Coach Steve Linnane Comments

BOARDROOM BRIEF

A warm Scotland welcome to Chris Hamilton, Mike Ford and all the Officials, playing staff and followers of our near neighbours Oldham who have travelled for today's Silk Cut Challenge Cup Fourth Round game.

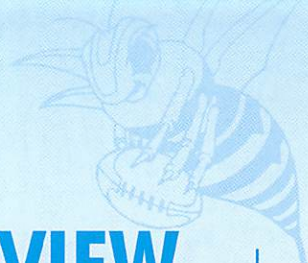

BIG MATCH PREVIEW



NO doubt that as soon as Hornets were drawn out of the hat for the Silk Cut Challenge Cup Fourth Round, many supporters were praying that the next team out would be Oldham.

And those fans got their wish, setting up a potentially fascinating match between these two local rivals, meeting for the third time within the space of two months.

Hornets supporters, in particular, will have been keen to see the Roughyeds here at Spotland, having seen their team defeated on both occasions recently.

Both games went right down to the wire and could easily have gone either way.

The Law Cup was a difficult match to read anything into because of coach Steve Linnane's approach to the "friendly", and because of so many new faces in both camps.

The Roughyeds emerged victorious with two late tries sealing a close match, and returning the Law Cup to Oldham in their first match under player coach Mike Ford.

Two week's later, Ford's side triumphed again in a tremendous opening day match at Boundary Park, in a game that kept over 3,500 spectators on the edge of their seats right up until the final hooter.

Hornets will no doubt feel that they should have won, especially considering that they

fought back from 6-18 down to lead 20-18, and then had a spell of concerted pressure on the Oldham line.

But the home side managed to hold out for a 23-20 win to get their season off to a perfect start, whereas Hornets were left to rue what might have been.

Since then, Hornets have won three games and lost two, Oldham have won four and lost two, setting the scene for another titanic struggle this afternoon.

Hornets' defeat at Swinton last week was very disappointing, and although many people were disappointed with the match official, there is no doubt that Hornets' discipline has to improve if they are to become a force in the NFP.

Last weekend Oldham went down 16-26 at high flying Doncaster Dragons, but despite defeat they again showed just how far they have come in a short space of time under Ford.

It's impossible to name one side as the favourites this afternoon and it promises to be a very tight battle between two well-matched sides.

Hornets will no doubt be keen to avenge their recent defeats against Oldham, as well as looking to book a place in the next round of the cup.

Hopefully another big crowd will be here at Spotland to witness what has all the ingredients of a classic.

TODAYS VISITORS

OLDHAM

AIDE MEAD

Product of Oldham Bears Academy this utility back is a handy member of the Roughyeds squad. Has played on the wing and at full back last season and has been very consistent.

MARK SIBSON

Major pre-season signing for the Roughyeds. A lot is expected from this goal kicking full-back. Although he played 2 games for Huddersfield Giants in the Super League last season most of his performances were for Bramley.

JOEY HAYES

The flying winger has signed for Oldham from Salford City Reds. Joey made his name playing for St. Helens where he won a Super League champions medal, played at Wembley and was also capped for Great Britain against Papa New Guinea.

JOE McNICHOLAS

This young winger is one of the most exciting prospects in the new First Division. Having turned down an offer from Bradford Bulls, Joe was unfortunate to miss most of '98 after breaking his leg in the early season. Rochdale born, he is armed with pace and a great side step.

ANTHONY GIBBONS

Signed with his twin brother, David, from Bramley this close season. Anthony can play anywhere in the backs but will be hoping to make the centre spot his own.

CRAIG BARKER

Local halfback or hooker who was not always a first choice in '98 but never lets the side down when selected.

LEO CASEY

Now at the veteran stage, Leo returned to Oldham last season and has resigned for this years campaign. Has represented Ireland at International level. This tough prop forward was delighted to be named Captain for last seasons campaign and his

performances were outstanding. Leads from the front and usually plays 80 minutes, which is a rarity in today's modern game.

JASON CLEGG

Formerly a Bradford Bull this prop had a barnstorming season for the Roughyeds last year. Scored a typical rampaging try in last year's Law Cup against Rochdale. 'Cleggy' is becoming a favourite with the Oldham spectators and is a member of a very consistent front row.

