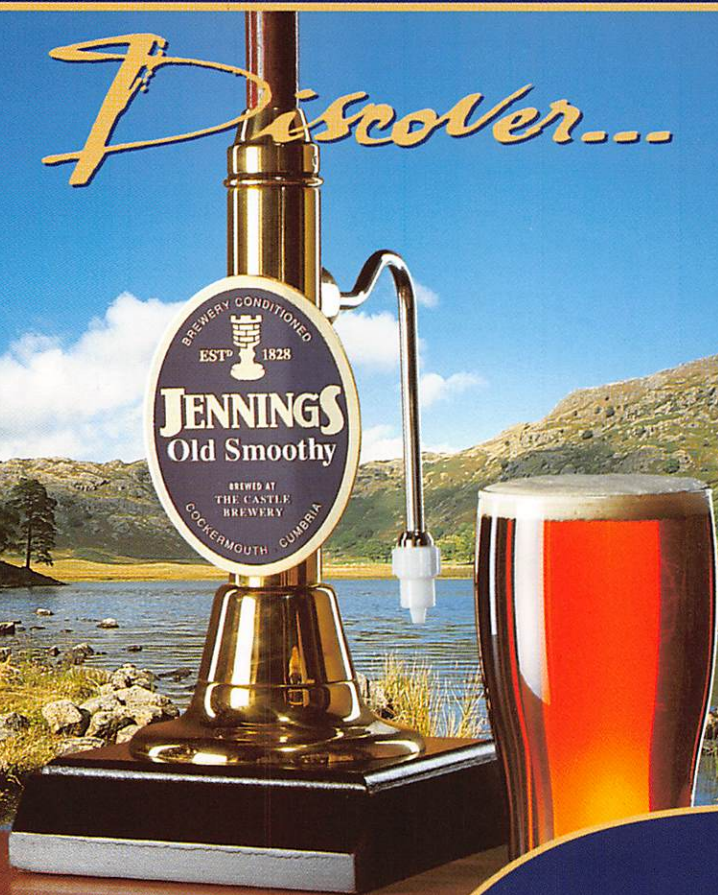

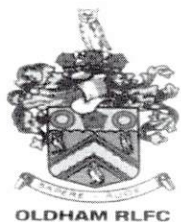

ANTHONY GIBBONS - former Leeds and Bramley player with a good step off either foot. Also one of the best defensive centres in the NFP.

winger or full back with great pace. A regular try scorer.

CHRIS FARRELL - Twin brother of Phil and another summer signing from Wigan. A loose forward with great vision.

GAVIN DODD - Young full back or winger and a former student international. A very elusive runner with great pace.

Alan McCurrie

The former Haven hooker a Wembley finalist with Wakefield Trinity who now coaches Oldham amateurs Waterhead

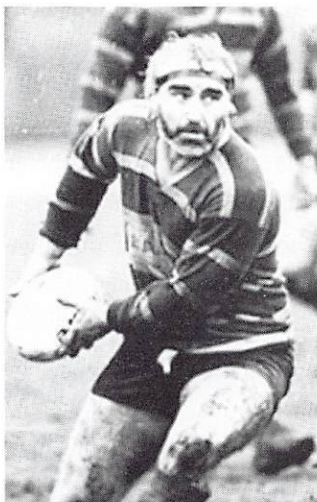
Alan became the latest in the long list of fine hookers to wear the no 9 shirt for Haven, when he signed from the Hensingham amateur club as a 19yr old in 1972. Haven had dispensed with their A team in the 71-72 season, and despite having represented both Cumbria and GB at amateur level, the presence of veteran Eddie 'Tally' Thompson in the hooking role meant that opportunities in those early days were limited to a handful of appearances. By the start of the 74-75 season however, Alan had made the no 9 shirt his own, one which he would occupy for the next four seasons.

"It was after a cup game at Central Park in 1978 that Wigan expressed an interest in me recalled Alan. The Wigan interest didn't go any further but I thought I was playing well enough to give it a go at a higher level, and when Wakefield came in with an offer it was an opportunity I couldn't turn down."

