



Welcome to

This afternoon we welcome players, officials and supporters to the Colosseum at Hilton Park.

After taking the coaching reigns in the middle of last season Steve Molloy steadied his side and guided them into National League One. The good news continued over the close season with the club returning to play at Boundary Park after a year in exile at Ashton United's cosy Hurst Cross surroundings. Like many sides, the Roughyeds have recruited, bringing seven new faces into their squad.

After being released by the Centurions in October, Chris Morley, Paul Anderson, Simon Svabic and Chris Irwin all became Oldham players and it is somewhat ironic that the draw for the opening round of the Arriva Trains Cup pairs the two clubs, giving three of those players a great opportunity to show why they should still be here at the Colosseum.

The Roughyeds other new recruits include:

Darren Shaw - An experienced Australian forward who has played for Sheffield, London and Salford during his time in this country. He can play in the second row or at prop and featured in 15 and 9 games for Salford and London respectfully last season.

Martin McLoughlin - Formerly of Wigan, 22 year old McLoughlin played 25 games last season for Barrow, scoring five tries.

McLoughlin is a player who will mainly be utilised in the front row.


lain Marsh - Another recruit from Barrow, Marsh appeared in 33 games for the Craven Park outfit last season, scoring 13 tries. Prior to his spell in Cumbria, Marsh played for Salford and St Helens and is a centre by trade.

The players that have moved from Oldham include one of our signings in Bryan Henare, twin brothers Dave and Anthony Gibbons and last season's top try scorer Mark Sibson. Despite the loss of this firepower and consistency, the Roughyeds can still call upon Neil Roden, one of the top halfbacks in the competition and the highly promising Gareth Barber who totalled 18 tries, 81 goals and 233 points in all competitions last season.

Last season Oldham and Leigh met on two occasions, the first game here at Leigh saw the Centurions play some excellent rugby to secure a 46-12 victory. Neil Turley was the Leigh hero with a try hat-trick and nine goals.

A much closer game followed in July when new Roughyed Simon Svabic was the hero with a late try for Leigh. Oldham gave a dogged display in which Bryan Henare, John Hough and Neil Roden were top performers in a 22-26 defeat.

If today's game is half as good as the last one between the sides we are all in for a good afternoon!

Paul Anderson - One of four players snapped up from Leigh Centurions. Originally a forward, Paul played for St. Helens and Sheffield Eagles before the then Hilton Park boss Ian Millward took him to Leigh - and converted him to centre. Big and strong, Paul has signed a one year deal with the Roughyeds.

Gareth Barber - 21 year old Oldham born half back or centre who was reared on rugby with his best pal, the Leeds and GB loose forward, Kevin Sinfield. When Sinfield signed for Leeds, Barber signed for Warrington, but returned home to Oldham for the start of the 2000-1 season. Played for the NFP under 21's at Widnes in the autumn of 2001. Became a regular last season and took on goal kicking responsibilities.

Jason Clegg - Former Bradford (Northern, not Bulls) forward who has had five good seasons with Oldham. Powerful on the break, he is a favourite with Oldham supporters and regularly picks up the Junior Roughyeds Player of the Year award. Has relished the competition for prop places since Steve Molloy became coach.

Will Cowell - A 22 year old who has played at Warrington. This Cumbrian utility back is equally at home at full-back, wing or centre. Played 18 Super League games for the Wolves after signing from Kells, the Whitehaven amateur club. Recommended to Oldham by former Wolves boss Daryl van de Velde, Will kick started his NFP career with the Roughyeds last season and promises much for the future.

Gavin Dodd - A local player. A wing or full-back, 21 year old Gavin has played for the NFP's under 21's. He made the full-back position his own towards the end of last season and will be eager to continue his development this season. Either at full-back or as a lively winger he knows where the try line is.

Lee Doran - Another young player in whom Oldham have a lot of confidence. A Wiganer, Les has worked his way through the Oldham Academy and Alliance sides and last season made the second row spot his own. A great prospect for the future and the Roughyeds are looking for a big season from Lee. Has previously shown up well in the NFP under 21 side against their Super League counterparts.

