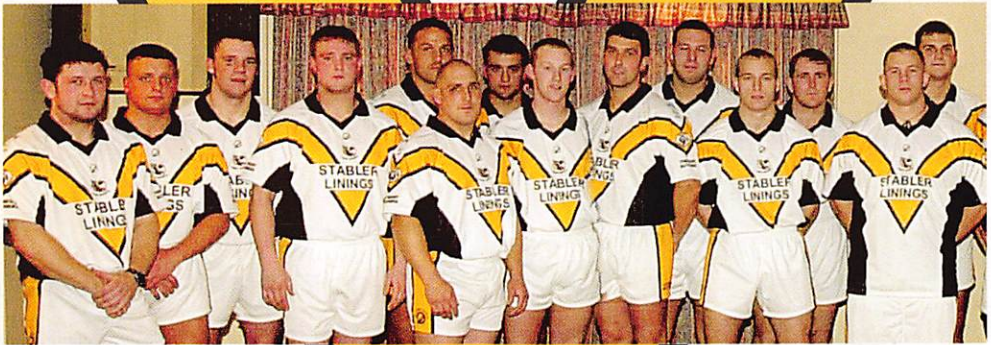

The Oldham club had just reformed that year after the collapse of the Bears following relegation from Super League the previous season. A group of 200/250 Oldham fans attended that day and "sang their hats off for their lads", for the entire 80 minutes in the popular stand. I know, I was there (during my exile) with them. Their team that day was of a similar standard to that fielded by York at Chorley recently (well not quite that bad), but the fans were just so pleased they still had a club, they just didn't care and they would not be silenced.

The cost of those players contracts playing for York that day "broke" the club. Quite a number of them were on bigger contracts than a number of star players we had at Gateshead Thunder playing in the Super League that year. Our current players, the fans, coaches and directors are all suffering as a result of that folly. Just what the goal was I have absolutely no idea - sheer madness! Hopefully the squad will be strengthened gradually as the season progresses. Tony Coleman, our new Director of Football, is trying desperately hard to recruit players to come and help our beleaguered squad and with our enforced Draconian budget (due to the CVA), that is far from being an easy task.

We're hoping and praying that everyone remaining; players, coaches, fans and sponsors, will stay with us and see us through to greener pastures in the future.

MARK SIBSON - Former Loughborough student who has had spells at Castleford and Bramley. Very elusive runner from full back, capable of scoring from long range.

JOEY HAYES - A firm favourite with the Oldham crowd. This former Super League star with St.Helens and Salford is always likely to get on the scoresheet.

ANTHONY GIBBONS - Former Leeds and Bramley player with a good step off either foot. Also one of the best defensive centres in the NFP.

PAT RICH - Geordie Law Graduate who was previously with Keighley. A very reliable goal kicker, he represented England students in the Student World Cup Final.

DANNY ARNOLD - Another player with Super League experience playing at St.Helens and Huddersfield. A prolific try scorer who can play wing, centre or full back.

DAVE GIBBONS - Twin brother of Anthony he too played at Bramley and Leeds. Very pacey with an eye for an opening. He is an aggressive defender, who also has a sound kicking game.

JASON CLEGG - A massive prop with deceptive agility. He gives the team a big go forward and a quick play the ball.

JOHN HOUGH - The clubs first ever signing, this Oldham born hooker

was the clubs player of the season last year. Very fast out of dummy half. He is a regular try scorer.

ANDY PROCTER - Club captain and a prop with a big workrate. Formerly with Wakefield and Bramley.

LEO CASEY - Now reaching the veteran stage. An Irish International prop with a wealth of experience. Former clubs include Rochdale Hornets.

DANNY GUEST - Huge young prop former with Keighley and Chorley. Has started to push through this season and big things are expected from him.

PHILLIP FARRELL - Second row who joined the club along with Neil Roden. Brother of England captain Andrew, he is probably the most exciting young second row in the NFP. A massive workrate and a great pair of hands.

