

youngsters in the A team, who entertain



League Express

Let's keep the Cup flowing

MARTYN SADLER, the editor of Rugby League Express, wonders whether the RFL should look again at the nature and format of the Rugby League Challenge Cup.

The Kellogg's Nutri-Grain Challenge Cup will spring into life for the Northern Ford Premiership clubs on the last weekend of this month, when the NFP clubs take on the amateurs who have won through to the third round of the competition.

For me the impact of the draw is reduced somewhat by its artificial nature, with the 19 NFP clubs being deliberately kept apart from each other in the 18 ties being drawn out of the hat. The only tie that will be contested entirely by NFP clubs is the one between Gateshead and Featherstone, which will take place at the Thunderdome. Other than that, there will be two ties between NFP clubs and French clubs, and 15 ties between NFP clubs and amateur clubs.

At least this year the amateur clubs have been given the chance to play home games in the Challenge Cup, provided they can find a ground to play on that meets minimum standards.

Nonetheless, for a long time I have believed that we need to look closely at the structure of the Challenge Cup, and its place within the Super League and NFP seasons, especially when the NFP moves once again to become a competition to be played mainly in summer from 2003.


With the rugby union Six Nations competition likely to be played over a seven


week period in February and March next year, the TV slots for the Challenge Cup are likely to be fewer and farther between from then, and perhaps now is the time to decide whether we really want the Cup final to be played at the end of April, or whether we want it to move to a point later in the year.

The final could be play at the time of the Whit Bank Holiday, at the end of May, for example. Or it could be played in July, or even during the Bank Holiday weekend at the end of August. Because I'm certain that the Challenge Cup sits uneasily in its current slot as a virtual pre-season competition, which is what it has been for the Super League clubs since 1996, and what it will be for both Super League and the NFP from next season.

The Challenge Cup final was always one of the climaxes of the Rugby League season, coming as it did almost at the very end of the season, shortly before the old Championship finals. While I don't think it should be played in September or October, I personally think that July would be a very good option, which the Whit Bank Holiday possibly the next best option.

I must say that I was surprised that the RFL's Strategic Review of the game, that took place last season, didn't appear to give any serious consideration to the place of the Challenge Cup in the Rugby League year as a whole. Perhaps now is the time to start having those thoughts if we want to the Cup to retain its historical importance in the game.



Oldham Roughyeds

Under the Spotlight



eather permitting rugby league action should return to Ram Stadium this afternoon with the visit of Oldham. It has been a pretty traumatic start to the

season for the club and hardly the one Chairman Chris Hamilton would have hoped for following their relatively successful season in 2001.

They were faced with logistical problems before the season started when they failed to reach agreement for the use of Boundary Park after being faced with a bill of £150,000 per season if they wanted to continue to share the ground with Oldham Athletic FC. The club considered a number of alternatives but eventually settled on a move to Ashton United's Hurst Cross ground. Ashton play in the Unibond league which is two levels below the Football League Third Division. The club doesn't attract large crowds and prior to the start of the rugby season the facility wasn't really geared up to accommodate the large number of Oldham fans that follow their team both at home and away. These concerns seemed to unsettle Tameside Council and they prevented the Roughyeds from playing Swinton on the opening day of the season because of their concerns over a number of safety issues.

The Oldham board have worked hard to resolve these issues and the club got the go-ahead to play Rochdale Hornets on the Christmas weekend only for the game to fall foul of the frosty weather. With a blank weekend the second weekend of the season the season got off to a frustrating start. With a total lack of match action it was no surprise that they went down 26–10 away at Hull KR as their season finally got under way. However the bad weather meant that it was the only game they would play until the New Year.

Oldham's problems were made greater when they received the news that coach Mike Ford was to leave to take up a position as the defensive coach for the Irish Rugby Union team. Ford, a nominee for the NFP Coach of the Year Award last season understandably saw it as a great career move. It came on the back of a 46-12 defeat at Leigh Centurions and while there was no suggestion that the defeat helped him make up his mind to leave it must have been a contributory factor. Chairman Chris Hamilton was understandably annoyed at losing his highly rated coach accusing the IRU of tapping the player up. Ford's departure has meant that Alliance coach Mark Knight has stepped up to take over the reins with the Chairman indicating that Knight could be considered for the job if the

results go in his favour in the meantime.

