FOLLOWING our disappointing defeat at Swinton over the weekend, which was due to a workman like Swinton team and a very poor performance by Rovers, there has been a good deal of criticism from some of our supporters, some of which are contained in other notes within this programme.

The Board, the Coaching staff and above all the Players were very disappointed with the performance, and these matters have been addressed by the Coaching Staff this week, so let's hope that we can turn in a performance that we know that the team is capable of against Oldham and also with the forthcoming home games.

The criticism that has been made by some spectators is valid, but under the present circumstances there is no short term quick fix, which the club could come up with to address the present situation. We need to look as the club in an objective manner and in the following comments I deliberately pull no punches. Regarding this as the main priority of the Board, over the past number of years and for the present time is stability. The Coaching Staff and Steve Lingard, (The Football Chairman), are fully aware of the strengths and weaknesses of the squad and on a regular basis we are in communication with other clubs and players regarding strengthening the team. Many hours are also spent by Steve Lingard and Ernest Wilby (Chief Scout), looking at potential new signings, both junior and experienced players.

Any player wishing to come to the club, and can I say players themselves contact the Club regarding the possibility of joining us, will not be signed on large contracts and playing terms which Rovers cannot afford. We have learnt the lessons of the past and contracts and playing terms will be offered within the budgeting requirements of the Club, and all playing personnel, both with us and potential, are made fully aware of this.

As described in previous notes we are also determined to keep three teams going on the basis of bringing young talent through the Academy and into the Alliance and hopefully then into the First Team. We at Featherstone believe that it is essential to have this system so that players can progress through the different teams to give them the best opportunity for development and to gain experience and also then to become a good asset for Featherstone Rovers.

We need only to look at the Rugby League scene; both in Super League and the Northern Ford Premiership, to see where Clubs are in trouble both on a financial and playing point of view. The alternative to what has been described is to have a situation, (and I use the following Clubs just as examples as there are other Clubs who are in the same situation), that if we were to pay excessive

contracts and playing terms which we clearly could not afford then we would have to disband either the Alliance Team, the Academy Team or both. Do the spectators at the Club want a Widnes situation where we are reliably informed that a player was on a £65,000.00 contract per year, has played 10 games this season, mostly from the bench and has departed to join another club. Taking into account the amount of money that Widnes have spent over the last 12 months in a bid to achieve Super League status are the results going their way? Widnes do not run an Academy Team so do not have the opportunity of signing young talent and therefore developing them into professional players of the future. Our near neighbours Dewsbury have gone one further and now do not have an Alliance or Academy Team and have therefore to be content with playing experienced players with a very limited opportunity for any young talent within the club to come through. What advantages are there to young players joining Dewsbury if there is not an Academy or Alliance Team and if they are not regularly in the first team squad then what are these players doing? Another example also is that if there are injuries to a squad player he does not have the opportunity of playing in the Alliance Team to test that injury out and also gain match fitness.

My final point in these notes is addressing the financial situation of Clubs in Super League and the Northern Ford Premiership, some players in the past have left this Club or not come to this Club because they were offered better playing terms, and after a very short time we find these Clubs are then going into administration and tearing the contracts up of those players and offering them reduced terms. We even have the extreme situation where clubs owe players a large amount of money and are allegedly in breach of contract and the players in redress are having to take the club to an Industrial Tribunal. The contracts we have at Featherstone and the playing terms fall below those which are offered by some other clubs, but putting hand on heart this Club makes sure that the players are paid what they are

I would therefore ask all spectators, who I know have Featherstone Rovers at heart, and quite rightly give valid criticism, to keep their nerve because we believe that the path which we have dedicated ourselves to is the right one. I can finally assure you that all concerned with the running of Featherstone Rovers will continue to monitor the situation and make improvements where we are able to and that these improvements will be for the benefit in the medium and long term and not affect the stability of this great club.

Get behind the team, as I know you will today and enjoy the game.







ROVERS v OLDHAM Our last encounter here at Lionheart Stadium 26th March 2000

OUR last encounter here at the Lionheart saw us up against a much stronger Oldham side than the one who were somewhat thrashed here 61-6 in 1999. The revived Oldham outfit were on the fringe of a top eight place against our third position but under Mike Ford they were rapidly making progress.

This was our twelfth game of the season and we were looking for our eighth successive league victory, not having been beaten (cup match apart) since losing

out at Doncaster back in mid January.