PAUL NORTON - Signed in the off season from Chorley, Knocker has been one of the clubs most consistent performers. Very strong defender who can play prop or second row.

IAN SINFIELD - Oldham born player, equally at home at loose forward or second row. An aggressive defender with pace running out wide.

KEVIN MANNION - Former Student international player. A loose forward with a good pair of hands. Wigan born and another former

Rochdale player.

GARETH BARBER - Young stand off born in Oldham and signed in the summer from Warrington. A player with huge potential, he has already played a number of first team games.

DARYL LACEY - Young winger or full back signed in the summer from Wigan. A player with plenty of pace and a safe pair of hands.

DEAN CROSS - Former Widnes wing or centre with great pace. A regular try scorer.

CHRIS FARRELL - Twin brother of Phil and another summer signing from Wigan. A loose forward with great vision.

GAVIN DODD - Young full back or winger and a former student international. A very elusive runner with great pace.

LEE DORAN - Teenage prop who has been starring in the club's alliance team. A very exciting prospect.

KEITH BRENNAN - Reserve team scrum half coming back after a serious knee injury. Expected to push through strongly for a first team place when he's back to full fitness.

WARREN BARROW - Big winger signed from St Helens. A regular try scorer last season and strong finisher.

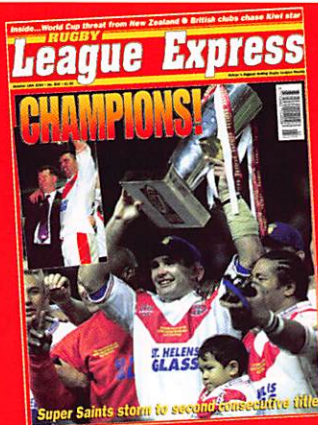

LEAGUE EXPRESS editor **MARTYN SADLER** congratulates **Doncaster Dragons** for their two stirring recent performances.

So there is life after a Creditors' Voluntary Arrangement after all.

At least that seems to be what Doncaster Dragons' experience suggests, after their recent stunning wins over Widnes and Leigh, in the latter case overturning the last unbeaten record in the Premiership.

The Dragons went into a CVA last month, causing them to offer significantly reduced contracts to their playing staff, and since then they have seen a succession of players leaving Belle Vue for greener pastures elsewhere.

Last Sunday they were forced to give a debut to 19-year-old fullback Johnny Woodcock, and, in what must have been a magical day for the young player, he scored the winning try with just three minutes to go to give the Dons a 16-11 triumph. After their 12-match unbeaten start to the competition this season, the Centurions were brought back down to earth with a bump, although not without Neil Turley managing once again to get onto the teamsheet. The Dragons have shown that you can reduce your financial commitments but continue to get good results.

This weekend we will have the biggest game of the season, as the Centurions visit Cougar Park to take on Keighley in a battle for top spot in the Premiership. It would be great to see a five-figure crowd thronging Cougar Park for that game, which certainly deserves Keighley's biggest attendance for many years.

In the meantime the debate about the timing of the NFP season rumbles on, with many different viewpoints being put forward.

I recently was speaking on a Radio Leeds phone-in about this issue, and I was followed by Featherstone general manager Terry Mullaney, a renowned supporter of Rugby League in winter. Terry made the point that the current NFP season is not reaching its full potential because it doesn't include the months of September, October and November, which are traditionally good months for watching Rugby League.

Of course he is absolutely right, but his conclusion was that we should therefore play the NFP season from September to May.

I draw a very different conclusion, however. Given that the worst months of the year are December to March - and you only have to look at the season so far to realise the truth in that statement - why not play a season that begins in the first week of April, after the switch to British Summer Time, with a Grand Final ending the season towards the end of November. Then we would play in all the best months, with a climax coming just when people are starting to think about Christmas.

With that timescale we could even have some free weekends at the height of summer for representative football, allowing fans, if they wish, to go on holiday without missing any of their club's games.

