Welcome to Ram Stadium

After last weekend's heatwave the heat could be really on but in a different way as Oldham come to town for a game which could well be crucial in the final outcome of the Northern Ford Premiership league placings. Oldham are currently in sixth place in the table with 37 points from 26 games and with Widnes in seventh place but 5 points behind they know that they cannot finish any lower in the table. However with the 5th to 8th place teams eliminated if they lose in the first round of play off matches Oldham will still be looking to force their way into the top four with Featherstone Rovers their target. Rovers are fourth with 39 points but should be too strong for Workington at the Lionheart Stadium this afternoon and a home win would end Oldham's hopes.

For Dewsbury Rams the scenario is quite straightforward. A win for the Rams this afternoon would see us clinch the League Leaders trophy for the second successive year and would take all the pressure off the team for next week's trip to Leigh Centurions. The target is two points from two matches to be certain of the title and with Keighley Cougars final two matches being at home against Whitehaven and Swinton it's almost certain that those vital two points will be required. It means another massive game is set to unfold here at Ram Stadium. Oldham are a well supported team so we expect to see the spectators turning up in their numbers. If they aren't attracted by a game of this magnitude we are probably wasting our time in developing rugby league at this level. In spite of increased home support this season we feel we still could have done much better and we hope that the locals will be convinced to help play their part and support the Rams to further honours.

The Oldham club has benefited from the strong leadership of Chairman Chris Hamilton and we would like to welcome to Ram Stadium Chris, his fellow directors, their highly respected coach Mike Ford and all the other players, officials and supporters of the club. Oldham have been in the news lately with the on loan signing of former Great Britain prop forward Steve Molloy and they were also linked with other players such as Aaron Lester who is currently captain of Whitehaven Warriors. The club were also in the news when they were forced to find a new home for their final two home league matches of the season. The pitch at Boundary Park has had it's share of problems over recent years (don't they all) and it needed urgent repair works in order for it to be ready for the soccer season which seems to start earlier each year. They were once again indebted to Rochdale who offered them the use of the Spoltand ground and in spite of playing their home fixture with Widnes at Rochdale there was still a crowd in excess of 2,000. So from the dark days of near extinction at the Watersheddings the club has found new heart and the team is now recognised as one capable of making a real challenge for honours. However Rams fans will have the satisfaction of knowing that under planning for such an important game is not a fault which Neil Kelly suffers from and the Rams players will be as well prepared for this match as for any throughout this season. A fascinating and exciting match is in prospect.

Finally a reminder to any November 1995 members of Dewsbury Rams. You should have received notice of the latest in the series of meetings to keep members informed of the progress and development of the club. This next meeting is at 7.30pm on Wednesday 5th July. You will be required to supply proof of November 1995 membership to gain admittance to the meeting.

Let everyone in the NFP and those who support the clubs, stand up and be counted – If the winner is entitled to promotion – lets fight to make sure they get it.

UNDER THE SPOTLIGHT

When a club in the Northern Ford Premiership can convince a player of Steve Molloy's stature to make a drop, albeit a potentially brief one, to a lower division is has to be recognised that that must be a club with ambition. Oldham have risen from the ashes of their Super League nightmare. The Watersheddings might now be a housing estate but the new Oldham are a vibrant club with Grand Final ambitions similar to those of the Dewsbury Rams.

Whilst the Rams chase the league title this afternoon Oldham's own ambitions centre around their final league placing. The club has won 18 and drawn 1 of its 26 league matches to date and they have been particularly impressive at their Boundary Park home. Only two teams have been to Boundary Park and escaped with the points but crucially those two teams have been the Rams and Keighley Cougars, the two teams currently placed 1st and 2nd in the table. Their first home defeat came against the Rams. It was a real thriller and left everyone marvelling at a superb afternoon of entertainment with neither team deserving to lose as the Rams wilted under some intense pressure but somehow hung on to win the game 14-12. Keighley Cougars fans were saved from the same nail biting finish as they beat Oldham 24-14 with Martin Wood in superb form and a match haul of a try and four goals. His try didn't however come until 11 minutes from the end as the lead changed hands for the sixth and final time. So although the finish might not have been quite as intense the game as a spectacle certainly was and the home fans have seen some great exhibitions of rugby league this season.

