

Advertising, sponsorship and especially Saturday Yankee Lottery provide the lifeblood for Rochdale Hornets.

In the past few weeks we have seen a supporters initiative which we hope gets off the ground. In addition we have written to all the club's shareholders and friends of Rochdale Hornets to see if they would be prepared to contribute £500 a year for the next two years. The hope is that if 100 people agree to the scheme it would provide a cash injection of £50,000 per year and would offer us a major lifeline. OLDHAM

Gavin DODD A local youngster who is learning the ropes at Oldham. A wing or full-back, 21 year old Gavin played for the NFP under 21's at Widnes and is sure to be pushing for a regular place this season, either at full-back or as a lively winger who knows where the try (goal) line is.

Jon GODDARD A 20 year old and the youngest member of the squad, Cas. lad Jon has joined Oldham from Castleford thanks to the old pals act. Graham Steadman is a firm friend and former team mate of former coach Ford, and saw a loan spell with Oldham as the ideal way to bring Jon along. Already this is bearing fruit as Goddard's defence has been superb and as his confidence grows it is expected that the tries will soon be coming.

Joe McNICHOLAS One of the original 1997 Roughyeds, wingman Joe made a first team spot his own midway through last season and went on to score eight tries in 14 consecutive appearances. Fast off the mark, god on his feet and always gives 100%.

Will COWELL A 22 year old who played at Warrington, this Cumbrian utility back is equally at home at full-back, wing or centre. Played 18 Super League games for Warrington after signing from Kells, the Whitehaven amateur club. Recommended to Oldham by former Wolves boss Daryl van de Valde, Will has kick-started his career in the NFP with the Roughyeds.

Chris CAMPBELL 22 year old utility back, signed from Whitehaven after impressing in trials. Is the son of ex referee David Campbell. Signed for Warrington from Crossfields amateur club as a seventeen year old and was the top Alliance try scorer in his first season with 26 tries from full-back. Played 10 matches in Super League before following coach Paul Cullen to Whitehaven on a full-time contract. Unfortunately broke his jaw early in his Whitehaven career.

Gareth BARBER 21 year old Oldham born half-back or centre who was reared on rugby with his best pal, the Leeds and Great Britain loose forward, Kevin Sinfield. When Sinfield signed for Leeds Rhinos, Barber signed for Warrington, but returned home to Oldham before the start of the 2000-01 season. Played for the NFP under 21's at Widnes in the autumn.

Steve MOLLOY Player coach Steve had been playing for Batley on a short term contract after leaving Huddersfield at the end of 2000. A strong

prop forward and ex captain of England, Steve's other previous clubs are Featherstone and Sheffield.

John HOUGH The first player to sign for his home-town club when the new Roughyeds were formed by Chris Hamilton and his fellow directors in the autumn of 1997. Before the start of 2000 season, he had played 87 of the club's 90 matches and had scored 32 tries, a phenomenal record for a hooker. He didn't enjoy one of his better seasons in 2001, but a change of job, and less travelling, has seen him back at his best in 2002.

Jason CLEGG Second biggest forward at the club after Danny Guest. Is a former Bradford (Northern, not Bulls) forward, who has had four good seasons with Oldham. Powerful on the break, he is a favourite of the Oldham supporters and regularly picks up the Junior Roughyeds Player of the Year award.

Lee DORAN Another young player in whom Oldham have a lot of confidence. A Wiganer, Lee has worked his way through the Oldham Academy and Alliance sides and he has now broke through to the first team on a regular basis. Showed up well for the NFP under 21's last year as one of five Roughyed players in the squad.

Paul ANDERSON One of four players snapped up from Leigh Centurions. Originally a forward Paul played for St. Helens and Sheffield Eagles before the then Hilton Park boss Ian Millward took him to leigh - and converted him into a centre. Big and strong, Paul has signed a one-year deal with the Roughyeds, similar to all the other new signings.

Neil RODEN A clever half-back who joined Oldham from Wigan, with Farrell, two and a half seasons ago. Has only missed a couple of games since. Can play stand-off or scrum-half and was a key figure in Oldham's run through to the NFP Grand Final in 2001. He is sure to be a regular performer in the long and testing 2003 campaign.

Gavin JOHNSON A young centre or wing, or occasional back-row forward, Oldhamer, Gavin spent two seasons at Odsal in the Bradford Academy side and made the occasional appearance for the Bulls in the Alliance Championship. Spent almost a season earning his Oldham spurs in the Alliance team before signing a two year deal in September 2001.

Danny GUEST Another of the Roughyed 'originals' who returned to the club two seasons ago. A big prop, he is expected to be a force to be reckoned with in the NFP this season after signing a new one year deal.

The first match took place on 7th May, 1921, finishing in a inauspicious 0-0 draw. Oldham were the first holders, winning the replay 12-2 at Watersheddings on 13th May, 1921.

Rochdale Hornets biggest win came in 1999 when Deryck Fox's side won 48-10.


Oldham's biggest win was 53-13 in 1961.

Oldham have won the trophy 40 times to Hornets' 17 times.


Hornets' win in 1999 ended Oldham's longest winning sequence of 7 consecutive victories, the longest in the Cup's history.

Hornets' best run of consecutive victories was between 1947 and 1952.

Oldham were the first team to win the trophy away from home, at the tenth time of asking. In those first 10 years the away team failed to reach a double figure score 9 times!

