





TIM RUMFORD Signed from Castleford Tigers Under 21. Can play anywhere in the back, but prefers full back as his favourite position.

BRYN POWELL Hunslet Warriors, Great Britain Under 21. A highly rated Winger with pace and a hunger for tries. Bryn had attracted the attention of several clubs from the NFP.

DAMIEN REID Signed on his 17th birthday, pace to burn, had a loan spell at Leeds Rhinos last season with their successful Academy side.

DANNY DOBSON In his second full season, Danny has size, speed and an eye for an opening

ANTHONY HENDERSON Signed from Leeds Rhinos two years ago and highly rated by the Headingley coaching staff

PAUL SEAL Paul was signed from Normanton ARLFC, and has already made a big impact in the Hawks' nest.

LEE BARGATE With vast experience with Batley and Featherstone, Lee is an aggressive, speedy centre with an eye for an opening

ANDY ATHA Another player who has come through the academy, with a great appetite for work. Andy missed the start of the season through injury, but has a bright future.

CRAIG IBBOTSON Made his first team debut three seasons ago. Craig never takes a backwards step and had a spell on loan at Leeds last season. He has the potential to go all the way.

MICK COYLE Mick is the longest serving member of the squad – he has just finished his Benefit Year, is a Grand Final winner, and a new member of the coaching staff.

NEIL LEE In his second spell at the club after spending the last two years at the Jungle with Castleford Tigers

DANNY COOK Recently signed from Leeds Rhinos and looking forward to establishing himself in the Hawks First Team

AMRAZ HAMID Came up through the club's Under 16 team two years ago, and made his first team debut last season

JERMAIN COLEMAN Great Britain student signed from Halifax Blue Sox. Jermain is an excellent defender with ball skills to watch.

GARETH NAYLOR Another local lad signed at 18, Gareth can play in any back position, as well as hooker and loose forward. He never gives less than 100%

DAN BRIGGS In his second term at the Hawks after having a short spell at Featherstone last

season, makes good yards and defends well.

TONY HOWCROFT A Great Britain student, Tony is always in the thick of it, and leads by example – always from the front

ANDY WRAY Former Featherstone and Batley player, Andy has the potential to go to the top if he can keep clear of injury

STUART TURTON Stuart signed from Eastmoor ARLF this season, after having first signed as a professional with Scarborough Pirates

SAM BROADLEY After two seasons at Cougar Park, Sam signed from Keighley Albion this season.

DAVE JESSEY Dave came up through the academy, and has great potential to go on to play at a higher level

JONLEE LOCKWOOD As a 17 year old Jonlee signed with Wakefield Wildcats on a full time contract. He has just finished a spell in Rugby Union and is a great acquisition for the team

KELVIN HENDERSON The older brother of Anthony, Kelvin had a brief spell with Castleford Tigers last season.

ALOOKAT OLDHAM ROUGHYEDS

GARETH BARBER 20 year old Oldham born half back or centre who was reared on rugby with his best pal, the Leeds and Great Britain loose forward, Kevin Sinfield. When Sinfield signed for Leeds Rhinos, Barber signed for Warrington, but returned home to Oldham before the start of the 2000-2— 1 season. Played for the NFP under 21's at Widnes in the autumn.

JOHN BRADDISH signed from St Helen on long term loan. Top goal kicker in the Alliance Championship last season and also leading points scorer in that same competition. Wanted a change of club because of limited senior opportunities at Knowsley Road and he turned down several other offers to join Oldham where he is developing his half back skills.

KEITH BRENNAN a versatile half back or hooker, local lad Keith shot to prominence last season when his form was so good that, for a time, he kept John Hough out of the number 9 shirt. A natural footballer with good hands, he damaged a hamstring in the pre season Law Cup game with Rochdale and then damaged a knee in his come back game in the cup against St Helens.

JASON CLEGG Second biggest forward at the club after Danny Guest is a former Bradford (Northern, not Bulls) forward, who has had four good seasons with Oldham. Powerful on the break, he is a favourite of the Oldham supporters and regularly picks up the Junior Roughyeds of the Year award.

WILL COWELL a 21 year old who played at Warrington, this Cumbrian utility back is equally at home at fullwing, wing or centre. Played 18 Super League games for Warrington after signing from Jells, the Whitehaven amateur club. Recommended to Oldham by former Wolves boss Daryl van de Velde, Cowell is keen to kick start his career in the NFP with Roughyeds.