Alan was transferred to Trinity in Sept 78 for £10,000 and in his first season went on to play in the 79 cup final versus Widnes, at Wembley. A dour game, with one of the few highlights an 80-yard try from Widnes's Stuart Wright, who ran out winners by 12-3. Lance Todd trophy winner that day was Trinity captain Dave Topliss who Alan describes as,

"One of the classiest players I have ever played with, a man who played with courage far above his size in days when half-backs were frequently the victims of some dubious off the ball tackles."

Alan, a proud Cumbrian, represented the



Cumbria team that won the county championship in 79 & 80 and he was privileged he says, to play with two of the most underrated players of the 70's in Tom Gainford and Gordon Cottier, who he feels, would have achieved International recognition with a more fashionable club.

After leaving Trinity, Alan had a spell with Oldham before re-signing for Haven at the start of the 86-87 season where he saw out his pro career. "When I had finished playing at professional level I was keen to have a go at coaching explained Alan and had a reasonable amount of success with firstly Maryport and then Lowca amateurs." Alan was postmaster at Hensingham post office when son Steve signed for Widnes, and he himself was offered the job of coaching the academy side. Alan was later appointed assistant coach at Widnes to Frank Myler which included another disappointing visit to Wembley, ending in a

20-14 defeat by Wigan in the 93 cup final, a game incidentally, in which Kurt Sorensen made a final try scoring appearance in a Widnes shirt before moving to Haven as player-coach.

Alan furthered his coaching career when he joined Andy Goodway as assistant coach at Oldham in the inaugural super league season of 96.

"We did reasonably well in that first season, recalled Alan we finished fifth from the bottom, but above Castleford and Leeds. The following season, however was a different tale when we finished bottom of the table and the club went into liquidation. We lost quite a few games by the odd points games that if the luck had been with us we may have won."

These days Alan, aged 48 and his wife Judy, still live in Oldham where he coaches amateur club Waterhead who are presently in the 1st division of the national conference league. An indifferent season has seen the loss of several key players but, nevertheless resulted in a third consecutive appearance in the Oldham cup final.

Alan is now a self-employed driving instructor, and any spare time he has after his driving and rugby commitments, is devoted to the breeding of parrots, a hobby which must be a first for an ex Rugby League forward! He always keeps a check on Haven's progress and in particular Howard Hill, who Alan was responsible for signing during his spell with Oldham.

Tom Hill, John McKinnell and present incumbent Aaron Lester have provided Haven with a wealth of talent at no 9 over the years, Alan McCurrie was certainly no exception.

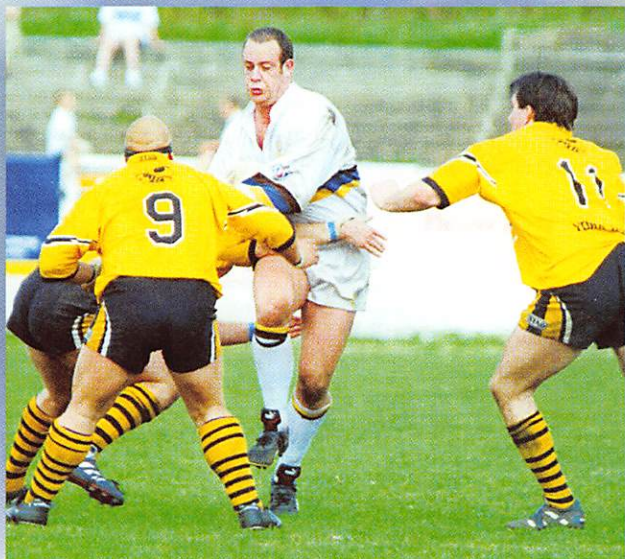

RUGBY LEAGUE EXPRESS

LEAGUE EXPRESS Editor MARTYN SADLER looks forward to the culmination of the NFP league season with relish, and pays tribute to Widnes star Phil Cantillon

AS we move into the final three weekends of the league campaign, the Northern Ford Premiership continues to throw up surprises.

The biggest one last weekend was Keighley Cougars' complete demolition of a Doncaster side still very much in the play-offs race. Despite the defection of the majority of their first team squad mid-way through the campaign,

Cougars' coach Steve Deakin has managed to quickly rebuild, and his side is now in an excellent position to make the top eight play-offs.