It's only a suggestion. But one thing's for sure. The question of when the NFP season should be played needs to be sorted out, the sooner the better.

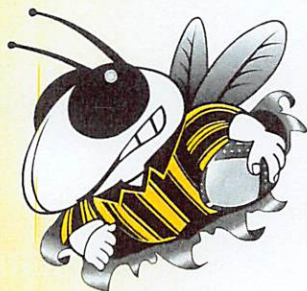

Recommended Route to Rochdale

Take the A64 towards Tadcaster turn left onto A1 continue to M1 and then onto M62 towards Manchester. Leave the M62 at junction 20 signposted Rochdale, Oldham A627M This brings you straight to a roundabout. Taking the turning marked Rochdale 3rd exit if travelling

Follow the dual carriageway to another roundabout. Take the first exit signposted Bury.

You will be on another dual carriageway for approx. 1 minute, until you reach another roundabout (with Tesco on your left hand side). Get into the middle lane here, and take the second exit onto Roch Valley Way.

Follow this road to the top until you get to a set of traffic lights (with the Cemetery Inn facing). Go straight through the lights which takes you straight onto Sandy Lane itself. Follow the road round, and you will see the football ground on your right hand side. Distance from Huntington Stadium 65miles approx. journey time 1 hour 10minutes

Recommended Route to Hunslet

Take the A64 towards Tadcaster turn left onto A1 continue to M1 turn off M1 onto A639 bear left onto M621 turn left onto Tunstall Road, then turn left onto Dewsbury Road, Then left onto Middleton Road. Distance from Huntington Stadium 32miles approx. journey time 45 minutes

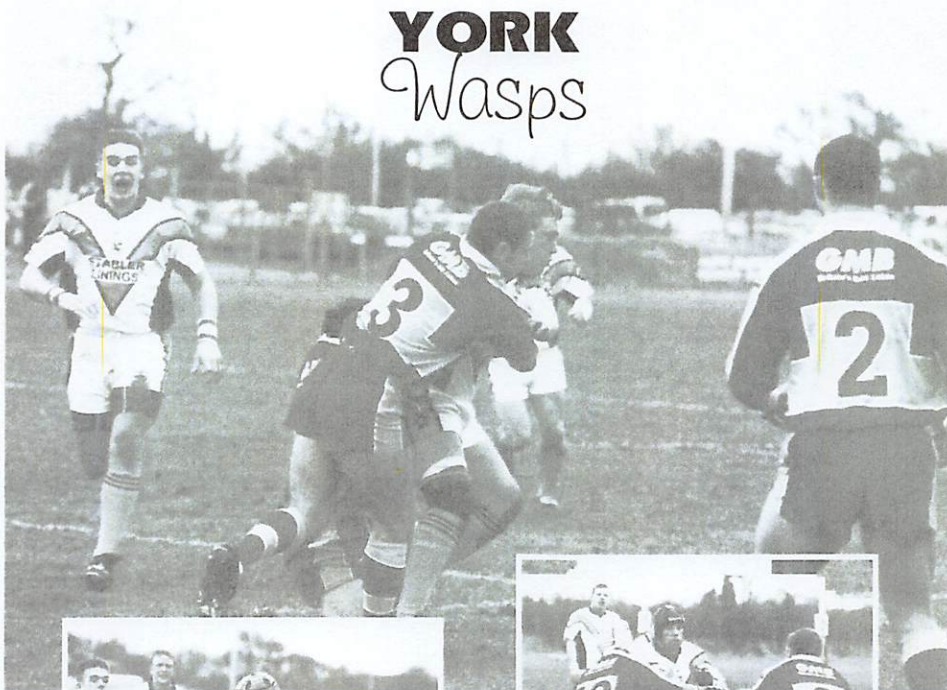

Down Memory Lane

This week we look back to 1984. The challenge cup semi - final against Wigan at Elland Road. Leeds. York from the second division and Wigan high in the first division and looking to make their 12th appearance at Wembley. York having only made one previous Wembley appearance in 1931 losing to Halifax. The game was in doubt due to the torrential rain that had fallen during the previous 24 hours. An estimated 10,000 York fans made the trip to Leeds to watch the team that had beaten first division Castleford and Wakefield in the previous rounds.

