Oldam

GARETH BARBER - 20 year old Oldham born half back or centre who was reared on rugby with his best pal, the Leeds and Great Britain loose forward, Kevin Sinfield. When Sinfield signed for Leeds Rhinos, Barber signed for Warrington, but returned home to Oldham before the start of the 2000-01 season. Played for the NFP under 21's at Widnes in the autumn.

KEITH BRENNAN - a versatile half back or hooker, local lad Keith shot to prominence last season when his form was so good that, for a time, he kept John Hough out of the number 9 shirt. A natural footballer with good hands.

CHRIS CAMPBELL - a recently signed 21-year-old utility back, signed from Whitehaven after impressing in trials. Is the son of ex referee David Campbell. Signed for Warrington from Crossfields amateur club as a seventeen year old and was top Alliance try scorer in his first season with 26 tries from full back

JASON CLEEG - second biggest forward at the club after Danny Guest, is a former Bradford (Northern, not Bulls) forward, who has had four good seasons with Oldham. Powerful on the break, he is a favourite of the Oldham supporters.

WILL COWELL - a 21 year old who played at Warrington, this Cumbrian utility back is equally at home at fullback, wing or centre. Played 18 Super League games for Warrington after signing form Kells, the Whitehaven amateur club.

GAVIN DODD - a local youngster who is learning the ropes at Oldham. A wing or full back, 20 year old Gavin played for the NFP under 21's at Widnes and is sure to be pushing for a regular place this season.

LEE DORAN - another young player in whom Oldham have a lot of confidence. Showed up well for the NFP under 21's as one of five Roughyeds players in the squad.

ANTHONY GIBBONS - formed a reliable centre partnership last season with goalkicking Pat Rich, who has now left the club to go on a twelve month world tour. Looked certain to be the first choice centre again this season, but suspension and a bad ankle injury have meant he missed the start of the season, but he is now back as a permanent member of the squad.

JON GODDARD - a 19-year-old and the youngest member of the squad, Cas, lad Jon has joined Oldham on loan from Castleford thanks to old pals act. Graham Steadman is a firiend and former team mate of former coach, Ford and saw a loan spell with Oldham as the ideal way to bring Jon along.

DANNY GUEST - another of the Roughyed 'originals' who returned to the club two seasons ago. A big prop, he is expected to be a force to be reckoned with in the NFP this season after signing a new one-year deal.

JOHN HOUGH - the first player to sign for his home-town club when

the new Roughyeds were formed by Chris Hamilton and his fellow directors in the autumn of 1997. Before the start of last season, he had played 87 of the club's 90 matches and had scored 32 tries, a phenomenal record for a hooker.

GAVIN JOHNSON - a young centre or wing, or occasional back row forward, Oldhamer. Spent almost a season earning his Oldham spurs in the alliance team before signing a two-year deal last September.

STEVE MOLLOY - Steve had been playing for Batley on a hort term contract after leaving Huddersfield at the end of last season. A strong prop forward and ex captain of England, Steve's other previous clubs are Featherstone and Sheffield Steve has of course recently been appointed the Club's Player Coach.

ANTHONY MURRAY- another recent signing from Swinton. Anthony is a versatile player who can play Hooker, halfback or loose forward.

NEIL RODEN - a clever halfback who joined Oldham from Wigan, with Farrell, a season and a half ago. He only missed a couple of games since. Can play stand off or scrum half and was a key figure in Oldham's run through to the NFP Grand final last summer.

MARK SIBSON - quick full back who loves nothing better than to attack from deep. Joined Oldham on a two-year contract when he left Bramley and has recently signed a new one-year deal.

Looking Back

Today we entertain our friends from Oldham here at Craven Park for the second time this season, on this occasion for the opening round of the Grand Final series of matches, in the Northern Ford Premiership.

In various forms of end of season play-offs the clubs' paths have crossed just three times since the last World War. The one which is most frequently recalled is the titanic struggle at Old Trafford in 1990 in which Oldham came back from a seemingly impossible 29 points to 8 deficit shortly after the interval to snatch victory by 30 points to 29 this in the Second Division premiership final.

This was the third time Oldham had beaten the Robins that season having completed a league double over them; this despite Rovers being crowned champions, by virtue of finishing at the top of the league. However as this match was covered in detail in the programme for Oldham's earlier visit this season, we will today concentrate on the other two encounters in the different play-off competitions, which the Rugby League have used over the years.

The first fixture dates back to the 1964/1965 season when in a one league system the top sixteen teams played in a knockout format at the end of the season. With the Robins having finished eighth and Oldham ninth, it gained Rovers home advantage.

The match was played at Craven Park on Holderness Road on Saturday the 24th April 1965. Rovers it is fair to say had completed a mixed season despite the major signings of Bill Holliday and Frank Foster. They were able to name a full strength side for this match with the exception that prop Brain Tyson failed a late fitness test and was replaced by Keith Pollard. Oldham too were only one short of being able to name their preferred line-up with new signing Rhodesian John Winton being ineligible for these playoffs. meant that veteran full back Frank (Spanky) Dyson was recalled for what was to prove to be the last match of his career prior to his retirement.

The two teams therefore lined up as follows. Hull Kingston Rovers: Kellett; Burwell (A), Burwell (B), Moore, Blackmore; Elliott, Bunting; Bath, Flanagan, Pollard, Holliday, Foster and Poole. Oldham: Dyson; Sims, Crowther, McCormack, Elliott; Warburton, Broomhead; Mumberson, Taylor, Bott, Major, Irving and Parker. Several of the players on view that day were old foes as many, on both sides had played some part in the three epic cup semi-finals of the previous season.

