

Three weeks without a home game results in "withdrawal symptoms" and it is truly refreshing to be back in action at South Leeds Stadium even though we are second favourites in todays game with Oldham Roughyeds. When I survey the scene from the front row of the directors box it is impossible not to look with envy at the extensive complex at the other side of our pitch. When you consider that the indoor athletics and bowls features - built at a cost of £4m - and the other broad range of planned developments we have to wonder what we did wrong when our request for a 10,000 seater stadium was denied. It was promised if we made Super League and the decision not to grant us elevation to the top echelon will go down in sporting history as an inexcusable, soul destroying, totally unfair and most despicable ruling.

The money to fund the new facilities includes a lottery grant of £3m, and it is a great pity that some of this windfall is not heading for our coffers.

However, we may benefit from the reputed multi-seater restaurant. It is possible that we may be able to stage our dinners, lunches, and other projects in this banqueting suite. It is regrettable that our current space for dinner guests is limited and that is why we have to patronise Leeds Uniteds larger premises. The bar profits go to United and that is a vital loss of income to our club.

Mention of dinners reminds me that we are planning a Summer Frolic to follow our highly enjoyable Spring Fling and details will be available shortly. We must maintain our fund raising and I am "knocked out" by the recently launched HISSA members who plan to raise money for team strengthening next season. You have my sincere gratitude lads and hopefully your ranks will increase in the coming weeks when the plea "Gissa Fiver" becomes the regular greeting.

Each Super League club receives just over £600,000 a year under the current deal with BskyB and this expires at the end of 2003. Isn't it about time a TV deal was given to the Northern Ford Premiership clubs? We certainly are the poor relations!

But hope springs eternal - as any Shakespeare scholar will tell you - and we are still in evidence, paying our way, in the hope that sponsorship and improved attendances will be the norm next season.

Meetings to consider the structure of the NFP are imminent and fingers are tightly-crossed that the mooted two divisions plot is scrapped. We are not in favour!

We extend a welcome to Oldham who looked as though they would lose touch with the top nine in the NFP but are now staging a revival. They beat Batley away in convincing fashion and the fact that we lost to our near neighbours suggests that we could struggle today.

It has been a long and exacting season for our young players. We have seen signs of fatigue but there is no lessening of enthusiasm. I am proud of the lot of 'em.

May the better side take the points today. Enjoy the match. Cheer for the Hawks and bring a friend with you next Sunday when we clash with Sheffield.

GARETH WALKER of Rugby Leaguer and League Express adds his name to the growing list of those calling for an NFP Origin.

ON the playing front, the recent Origin Series was a success. But isn't now the perfect time to introduce an NFP Origin for next season?

Leigh Centurions' coach Paul Terzis certainly thinks so. Writing in his monthly column for Rugby League World, Terzis says: "In future, possibly as a lead-up to the main games, it would be ideal if they had an NFP representative game as a preview to the main event.

"It would give the players in the NFP something to aspire to, show that there is some representative rugby there for them. You shouldn't have to be at the highest level - in our case at Super League - to receive representative honours.

"There's a void there - you've got representative honours at Super League at the top, and BARLA at the bottom, but nothing in between. All players should have a higher level to aspire to, to be able to test themselves.

"As has been shown with Stuart Donlan and David Mills, and Neil Turley last year, if the chances are given to the players they are going to perform.

"It would also bring coaches in line as well, and would help for attendances, because NFP supporters would want to see their own players.

"What players want is an opportunity, and an NFP Origin series would be fantastic."



There is a wealth of talent within the Premiership, ensuring that the game would be a contest of high quality. Similarly, there are several top coaches in the competition that could lead the respective sides.



MARTIN LUXFORD - LUCKY LUXFORD

A hocker who has been known to wear his wife's T-shirts on numerous occasions? Just another Hunslet player with their own idiosyncrasy, step forward Martin Luxford

Joining the Hawks five games into the season Martin remembers his debut, "I came on with about half an hour left of a defeat to Domaster at home, although I did enjoy a good 35 yard breek." Prior to the Hawks there was a spell with amateur side Stanley af ter he had left Wakefield. Martin's career high was signing professional for Wakefield at 17 years old, he adds, "I made my first team debut against Batley at 18 and I spent four seasons there but was not offered a new contract, so I was a little sad to leave." But he does maintain that his career ambition is to carry on playing at the top for as long as possible.

The Batley match saw a disappointing result after plenty of possession and a few good chances, Martin says, "we were in with a shout when we went in at half time at 10-6 but we missed chances, became a little complacent and definitely tired towards the end. The rain also made it very hard, the ball was very slippy making handling from half back especially difficulty. Overall we should have won and we all really wanted to win." Particularly hard for Martin who describes his career low simply as losing games, stating it hurts to lose.

Now at the end of June the season is starting to draw to a close, but what are Martin's feelings towards the rest of the season, he says, "it is hard to say but we need to get a few wins and can then look forward to next season." But next season may, or may not, see the introduction of three main divisions seeing the NFP split in two, Martin adds, "it could be a good idea, it would make most games competitive and definitely close the gap between the teams."

Martin prefers to play at hocker and describes his own strengths and weaknesses as, "defensively I think I have been very strong for the past few weeks but I feel I haven't been making enough runs during half."Team spirit has always been good, leading Martin to say, "we were a bit down at the beginning of the season but there is a good buzz around the place after signing a few experienced players at add to the young lads, I think Roy has done well." Bringing Stevo back did seem like an inspired move, lets hope a few more things click into place today.