The first half was very even with Wigan going into the break with just a 4-2 lead from penalties from Colin Whitfield, the first for interference at the play the ball and the second for obstruction by Brian Hughes on Colin Whitfield. York's penalty came from Graham Steadman after Brian Case had been penalised for an off the ball incident.

The second half started with both sides in clean jerseys. Wigan applied intense pressure and on the last tackle Whitfield chipped through, John Kain the York winger dives for the ball and the ball bounces of his chest for Whitfield to score too wide, out to add the conversion.

The second Wigan try had more than a hint of luck, on the last tackle at the play the ball Stephens fumbled the ball, Mick Hughes tried to drop on the loose ball but it slips in the mud from under his body back to Stephens to feed Mick Scott who gratefully dives under the posts, Whitfield converts to make the score 14-2.

York didn't give up and continued to put Wigan under pressure, this pressure paid off 5 minutes from time when Wigan centre Whitfield sent a kick downfield which was taken by Midgely on the York 25. He was tackled, from the play the ball Gary Price made a 30 metre break and passes onto Steadman who was brought down, from the play the ball Mick Hughes passed onto Tansley who passed to Gary Smith, Smith was held up by 3 tacklers but still managed to pass to the supporting Tansley who fed on to Chris Harrison to score under the posts. Steadman added the two points to make the score 14-8 with just 3 minutes to go. From the restart Trevor Hooper shrugged of 4 would be tacklers but was brought down.

Wigan regained possession on the last tackle and played the minutes out, to achieve their first Wembley appearance in 14 years.

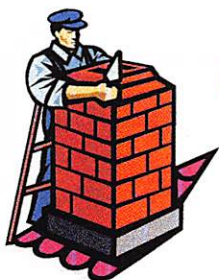

For proof that there is light at the end of the tunnel, York Wasps need look no further than today's opponents Oldham.

Many fans think the future of the Wasps is even blacker than the gloomy present.

But just three years ago, Oldham found themselves in a similar dark and imposing tunnel. The Oldham Bears, as they were known, went into liquidation in 1997 and the club was re-born as Oldham the following year.

The euphoria which greeted the club that year soon wore off to be replaced by the harsh reality of life in the lower echelons of the Rugby League.

This brief history, taken from Oldham's official website, has something of a familiar ring about it. "The club was forced to play its home matches out of town at Rochdale's Spotland Stadium. Some of their better players from the previous season had been lured to other clubs. There is no doubt that the second season for Oldham RLFC (1997 Ltd) was frustrating for all concerned with the club. A series of heavy defeats in the second half of the campaign tested the resolve of even the most diehard supporters. As a result, attendances dwindled to the faithful few".

But following a move to Boundary Park and the appointment of a former GB International, in the shape of Mike Ford, the Oldham club have turned their fortunes around.

They made it into the play-offs last season and have become one of the strongest sides in the division, despite a few poor results this season.

They have proved with hard work and dedication - and a loyal coach at the helm - that darkness is not eternal. York's embarrassing hammering by Chorley was the low point in the club's on-field history but at least there's one consolation - it can't get any worse.

If Lee Crooks was ever going to quit then that would have been the time. There's no doubt he seriously considered it - maybe even ruing his comments after the 90-6 defeat at Widnes when he insisted "I'm no quitter" - but at the end of the day he still has belief.

He knows what a fairytale story it would be if the Wasps come through this current mess and "do an Oldham". A few words today with Mike Ford, who recently signed a new three year contract with the Roughyeds, will surely convince him that he has made the right decision.