There's no doubt that the Oldham team will be fired up for today's visit to the Rams if the want to go one better than they did last season. After finishing in 4th place behind Leigh, Widness and Oldham they upset the odds to reach the Grand Final. They took the away route to Gigg Lane winning 15-14 at Leigh Centurions and 39-32 at Rochdale Hornets. Unfortunately they didn't reproduce that away form in the final itself and they were beaten 24-14 by Neil Kelly's Widness Vikings with the Vikings fielding three players, Richard Agar, Sean Richardson and Matthew Long who had appeared for the Rams earlier in the season. Both Richardson and Long also played in the Rams team that beat Oldham 18-13 at Ram Stadium on 11th March. The Rams are of course much changed since then with only Adrian Flynn, Andy Fisher and Gavin Wood still in the squad. Oldham have retained many of last season's players and their experience will be of great benefit as the club attempts to make up on lost time. How they will fare without their guiding hand of recent seasons remains to be seen but it is hard to imagine that they will not make the play offs and of course clinch an all important top nine spot.

Last season we only faced each other once in the league and that game was at Ram Stadium and it it's the same again this season although we do visit Oldham in the National Cup. For us not to visit Oldham in the league for two successive seasons would appear to be a criticism of the fixture planners and doesn't really seem to make much sense. But all that changes at the end of this year (or will it!).

For both teams there's much to play for and for Oldham another chapter in their long history that started when they entered the league in 1895-96. They have endured a number of ground changes and they have struggled to keep the great name of Oldham alive at times especially following their liquidation in 1997. The club has won almost every major honour open to them over the years. Their fans have backed the club to the hilt and they have a board of directors and an energetic chairman who care about the club and the game. We wish them well for the remainder of this season and for the future but hopefully we won't be giving them too many presents on the field this afternoon. Enjoy the game.

Oldham Roughyeds Pen Pics

NEIL RODEN A clever half-back who joined Oldham from Wigan, with Farrell, a season and a half ago. Has only missed a couple of games since. Can play stand-off or scrum-half and was a key figure in Oldhams run through to the NFP Grand Final last summer. A knee injury kept him out of the pre-season warm-up games, but he is sure to be a regular performer in the long and testing 2002 campaign.

BRYAN HENARE Joined Oldham midway through last season from St Helens on loan. A Kiwi backrower who has played for Auckland Warriors, Henare played a prominent role in Oldham's surge to the Grand Final in July, 2001 before signing permanently for the club for 2002 on a one-year contract. SIMON KNOX One of a handful of new recruits for 2002, Simon made his name with Bradford Bulls and Widnes Vikings before signing for Roughyeds in September. He was an outstanding player for Widnes against Oldham in the Grand Final at Spotland last July and it was soon after the final that Oldham started

the overtures to sign him.

TOMMY HODGKINSON Much-travelled and vastly experienced back-row forward, Tommy joined the Roughyeds from Widnes a week after his Auto Quest Stadium team mate Simon Knox followed a similar path. Did well in the Oldham warm-up games and is expected to be a key figure in Oldhams plans.

GAVIN DODD A local youngster who is learning the ropes at Oldham. A wing or full-back, the 20-year-old Gavin played for the NFP under-21s at Widnes and is sure to be pushing for a regular spot this season, either as competition for Mark Sibson at full back or as a lively winger, who knows how to get to the line.

LEE DORAN Another young player in whom Oldham have alot of confidence. A Wiganer, Lee has worked his way through the Oldham Academy and Alliance sides and is now on the verge of breaking through to the first team on a regular basis. Showed up well for the NFP under-21s, one of five Oldham players in the squad.