Oldham took Rovers by surprise as early as the third minute when some clever interplay between Gibbons and Ford made the space for Mark Sibson to score the first try of the game. A fine conversion by Pat Rich and Rovers were six points down with the game barely underway. However Rovers hit back immediately and only four minutes later Bastow had touched down for Rooney to level the scores with the resultant conversion - albeit bouncing off an upright. From this point the Rovers' attacking machine got into gear. First Stokes picked up a loose ball and showed his speed in an unassailable sprint for the line. Almost from the restart Dooler drove in strongly and set the platform for some superb handling - eventually Chapman found Jamie Stokes, who had popped up on his opposite wing, to carry on the movement and a neat inside pass to Martin Law was enough to secure Rovers' third try. With Rovers now sizzling another try - this time to Matt Lambert was not long in coming. And so it continued, next was Richard Chapman as Rovers showed just how well they could attack.

With Oldham looking in deep trouble Mike Ford produced a gem of a pass that paved the way for Sibson to collect his second try and keep them in with a shout. Only minutes later the Oldham player coach was again the driving force behind a further score, this time wingman Joey Hayes going on the score sheet following neat handling by the Oldham three-quarter line. The first half's closing moments saw a Jamie Rooney drop goal followed by a towering bomb from the young scrum half which, after a cruel bounce, enabled lan Thompson to extend Rovers' lead. With the half time score line showing 33-16 in Rovers' favour we all felt the game was surely safe.

Anyone who thought different must have been finally convinced by the time the second period was two minutes old. With the taste of oranges surely still in their mouths, one of Chapman's classic outrageous dummies paved the way for Rooney to score Rovers seventh try.

Although Oldham persisted and indeed added fen more points to their total thanks to tries by David Gibbons and his brother Anthony, the enormity of the task was too great. Rovers finished off in fine style. A second Jamie Stokes' effort brought the house down, fielding a chip through by David Gibbons, virtually under his own posts, he raced down field in spectacular fashion for the try of the game. Lowe and Rooney added further late tries, as Rovers went on to notch up exactly the same number of points as in the corresponding fixture in 1999. This victory the eighth consecutive, put Rovers in second position, their highest of the season.



WELCOME this afternoon one and all. Oldham visit today as one of NFP success stories. Things are going well on the field after starting from scratch and crowds are on the up. This lends weight to the argument that supporters want to see a

winning team no matter what level it is played.

The Rovers players and supporters are in for a tough afternoon. Injuries to Rovers' already small squad have hit hard, but the youngsters of Richard Thaler, Matt Turner and Steven Jones haven't looked out of place or let anyone down. Us supporters have been getting carried away with our lofty position with dreams of 5th or better when in reality making the top eight will be an achievement. After finishing 5th for the last two seasons surely we should be looking to build on this and go forward, but Rovers are standing still. Other clubs like Oldham, Keighley, Widnes, Hull KR and Rochdale have steadily built their squads and are stronger. At the shareholders meeting Richard Evans again reiterated Rovers' intent of reaching Super League but in my eyes the light at the end of the tunnel is turning into the gold at the end of the rainbow. Of course throwing money around we don't have is out of the question but if funds can't be raised for Peter Roe to strengthen the team by supporters coming through the turnstiles, other ways have to be found. Losing a 'star' player and Peter Roe getting none of the

money is unthinkable but if he has all the money to sign four or five proven NFP players like Gary Lord or Paul Darley to make the squad bigger would this be better? No one, least of all me, wants to see our best players leave and every supporter will have their own views on how Rovers should progress, but progress is a must. The wheels appear to have fallen off Rovers' bus and no matter how long the journey, without wheels the destination can't be reached.

This is the first of three home fixtures on the bounce. The League table shows Rovers as fifth but other clubs have games in hand, we could find ourselves as far down as tenth. Rovers have to win our home fixtures starting this afternoon. It won't be easy. Lets get behind the lads, enjoy the match and have a safe journey home

IT APPEARS we have lost the plot somewhat lately. However the injuries we have had to carry, plus the inexperience of one or two players doesn't help the situation. I have no doubt the RL will look at it kindly as they always do, ignoring as usual the requirements of any talent outside SL. If you read any forthcoming event like the Yorks V Lancs teams, or the under 21 tour of the above country the selectors keep saying that there is enough young talent to put on these

events, from the SL. Do we not exist! Is our league being ignored in the hope that it will quietly go away? Surely the RL can find a game or two to give our talented players a platform to represent our league. We need something to stimulate money coming into our competition. But nothing seems to be happening at all.