Phil Farrell - Younger brother of Wigan and GB ace Andy Farrell. In his first three seasons at the club has a remarkable record of consistency. Unfortunately had a couple of injuries last season that sidelined him for some time. Now back to full fitness he is raring to go for the new season. Played for the NFP under 21 side against their Super League counterparts in 2001.

John Hough - The first player ever to sign for his hometown club when they were re-formed way back in 1997. Before the start of the 2000 season, 'Scruff' had played 87 of the clubs 90 matches and scored 62 tries, a phenominal record for a hooker. He didn't enjoy one of his better seasons in 2001, but a change of job, and less travelling, saw him back to his best in 2002. The first player again this season to sign a new two year contract.

lan Marsh - A big lad who was at Barrow last season, lan hails from St. Helens. He spent several seasons with Salford City Reds before moving North to Craven Park where last season he forged a regular centre partnership with Kiwi Cliff Beverley. The Roughyeds have put a good deal of emphasis in their new signings on strength and physique. Marsh fits the bill more than admirably.


Joe McNicholas - One of the original 1997 Roughyeds, wingman Joe made a first team spot his own mid way through the 2000/1 season and went on to score 8 tries in 14 consecutive appearances. Fast off the mark, good on his feet and always gives 110%.

Steve Molloy - Local lad Steve had been playing for Batley on a short-term contract after leaving Huddersfield. A strong prop forward and ex captain of England, Steve's other previous clubs are Featherstone and Sheffield. After accepting the role of player-coach when John Harbin left, Steve guided the Roughyeds to safety to ensure National League One rugby this season. Has recently signed a new contract to stay on as player coach.

Chris Morley - Elder brother of Adrian, the Sydney City Roosters and GB pack star. Like Anderson, Chris has also played previously for St. Helens, Sheffield and Leigh as well as Warrington. A tough and experienced back row forward; he has also played several times for Wales. Is relishing the challenge of a new club with Super League ambitions.

Neil Roden - A clever half-back who joined Oldham from Wigan, with Phil Farrell. Has only missed a couple of games since. Can play at stand off or scrum half and was a key figure in the Roughyeds' run through to the NFP Grand Final a couple of seasons ago. He is sure to be a regular performer in the long and testing 2003 campaign.

Darren Shaw - One of the most experienced forwards in the English game, Aussie born Darren, has played most of his rugby league in this country - at London Broncos, Sheffield, Castleford and Salford. He played second-row for the Eagles of Steel City when they beat Wigan 17-8 at Wembley in one of the Challenge Cup's biggest upsets in 1998.

Behind The Sticks with Mike Hulme

Commercially Speaking with Mike Callaghan

NEWS of the RFL's plans to consider fast-tracking a leading French team into Super League as early as next season should be met with alarm, not only here at Hilton Park, but at all other National League clubs who aspire to join the game' elite division.

A heavyweight RFL delegation, including Richard Lewis and David Waite, spent last weekend in the south of France (not bad work if you can get it) meeting the Super League hopefuls Toulouse, UTC and Villeneuve.

By all accounts the British delegation returned very impressed with the business plans presented by the French club and although they admitted there were three diverse proposals, the Super League clubs are due to chew over the idea this week.

But hang on a minute. Is this French 'revolution' something we should be rushing towards? I think not.

What message does this send out to clubs outside Super League who aspire to win promotion to the highest level. If a French club is re-admitted to Super League for 2004, does it mean that this year's National League Division One Grand Final will be denied the right to move up? The response from HQ when asked that question has been deafening.

Before the RFL rushes off lemming-like to give Super League a 'European' element National League Clubs should be consulted and have an input into any decision-making. In theory they are all potential Super League clubs and deserve to have their voices heard.

Is the RFL a democracy or dictatorship. We'll soon find out.

We rugby journalists are supposed to be objective. But when it comes to beating the Aussies (at anything) you can stuff your objectivity.

You can keep your tied series against the Kiwis in the autumn, the most significant results for years came later when Great Britain's Academy side turned the previously invincible Australian Schoolboys over not once, but twice.

The 2-0 series win Britain's first victories in over 30 years of trying shows that perhaps we are closing the gap at junior level.

We should be shouting out from the roof-tops after these results. Just look at the long list of players who have tried and failed to beat the Aussies at this level and gone on to have long international careers. That must make this bunch of players particularly special and I, for one, can't wait to see their careers blossom.