GARETH BARBER 20-year-old Oldham born stand-off who was reared on rugby with his best pal, the Leeds and Great Britain forward Kevin Sinfield. When Sinfield signed for Rhinos, Barber signed for Warrington, but returned 'home' to Oldham before the start of last season. Seven Roughyeds first team appearances behind him. Played for the NFP under-21s at Widnes in the Autumn.

JOE McNICHOLAS One of the original 1997 Roughyeds, wingman joe made a first-team in his own midway through last season and went on to score eight tries in 14 consecutive appearances. Fast off the mark and good on his feet.

DANNY QUEST Another of the Roughyeds 'originals' who returned to the club two seasons ago. A big prop, he is expected to be a force in the NFP this season after signing a new, one year deal.

JOHN HOUGH The first player to sign for his home town club when the new Roughyeds were formed by Chris Hamilton and his fellow directors in the autumn of 1997. Before the start of last season he had played in 87 of the club's 90 matches and had scored 32 tries, a phenomenal record for a hooker. he didn't enjoy one of his best seasons in 2001, but a change of job, and less travelling, should see him back at his best in 2002.

JASON CLEGG Second biggest forward at the club, behind Quest. Jason is a former Bradford (Northern, not Bulls) froward, who has had four good seasons with Oldham. Powerful on the break, he is a people's favourite, who regularly picks up junior player of the year awards.

DAVID GIBBONS Anthony's twin. The brothers have moved around together throughout their rugby league careers with Leeds, Bramley and now Oldham. Vice captain last season, stand off David has been appointed one of TWO Oldham captains this term and is sure to be one of coach Mike Ford's leading lights.

MARK SIBSON Quick fullback who loves nothing better than to attack from deep. Joined Oldham on a two year contract when he left Bramley at the same time as boss Mike Ford, the Gibbons boys and Andy Proctor and has recently signed a new one year deal.

PHIL FARRELL The other Oldham captain in a new move that ford believes will work well to the benefit of the entire squad. Phil, younger brother of Wigan and GB ace Andy Farrell, didn't miss a match last season and in his two last seasons with the Roughyeds, has a remarkable record of consistency. Played for the NFP's under 21's against their Super League counterparts at Widnes.

JOHN BRADDISH Signed from St Helens on long term loan. Top goal kicker in the Alliance Championship last season and also leading point scorer in that competition. Wanted a change of club because of limited senior opportunities at Knowsley Road and he turned down several other offers to join Oldham where he is devolping his half back skills.

JON GODDARD A 19 year old and the youngest member of the squad. Cas lad Jon has joined Oldham on loan from Castleford thanks to the old pals act. Graham Steadman is a firm friend and former team mate of Ford and 'steady' looking to his old mate to bring Goddard along and devolp his skills in the NFP.

The Super league Grand Final is normally time for the BBC Radio Leeds Rugby League Producer to put his metaphoric feet up. But then came the controversy of the Ashes tour to deal with. The Kangaroo's decision to call off the tour was met with horror on both sides of the world. In the end they were shamed into coming albeit with a truncated tour. There subsequently followed the customary 2-1 series defeat but there was much to take heart from and next July's one-off test down under may be our chance to set the record straight once and for all.



Premiersh

The recent spell of wintry weather has played havoc with the fixture list especially over the Christmas and New Year period and much of the talk in the pubs and clubs has had to be directed at off the field activities. It was meant to be the final wave to winter rugby (has that been said before??) but it went out with a wimper rather than a bang. Oldham managed to play a pre-Christmas game but probably wished they hadn't when they were beaten 46-12 by Leigh in spite of being 12-6 ahead at half time. Oldham were full value for their half time lead but they were on the receiving end of a 16 minute blast from Leigh who scored four tries during this crucial period. Oldham could not overcome the 20 minute period when they were down to 12 men as forward Leo Casey spent two spells in the sin bin for holding down in the tackle offenses. Elsewhere that Sunday Batley

edged home 28-14 at Chorley Lynx and Rochdale Horners won a thriller at snowbound Spotland. Wingman Sean Cooper collected a hat-trick of tries for the home team and Alex Godfrey crossed for a couple for the Rovers as he renewed acquaintances with five former Rams team-mates.

