coach's corner

Good afternoon and a big Cougar Park welcome to everybody. It feels like an age since we last played at Cougar Park!

Today we welcome players, officials and supporters from Oldham to Cougar Park, the Roughyeds like ourselves are looking to climb into the top nine and will provide stern opposition today. Lets hope we see a great match.

Although things have been quiet on the playing front, as far as the first team goes, Cougar Park has been a hive of activity over the last few weeks. First we have launched our under 19's Academy side, which has rapidly been followed up with the launch of the "Cougar Scholarship" scheme.

This is perhaps the most significant move that the club has made for many years, and at last we have begun to lay the foundations for the future. Keighley, as a town, has produced many professional players over the years, but unfortunately many of these players get picked up by other clubs simply because systems have not been in place to bring them through the ranks and into oursenior squad. Hopefully, we will now be able to identify the stars of the future and create an environment that they want to be a part of.

Talking of "up and coming" youngsters, I would like to congratulate Richard Moore who, as a loan player, made his professional first team debut with us earlier this season and has since has gone on to make his first team debut in Super League. Richard has proved what can be achieved by being prepared to buckle down and work hard. Our youngsters can use Richard's success as real encouragement and inspiration so let's hope we can produce more like him.

The Academy has had a tough start to the campaign with games against Leigh (home) Oldham and Whitehaven (away). Although yet to get a first win, our lads have shown great spirit and determination. A problem they are faced with is that they are a very young "under 19's." Initially we had applied to join the Junior Academy (under 17's) league but unfortunately the "powers that be" at Red Hall decided that the Junior League is an "elite" competition, mainly for Super League clubs. On the positive side our lads will be able to play together for the next couple of years and there are some very promising youngsters on display. I am sure that you will get behind them in the coming weeks and offer your support.

We have been busy lately in bringing more new faces to the Club.

Chris Hartley and Peter Leeming have joined us on trial, having been released by Halifax Blue Sox. Both these players were part of my Under 21 side at Halifax and will add more competition for places to our squad. Carl and Lee Patterson have also joined us on trial with Lee making an impressive debut for us against Gateshead. Carl has been playing at stand off for Selby Rugby Union, whilst Lee joins us from Sheffield Eagles. Current GB International centre Andy Robinson has also ioined us as a trialist from National Conference side Dewsbury Moor. We have watched Andy several times and he has great potential. Finally, we have also signed, on a permanent basis, Lee Kelly from Batley Bulldogs. Lee has represented GB at amateur level and, weighingin at 16st 7lb, will add much needed weight to our front row. We are still hoping to make further signings in the near future, so watch this space.

The players have been working very hard throughout the mid-season break, our conditioner Paul Royston has certainly been putting them through their paces in the gym, hopefully we will return to action a little bit sharper and stronger. Paul's contribution to the coaching staff is invaluable and is also overseeing the Academy and the Scholarship youngsters. Paul is also a perfectionist and if players listen and learn from him they will go a long way; we certainly are lucky to have him onboard.

Good news on the injury front now. Following a second opinion, Phil Stephenson is now back in full training and we are hopeful that he will return to action when we play Rochdale in mid-June. Stuart Calvert should also be ready to return in June (the ban on visiting the local fast food establishment has done wonders for his figure) so keep it up Stu!



the "amber and black" are fighting back

"Derby Match"!!! "You must be joking", might well be your reaction when talking about Keighley v Bramley.

In fact, whilst not adjacent towns there was always something of a neighbourly-feeling between the two Clubs. As a kid I was always amazed that the one town which is signposted on Bramley's "Town Street", the location of the former "Barley Mow" and "McLaren Field" homes to the "villager's', is, yes, you've guessed it - KEIGHLEY!

From Bramley, you can take just one road, and if you keep going west into the setting sun, you will eventually hit Keighley. OK, so it's 13 miles, but between them, the two Clubs have much in common.

Both have their roots firmly planted in their local communities, successfully maintaining their proud identities in the face of their larger neighbours and Super League clubs. Both have also arguably been victims of Rugby League "politics", but overriding all of this, they can both lay claim to an outstanding player of his time - Terry Hollindrake.