I was recently passing a charity shop and there in the window was a video 'Scrumdown, Best 101 tries of 1990. price £1.50. On impulse (I was in Pickering, of all places to spot a RL relic). I went in and bought it. Sure enough during it's playback there the Rovers were, playing superb rugby against Cas, Wakey, Bradford, Leeds, and competing with the best. What happened. Well we were sold down the river, and in reality the executives outside the top ten teams took a bit of brass to bugger off; if we were being completely honest. Now that money is coming to an end and the people who didn't want us now have all the power, and I don't see a way back. We have our dreams but without big money backing no team is going far, and I predict that guite a few SL teams will bite the dust in the next few years, along with a number of NFP clubs in their present form. When you see how the amateur game is progressing throughout the country, it could be a signpost for future development. Should we opt out of the rat race and let the rats have their boat to sail it with their RU chums. It might in the end be the best bet. A totally separate competition under our own organisation with the various Conferences. It's a sure as hell the SL and RL board don't want to know us. Have a good game safe journey home.

MARTYN SADLER applauds the competitive nature of Northern Premiership.

LAST Sunday was a bad day for three of the top five clubs in the Northern Ford Premiership.

Dewsbury suffered a decisive defeat at Rochdale; Widnes suffered a shock home defeat by Doncaster that cost their coach David Hulme his job (although Dragons fans may claim that, as they are also a top-eight side, that result wasn't really much of a shock); and Featherstone suffered a shock defeat at Swinton, although only by three points.

The fans of each of those three clubs may disagree with me, but I believe that those shock results last weekend meant that it was a great day for the NFP

competition.

The point is that a league competition thrives when its results are unpredictable, and when there are plenty of clubs in the running to win the title. And if we look at the league table as it stands today, we can see that there are still probably 14 clubs in the running for the top eight play-off places. York, Chorley and Gateshead are already out of it, and Hunslet only have seven points from twelve games. But every other club is still battling away either to retain its position in the eight, or to climb over its rivals to gain admission to that elite band of clubs.

Without any doubt the most improved club recently has been Rochdale Hornets, under their rookie coach Martin Hall. The Hornets gave Dewsbury a lesson at Spotland last Sunday, showing that their recent win at Keighley was no fluke at all. Given their

current form the Hornets must fancy their chances of getting into the eight, and their game this weekend at Hull Kingston Rovers looks to be one of the match-ups of the

season so far, with themselves, who had the bye last Sunday, currently in eighth

position.

Before last weekend Whitehaven would have been the other club I would have cited as the big improvers, but that defeat at Batley brought Haven's fivematch winning sequence to an end. I'm sure they'll soon get back on track, however, and this weekend their game against the visiting Sheffield Eagles is another to make me drool in anticipation.

I don't know who the fixture compiler is for the NFP, but that person should be given hearty congratulations for the fixtures he or she has produced for this Sunday. Apart from the two games I have already mentioned, there are plenty of other fascinating encounters. Who would want to miss Leigh's trip to Doncaster, or Keighley's visit to Widnes, or Featherstone's game Oldham. Surely we should see some big crowds and stirring contests. Even the game between Chorley and Batley looks much better than it did just over a week ago, given Chorley's 78-8 defeat of York last week at Victory Park.



THE unprecedented injury crisis that has hit the club reflected back on the Alliance team. Replacements for the first team squad left the coach with innumerable gaps to fill. This necessitated calling upon 9 Academy players, some as young as 16, plus signing Martyn Nicoll from Wakefield. After all these efforts only 16 players formed the squad.

ALL I can say about the game at Swinton last week is. have they changed the forward pass and advantage laws without telling us? I could say a lot more, but then I would only be whinging and perhaps putting myself into a position of disrepute. Still at least we were all treated to a joke, I mean of course the official in the middle, whose name will never be uttered by me again. The idea is for them to have teams in the NFP. This I believe will be a kick in the stomach for most fans of NFP teams, as no doubt it will be open to abuse, i.e. using the team for players coming back from injury or when a loss of confidence is upon the 'poor' little souls. I believe it would be much better to form a league of teams from the bottom of the NFP and allow all teams who can afford it, to sponsor a team in this league. For example should a team like Leeds have a player surplus, then they could sponsor an over age Alliance side NOT under the name of Leeds Rhinos. and whose players would play exclusively for that club until transferred officially and legally. This would give rise to the resurrection of teams such as Bramley and perhaps the saviour of teams such as Hunslet Hawks. who surely deserve better after their input to the NFP. The outcome I believe would be a more creditable NFP league with teams becoming better supported due to an improvement in standards and games. It would also allow young players who might make the grade eventually, the chance to play a professional sport. The idea being that the Yorks, Gatesheads and Chorleys, to compete on a more even keel. (Although after last weeks result for Chorley, who knows?)

