"The Mount Scene"

Well we have ended up with another home game after all!

The tremendous victory at Doncaster was followed up with an even better performance at The Lionheart Stadium, Featherstone last Sunday. Hopefully, Rugby League Raw showed more of the match and less of the Featherstone Chairman's pets as was the case for the Doncaster game!

A sizeable Batley following saw our first win at Featherstone since 8th October 1952

(which was a Yorkshire Cup Semi Final 8 - 4 victory incidentally) and the lads fully deserved the win and extended what seems like a never ending season - still as far as I am concerned it can carry on all the way to 12th October and the Grand Final at the Halton Stadium, Widnes. Only 2 more games to go and having a home tie at this stage is a bonus - Go for it lads! The support has been tremendous - What a second half to the season.

Moving onto the current stats position which shows the following :-

Goal Kicking - The leading goal scorer is Dean Lawford with 84 successful attempts from 119 which represents a 71% success rate, Paul Gleadhill 9 from 12 (75%), Craig Stevens 2 from 3 (67%), Chris Hough 9 from 17 (53%), Will Cartledge 2 from 5 (40%) and Richard Gibson with one from 3 (33%). Long term injury victims, Jez Dyson 14 from 20 (70%) and Craig Wright failed with his two attempts at goal.

Try scoring - The leading try scoring position is currently held by Craig Lingard on 25 with Glen Tomlinson on 23, followed by Danny Maun on 19.

Points scoring - Dean Lawford leads the way with 182 points.

Consecutive appearances - The longest run of consecutive appearances is held by Paul Harrison who stands on 18.

Penalty count - For the entire season stands at 263 in Batley's favour and 292 to our combined opponents. Last week at Featherstone Mr Silverwood rather generously awarded 7 to us whilst he felt the need to ignore Featherstone's high tackling and strangely enough gave them 13!

Consecutive games scored in - Dean Lawford has currently scored in the last 5 games.

In Town Today **Oldham**

This includes all competitive games against Oldham & Oldham Roughyeds.

Earlier this season on 5th May we lost 16 - 40 at Hurst Cross in the Buddies National League Cup but gained revenge in the league fixture on 23rd June by winning 34 - 26.

On 11th August the points were shared 20 - 20 in the league fixture at 'The Mount'. Emergency goal kicker, Will Cartledge landing 2 goals with tries from Craig Lingard, Chris North, Kris Lythes and Paul Harrison. The crowd being 1,013.

Not many players have represented both clubs over the years, here are some of them that have: Probably the most famous being former Batley 'great', John Etty. Others include scrum half, Mick McCone, centre, Mick Parrish, wingman, Hugh Gumbs, prop forwards, Jason Clegg, and former Batley club captain Gary Lord, hooker John Clarke, second row forward Craig Richards and current Bulldog, Joe Naidole. Incidentally current Oldham coach, Steve Molloy has represented both clubs this season!

14th September 1895 sees Oldham play their first match in the Northern Union against Hunslet and lose 8 - 16. Season 1899 and Oldham beat Hunslet in the Challenge Cup Final becoming the first Lancashire club to win the trophy. Season 1907 sees Dickie Thomas' team beaten in both the Challenge Cup Final and Championship Final. Oldham, however, win their first Lancashire Cup.

Season 1911 and Joe Ferguson's great team retain the Championship after beating Wigan in consecutive finals. 1922 and Reg Farrar sets a club record of 49 tries in a season.

Season's 1924, 1925,1926 and 1927 Oldham reach 4 successive Challenge Cup Finals, winning in 1925 under Herman Hilton and 1927 under Bob Sloman. Also in 1927 the first radio broadcast of a Challenge Cup Final takes place when Oldham meet Swinton at Wigan.

Alex Givvons makes his debut for Oldham in 1933, the start of an association with the club which would last 60 years. Alan Davies makes his debut in 1950 and goes on to score a club record 173 tries. 1956-57 marks a three trophy season, Frank Stirrup captains the team to victory in the Lancashire Cup and League. Bernard Ganley leads them in the 15-14 defeat of Hull in the Championship final. Season 1958 sees Ganley become the first player to kick 200 goals in a season.

