

Casualty - by George the Physio

In the 'Physio Report' this week the top three injuries go like this.

In the No. 1 spot this week we have Basil Richards with a torn calf muscle.

In the No. 2 spot this week we have Joe Berry with a pulled groin, but

Joe could be back for today's game.

In the No. 3 spot we have Carl Gillespie, who has torn ankle ligaments, but they are responding to treatment, so I could well see Carl being OK for today's game if selected.

On 'Injury Corner' this week we will talk about 'strapping'. It is important that players get the correct strapping before they go out onto the field. The most common areas that players get strapped are

ankles, thumbs, wrists and knees. It is very important that these area's are protected, but it is also very costly as it can cost up to £10 per player to protect him each match and that's just on strapping alone.

So if you multiply that by seventeen and then multiply that by the

number of games in a season - plus training - you will see that the cost is high.

But not as high as it would be if you did not use the strapping.

5 YEARS AGO (8/2/95)

Matches in Division One continued to prove that the Dons were on a downward spiral as they were beaten by Warrington at Wildespool by 68 points to 20 with tries from Neal (2) and Miller before a crowd of 4082.

10 YEARS AGO (4/2/90)

The Dons loose their first match after a run of five wins in Division Two against Hunslet at Elland Road by 21 points to 12, with tries from Roache and Keith Jones, but still stay in 8th position in the league table.

15 YEARS AGO (3/2/85)

A preliminary round fixture of the Challenge Cup against Wakefield Trinity saw the Dons loose by 25 points to 6 before a crowd of 852 at Tattersfield, with a try from Moore converted by Harcombe.

20 YEARS AGO (10/2/80)

An away defeat by Rochdale Hornets in the Challenge Cup by 3 points to 11 only contributed to another defeat in a season which saw the Dons rooted to last place in the league throughout the season.

A Profile of

CRAIG BARKER Local lad who was with the Bears before signing for the Roughyeds when one club died and the other was born in 1997. A stand off half with a neat pair of hands, this product of the Waterhead amateur club is still waiting for the opportunity to command a senior place consistently. KEITH BRENNAN A late entrant into the pro ranks, Keith played for Higginshaw and Shaw Rhinos before impressing as an amateur for Oldham towards the end of the 1999 season. Did enough to be offered a contract for 2000 at the age of 25. An extremely accomplished scrum half who is expected to push player coach Mike Ford all the way for the No. 7 jersey.

MÁRK CAMPBELL One of 16 new boys brought to the club by Mike Ford during the first two months of the player coach's reign. Formerly with Leeds Rhinos and Keighley Cougars, this 28 year old hard working back row forward is studying at Leeds University for a degree in chemical

engineering.

LEO CASEY Needs no introduction to Roughyeds fans. A tough prop, who played with the former Oldham club, Featherstone Rovers, Swinton and Rochdale Hornets before signing for the Roughyeds for the 1999 season. Captained the side and, at the age of 32, became a firm favourite of the crowd. An Irish international, he was the first and only Oldham player to command a transfer fee of £100,000 when Peter Fox took him to Featherstone.

JASON CLEGG A product of Littleborough RI Club, this heavyweight prop turned pro for Bradford Bulls and had a stint with Batley before signing for the Roughyeds shortly after the club was formed. Made the first team place his own property in 1999 and earned selection for the West of Pennines side against an East side coached by Mike Ford. Received an approach from France, but chose to re-sign for Oldham for the year 2000. PETER FERRIS A former Higginshaw player and another late recruit into the pro-ranks. Toured

Australia with BARLA under 19s and represented BARLA under 23s, but then left the sport to concentrate on his career in computers, only returning at the age of 23 when Ford spotted him playing at centre for Dukinfield RU Club. Played hooker or loose forward in his younger days.

KEVIN FITZPATRICK A full back who made his name at Saddleworth Rangers. Became the Rangers first choice and regular No. 1 at the age of and turned pro for Oldham at the age of 20. Recently celebrated his 21st while studying for a degree in journalism and the media. Hopes to

make headlines as well as write them.

MIKE FORD A scrum half who has been making the right sort of headlines all his sporting life. Played for Wigan at Wembley when only 19. Also starred for Leigh, Oldham, Castleford, Warrington, Wakefield and South Queensland Crushers. Toured down under with GB in 1988. Coached Bramley to mid table respectability in 1999 before landing the Oldham job - at the 4th attempt - to fulfil a sporting ambition.

ANTHONY GIBBONS One half of the twin combination which played for Leeds Rhinos and Bramley before joining Oldham for the start of the 2000 season. A utility back, 23 year old Anthony is earmarked to play right centre. Signed a two year contract after impressing Ford with Bramley in 1999.

DAVID GIBBONS The other twin. Like brother Anthony, David turned pro with Leeds Rhinos as a 17 year old to follow in the footsteps of their uncle, Neil Hague. Both became a house-hold name at Headingley and played more than twenty senior games, including several in the first Super League season of 1996. Formerly captain of Bramley, David will be a key figure for the Roughyeds at stand off.

