


doubt that he'll receive a warm welcome from the fans today.



ALOOKAT OLDHAM ROUGHYEDS

GARETH BARBER 20 year old Oldham born half back or centré who was reared on rugby with his best pal, the Leeds and Great Britain loose forward, Kevin Sinfield. When Sinfield signed for Leeds Rhinos, Barber signed fro Warrington, but returned home to Oldham before the start of the 2000-2— 1 season. Played for the NFP under 21's at Widnes in the autumn.

JOHN BRADDISH signed from St Helen on long term loan. Top goal kicker in the Alliance Championship last season and also leading points scorer in that same competition. Wanted a change of club because of limited senior opportunities at Knowsley Road and he turned down several other offers to join Oldham where he is developing his half

KEITH BRENNAN a versatile half back or hooker, local lad Keith shot to prominence last season when his form was so good that, for a time, he kept John Hough out of the number 9 shirt. A natural footballer with good hands, he damaged a hamstring in the pre season Law Cup game with Rochdale and then damaged a knee in his come back game in the cup against St Helens.

JASON CLEGG Second biggest forward at the club after Danny Guest is a former Bradford (Northern, not Bulls) forward, who has had four good seasons with Oldham. Powerful on the break, he is a favourite of the Oldham supporters and regularly picks up the Junior Roughyeds of the Year award.

WILL COWELL a 21 year old who played at Warrington, this Cumbrian utility back is equally at home at full-wing, wing or centre. Played 18 Super League games for Warrington after signing from Jells, the Whitehaven amateur club. Recommended to Oldham by former Wolves boss Daryl van de Velde, Cowell is keen to kick start his career in the NFP with Roughyeds.

GAVIN DODD a local youngster who is learning the ropes at Oldham. A wing or full-back, 20 year old Gavin played for NFP under 21's at Widnes and is sure to be pushing for a regular place this season, either as competition for Mark Sibson at full-back or as a lively winger who knows where the try (goal) line is.

LEE DORAN another young player in whom Oldham have a lot of confidence. A Wiganer, Lee has worked his way

through the Oldham academy and alliance sides and is now on the verge of breaking through to the first team on a regular basis. Showed up well for the NFP under 21's as one of five Roughyed players on the squad.

PHIL FARRELL the 'other' Oldham captain in a new move that former boss Ford believed would work well to the benefit of the whole squad. younger brother of Wigan and GB ace Andy Farrell, didn't miss a match last season and, in his two seasons with the club, has a remarkable record of consistency. Played fro the NFP under 21's against their Super League counterparts.

ANTHONY GIBBONS Formed a reliable centre partnership last season with goalkicking pat Rich, who has now left the club to go on a twelve months world tour. Looked certain to be the firstchoice centre again this season, but suspension and a bad ankle injury have meant he has missed the start of the

DAVID GIBBONS Anthony's identical twin. The brothers have moved around together throughout their rugby league careers with Leeds, Bramley and now Oldham. Vice captain last season, stand off David, has been appointed one of TWO Oldham captains this term and is sure to be one of Oldham's leading

JON GODDARD a 19 year old and the youngest member of the squad, Cas lad Jon has joined Oldham on loan from Castleford thanks to the old pals act. Graham Steadman is a firm friend and former team mate of former coach, Ford and saw a loan spell with Oldham as the ideal way to bring Jon along. Already this is bearing fruit as Goddard's defence has been superb and as his confidence grows it is expected that the tries will soon be

DANNY GUEST another of the Roughyed 'originals' who returned to the club two seasons ago. A big prop, he is expected to be a force to be reckoned with in the NFP this season after signing a new one year deal.

BRYAN HENARE joined Oldham midway through last season from St Helens on loan. A Kiwi back-rower who has played for Auckland Warriors, Henare played a prominent role in Oldham's surge to the Grand Final in July 2001

before signing permanently for the club for the 2002 season on a one year contract.

HODGKINSON much travelled and vastly experiences back-row forward, Tommy joined the Roughyeds from Widnes in the close season. well in the warm up games ad then picked up a whiplash injury that has kept him out of rugby for much of the season

JOHN HOUGH the first player to sign for his home-town club when the new Roughyeds were formed by Chris Hamilton and his fellow directors in the autumn of 1997. Before the start of last season, he had played 87 of the club's 90 matches and had scored 32 tries, a phenomenal record for a hooker. He didn't enjoy one of his better seasons in 2001, but a change of job, and less travelling, has seen him back at his best in 2002.

GAVIN JOHNSON a young centre or wing, or occasional back-row forward, Oldhamer, Gavin spent two seasons at Odsal in the Bradford Academy side and made the occasional appearance for the Bulls in the Alliance Championship. Spent almost a season earning his Oldham spurs in the Alliance team before signing a two year deal last September.

PAUL NORTON journeyman forward and former Lancashire Lynx stalwart, who played in 31 of 34 games last season. A hard worker and value for money performer, 'Knocker' was sorely missed at the start of the season when he was recovering from a groin operation.