The only game to beat the weather on Boxing Day was up in Cumbria where a crowd of 3,690 saw Whitehaven continue their impressive start to the season. Once again the visitors were ahead at the interval but three tries in 13 minutes midway through the second half sent Whitehaven on their way to a 28-14 derby triumph. Both teams had star players at half back with Leroy Joe again outstanding for Whitehaven and Martin Wood bringing some class to the Town play. Featherstone Rovers game against Huddersfield was postponed on Boxing Day and then re-arranged for the following day. That decision seems to have upset Giants coach Tony Smith who felt that his full time squad of players, the only full time squad in the NFP, didn't have enough time to prepare for both games especially with a McAlpine clash against struggling Keighley on the cards five days later. He

criticised the Featherstone club in the media accusing them of failing to put down sheets to cover the pitch. Now if they're too lazy to do it themselves on Christmas Day, then I would have driven over myself, were his words that were reported in the League Express. He accused the club of forgetting to put down the covers, a claim that Rovers deny. Rovers officials were clearly annoyed by Smith's comments and replied that they haven't owned any covers since 1995 and they commented on the financial assistance that had come the way of the Giants during the last five years as well as during the ill fated merger with Sheffield Eagles. The Giants are certainly in a privileged place in the NFP whose other member clubs are now entirely self funded.

ip Review

To rub salt into the wounds Huddersfield scraped home 21-20 when the game was played. The Giants withstood a dramatic late fightback from Featherstone Rovers who scored two tries in the last five minutes to almost snatch an unlikely victory in a game that exploded on 66 minutes when Rovers Jim Carlton and Giants Chris Langley were sent off for fighting.

Five days later Huddersfield swamped Keighley Cougars 66-0 at the McAlpine Stadium. There were hat-tricks for full back Ben Cooper and substitute Darren Turner as the Cougars struggled to overcome the shock loss of coach Steve Deakin to London Broncos. Hefin O'Hare scored the first try in the very first minute as the Giants racked up the points. They didn't have it as easy last weekend as their 100% record disappeared when they could only manage a 12-12 draw away at Whitehaven in spite of leading 12-0 at the break. Two converted tries from Whitehavens David Seeds (56 mins) and Aaron Lester (69) set up an epic finale. Huddersfield screwed three late attempts at a drop goal wide of the mark to leave just Leigh Centurions and Rochdale Hornets as teams with an unblemished league record.

Leigh's game at Hull KR finished in farcical circumstances when the game was abandoned after 51 minutes with because of a floodlight failure. Leigh were ahead 1462 at the time the game came to its premature end. Leigh coach Paul Terzis blasted everyone in sight about whose fault it all was. Rover's director Wayne Smith explained that they knew there was a fault before the game started but set off using the greyhound lights and training lights in the hope that the fault could be fixed before the lights were needed in full. The fault couldn't be fixed and referee Stuart Cummings had to abandon the game when he felt conditions had deteriorated enough to make them dangerous leaving Leigh chairman Mike Nolan saying that they will be writing to the RFL to claim the points! It's a farcical chain of events that does little to portray a professional image.

Today's visitors Oldham finally got their home season underway at Hurst Cross as they somewhat nervously put paid to York Wasps hopes of a shock win by beating them 32-16 in front of a crowd of 1,130 - over five times the average gate of the football club. Oldham's fans seemed to favour the upbeat atmosphere of the compact ground. The players took a few moments to adjust to their new surroundings and they conceded a 2nd minute try to York veteran centre Carl Hall. Joe McNicolas scored the first try for the Roughyeds in the 6th minute and then crossed again on 25 minutes. Gavin Molly scored a 31st minute try for York but second row forward Bryan Henare ensured that Oldham were 14-10 ahead at the interval. Tries from Phil Farrell, John Hough and Neil Roden sealed the points for Oldham while York had a consolation try from former Hunslet player Andy Precious.