DANNY GEEST This 22 year old, 18 stone prop was an up and coming youngster with the Bears. He played for the Roughyeds in the new clubs' first ever and historic game at Rochdale on 1st January 1998 but then joined Keighley on a round robin.

He returned to the Roughyeds via Lancashire Lynx. JOEY HAYES Young winger who has crammed a lot into his relatively short spell as a pro. Made his name with St Helens for whom he played in a Regal Trophy final and a Super League Premiership final to earn a place on the Great Britain tour squad which went to New Zealand, Fiji and Papua New Guinea in 1996. Suffered a setback with a serious knee injury, but fought back to play 11 Super League games with Salford Reds in 1999.

CHRIS HÖLLÄND Aged 21 and a product of the youth game in Wigan, Chris has played for England and GB Students and took the Man of the Match award in England's defeat by New Zealand at Hull in the last World Cup. Made his debut for Rochdale Hornets at the age of 16. Equally at

home at centre or in the back row.

JOHN HOUGH Will go down in local RL history as the first player to sign for the new Oldham club when it was launched in the autumn of 1997. Has had two cracking seasons in 1998 and 1999, when he took the club's Player of the Year award. A native of Oldham, John played more than 30 senior games for Warrington before returning 'home' to hook for the Roughyeds.

DAVE LEWIS Another big prop and a native of Doncaster, he played trials for the newly formed Alliance team in 1999 and did enough to earn a senior spot at Doncaster in mid season. Later signed a contract, but spent the remainder of that first season learning his trade in the reserves.

KEVIN MANNION Another Wigoner, 22 year old Kevin is a ball playing loose forward, who made his senior debut with Rochdale Hornets when only 16. Starred in the Hornets Academy and Alliance side, but concentrated on his studies at Lancaster University. Played for England and GB Students, for whom he toured Australia and played in France.

ALFIE HEAD Starting his third season with the Roughyeds after playing initially for the Bears. Did well as a centre on the Bears Alliance team of

1997, but prefers wing, the position in which he will be hoping to hold down in the senior spot for 2000.

JOE McNICHOLAS Played his first senior game in the Bears last match at Leeds. Broke his leg for the Roughyeds in the new club's first league game at Workington and missed the rest of the 1998 season, apart from a brief spell as a sub in the final match. A pacey winger, Joe bounced back to hold down a regular spot on the right flank in 1999.

CRAIG MILNER A young hooker, Craig played open age rugby with Higginshaw while only 17 and also turned out for junior side at Saddleworth. Had trials in the club's Alliance side and impressed sufficiently not only to win a contract but to carry of the Alliance team's Player of the Year award in 1999. Hard working and tenacious tackler.

CHRIS NAYLOR Young prop formerly with the Academy sides at St Helens and Salford. Big and strong, Chris played for England in the last Students World Cup, becoming the only English player to be named afterwards in an imaginary World XIII. Also played for GB against the Aussies at students level, where he confirmed Mike Ford's interest.

TOM O'REILLY An international for Papua New Guinea, 23 year old Tom is an Aussie with an Irish passport. Can play stand off or loose forward equally well, but will be earmarked by Ford for the No. 13 jersey. In line to play for Papua New Guinea in this year's Worls Cup. First recommended to Ford by Darryl van de Velde. Ford, then coach of Bramley, was not disappointed.

ANDY PROCTOR Named captain of the club by Ford for the 2000 season. This former Saddleworth, Wakefield Trinity, Oldham and Bramley prop forward, now aged 30, won the Man of Steele award while with Trinity, as the club was then called. Has built a reputation as 'rugged players' player, who performs well above his weight.



IT is pleasing to see both Doncaster Dragons and Oldham doing so well in the Northern Ford Premiership this season.

Both clubs have had to re-apply for membership in recent years after suffering serious financial problems, and both have had to play a season without any Sky money.

In fact there were real fears that Oldham would go out of business at one stage which would have been a tragic loss for the Rugby League world in view of their illustrious

When I first started watching rugby league

over 40 years ago, Oldham were one of the country's top teams and in full-back Bernard Ganley they had one of the best goal-kickers of all time.

Bernard, as did all the kickers of that era, used to kick the ball toe-end style and I wonder what he would have made of today's kickers.

The relative merits of the various goal-kicking styles has certainly produced much lively debate over the years.

As a former goal-kicker myself

(traditional style) it would be fascinating to see the likes of Ganley, Neil Fox, Lewis Jones (all toe-enders) in their heyday taking on the best of the modern generation of goal kickers.

Certainly the likes of former Wigan and Castleford star Franco Botica would have given the old masters a run for their money. Doncaster have boasted several useful kickers over the years.

David Noble served the Dons well in that

respect for many years and is the current club record holder.

It was Noble's kicking skills which was mainly

FOR ALL YOUR responsible for him holding down a first team place earlier in his career though he developed into a good all-round

player later in his career.
Davide Towle, who once kicked nine goals in a match during the years when the Dons were the whipping boys of the Rugby League, was also a tremendous kicker on his day, I suspect that Dragon's current kicker, Lynton Stott, will not be talked about in the same breath.
But he is improving all the time and if the supporters keep off his back I am sure he will do a good job. It doesn't help that most of the Doncaster tries have been scored out wide this season.