GAVIN DODD a local youngster who is learning the ropes at Oldham. A wing or full-back, 20 year old Gavin played for NFP under 21's at Widnes and is sure to be pushing for a regular place this season, either as competition for Mark Sibson at full-back or as a lively winger who knows where the try (goal) line is.

LEE DORAN another young player in whom Oldham have a lot of confidence. A Wiganer, Lee has worked his way

through the Oldham academy and alliance sides and is now on the verge of breaking through to the first team on a regular basis. Showed up well for the NFP under 21's as one of five Roughyed players on the squad.

PHIL FARRELL the 'other' Oldham captain in a new move that former boss Ford believed would work well to the benefit of the whole squad. Phil, younger brother of Wigan and GB ace Andy Farrell, didn't miss a match last season and, in his two seasons with the club, has a remarkable record of consistency. Played for the NFP under 21's against their Super League counterparts.

ANTHONY GIBBONS Formed a reliable centre partnership last season with goalkicking pat Rich, who has now left the club to go on a twelve months world tour. Looked certain to be the firstchoice centre again this season, but suspension and a bad ankle injury have meant he has missed the start of the season.

DAVID GIBBONS Anthony's identical twin. The brothers have moved around together throughout their rugby league careers with Leeds, Bramley and now Oldham. Vice captain last season, stand off David, has been appointed one of TWO Oldham captains this term and is sure to be one of Oldham's leading lights.

JON GODDARD a 19 year old and the youngest member of the squad, Cas lad Jon has joined Oldham on loan from Castleford thanks to the old pals act. Graham Steadman is a firm friend and former team mate of former coach, Ford and saw a loan spell with Oldham as the ideal way to bring Jon along. Already this is bearing fruit as Goddard's defence has been superb and as his confidence grows it is expected that the tries will soon be coming.

DANNY GUEST another of the Roughyed 'originals' who returned to the club two seasons ago. A big prop, he is expected to be a force to be reckoned with in the NFP this season after signing a new one year deal.

BRYAN HENARE joined Oldham midway through last season from St Helens on Ioan. A Kiwi back-rower who has played for Auckland Warriors, Henare played a prominent role in Oldham's surge to the Grand Final in July 2001 before signing permanently for the club for the 2002 season on a one year contract.

TOMMY HODGKINSON much travelled and vastly experiences back-row forward, Tommy joined the Roughyeds from Widnes in the close season. Did well in the warm up games ad then picked up a whiplash injury that has kept him out of rugby for much of the season so far.

JOHN HOUGH the first player to sign for his home-town club when the new Roughyeds were formed by Chris Hamilton and his fellow directors in the autumn of 1997. Before the start of last season, he had played 87 of the club's 90 matches and had scored 32 tries, a phenomenal record for a hocker. He didn't enjoy one of his better seasons in 2001, but a change of job, and less travelling, has seen him back at his best in 2002.

GAVIN JOHNSON a young centre or wing, or occasional back-row forward, Oldhamer, Gavin spent two seasons at Odsal in the Bradford Academy side and made the occasional appearance for the Bulls in the Alliance Championship. Spent almost a season earning his Oldham spurs in the Alliance team before signing a two year deal last September.

PAUL NORTON journeyman forward and former Lancashire Lynx stalwart, who played in 31 of 34 games last season. A hard worker and value for money performer, 'Knocker' was sorely missed at the start of the season when he was recovering from a groin operation.

NEIL RODEN a clever half-back who joined Oldham from Wigan, with Farrell's season and a half ago. Has only missed a couple of games since. Can play stand off or scrum half and was a key figure in Oldham's run through to the NFP Grand Final last summer. A knee injury kept him out of the pre-season warn-up games, but he is sure to be a regular performer in the long and testing 2002 campaign.

MARK SIBSON quick full back who loves nothing better than to attack from deep. Joined Oldham on a two year contract when he left Bramley at the same time as former boss Mike Ford, the Gibbons twins and Andy Proctor and has recently signed a new one year deal.

NATHAN BATTY One of Harbin's Wakefield John signings, toured Australia with Wakefield. Played for the Yorkshire Academy 2000.

DANNY BROUGH A local lad formally with Thornhill Trojans, signed from Wakefield 1998 and toured Australia in 2001.