Oldham's finest home display was probably their 27-16 defeat of Leigh Centurions earlier this month, a win which was cheered by all Rams fans. The Oldham pack led by two try John Hough were simply outstanding with a forwards dominated substitutes bench providing a considerable assist to those who started the game. Leigh were rocked by two tries inside the first 13 minutes and just couldn't impose themselves on the game. Oldham have also tried to keep their supporters entertained with three other games which ended a little closer than they might have hoped. They almost let Whitehaven Warriors back into the game in an early season fixture. The Warriors came back from 10 points down to lead by 6 only to be undone by some Joey Hayes magic who scored tries in the 68th and 72nd minute to help Oldham secure a 26-22 win. It was even closer in their festive encounter with Rochdale. The Hornets nearly got a late Christmas present when they came from 18-6 down to lead 20-18 early in the second half only to be undone by poor discipline as Mark Sibson kicked two penalty goals. When Anthony Gibbons landed a field goal the damage was done and Oldham scraped home 23-20 in front of a derby crowd of 3,562. Last weekend Oldham were at Rochdale for their home match with Widnes Vikings. On a blazing hot afternoon Steve Molloy marked his debut with style and a 6th minute opening try. Both teams deserved the standing ovation at the end of the game but it was Oldham who deserved the points and got them, but only just, 34-26.

Some of the other home matches must have seemed tame by comparison. A 30-17 defeat of Workington Town after being behind 7-2 at half time and an easy 50-8 win over luckless Lancashire Lynx were two early season wins. Their home defeat by the Rams was felt by Hunslet Hawks who were hammered 44-18 in an 8 try display in the next match to be played at Boundary Park. Swinton were beaten 34-28 in another nail biter. The club names suggest an old fashioned derby but with Swinton now based at Bury that is no longer the case. York suffered yet another defeat in their troubled season 40-18 and it was another 30+ haul three weeks later as Oldham beat travel shy Barrow Border Raiders 30-16. The club made it a marvellous May at Boundary Park when they won their crucial Bank Holiday match with Doncaster Dragons 25-6 to show that their pack is a match for any team in the division.

Away from home things haven't been quite as good. There have been some good wins. There was the New Year's win at Swinton 23-18 in a holiday thriller. The game was delayed 10 minutes to get the waiting spectators into the ground and they had more than their money's worth as the game went on for a minute after the final hooter with none of the match officials hearing the signal for the end of the game! There was a great win at Widnes 31-20 with another outstanding performance from John Hough. They were too good for Sheffield Eagles who they beat 28-6 and they relished the Heavy Woollen air when they came to Mount Pleasant and picked up the points 28-16. Two tries (Pat Rich 59 and Neil Roden 74) in the final quarter of the game secured victory against a Batley team who missed a number of scoring opportunities. Oldham had a second thriller of the season against Rochdale Hornets in the familiar surroundings of Spotland where they had been welcomed so warmly in the past and again this season. The late field goal from Australian Shayne McMenemy, a player released by Hornets earlier in the season because of disciplinary reasons, proved to be the winning score as Oldham, inspired by the appearance on the field of their coach Mike Ford on 54 minutes, just scraped home 13-12. Another milestone in their season came with the early May visit to Hull KR. It was a game vital to the play off hopes of both teams and Oldham made it seven wins in a row when they beat Hull KR 32-12 leaving the Robins coach Dave Harrison to regret a poor tackling display from his team.

There was a comfortable 28-6 win over Sheffield Eagles and a predictable win over Lancashire Lynx. However in spite of the upturn in fortunes of the Cumbrian club there was still the disappointment of a point dropped at Workington in a 12-12 draw in May. There was also immense disappointment at the manner of their 61-26 defeat at Featherstone Rovers who ran in 11 tries in the process. They can however take heart from defeats at Leigh 28-10, Doncaster Dragons 26-16, Whitehaven Warriors and Barrow Border Raiders 19-16. All of these teams boast impressive home records and have beaten many of the top teams along the way.

