PREMIERSHIP

MARTYN SADLER , editor of League Express, looks at the prospect of an Origin game for the Northern Ford Premiership.

FEATHERSTONE Rovers coach Peter Roe raised an interesting proposal last week, that the Northern Ford Premiership should look at staging its own "Origin" match next

Áfter what was widely regarded as being a successful venture in Super League this year, Roe suggested that a weekend be set aside next season for an Origin double-header, with both Super League and NFP games taking place at the same stadium on the same day.

He also explained that the NFP competition could incorporate Cumbria. That would be a good idea, particularly with the growing strength of Whitehaven and Workington in this season Is NFP competition. How a three-way tournament would be formatted has yet to be discussed, but importantly the idea received initial support from APC Chairman Chris Hamilton, who welcomes any form of representative rugby at this level.

It would also be welcomed, surely, by the supporters, clubs and players in the Premiership. It was noticeable at this year's Super League Origin game that a number of Leigh Centurions' supporters made the journey to Headingley to cheer on the only NFP representative Neil Turley, and fans of other clubs would surely be interested to see how their best players fare in a high profile game.

Already people are discussing which of their players could be included in such squads. In recent years, the NFP has been dominated by clubs in Yorkshire, with the Grand Final winners all coming from that side of the Pennines in the shape of Wakefield, Hunslet and Dewsbury. But this year there is a possibility that the top four will be made up entirely of teams from Lancashire.
Representing the Red Rose county could be the likes of Danny Sculthorpe (Rochdale),

Simon Baldwin (Leigh), Phil

Farrell (Oldham) and Phil Cantillon (Widnes). And there could be a number of coaches in line to take charge of the squad, such as Oldham's Mike Ford - who was assistant to the senior

Lancashire team this year - Mike Gregory of Swinton or Rochdale's Martin Hall.

In the Yorkshire side we could see Featherstone scrum half Jamie Rooney, Barry Eaton (Dewsbury), Richard Goddard (Sheffield) and Martin Wood (Keighley). They would also have plenty of coaches to choose from, including Yorkshire-born Neil Kelly, Mark Aston of Sheffield and Roe himself, who was assistant to Lee Crooks for the senior Yorkshire side.

Then there is the Cumbrian side, which would certainly fancy its

chances.
Workington's Carl Sice and
Graeme Lewthwaite, Mark Cox
and the Purdham brother at
Whitehaven, and Darren Holt and
Ade Gardner of Barrow are a
handful of players who would
come into contention. And any of
the coaches in charge of the three
professional clubs would be
worthy candidates for that
coaching role.
Sound interesting? If it was
marketed and promoted correctly,

it could develop into a series that was anticipated with excitement by all fans in the NFP. If they did set aside weekends, as Roe is proposing, it would also avoid the problems with the last time a representative fixture was scheduled for the competition. In 1999 there was an East versus West match, but because it was played as a curtain raiser to the Grand Final, many of the competition's best players could not be involved. Certainly, anything that can continue to promote this superb competition

could only raise its profile.

A FUTURE FOR RUGBY IN KEIGHLEY?

They say that good always comes out of bad and one of the main things that has come out of Cougars financial crisis recently has been the way the people of Keighley have come to the aid of the club and helped it through. This, in the shape of local businesses and moreover local players have shown that pride, commitment and loyalty to their own town's club can sometimes overcome when odds are stacked against them. As far as the players are concerned it's normally only been in the local cup games that we have seen such commitment and passion. Now these same lads have had a chance to show this for their local team. To view this in the long term it may well have

set the foundations for what I think should be the radical idea of ONE TOWN and ONE CLUB. Here in Keighley we have three amateur teams plus the Cougars Cubs doing their own thing and, it must be said, sometimes actually working against the interests of each other. We must consign this to the past and for the sake of the game of Rugby League both in Keighley and throughout the rest of the country I believe that here in Keighley, always the home of innovation in our sport, this revolutionary idea CAN happen. With a director of coaching and the experience that already exists within the four clubs

maybe now is the time to

pool all our resources and pull all these clubs together making just one club - utilising all our facilities i.e. coaches, committees, training and playing facilities and local business's sponsoring one association, developing all our players through one club to represent our town and forcing our leagues as in the National Conference that to play in Northern Ford you must have a youth set up permanently in place. 1st team, (Conference or Alliance), open age, youth teams, and schoolboy teams, continually developing all the way through. The social facilities must also be exploited and could be used both on both Saturdays and

Sunday's creating continual revenue twelve months of the year for both after match functions and special events. This is a radical and revolutionary proposal but it is one that MUST be put into place. The alternative is the stagnation and possible extinction of the game of Rugby League that while hitting the amateur game now will in turn reach the professional game in the near future. We must put aside the parochialism that has held back our game in the past and look forward so that we can pass on the 'beautiful game' to our children for them to enjoy and nurture in the future. 
TALKING OUT OF...

HOME THOUGHTS

THE forgotten man of Rugby League reappeared at Cougar Park in the Doncaster game, in the shape of Leroy Rivett.

A surprise inclusion after reportedly signing for the York Wasps earlier in the week, Rivett made an immediate impact coming off the bench to score two tries in the Cougars mightily impressive win against one of their nearest rivals for a play off spot.

In Rivett, the Cougars have signed a player who is currently steeped in the game's history. It is only two years ago in 1999 since he was representing his hometown club, the Leeds Rhinos, in the last Challenge Cup final to be played at Wembley. Playing in the game is an honour itself; however, Rivett went further, becoming the first player to score four tries in the game, and also walking off with the Lance Todd trophy, which is awarded to the man of the match. It was Leeds first victory in the competition for twenty one years, a fact that made their emphatic victory against the London Broncos, and Leroy's achievement, all the more sweeter. He was also present in the Leeds side that narrowly lost to Wigan in the Super League's first ever top five play off final at Old Trafford in 1998.

During his time in the blue and amber Leroy benefited greatly from the guidance that he received from the Rhinos former coach Graham Murray which culminated in him being called up to Great Britain training squad. Although appearing in the 2000 Challenge Cup final at Murrayfield where the Rhinos were defeated by the Bulls, he never really featured in Dean Lance, Murray's successor at Leeds, plans.

Subsequently this led to him being loaned out last season to the Huddersfield Giants, and when this move didn't work out, he was released by the Rhinos when his contract expired.

From seemingly having the world at his feet a couple of years ago, he found himself not being attached to a club at the beginning of the Super League season. This must have been a far cry from the grandeur of 1999.

Warrington Wolves have until recently had Rivett on trial, and their loss could turn out to be the Cougar's gain. Although only signed until the end of the season, Keighley have got themselves a real crowd pleaser who has few equals in his position in the competition. Together with the enthusiasm and commitment being shown by the players in recent weeks this may be just the edge that they need to make an impact in the play off's.

It may also give Leroy the chance to kick start his career again, as he definitely has age and experience on his side.

INTERESTINGLY another familiar face has also reappeared in the NFP in recent weeks, in the guise of former Cougar Jason Critchley. Released from his Rugby Union contract with the French club Dax, he has signed for the resurgent Whitehaven with the specific aim of helping them push for a top eight place. Another incentive for Critchley will no doubt be the forthcoming home internationals for which he will be eligible to play for Wales. IAN STRICKLAND