CHRIS CHAPMAN Signed at the start of the season from Sheffield Eagles, formally with Leeds Rhinos and has Great Britain Academy experience.

JIMMY ELSTON Signed from Oulton Raiders by John Harbin in 1999 was Wakefield Alliance player of the year 2001

TONY FELLA A strong fast prop signed from Doncaster Dragons in the close season.

ADRIAN FLYNN Now in his sixth season at Dewsbury. A local lad with over 150 appearances. Last seasons leading try scorer.

PAUL HICKS Signed from the Batley Bulldogs for the start of this season. Formally with Wakefield Wildcats.

JIM LEATHAM An experienced player joined

Dewsbury from Keighley mid way though last season.

DAVIDE LONGO Second spell at Dewsbury, first joined in 1993/4 season, has been at Bradford, Keighley and Batley before returning.

GEORGE MACK Product of local Amateur club, now in third season at Dewsbury.

CHRIS PARKER Signed from Gateshead Thunder, formally with Bradford also had a couple of seasons in South West Australia.

CHRIS REDFEARN

A very experienced player, signed from Hull K.R. Formally Featherstone with Rovers where he was also captain.


FRANK WATENE

Association of Premiership Clubs Round-Up

We are almost half-way through the Northern Ford Premiership having played 13 of the 28 scheduled games. Looking at the League table though it is in an uneven state with only three other teams besides ourselves having completed thirteen. Workington Town have somehow managed to play fourteen but the majority have played twelve with Leigh, Doncaster and Swinton trailing on ten each. At the time of writing, York Wasps are in danger of folding and if their demise comes to pass then Leigh and Swinton will be down to nine. The point of all this is that the Giants have games and points in the bag and should not be stuck with a fixture glut at the later stage of the season. Not having to fit in re-arranged matches will be a bonus and a big help in the Giants goal of being promoted back into Super League. At the start of this season the favourites for the top are proving to be in position as expected. If there are to be any changes I think that Doncaster and Oldham will be the two. currently in the lower half, who will join the top set. Doncaster because they have potentially a strong side and, of course, they have three games in hand over Sheffield Eagles the club directly above them. Oldham could repeat the form of last season when they only lost one game out of fourteen in the second half of the campaign. With John Harbin

guiding them there is every possibility. This season will see the fifth time a Grand Final is played to determine the championship. In the previous four only two teams who headed the table at the seasons end have finished up champions and only one has progressed into Super League. Wakefield were the first in 1998 and successfully overcame fourth placed Featherstone in a cracking final here at the McAlpine Stadium in 1998. Dewsbury lost to 2nd in the table Hunslet in 1999 who could not meet the criteria and stayed down. One year later Dewsbury again finished top of the table and this time overcame fourth placed Leigh to become champions but went the same way as Hunslet regarding criteria. Last season was the cruellest when Leigh romped home at the top of the League by eight clear points only losing two games all season but were defeated by runners up Widnes who are now in the top flight. With the Giants beating Leigh and successfully coming through a hard March they are clear favourites to be first at the seasons end. However one slip in the Grand Final and it could be curtains and another season in the lower reaches. I am confident that this will not happen but this piece reports just what has happened.



Each home match during the course of this Northern Ford Premiership season we will feature a former player from the last twelve years. They may not have been internationals but will have made a valuable contribution to the fortunes of the Huddersfield club during their career wearing the claret and gold. We hope that happy memories will return for our faithful supporters.

No 7: Neil Flanagan

The summer of 1992 saw a lot of player movement at Fartown. Alex Murphy and Terry Flanagan had seen the break up of their Third Division Championship winning side and were frantically recruiting. One of the

newcomers was the nephew of Terry Flanagan, 22 year old Neil a scrum half signed from Oldham, Greg Shuttleworth, the club captain was on his way to Bramley so Neil was an automatic choice for the number seven position. His first game against York in The Yorkshire Cup first round was the last for the Huddersfield senior side at the old Fartown ground. One week later, on August 30th, 1992 ground sharing with Huddersfield Town began. Against York the Fartowners ran out winners by 36 points to 12 and Neil had the honour of scoring the 1st teams last try at the ground shooting under the posts directly from a scrum. Two days short of two years later he had the distinction of registering the first ever try scored at the McAlpine Stadium

