# Peter Roe's Verdict

# Welcome To Today's Visitors

Oldham

### Paul Anderson

Signed from Leigh Centurions for the beginning of the 2003 season. His preferred position is centre three-quarter but is not at a loss in the second row. A burly build enables him to make a try out of sheer strength. Was Leigh's leading try scorer the season before last, and is well known for his bock-busting runs. His previous clubs include St. Helens and Sheffield Eagles.

### Gareth Barber

A 21 year-old Oldham born half back who was reared on rugby with his best pal, Leeds and GB ace Kevin Sinfield. Barber was with Warrington before his signing for Oldham for the start of the 2000/1 season. A promising young player who made the Stand off position his own last season.

### Will Cowell

Played 18 times in Super League for Warrington, mostly as a sub. The 22 year old Cumbrian a product of the prolific Kells club, he left Wilderspool to join Oldham. A Full back, Wing or Centre, preferring Full back, his chances to impress the coach will probably be as a Centre or Winger. Former Warrington coach Darryl van der Velde spoke well of him before the youngster was invited to join the Roughyeds.

### Gavin Dodd

Former Royton Tigers youngster, who had a spell with Bradford Bulls Academy team. Fast on the break yet unpredictable at times, Dodd scored some good tries last season and made the full back position his own, pushing Mark Sibson out onto the wing. Dodd represented GB students in Australia and New Zealand and has been selected for Great Britain under 21's in the past.

### Lee Doran

Another young player in whom Oldham have a lot of confidence. A Wiganer, Lee has worked his way through the Academy and Alliance teams at Oldham and is now probably one of the first names on the Oldham team sheet each week. Good pace and robust defence give him all the assets required to make a top class second row forward. Showed up well in the NFP under 21's in 2001. One of five Oldham players in that squad.

### Phil Farrell

Phil starting his fourth season with the Roughyeds, has just been appointed club captain. Played most of his rugby at Oldham at second row but it looks like he will fit into the loose forward role this season, a position his older brother Andy fills for Wigan. One of the youngest captains in the league, will not be fazed by the responsibility.

### John Hough

The first player to sign for his hometown club when Chris Hamilton and his fellow directors formed the new Roughyeds in 1997. Has just signed a new contract to take him to the end of the 2004 season. On his day, one of the best hookers in the National League, a danger to any defence from acting half back. By the end of the 2002 season he had made 152 appearances for Oldham, 37 of them in the 2002 season alone. Last season saw him cross the whitewash on 10 occasions, second only to Lee Doran in the Forward try scoring charts.

### Chirs Irwin

Another player sign from Leigh Centurions at the end of the 2002 season. Chris is happy on the wing or at full back. Has natural pace and will be a great asset to the Oldham back line wherever he is chosen to play. Gained experience with the Centurions playing at the top level of the National League.

### Iain Marsh

22-year-old goal kicking centre or winger signed from Barrow Border Raiders. Iain, a St. Helens lad played for Salford for 5 years including some Super League appearances, before signing for St. Helens. Was Cameron Bells first signing for Barrow last season and mainly played as a centre along side Kiwi Cliff Beverley. Scored 12 tries in 32 appearances. A solid defender and a very strong finisher.

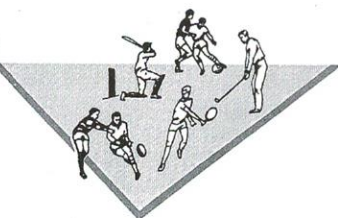

### Darren Shaw

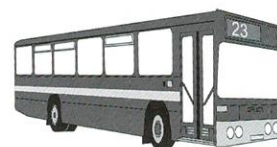

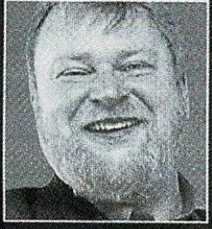

# One Lion on the Shirt

The formation of the Swinton club in 1866 coincided with the rise in inter-club contests and the formal organisation of the various codes of football. The original name of Swinton and Pendlebury was shortened to Swinton Football Club within a few years of joining the Rugby Football Union in 1871. There was tremendous enthusiasm for football in the Manchester area at this time and it is not surprising that Swinton decided to play the rugby code given the physical nature of the town's main industry at the time, namely coal mining. Indeed, during those early days, the club was often referred to as the Colliers. Famously, the nickname of the Lions was adopted, after moving the club's headquarters from the Bull's Head to the White Lion, of course.

Swinton FC were a prominent and successful member of the rugby union ranks for thirty years after formation. This ended when the club decided to join the breakaway Northern Union (later to be re-titled Rugby League) in 1896 a year after the rebel code was created in a row over broken-time payments to players. Steve Wild's book "The Lions of Swinton" gives a wonderful narrative to this exciting period in the history of the club, as well as the massive contribution of England international Jim Valentine. The growth of the club was spectacular and a credit to the early pioneers, who ensured that the club had a successful start, including regular games against the top teams in the north such as Manchester and Birch and eventually a fixture against Oxford University.

There are a number of interesting facts about Swinton in the book "The Code War - English Football under the History Spotlight." There is an account of Swinton playing under floodlights in October 1878 at Broughton. Later that year there was a failed attempt to play under floodlights at Chorley, when the generator failed due to the rain. There is mention of the highly talented Swinton and Lancashire full back Arthur Paul who was as an architect, but more on this person in future programmes. By 1892-93 Swinton has been selected to take part in a ten team Lancashire club Championship that included Oldham, Warrington and Wigan as the dissatisfaction with the Rugby Union authorities grew stronger.

Rugby Union sources also provide valuable information on Swinton; such as the contribution of the club to the game in the early years. "The History of the Rugby Football Union" by O.L. Owen and published in 1955 shows that the Lions beat a visiting Maoris team in 1888-89 by 2-0 and that Swinton provided four players on the 1888 tour to Australia and New Zealand, namely T. Banks, W. Bumby, A. Paul and the tour skipper, Bob Seddon, who tragically drowned while in Australia. It also lists the five players that represented England at Rugby Union between 1882 and 1896. These players are E. Beswick (2 caps), C. Horley (1 cap), J. Marsh (1 cap), S. Roberts (2 caps) and J. Valentine (4 caps).

Finally, in the Complete History of Oldham RLFC by Michael Turner there is a mystery involving Swinton. The Lions were the first visiting team to Watersheddings and the last in a specially arranged game. Just prior to the match the scoreboard had a sign for Oldham and a sign for Swinton, but at kick-off the Swinton sign was gone and replaced by Visitors. Whodunit? Roughyed or Lion? In the next programme soccer books will be searched to find one lion on the shirt.