Terry was, and still looks it today, a prime example of that tall, muscular, sleek-as-a-greyhound winger, who developed naturally through his own active lifestyle, rather than spending hours on the weights, as do all of today's players in Super League. He was like lightening, and won a Great Britain Cap, when at Keighley and "Internationals" came from a wider range of Clubs.

He was also a Bramley player, and it has been a delight to see him attending the recently-revived "Bramley ex-Player's" functions. Wishing the newly-formed Bramley the best of luck, he also told us that in his opinion too, Bramley and Keighley had a lot in common.

If we are readmitted to the League next month, we hope to live up to that comment and take Keighley as an example of what can be achieved against all the odds. I know that Keighley have undergone major changes in the last 12 months, but they are still regarded as a "model" of how to get into the Community. Many of Super League's ideas started at Keighley, at a time when they were dismissed out of sight.

Our new, yet to be unveiled, "Logo", has been designed by the same person who created the original "Cougar" and we hope that we can make as big an impact on our Community as that which the Cougar's have in Keighley. But that's in the future.

By necessity, we intend to start our new life playing at the excellent facilities which can be provided by Morley RUFC, but our longer-term plan is to return "home" to our Bramley "heartland". We have always received a warm welcome from the Keighley Club and we look forward to visiting "Cougar Park" with a Bramley team next year under the guidance of Bramley "heroes", Darren Coen and Gary Barnett, rather than on the last two occasions when we met as part of our "Bramley on the road" nomadic campaign.

I had one of those 'cut out and keep' moments the other day, when I was reading an article by my favourite sports journalist, Ken Jones of 'The Independent.'

Jones writes about everything, but concentrates mainly on football and boxing. I think it must be the boxing that has given him well justified cynical world-weariness, which spices up his brilliant writing. The piece that I cut out and kept was about "televised sport" and was written in the wake of the ITV digital soccer debacle, but relates very well to Rugby League as well. Here are some tasters from the piece. See what you think.

"The medium, someone said, is the message. And the message that filters through the medium of television is clear. In ever increasing numbers, sports fans are pressing the off button. Enough is enough."

He has a point, but this effect, which is already some way down the line in the States, seems to relate to soccer at the moment. However, Rugby League could be caught in the aftershock of the 'Premiership' and ITV Digital fiasco come contract renegotiation's time, although I would suggest that RL fans aren't engorged on a surfeit of TV RL just yet, no matter what they think of "Eddie and Stevo." Next he says:

"There is startling evidence that the sports boom in television is over... viewing figures for the Grand national one of the BBC's few remaining showpiece events, remained in a downward spiral, from the peak audience of 16.7m in 1994 only 1.3 million switched on to watch." There is an argument that this could be to do with the event itself. Many people are repulsed by 'sporting events' such as the "National." Challenge Cup viewing figures continue to do well on Grandstand. OK, so what does he say next; citing downward viewing figures for the six Nations (good) and premiership soccer in a world cup year. He goes on:

"No wonder. Week in, week out, the armchair audience comes under a bombardment of sports events, many of stultifying mediocrity. The answer is to switch off and many do. Not so long ago, when asked about football on television, a prominent manager relied that it did not occupy much of his time because "there is only so much football I can take."

If people are getting out more, well that's fine by me, but, like I said be before, it would be unjust if we all fall out of the err Sky because soccer's balloon has burst. My favourite bit in Jones' piece comes near the end:

"...the television mentality bangs the drum for the product by apologising for it and patronising the viewer at every turn, retreating behind jargon, cliché and myth, showing no inclination to conduct a searching interview...the English language is frequently debased to a duffel bag of clichés and adjectives."

I'll leave you to decide whether Jones' words apply to Rugby League broadcasters.





DIRECTIONS TO CRAVEN PARK:

Follow the M62 all the way east to J38 where it joins the A63. Continue under the Humber Bridge and over the flyover, carry on over the roundabout still along the A63, at the next roundabout carry straight on (3rd exit) joining the A1033 (Hedon Road).