PAT RICH

Signed from Keighley Cougars in the close season. Pat is a promising young centre who played for England in the recent Student's World Cup. He has the drive, ambition and ability to have a really big season.

DAVID GIBBONS

Signed with his twin Anthony from Bramley. Can play anywhere in the backs but will be hoping to impress at stand off. David is very talented and began his career at Leeds.

JOHN HOUGH

John will go down in the 'new' clubs history books as the first player to officially sign for the Roughyeds. A bright future is predicted for the ex-Warrington hooker who is renowned for his hard work and sportsmanship. Has been consistently outstanding for the Roughyeds and is one of the divisions form hookers.

ANDY PROCTOR

Andy has returned to the club to play for Mike Ford, who was his coach last season at Bramley. Procky can play at prop or in the back row and with his professional attitude to training will be a valuable addition to this season's team.

MARK CAMPBELL

Back row forward signed from Keighley Cougars. Oldham wanted to sign Mark last season but have finally got their man. Another player for whom big things are expected.

KEVIN MANNON

Will need no introduction to Spotland as he has previously played for the Hornets. Big, tall, loose forward whom coach, Mike Ford said reminds him of Barrie Jon Maher.

NATHAN VARLEY

Started most games from the subs bench last season but was still one of the clubs top tacklers. This ex-Bradford back rower had his season ruined by an ankle injury picked up on New Years Day at Rochdale. returned to his tackling best but was unlucky again when injuring his wrist against Rochdale! Will be hoping a new season brings more luck.

GRAEME SHAW

Hard working back row forward signed from Bradford Bulls. Became the 'new' clubs first international in October 1998 playing for Scotland. Always guaranteed 100% commitment from Graeme.

WES ROGERS

Wes signed from Swinton Lions in the close season. Wes is very pleased to have signed for his home team, not least because his family are all fanatics! Can play anywhere in the forwards and is major boost to the Roughyeds pack.

KEITH BRENNAN

A late entrant into the pro ranks, Keith played for Higginshaw and Shaw Rhines before impressing as an amateur for Oldham towards to end of the 1999 season. Did enough to be offered a contract for 2000 at the age of 25. An extremely accomplished scrum-half who is expected to push player-coach Mike Ford all the way for the No 7 jersey.

PETER FERRIS

Like Brennan, another former Higginshaw player and another late recruit into the pro ranks. Toured Australia with BARLA under-19s and represented BARLA under-23s, but then left the sport to concentrate on his career in computers, only returning at the age of 25 when Ford spotted him playing at centre for Dukinfield RU Club. Played hooker or loose-forward in his younger days.

KEVIN FITZPATRICK

A full-back who made his name with

Saddleworth Rangers. Became the Rangers first choice and regular No 1 at the age of 19 and turned pro for Oldham at the age of 20. Recently celebrated his 21st while studying for a degree in journalism and the media. Hopes to make the headlines as well as write them.

MIKE FORD

A scrum-half who has been making the right sort of headlines all his sporting life. Played for Wigan at Wembley when only 19. Also starred for Leigh, Oldham, Castleford, Warrington, Wakefield and South Queensland Crushers. Toured Down Under with Great Britain in 1988. Coached Bramley to mid-table respectability in 1999 before landing the Oldham job - at the third attempt - to fulfil a sporting ambition.

DANNY GUEST

This 22 year old, 18 stone, prop was an up-and-coming youngster with the Bears. He played for the Roughyeds in the new club's first ever and historic game at Rochdale on January 1, 1998 but then joined Keighley on a round-robin return to the Roughyeds via Lancashire Lynx.

JOEY HAYES

A young winger who has crammed a lot into his relatively short spell as a pro. Made his name with St Helens, for whom he played in a Regal Trophy final and a Super League Premiership final to earn a place on the Great Britain tour squad which went to New Zealand, Fiji, and Papua New Guinea in 1996. Suffered a setback with a serious knee injury, but fought back to play 11 Super League games with Salford Reds in 1999.