NEIL RODEN a clever half-back who joined Oldham from Wigan, with Farrell's season and a half ago. Has only missed a couple of games since. Can play stand off or scrum half and was a key figure in Oldham's run through to the NFP Grand Final last summer. A knee injury kept him out of the pre-season warn-up games, but he is sure to be a regular performer in the long and testing 2002 campaign.

MARK SIBSON quick full back who loves nothing better than to attack from deep. Joined Oldham on a two year contract when he left Bramley at the same time as former boss Mike Ford, the Gibbons twins and Andy Proctor and has recently signed a new one year deal.

Today we set out on what appears to be, on paper, the toughest month of the season, without underestimating today's visitors to the McAlpine Stadium we must consider the likes of Hull K.R., Rochdale Hornets and Leigh Centurions to be the nearest teams to spoil our ambitions of returning to Super League. In three weeks time we will certainly know our chances before the commencement of the League Challenge Cup which will take up two months of this season. To remain unbeaten before the cup competition will be a real morale and confidence booster and which, if it comes to fruition, ought to draw a bigger audience here at the McAlpine for the remaining games. Oldham are here today for only their second appearance. In 1995 they lost to Wigan in the Challenge Cup semifinal by 48 points to 20. To reach the last four they overcame our own club, still affectionately known as Fartown, in the quarter final at the Watersheddings. A try each to Simon Reynolds and Dean Hanger plus two goals from Steve Kerry was just not good enough as the 'Roughyeads' scored 23 points to our 12. It is hard to believe but we have not met each other in a league game since 1992/1993 season. It was a one off season for us, we played our opponents four times in a second division consisting of just eight teams. We played Oldham five times due to being drawn in the Challenge Cup 2nd round when we went down 17 - 20 but were all square in the league each winning two. After the two Super League seasons in 1996 and 1997 finishing 8th and 12th (bottom) the Oldham Bears were wound up and relegated to reform in division two for the 1998 season. Since then the club has had to battle against misfortune and now with no ground of their own they are in Ashton with the local soccer club. This season they have won three games from their seven fixtures. It would have given us a guide to their form if their game against the Rochdale Hornets last Sunday had not been called off for in charge of team affairs is now none other than John Harbin. If this very shrewd gentleman can work the same magic as he did for the Wakefield Wildcats last season then Oldham will rise from the bottom half of the league. The three N.F.P. games which were fulfilled went as probably predicted, only the score line at Swinton surprised me with Dewsbury clocking up 75 points when the Giants only managed 48 the previous week. Today's N.F.P. fixtures throws up an interesting game at Derwent Park where Workington entertain Rochdale the rest should go with form. Finally let us congratulate Chris Thorman reaching his hundredth point of the season in our last game at Gigg Lane.





No 5: Andy Puchill

During the summer prior to the start of the 1992/1993 season there was a lot of transfer activity taking place at Fartown. The third division champions seemed to be losing established players from their championship winning side

at an alarming rate. Terry Flanagan and Alex Murphy though were wheeling and dealing behind the scenes and among the new faces to sign for the claret and gold was a quiet 24 year old who had played 94 first team games out of a possible 95 for Swinton in the first division. His name was Andy Pucill and he was to show the same consistency for the Fartowners in the next four seasons. Playing in the front row Andy made the number ten iersey his own and when

team selection was being discussed his

name was one of the first on the sheet. Owning the number ten iersey is not just a figure of speech, as in his 110 first team starts for the club he only had to swap it once for the number eight in a game against London Crusaders on March 15th, 1993. This was a game in which the Fartowners were without eight players through injury and suspension but remarkably were leading 11 - 0 after 27 minutes. Unfortunately the Londoners finished on top winning by 31 points to 17 but a great performance by Fartown had kept them to only a 20 - 17 lead with six minutes to go. Pucills work rate in this game was exceptional and amidst his tackling stint he somehow managed to get into position to attempt a drop goal which, had it gone over, would have been his only goal during his career at Huddersfield. No goals but ten tries and everyone deserved. His most successful season was in 1994/1995 when the Fartowners reached the quarter final of the Silk Cut Challenge Cup meeting Keighley in the Divisional Premiership Final at Old Trafford. The Challenge Cup defeat came at the Watersheddings where Oldham were the victors by 23 - 12. Against the Cougars the Giants did really have an off day going down by 26 points to 6. The summer of 1996 saw Andy's departure from the McAlpine Stadium. He joined Rochdale Hornets for the second half of the season and then moved onto Leigh Centurions. He is now back in his native county where he began his career with Crossfields. Warrington.



We will give you details on the playing squad in the next programme.









Two of the games most highly-respected coaches will be going head-to-head in today's big match.

And it's not just among their fellow professionals that the Giants' Tony Smith & Oldham's John Harbin are held in exceptionally high regard. Throughout the RL media both men are admired for the way they conduct themselves. Even when the pair were under the most extreme pressure last season when Smith & Harbin - who a few will need reminding was in charge of Wakefield at the time - were attempting to plot their respective clubs Super League survival, they always had time to speak to the press.

Hopefully, his reward will come at the end of the season with success in the NFP Grand Final and a place in Super League.

Yet whatever happens, the openness of Smith and Harbin has definitely been good for the game.