There is no doubt that Oldham will have made the relatively short journey to Ram Stadium boosted by their more recent performances. Their team contains a number of players with Super League experience and their contingent of former Bramley players will no doubt be looking forward to renewing acquaintances with Dan Potter and Ryan McDonald. Like the game at Boundary Park this match has all the ingredients of a superb spectacle of rugby league and worthy of television. The game will not be televised live but perhaps the two teams will meet again in the one that will be screened live - the Grand Final at Bury on Saturday 29th July!

OLDHAM

MARK CAMPBELL

One of 16 new boys brought to the club by Mike Ford during the first two months of the player coaches reign. Formerly with Leeds and Keighley Cougars, this 21 year old hardworking back-row forward is studying at Leeds University for a degree in chemical engineering.

LEO CASEY

A tough prop who played for the former Oldham club, Featherstone Rovers. Swinton and Rochdale Hornets before signing for the Roughyeds for the 1999 season. Captained the side and, at the age of 32, became a firm favourite of the crowd. Recently returned from a three match suspension after being sent off at Rochdale in the Silk Cut Challenge Cup.

JASON CLEGG

A product of Littleborough RL Club, this heavyweight prop turned pro for the Bradford Bulls and had a stint with Batley before signing for the Roughyeds shortly after the club was formed. Made a first team place his own property in 1999 and earned selection for the West Pennines side against an East side coached by Mike Ford. In superb form this season and was voted the Oldham player of the month for February.

MIKE FORD

A scrum-half who has been making the high sort of headlines all his sporting life. Played for Wigan at Wembley when only 19. Also starred for Leigh, Oldham, Castleford, Wakefield and South Queensland Crushers. Toured Down Under with Great Britain in 1988. Coached Bramley to mid-table respectability in 1999 before landing his dream job of coaching his home town club. Still a key player with an excellent kicking game.

ANTHONY GIBBONS

One half of a twin combination which played for Leeds Rhinos and Bramley before joining Oldham at the start of the 2000 season. The 23 year old is playing consistently well at centre but also helped out at scrum-half against Rochdale in the Cup.

DAVID GIBBONS

The other twin. Became a household name at Headingley and played more than 20 senior games, including several in the first Super League season of 1996. Formerly captain of Bramley, David will be a key figure for the Roughyeds at stand-off half.

DANNY GUEST

This 22 year old, 18 stone prop was an up-and-coming youngster with the Bears. Also played for Keighley and Lancashire Lynx before returning to Oldham. Has been playing mainly as a substitute this season but has been a consistent performer, as shown when scoring with his first touch of the ball in the recent rout of Lancashire Lynx.

JOEY HAYES

A young winger who has crammed a lot into his relatively short spell as a pro. Made his name with St. Helens but also played 11 Super League games for Salford City Reds last season. Turning into a real crowd favourite at Oldham and certainly must be one of the most exciting wingers in the NFP. His superb performances were rewarded with him receiving the May Player of the month award.

CHRIS HOLLAND

Aged 21. Chris has played for England and Great Britain students and took the man-of-the-match award in England's defeat by New Zealand at Hull in the last World Cup. Equally at home at centre or in the back row.

JOHN HOUGH

Will go down in local RL history as the first player to sign for the new Oldham club when it was launched in the autumn of 1997. He had two cracking seasons in 1998 and 1999, when he took the club's player of the year award. Played more than 30 senior games for Warrington before returning "home" to Oldham. Been in tremendous form again this season which was encapsulated with two superb tries in the defeat of Leigh Centurions.