CHRIS HOLLAND

Aged 21 and a product of the youth game in Wigan, Chris has played for England and Great Britain Students and took the man-of-the-match award in England's defeat by New Zealand at Hull in the last World Cup. Made his debut for Rochdale Hornets at the age of 16. Equally at home at centre or in the back row.

And so there were “giants” that were slain by the David’s of the lower reaches the rugby world.

Sheffield Eagles, the Silk Cut Challenge Cup winners as recently as 1998 were dumped out of this year’s competition 14-16 by National Conference side Thornhill Trojans. Thornhill have been languishing at the foot of the National Conference Premier Division this term but doggedly held on to a slender, well deserved lead during a seemingly “interminable” injury time. York Wasps are next up for the Trojans.

Oldham St Annes were the other surprise package. They “nailed” Batley Bulldogs at Mount Pleasant for a comprehensive win. A towering performance by their pack saw Saints hold out easily against the Bulldog second half onslaught even though they were coming down the hill with the wind at their back. Oldham St Annes got their reward for a wonderful performance with a draw against Super League giants, Castleford Tigers in the 4th Round.

Mixed fortunes for the two French sides in the draw for the first time. Villeneuve won at Castleford Tigers newly re-named The Jungle ground, where opponents Castleford Lock Lane gave a good account of themselves. Doncaster Dragons beat St Gaudens 40-10.

Rochdale Hornets defeated the other “interesting” team in the draw. The weather in east Lancashire saw the games at Oldham and Swinton cancelled and resulted in a rain sodden pitch at Spotland where The Army side showed good spirit and fitness and not

a little skill before Hornets better organisation allowed them to run out 66-6 winners. The win set up today’s mouth watering derby clash with Oldham, winners against Wigan St Judes earlier this week.

Those other Hornets, Wath Brow, won the clash of the two amateur sides when they defeated Eccles 26-0. Their reward, a glamorous, if not too financially rewarding trip to play last years beaten finalists London Broncos.

Ex Rochdale Hornets Coach Deryck Fox put in a man of the match performance but was unable to inspire his Shaw Cross Sharks team to an upset against Whitehaven Warriors.

Biggest score of the day was posted by Keighley in scoring 90 unanswered points against Cardiff Cougars (who had defeated Rochdale Mayfield in the last round). This was followed by Widnes’ 76-8 trouncing of one of the best amateur sides, West Hull and Swinton’s 74-1 win over Oldham amateurs Waterhead that set up a home game against the mighty St Helens.

Dewsbury (66), Featherstone Rovers (64), York Wasps (56) all broke the 50 point barrier but there were far more competitive games at Lancs Lynx, Workington and Leigh where Walney Central, Skirlaugh Bulls and Siddal respectively, gave good accounts of themselves to make life more than a little uncomfortable for the professional sides.

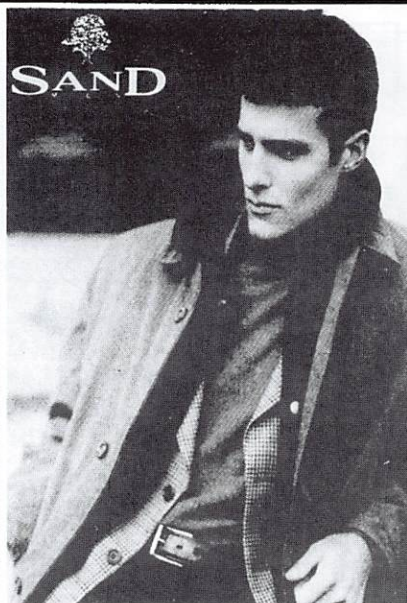

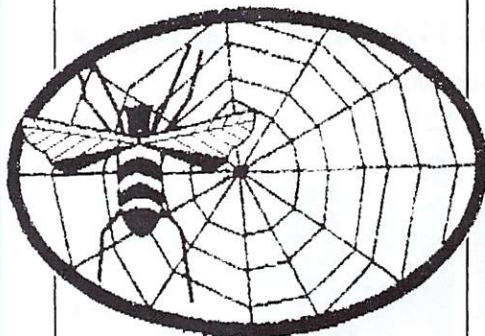

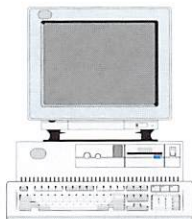