1959 and Oldham pay a world record £10,650 to Workington Town for Ike Southward. Oldham come nearest to reaching Wembley in 1964 losing to Hull KR after 2 semi final replays.

Mick Parrish (latterly a Batley player) becomes the only Oldham player to score in every match in a season in 1981-82. Andy Goodway captains Great Britain against France in 1985. James Lomas is the only other Oldham player to lead Great Britain in a test match (1911-12).

1988 and Oldham win both the Second Division Championship and the Second Division Premiership at Old Trafford after a 28-26 victory against Featherstone Rovers. Des Foy wins the Harry Sunderland Trophy as man of the match.

Oldham beat Hull KR 30-29 in the Second Division Premiership Final in 1990, Mike Ford wins the Harry Sunderland Trophy.

19th January 1997 and Oldham beat Swinton 20-16 in the last match to be played at Watersheddings. In the same season Oldham drop out of Super League and go into liquidation and are resurrected as a Second Division team.

Oldham win the inaugural Red Rose Trophy and are beaten finalists against Batley Bulldogs in the Trans Pennine Trophy in 1998. Season 2000 - 01 and Oldham are beaten Grand Finalists against Widnes and miss out on a possible Super League place.

JASON CLEGG Prop	Former Bradford Northern prop who has had four good seasons with Oldham A favourite of the Oldham supporters.						
WILL COWELL Utility Back	21 year old, former Warrington player. Played 18 Super League games for Warrington and was recommended to Oldham by Daryl Van de Velde.						
PHIL FARRELL Forward	Brother of Wigan forward Andy Farrell, Phil has spent over two seasons at the club and was signed by former coach, Mike Ford. Another player who played in the NFP U-21's.						
ANTHONY GIBBONS Centre	Formed a reliable centre partnership last season Pat Rich. Hit by injury earlier in the season.						
DAVID GIBBONS Half-back	Anthony's identical twin. Former Leeds and Bramley half-back who was vice captain last season.						
DANNY GUEST Prop	Another Roughyed's original who returned to the club two season's ago. A big prop he has had a great season.						
BRYAN HENARE Back Rower	Former St Helens and Auckland Warriors back rower who originally joined the club on loan from Saints before signing permanently for the 2002 season on a one year contract						
JOHN HOUGH Hooker	Live wire hooker, who was the first player to sign for the Roughyeds in 1997. Before last season, he had a try scoring rate of a try every three games. A tremendous record for a hooker.						
GAVIN JOHNSON	Gavin spent two seasons at Odsal in the Bradford Academy side. Gavin is Oldham borm and bred.

MARK SIBSON	Another player that Mike ford signed from Bramley. He is widely regarded as one of the best and most exciting fullbacks in the NFP.						
<u>LEE DORAN</u> <u>Prop</u>	Teenage prop who is just starting to emerge as a another possible future first team regular. Played for the first team against Batley where he made an immediate impact with his powerful runs.



LEIGH coach Paul Terzis remarked after his side's defeat at Huddersfield that the only result he predicted incorrectly at the weekend was the Centurions', as Batley and Oldham continued their remarkable runs on a weekend of upsets.

The only game that went as league positions suggested it would, was at the McAlpine Stadium, where the Giants continued their seemingly unstoppable march towards Super League with a 36-10 win over the Centurions.

Admittedly, Leigh were severely disrupted by suspensions to key pair Adam Bristow and Vila Matautia, and lost halfback pairing Bobbie Goulding and John Duffy to injury in the opening 25 minutes. But: the Giants still looked formidable, even more so following coach Tony Smith's after-match comment that they "played OK".

But the weekend's real stories in the NFP play-offs came with Batley's and Oldham's wins at Featherstone and Rochdale respectively.