KEVIN MANNION

IN THE PHYSIO ROOM

As one season starts to wind down, then another is reaching the half way stage. Today sees the last home league match of the Northern Ford Premiership season, before the play-offs start in a fortnight, but the Alliance team have just reached the half way stage in their season. The Wakefield game last Thursday was their twelfth in a twenty-four game Championship season.

As the Alliance season is predominantly a summer season, the injuries have been slightly different to that of the first team, who have played half in the mud and rain and half in the sun. This time of the season sees a different type of rugby injury with skin lesions being the worst suffered: ie. blisters, grass burns and cuts and scrapes on the hard grounds.

Blisters come about from the change in the pitch surface, where the players are changing their boots or studs, regularly. Preventative measures are essential – such as correct training and playing attire (especially footwear), protective plasters and vaseline. Cuts, abrasions and scrapes should be cleaned thoroughly following the game with various types of antiseptics. Many players from both squads are suffering from knee abrasions at present, but nothing that will keep anyone on the sidelines.

As the grounds are so dry at present, general tackles and falls to the ground can be a lot more serious than the equivalent tackle in the mud and wet grounds. A few players are suffering sore joints at the present time from tackles, which in the present climate is the equivalent of being tackled on the car park behind the main stand! Other injuries suffered on the hard grounds are jarred shoulders, turned ankles and head bangs which take a little longer to recover.

Of the injuries in the Alliance side, **Scott Dyson** went into hospital last week for minor knee surgery and had some of his cartilage removed and **Ryan Halloran** was carried off in the Hull game a fortnight ago with a groin problem. Both are having regular treatment and rehabilitation and are not too far away. Nothing to report on the first team injury front, although **Paul Delaney** is recovering well from his spinal surgery and is starting light training next week..

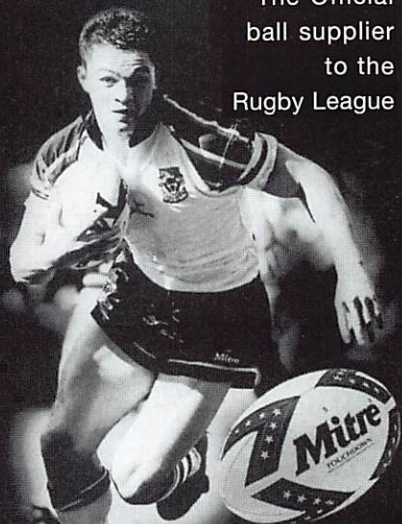

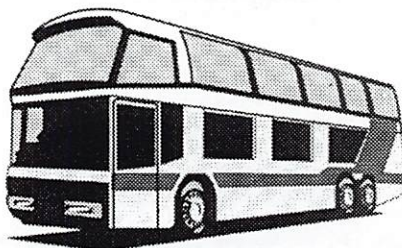

Whoever prepared the NFP fixtures must have been psychic!

That's the only conclusion I can draw when looking at the prospects in store from today's and next Sunday's matches.

With the jostling for the top eight positions so finely balanced, we find that today six out of the top eight teams are playing against each other.

Six clubs are still in contention for the top four, but of those only Dewsbury, who are three points ahead of the field, are sure of finishing in the leading four at the end of the season. The top four clubs, of course, will play against each other in the preliminary round of the play-offs, and they will have the benefit of a second bite of the cherry if they lost those games. The clubs finishing in fifth to eighth spots, on the other hand, will be playing knockout football throughout the play-offs.

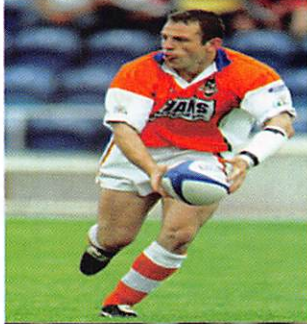
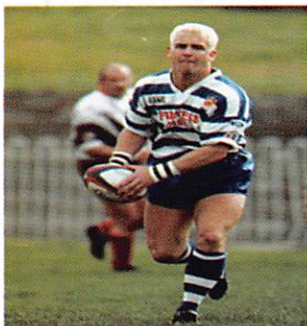