Elsewhere, Cumbrians Workington and Whitehaven were both unlucky not to have recorded wins against Leigh and Rochdale respectively. Both Town and 'Haven were ahead going into the final five minutes, but late tries from the Centurions and Hornets condemned them to defeat. However, Town and 'Haven still have very realistic chances of pushing for a top eight place, although Paul Cullen's side won't be able to lose another game and must beat Oldham this afternoon.

At the Auto Quest Stadium last weekend, Widnes hooker Phil Cantillon wrote himself into the record books by taking his try scoring tally for the season to 42 - the highest ever for a forward in British Rugby League, overtaking Ellery Hanley's previous record of 41. The lightning quick Cantillon has consistently been a shining light for the Vikings during his three-year stint at the club, and was nominated for the NFP Player of the Year award in 2000. After his phenomenal achievements this season, he could be

set to go one better this time around.

And Leigh fullback Neil Turley must be looking over his shoulder now in his battle to remain as the competition's top try scorer.

Meanwhile the NFP clubs still haven't decided when they want next season to begin. The good news for advocates of promotion and relegation is that the clubs did reverse their decision to move the season back to September, with just three clubs supporting that motion at a recent Rugby League Council vote. They have now pencilled in a December 9 start, but will wait until the recently established Strategic Planning Committee gives its verdict on what would be best for the competition.

They may recommend a return to an NFP season running alongside Super League in summer. In the meantime the uncertainty cannot be good for the game, and needs to be sorted out quickly. Forward-thinking clubs already looking towards next year must be finding it difficult to offer their players new deals, not knowing when the new season will begin.

Amid all this indecision, it seems as though the only people not being listened to are the supporters. One outlet for your views is the totalrl.com Fans Forum, where you can join in with an ongoing debate or start your own. Visited by fans from all over the country, it is a platform from which to put your view across. What month do you think the next NFP season should start in next season? Would a December start be more beneficial than a February one?

One thing's for sure, the action on the field in this competition continues to warrant better organisation off it.

FARRELL AIMS FOR 1,000 GOALS

ANDREW FARRELL of Wigan Warriors needs three goals for a career total of 1,000 in British club and representative matches. The loose forward's 997 goals include nine drop goals in 301 appearances. He has kicked 932 for Wigan and 65 in representative matches, including 28 in Tests for Great Britain.

Farrell holds the Super League records for goals in a season with 151 in 2000 and goals in a career with 648.

He has been the leading goal scorer (all club, cup and representative matches) in three seasons with 163 in 1997, 164 in 1998 and 183 in 2000. His best match feat is 15. He has also kicked 11 in a match twice and 10 six times. A former Orrell St. James amateur, Farrell made his senior debut for Wigan as a substitute in a 32-8 Regal Trophy second round home win against Keighley Cougars on 24 November 1991. He made seven more substitute appearances before starting in the second row in a 27-14 League win at Warrington on 12 April 1993, scoring a try.

Wigan legend Jim Sullivan holds the record for most goals in British club and representative rugby league with 2,867 from 1921 to 1946. Farrell is still some way behind the top 20.

LEIGH GO FOR RECORD WINNING RUN

LEIGH CENTURIIONS will equal the club record winning run in all matches of 14 if they win their next game. Their current run of 13 wins consists of 12 Northern Ford Premiership matches plus the Trans-Pennine Cup final. Their last defeat was 16-11 at Doncaster Dragons on March 25.

The club record of 14 has been achieved twice. It was set in 1981-82 from November to February when they won 12 in the old First

Division (Slalom Lager Championship) plus two RL Challenge Cup-ties. The record was equalled in 1985-86 when they won 14 successive old Second Division matches from March to May.

HUDDERSFIELD FACE ANOTHER RECORD RUN OF DEFEATS

HUDDERSFIELD GIANTS will equal the Super League record run of 17 defeats if they lose their next match. Huddersfield set the unwanted record with 17 successive defeats from June 1998 to April 1999.

Their current run of defeats began with two at the end of last season and their opening run of 14 defeats this year is also a record for the start of a Super League season.

