation as rugged players' player who performs well above his weight.

#### PAT RICH

Another of the younger signings, 21 year old Pat is a native of the North East. Played regular senior rugby for Keighley in 1999, while studying for a law degree at Leeds. Also represented England Students, for whom he played in the centre in the World Cup Final at Hull. Can play centre of back row forward.

#### **WES ROGERS**

A strong second row forward, Was has joined his home town club after stints with Widnes and Swinton. A hot property as a teenager, he was signed for Widnes by Doug

> Laughton. Scored two tries for Swinton against the Roughveds at Gigg Lane last season.

#### **GRAEME SHAW**

Another ex-bradford forward. Graeme is the son of former Oldham Athletic striker David Shaw. Ready for his third season with Oldham, he has won Scottish international honours and won recognition as the new club's first international. Runs and tackles hard. Another ex-student with a degree in chemical engineering.

#### MARK SIBSON

An exciting full back and goalkicker, this 23-year old played for Loughborough University for four years before turning our for Castleford's Alliance side. Recommended to Batley and became an instant hit, going out on loan to Super League club Huddersfield Giants. Has signed a two year deal for Oldham.

#### **NATHAN VARLEY**

One of the best tacklers in the club, Nathan played for the Roughyeds in 1998 and 1999 after signing from bradford. Had an injury free first season, but was desperately unlucky in 1999 when he broke an ankle, smashed a wrist and then damaged a foot on his comeback in the Alliance side. Missed much of the season, but fully fit now and raring to go in the new



MARTYN SADLER, Managing Editor of Rugby League Express, examines the nature of the NFP Championship play-off that will take place at the end of this season.

Many Rugby League fans might be asking why the Northern Ford Premiership is

changing its play-off format this season, after the successful operation of the top-five format in the last two seasons.

The system is being changed to a top-eight format, and for one simple reason. The NFP wants to give more of its clubs the chance to participate in finals football. Eight out of the 18 NFP teams will feature in the play-offs this season, which means that the majority of clubs will have plenty to play for right throughout the season, right through to the Grand Final on the last Saturday in July.

But the new finals system won't be played under the old Premiership format, where the team finishing first played the team in eighth spot, second playing seventh, etc, with the loser of each game being eliminated.

Leigh coach Ian Millward pointed out the fault with that system in 'Total Rugby League' last August.

"In a straight knock-out competition, you could finish first and see six months hard work go down the drain in one match, which obviously isn't fair," said Millward at the time.

The system the NFP has come up with, like the top-five system, gives the highest placed clubs in positions one to four a second chance, if they are defeated on the first weekend, whereas the clubs finishing fifth to eighth are playing straight knockout football throughout the play-offs.

I have to take the credit (or the blame!) for suggesting the system to the NFP clubs, so I'd better explain in some detail how it works.

Set out below is the week-by-week guide to the top-eight play-off system.

WEEK 1

If this system had operated in 1999, Hull KR, York and Whitehaven, as the teams finishing sixth, seventh and eighth respectively, would have qualified for the play-offs.


But Whitehaven, as the eighth team, would have faced a tough battle to reach the Grand Final, having to win three times away from home to make it to the big one. Contrast that with the team finishing top, which only has to win twice at home to make the Grand Final.

You can see, I hope, the potential for a fascinating and exciting finals series. I, for one, can't wait for the last Saturday in July.

# FROM THE LIONS ARCHIVES...

#### AN A-Z OF SWINTON GREATS ~ PART ONE



#### TOM ANDERSON Anderson was a fine scrum-half whose

scrum-half whose career spanned the Great War. He made his debut on 11

November 1911, and often appeared in the same line-up as his brother, Fred, who was a winger. The brothers answered the patriotic call in 1914 and indeed Fred was awarded the Military Medal, whilst Tom spent much of his time digging the trenches in a labour battalion. Having survived the war, Tom continued at scrum half until early 1921 when he was sold to Warrington following the Lions' acquisition of a certain Bryn Evans. Anderson's solitary representative appearance came almost by accident. He was selected as reserve for a Tour Trial at Leeds in 1920, but due to a Widnes player being delayed by a late train Anderson ended up playing. However, he did not make final selection for the Great Britain tour to Australasia later that year. Swinton Career Record: 99 appearances, 12 tries, 14 goals Representative Honours: 1 Tour Trial

#### **CHARLIE ARMITT**

The son of the Lions' great hooker, Tommy Armitt. Charlie carved a niche for himself in the second row after making his debut on 18 October 1947. However, he could also play loose forward and even had several outings on the wing including one for his club against the 1948/49 Australians, but his eye for a try made him the top scorer at Station Road during that same season. At the end of the 1948/49 campaign he made his debut for Lancashire, and in September 1949 he played for England when they lost to the Other Nationalities at Workington. Prior to the start of the 1953/54 season he was sold to Huddersfield.

Swinton Career Record: 145 appearances, 32 tries, 3 goals Representative Honours: 1 England cap, 1 Lancashire cap.

#### TOMMY ARMITT

Arguably Swinton's greatest ever hooker. In fact Tommy had tried his luck at soccer with Crewe Alexandra before the Lions snapped him up from a local junior rugby team at the turn of the 1930s. He made his debut at the opening of Barrow's Craven Park on 29 August 1931, and went on to enjoy a glittering career. However, he was on the losing side with Swinton in 3 major cup finals before his club won the RL Championship in 1934/35. He also won the Lancashire League and Cup Double in 1940 in what should have been his testimonial year. However, in a show of great loyalty to his club which would shame many modern day players, Armitt refused his testimonial because he felt that Swinton RLFC could ill-afford the expense during what was the early



years of the War. Tommy Armitt made his Test debut at Station Road against the 1933 Australians, and went on to win 8 caps in all. He toured the Antipodes in 1936 alongside Martin Hodgson, and gained many other representative honours. On top of all this he was also twice on the winning side for Swinton against Australia. The War (during which he sometimes guested for Hull) cut short his career, but he did play on until 19 October 1946 when he made his final bow at Leigh. Swinton Career Record: 352 appearances, 24 tries, 6 goals Representative Honours: 8 Great Britain caps (plus 8 Tour games), 10 England caps (1 try), 13 Lancashire caps (1 try), 1 Lancashire League, 3 Northern Rugby League, 1 Tour Trial

#### OWEN BADGER

Swinton's signing of the Welsh Rugby Union international centre, Owen Badger, caused a nationwide sensation back in 1897. Badger was persuaded to leave Llanelly for a reputed fee of £70, but his wife's opposition to the move was to cause him great difficulties during his relatively short stay at Chorley Road. Indeed on one occasion he found himself suspended for a breach of the anti-professional rules after he had gone home to visit his sick child and therefore had not worked prior to a Saturday match as he was required to do. He scored a try on his Swinton debut in a victory at Rochdale Hornets on 4 December 1897, but by 8 April 1899 he had made his final appearance. In between he had played for Lancashire against Yorkshire at Salford's New Barns