Oldham were first into their stride and built an early 7 points to 0 lead courtesy of a Tommy Warburton try and Frank Dyson conversion and a further Dyson penalty. Rovers soon hit back however when a break in the middle of the field put prop Pollard over for Cyril Kellett to convert and narrow the gap to 2 points.

Looking Back continued

David Elliott then scored a brilliant try for the Robins beating two defenders in the process and going thirty yards to cross the line giving Kellett an easy conversation. This gave the home side a 10 points to 7 lead which was reduced to just one point when Dyson kicked a further penalty given for a scrum offence. However three penalties by ace goal-kicker Cyril Kellett gave the Robins breathing space at 16 points to 9.

Oldham however were not going to lie down and a second try from Warburton made by loose forward Dave Parker and again converted by Dyson made the score 16 points to 14 in the Robins' favour. However two late tries for Rovers the first scored by Arthur Bunting and made by captain Harry Poole and the second by Foster after good work by Poole and Holliday, both converted by Kellett made the final score Hull Kingston Rovers 26 Oldham 14. All in all an excellent open match watched by a crowd of 9,500 and well controlled by Mr. D.T.H. Davies of Manchester, who incidentally had officiated in two of the three cup-ties between the sides the previous season.

For the second playoff match between the two clubs one only has to go back two years to 2000, when the sides met at Spotland the home of Rochdale Hornets in the Grand Final elimination semi-final. It was played on Sunday the 9th July 2000, and the losers knew that their season would come to an end.

The two sides lined up as follows: Oldham: Sibson; Cross, Gibbons (A), Rich, Barrow; Gibbons (D), Ford; Molloy, Hough, Proctor, Farrell, McMenemy and Mannion. Subs. Roden, Clegg, Guest and Sinfield. Hull

Kingston Rovers: Molloy; Wray, Nolan, Taewa, Blanchard; Joe, Hewitt; Fletcher, Dixon, Wilson (Rc), Leatham, Andrews and Charles. Subs. Yeaman, Bovill, Hardy and Wilkin.

The excitement in this game intensified as it went along as no one could have visualised the drama to come when after 58 minutes Oldham led by 17 points to 0. This due to tries from Dean Cross, Phil Farrell and David Gibbons, two goals from Pat Rich, and a drop from player coach Mike Ford. However Rovers then started a tremendous fight-back with first Mark Hewitt's kick creating a try for John Wray, and then Mike Dixon and Hewitt combined to send Whetu Taewa in, both tries unfortunately from a Rovers point of view unconverted thus leaving the score at 17 points 8. Neil Roden then put over a drop goal to ease Oldham out to 18 points to 8, then with just two minutes left on the clock Hewitt scored for the Robins from acting half near to the line and Chris Charles successful conversation made the difference just 4 points.

However in the dying seconds Anthony Gibbons sealed Oldham's win with a late unconverted try, making the final score 22 points to 14 in the home side's favour and completing Hull Kingston Rovers season. Paul Fletcher was adjudged the Robins best player in a match controlled by Mr. S. Nicholson of Whitehaven and watched by a crowd of 2,584 including a good proportion from the Hull area, supporting the Robins.

COME the business end of the season and it looks as if Rovers are on their way again. Recent form, culminating in the wins over Hunslet, Leigh and Doncaster inside a week has really sent spirits and hopes soaring. People this time are taking a Grand Final appearance as a possibility rather than a dream. Last year that would not have been possible. This year the only teams above Rovers are two full-time outfits and Rochdale whose form under Martin Hall was marginally more consistent than The Robins during the season. Perhaps the slump and the troubles which followed the defeat at Batley took a toll more costly than people realised at the time.

Another couple of wins and Rovers could have had a week off and third spot. But fourth place is an improvement on last year and also Rovers have been to the Buddies National League Cup final. Not the biggest final in the world that's for sure. But it was the only final the NFP sides realistically had a chance of reaching and Rovers took it.

That too might have had more points on the minus than plus scale as it took a lot out of the players, and allowed other sides, including outfits like Batley to recharge their batteries somewhat. But it did allow Gary Wilkinson's men to experience the build up to a final and that could stand them in good stead.

The other thing that is in their favour is they have beaten all the sides in the competition with the exception of Huddersfield. In the case of Leigh they have beaten them twice out of the last three

times they have played each other. Much depends on the strength of squad the club can put out, and how up they are for it on the day.

Injuries seem to be clearing up and apart from the loss of Ally McClarron with his broken shoulder I don't think the casualty situation is too bad.

Judging by the spirit in the camp the Robins could be set for a cracking close to the end of the season. There is no fear there, respect of course for the opposition, but not even Huddersfield scares them. Paul Fletcher was saying in midweek that he felt the side ran Huddersfield close for long periods of each game played between the clubs, and he felt there was the same sort of dressing room spirit in the club now as during last season's run-in. One thing which must help is the sheer amount of local lads in the team. I think there were 13 out of the 17 against Leigh who were locals. And there are not a lot of places about which you can say that.

I suppose now is not really the best time, but then is there ever a best time, to ask about next season. Has the club got any targets? Who are they? And what's the situation with the coach because that's one area which seems far from clear. And fourth place and a good run in the play-offs must surely be counted by everyone as success. And success does tend to get people noticed. I understand meetings are scheduled to sort some of these problems out but I'm sure most fans would appreciate more information from the portals of Craven Park than emerged during the last close season.

And for those of you who wondered where the chairman was last week I can say he was being a very proud dad watching his daughter come ninth in a national dressage competition at a meeting in the Midlands. He was a man of very divided loyalties he said on Saturday night, but decided there were some times when family must come first, even before Rovers.




Language