Huddersfield's last Super League win was 16-14 at home to Wakefield Trinity Wildcats on 3 September 2000. The losing run began with Tony Smith's first match officially in charge as coach, so the Australian has yet to win a Super League match. Huddersfield had lost two and won one while he was awaiting a work permit. Huddersfield's last victory in any competition was a 38-24 Silk Cut Challenge Cup fifth round home defeat of Doncaster Dragons on 25 February. They have since lost 15 successive Cup and League matches.

TURLEY SEEKS LEIGH TRY RECORD

NEIL TURLEY of Leigh Centurions needs four tries to equal the club record of 49 in a season. This is the 21-year-old's first season as a senior player after being signed from Wigan Warriors in January 2000.

The Leigh record was set by English-born centre Steve Halliwell in 1985-86 in his first season of English rugby league after being brought up in Australia. Halliwell played in 38 of Leigh's 43 matches and all but one of his tries were scored

in League matches to give him a record old Division Two total of 48. Turley's 45 tries are already a record for a full back in a season and have come in only 26 match-

es. His total includes a club record-equaling six in a match, against Workington Town. He has also scored five and four tries in a match plus four other hat-tricks. He has failed to touch down in only four matches in which he has played.

Turley has scored 42 tries in the Northern Ford Premiership, two in the Trans-Pennine Cup Final and one in the Silk Cut Challenge Cup. He has also scored one try for Lancashire against Yorkshire.

CANTILLON BREAKS FORWARD TRY RECORD
PHIL CANTILLON, the Widnes Vikings hooker, broke the record for tries in a season by a forward with three in the 72-18 Northern Ford Premiership home defeat of Chorley Lynx taking his total to 42.

The previous record was held by Ellery Hanley with 41 tries at loose forward for Leeds in 1994-95. Hanley played in 34 of Leeds' 42 matches and also played one match each for Yorkshire and Great Britain without scoring. He scored 29 tries in the old Division One plus 12 in Cup-ties. Cantillon has been hooker in all 28 matches for Widnes this season and has scored 38 tries in the Northern Ford Premiership plus four in the Silk Cut Challenge Cup. His total includes a club record seven against York, which is also a match record for a hooker. He has also scored five tries in a match this season, four tries twice and one other hat-trick.

His 42 tries, of course, is also a record total for

a hooker in a season, having set the previous record with 30 last season. The 24-year-old has had spells at Wigan, Keighley, Leeds, Bramley and Whitehaven.

MILESTONES

TOMMY MARTYN of St. Helens needs two tries for a career century of touchdowns for the club.

GARY MERCER of Warrington Wolves needs one try for a career century of touchdowns in British club rugby league. The New Zealander has scored 17 for Bradford, 17 Warrington, 43 Leeds and 22 Halifax.

GRAHAM HOLROYD of Salford City Reds needs one goal for a career total of 500, including drop goals. He has scored 387 for Leeds, 92 Halifax, 17 Salford and three for Emerging England.

ROBBIE PAUL of Bradford Bulls needs three tries for a career century of touchdowns for the club.

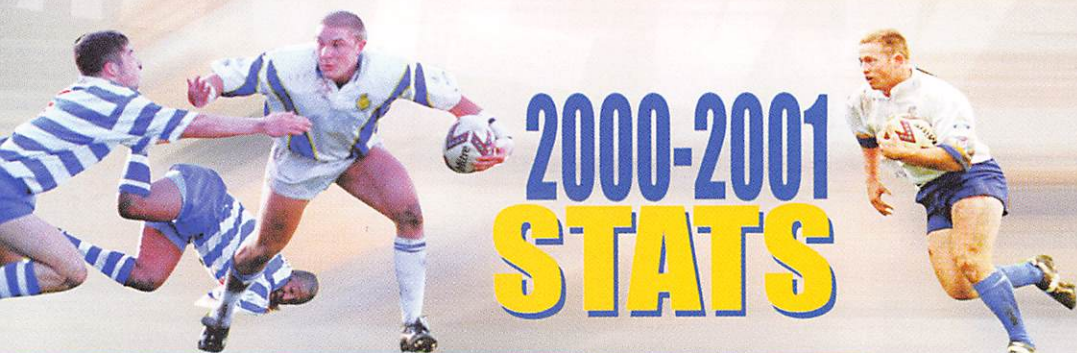