Elsewhere Barrow beat the improving Gateshead Thunder 32-14, two tries to Scott Dyson for the Thunder. Batley beat Workington Town 18-10, two goals to Dean Lawford (7 games for the Rams last season) and Featherstone beat Sheffield 28-18 to move into 9th position. There's a lot to play for and with numerous games to re-arrange will that spell the end of the National Cup? Only a thought but games could then be re-arranged at leisure and without the inconvenience of a number of mid-week trips!



The Brooke Report



Steve Brooke

FORMER chairman Bob McDermott may have left the club at a bad time and under the wrong circumstances but while some supporters have turned him into something of a villain in the piece I would urge them to look at some positives for a change. Firstly, under his aegis the Rams achieved more success in 1999 and 2000 than they had done in the previous quarter of a century. And secondly he made some inspired choices in his time. Who could have predicted the meteoric rise of Neil Kelly, once a workhorse hooker new to management but now seen as one of the brightest British coaching prospects in Super League? Who appointed Andy Fisher? And who brought John Harbin to the Rams? Bob McDermott may have excited criticism from the ranks because the Rams

flattered to deceive when they had a stab at Super League but the man had a knack of making the right appointments and we have his legacy in charge today.

There's no doubt that John Harbin has one of the toughest jobs in Rugby League. But he's used to battling it out. He did it at Wakefield, remember. People automatically think of him as the archetypal nononsense Aussie, but he's nothing of the sort. He is a Yorkshireman by birth and cherishes his roots. Maybe the secret to his battling spirit is the fact that he was born in a castle just after the Second World War. Hazlewood Castle, three miles south of Tadcaster. Built during the reign of Edward 1 it remained in one family's name until becoming a monastery then part-time maternity home in the 1940s. If Dewsbury needed a knight in shining white armour they've got him! Four decades in Australia have left their stamp on Harbin but he genuinely wanted to come back to his Yorkshire roots. The Harbin family lived in Swillington Common, near Leeds, just before John

emigrated to Australia in 1957. He was a fanatic Leeds United supporter (and still treasures a Christmas card sent to him by Raich Carter, manager of Leeds 1953-58) when he left Britain.

Arriving in Australia he told everyone he was a footballer and soon found himself playing...rugby league! "Everyone calls it footie over there, so they assumed I played rugby," said John. He went on to play

Queensland County RL until a knee injury forced him to retire prematurely at 24. He took up coaching, however, and stayed within the game, eventually working with players of the calibre of Rod Reddy and Gary Larson at Queensland.

"I coached the kids, then the amateurs and finally the professionals, but I always wanted to come back to England. I knew what was going on over here because I got copies of the old Green sports edition of the Yorkshire Evening Post sent to me."

His first post back in Yorkshire was with Wakefield Wildcats where he spent three years as development officer, football manager and head coach. Harbin developed many ties with Wakefield and his many fans within the club were deeply upset when the Wildcats lost him. Wildcats chief scout John Holroyd and the development team at Belle Vue were quoted as being 'devastated' by Harbin's departure. "In my opinion John's a genius,' Holroyd is reported to have said, adding: "We learned so much from him. John's one of these people who makes things happen. He does make dreams come true."

Moving across to the Rams Harbin said he wouldn't be pinching for players from Wakefield unless they were available. Nevertheless Andy Fisher has been recruiting heavily from Belle Vue and Harbin finds himself surrounded by familiar faces.

"We are in a good situation now because we have been recruiting hungry players. "The downside to that is that if our players re-establish themselves and build a reputation then they could be on their way to a Super League club. We wouldn't stand in their way." About ten have come from Wakefield.

"We now have an Alliance team, which is something given that most NFP clubs are not fielding one. Their season starts on January 18 when they have an eightweek season of friendlies before a break, then the season proper begins. "We are looking for a top 9 spot this season so that we go into next season's new National League Division 1. "We've got about 36 players in all if you count the six academy lads.