on August 28, 1994. In his first team season in the claret and gold Neil and his team mates got off to a slow start in the League probably due to the changes in vital positions from the previous season. The tide turned at Featherstone on November 1st when Fartown, down to 12 men as early as the 13th minute when Roy Hagerty was sent off for a high tackle on Paul Newlove, turned on a superb performance to beat the team who were to be league champions by 25 points to 18. Neil scored one try and had a hand in just about everything and when he popped over a field goal with 7 minutes to go it sealed a wonderful day. The teams recovery enabled them to reach the Divisional Play Off at the end of the season but lost to Workington Town in the first round. In Neil's second season Fartown won the opening ten games before having a mid season dip and then another up turn to reach the play offs losing this time to Batley. Neil had now been partnered with Brad Davis at Stand Off for a season and a half and this combination was responsible for engineering a lot of the teams tries. At the opening of the McAlpine Stadium the Fartowners said farewell to the Murphy - Terry Flanagan partnership and George Fairburn took over the coaching duties. Neil was still first choice for Scrum Half during the early games in the 1994/95 season but when Steve Kerry signed from Oldham and Dean Hanger from Leigh the competition proved too much. 'Flans' last first team game was in the Challenge Cup 3rd Round against amateurs Wigan St Judes on January 22nd, 1995. In his three seasons at Huddersfield he made 72 first team appearances scoring sixteen tries, nine goals and two drop goals for a points tally of 84. He left to join Rochdale Hornets later in 1995 where he played two seasons before going back to his roots at Oldham. Neil is currently assistant coach with the Hornets so his career has revolved around three professional clubs. Usually the smallest man on the pitch in stature but never the smallest in heart and grit







On 4th December 1988, Fartown travelled to Elland Road after going twenty consecutive games without a win and confidence in all parts of the club was at a low ebb. With. believe it or not, still a hardcore following to away games our supporters were rewarded with a real gritty performance to record a win by 21 points to 18. Simon Kenworthy was the star of the show with a try, four goals and a drop goal. Two other tries were scored by Kevin Brooke and our current under 19's coach Lee St Hilaire. This game was a turing point for the club and the team continued that season to improve, winning 50% of their remaining league games including the last four of the 1988/89 season on the trot.

OLDHAM


In the 1994/95 season the claret and gold reached the Quarter Finals of the Challenge Cup for the first time in 16 years. They were drawn away at Oldham on March 12th, 1995 where they fell to the then 1st division club by 23 points to 12. This was the season which the Fartowners reached the Divisional Final at Old Trafford when they lost to Keighley and the season in which our club set a high scoring record beating Blackpool Gladiators 142-4. Unfortunately against Oldham they failed to maintain their form and tries from Simon Reynolds and Dean Hanger plus two Steve Kerry goals just were not enough to reach the Semi-Final stage.

DEWSBURY

Dewsbury were playing their last season at Crown Flat before a spell moving to Batley's Mount Pleasant ground for a spell until their new ground at Owl Lane was ready when the Fartowners came away with a remarkable win. Fartown were four points down in ninety seconds and 6-16 behind at half-time. Dewsbury were well on top but a purple patch early in the second half turned the game around. Sporty Stories Boxing Cricket

As a young man, Paul Berienbach, future world lightheavyweight champion of the mid 1920's, was deaf and dumb. One day he climbed a telegraph pole and received a shock from a loose cable. His speech and hearing returned.

Ali Lukuse of Zaire did not do very well in his bout against Frank Bruno at the West Berlin Sportshalle in 1982. After being knocked out in two rounds he went for a walk and was mugged and beaten up by four men.

When Tippy Larkin was introduced to the crowd before his constant with Tommy Cross at Newark in 1942, he threw off his robe with a flourish and acknowledged the cheers of the crowd. Then hastily he put the gown back on again. Larkin had forgotten to wear his boxing trunks. On one occasion during a county game, Dr WG Grace mad a towering hit into the outfield. As he was turning for his second run, he saw that a fielder was in a position under the ball so he straightaway declared the innings closed. Grace then persuaded the umpire into giving him not out on the grounds that the catch was made after the declaration.

One umpire in a game involving

Cheam CC in 1899, refused to give a batsman out to what had obviously been a catch. Responding indignant looks from the fielders he said "You were too slow in appealing".