MONEY is ruining football, new UEFA chief Gerhard Aigner said last week in an interview with the *Observer*. The amount of money swirling around the game, he said, and the imbalanced way the money is distributed throughout the football hierarchy, poses the real danger of alienating fans. "Football grew because everybody put in. Now everybody is trying to take out... There are too many vested, competing interests. The common interest is not evident — everyone is trying to protect their own interest..." And I thought, is he talking about football? Or is he talking about the NFP, and where it fits into Rugby League's myriad (and cross-cutting) structures and governing bodies?

Because we have those problems. Even the sums involved are similar. The £32m Leeds United will receive by beating Deportivo La Coruna, for instance, and reaching the semi-finals of the Champions League, is exactly what Featherstone Rovers won't earn in a thousand years! The £100,000 Luis Figo is getting (a week) is exactly the amount NFP clubs are receiving from News Corp this season! The zilch received by those apprentices offloaded from Lincoln City FC because the near zilch that filters down to the club from the game's controlling bodies is not enough to pay the first team players is exactly what NFP clubs will be receiving the season after next!

What's more, we in the NFP have a new chief, too, who's also of the opinion that money could be our ruin!

It's uncanny! Unlike Gerhard Aigner, though, Chris Hamilton, (albeit in his capacity as Chairman of Oldham), is sitting in the main stand here at the Lionheart Stadium today. If he's reading these notes (well, someone has to) first of all I'd like to take this opportunity to congratulate him on his appointment as Chairman of the APC. Well done Chris. Unfortunately Chris cannot now appear on the Fans Forum Panel due to Oldham's re-arranged fixture. I'll not be able to make it myself, so I'll ask some questions now.

Chris, you spoke, in your interview with Rugby League World in January, of the NFP competition's positives – its competitiveness, 'honesty' (what's that mean?), passion, high standard, etc. – and went on to talk about these as selling points, and the success of the terrestrial TV coverage we got at the end of last season. What freedom do you – as

Chairman of the APC — have to negotiate for separate TV rights? Is it not the case that the Faustian pact the game signed with Mr Murdoch a few years ago holds the NFP in a double bind? *Sky Sports* holds the rights to screen the NFP competition, yet chooses not to exercise that right. If the BBC or ITV wanted to show some of our games, they'd have to arrange it with him — or rather with News Corp. In which case wouldn't it be News Corp that would be the main financial beneficiary, rather than the NFP, or even the RFL? And if the APC were, somehow, successful in negotiating separate TV rights, wouldn't that be one step further along the road to complete severance from SLE, and a tacit acceptance that there will be no promotion or relegation? Isn't the edging towards a full return to a winter season for the NFP a similar admission? What are your thoughts on this?

Your chairmanship of the APC gives you a place on the Board of the RFL. Will you be arguing at these board meetings for the abolition of all bodies other than the RFL? That it should be the RFL that negotiates TV rights and sponsorship deals, and that the RFL then distributes the monies accruing to where the game (the game as a whole—1st division, amateur, schools, student, etc., as well as to

Super League clubs) most needs it?

Back on Planet Earth, I understand Northern Ford's sponsorship of the Premiership will cease at the end of this season. How far are you towards securing another sponsor? You said in your RLW interview that we need someone, full time, "purely and simply to sell us". How far are you with that? Where will the money to finance this post come from? You also said that with the News Corp money about to run out you worry for the future of at least half a dozen clubs. "We don't want to get to the edge of the cliff with 18 other clubs and find we're all jumping off together. I want us to see the warning signs so we can start to turn around and do something about it." Do you see much evidence that the buffoons in charge are seeing these and doing this when they can't even organise a sensible fixture list, or organise themselves into a single, coherent, governing body; when they've apparently no idea how to sell this great game of ours, games like the one we'll see here this afternoon???

I've run out of space. But that should be enough for you to think about. Good luck!