Changing Faces by GARETH WALKER of Rugby Leaguer & League Express

IN the modern game, the close season usually equates to a flurry of transfer activity, and the period since Huddersfield Giants' October Grand Final win has been no different. All ten National League One clubs have been busy building new squads for the 2003 campaign, with some noticeably more active than others.

Today's two teams have both had a significant turnover of players. At Oldham, it's been a case of seven in, seven out for player coach Steve Molloy, with four of his recruits coming from Leigh Centurions.

Hornets had also added seven new faces at the time of writing, with the batch headed by Salford's International duo lan Watson and Paul Southern, who have represented Wales and Ireland respectively in recent years.

On the way out of Spotland for various reasons have been six Hornets. But despite the moves, this close season represents a little more stability for Hornets after many recent years have seen massive turnovers of both players and coaches.

In fact, Hornets and Oldham look to have profited from the off-season change-around more than most. Leigh Centurions and Hull Kingston Rovers look noticeably weaker than last season at least in terms of numbers, though both were still hoping to recruit as this piece was being written.

Batley Bulldogs look considerably stronger despite the loss of key halfbacks Dean Lawford and Glen Tomlinson, while Featherstone's fortunes without points machine Jamie Rooney will be interesting to monitor.

Whitehaven, Dewsbury and Doncaster look to be among the most stable of clubs in terms of player movement.

Which only leaves newly relegated Salford City Reds. They have lost a significant part of their Super League squad, but have also retained plenty of quality players and with some impressive new additions and their full-time status will undoubtedly start as strong favourites for the title.

But it is far from a foregone conclusion and 2003 again promises to provide Rugby League supporters with a feast of passion, excitement and entertainment.



Rugby League as a sport is suffering financially at the moment, with several clubs in very dire straits indeed. No-one can have failed to notice the stories in the local press that have highlighted Hornets' situation - but loyal Hornets fans are playing a vital part in helping secure the future of our club.

Last month saw the inaugural meeting of the Hornets Nest-Egg - an independent supporters' fund-raising association. Several clubs already have 'squadbuilder' schemes and independent supporters' associations and this will follow similar lines.

We are asking supporters to make either a single contribution of £100 or £10 per month - but all donations are welcome and will guarantee full membership. A democratic voting system ensures that members always have the final say in how the money will be spent.

In a perfect world we'd have 1000 fans paying £100 and we'd have the cash-richest club in the league - but all we can do is try and get as many people as possible involved and raise as much as we can. It's envisaged that all funds raised will be used for the acquisition, retention and development of the best quality players we can afford. We are currently talking to Martin Hall about his plans for the forthcoming season and it's hoped that the Nest-Egg will go some way to ensuring that Hornets remain a competitive team that we can all take satisfaction in watching.

Rugby League's at a crossroads - those clubs that can hang in there through the next few difficult years will have a better chance of long-term survival. If Hornets are to remain serious challengers next and every season, we can all make an investment in the future of our club by getting behind it. £100 sounds like a lot of money - but it works out at less than £2 a week to help maintain a competitive team - and ensure that we have a successful future.

The Hornets Nest-Egg is an independent supporters' movement, run by supporters for the good of the club and the survival of professional Rugby League in Rochdale. Hornets is your club as much as it is anyone else's and the Nest-Egg has the potential to be 'fan-power' in action.

Hornets have been struggling on since 1871 - now the future is in our hands. If enough people get behind this idea, its potential is huge. We're just supporters like you are - but we think that together we can do something that will have a positive effect on our club.

The next Hornets Nest-Egg meeting takes place at The Baum, Toad Lane, Rochdale on Wednesday, 8th January, 2003 at 8 p.m. Martin Hall has agreed to come along to talk about his plans for the season and answer questions. And, in addition to the Raffle, we will be auctioning ex-Kiwi Dave Watson's Hornets playing jersey.

LOOKING BACKTO LAST YEAR

25th November, 2001 Rochdale Hornets 27 v 14 Oldham (HT 16-2) Attendance 1,480

Both teams went into this game on the back of impressive pre-season results but Hornets ended the game as convincing winners and collected the A. J. Law Infirmary Cup for the first time since 1988.

It was Hornets' new boys who did most of the damage, with new signings Richard Pachniuk, Richard Agar and Matt Long scoring 20 of their 27 points. Agar finished with 12 points from 2 tries and two conversions but it was hooker Pachniuk who stole the show on his return with an accomplished display around the play-the-balls. Fittingly "Pach" received the Karl Marriott Memorial Trophy, particularly poignant as he had played alongside Marriott on several occasions in his previous spell with Hornets.

Matt Calland was another player to have a big game, as he regularly punched holes in the Roughyeds defence. Marlon Billy started the season as he had finished the last, with a try and Danny Sculthorpe signed off with a reminder of his full repertoire of rugby league skills by landing a long-range field goal.

Oldham lacked the cohesion they had shown in beating Leigh a week earlier and despite Hough's prompting did not cross Hornets' line until Brennan's 52 minute effort: It was only a last minute consolation try from Henare that gave the game a respectable look.

Martin Hall was reasonably satisfied with the performance "we were disappointed with conceding the try at the end but generally I thought some of the guys played particularly well. There is more depth and quality in the squad and that brings more options."

Hall's counterpart Mike Ford said "Rochdale played well and we're disappointed, we've got a lot of work to do. But I saw one or two signs that we're going to be up there at the end of the season, and certainly Rochdale will be as well."
