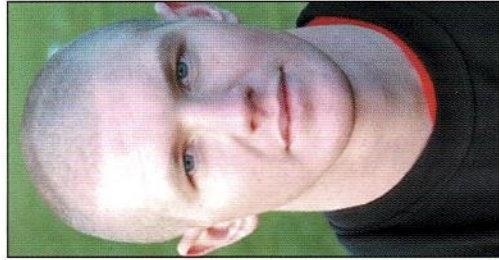

The first occasion that Salford met Oldham was during the 1896-97 campaign at New Barnes, the visitors winning by 9 points to nil and they completed a double over us later that season courtesy of an 11 points to 3 victory. At the end of that campaign Oldham finished second in the league whilst Salford found themselves next to bottom!

However, during the 1901-02 and 1902-03 seasons the two clubs met six times in league and cup encounters and Oldham failed to register a point in any of these matches!

Oldham had all their own way in the 1920s but the roles were directly reversed in the 1930s, when Lance Todd was working his magic at the Willows. Once again the emphasis shifted in the post war period, especially in the 1950s, when the Roughyeds swept all before them. Then, in 1961-62, Oldham set up a record victory here at the Willows, when they

With Super League on the horizon at the end of the 1994-95 season, it was proposed that Oldham and Salford should merge under a geographical banner, but nothing was resolved with the outcome that Oldham (who had finished 10th in the league) gained automatic entry into Super League and Salford (12th in the league) were placed in the First Division for 1995-96, the Centenary season. Salford won the Centenary First Division by a clear 7 points but there was no promotion or relegation, so the Reds stayed in that league again and had to work their way into Super League the hard way by becoming champions of the First Division in 1996 as well.

Oldham finished in 8th position in the 1996 Super League and thus retained their place in the elite Division for 1997 when we resumed our fixtures against them. We beat them 35-26 here at the Willows but we lost at Boundary Park by 19 points to 10.

A B R I E F H I S T O R Y

A founder member of the breakaway Northern Union, Oldham's history goes back to September 1876 when the club were formed at a meeting in the Prince Albert Hotel.



Their first ground was a field at the rear of the Gladwick Spinning Company's Mill the players having to change in the nearby Shakespeare Hotel and the very first game played there was against Stalybridge on October 21st 1876. A move to the sloping ground at Clarksfield preceded the switch to the site at Watersheddings where the opening game against Swinton on September 28th 1889 unfortunately ended in defeat in front of a 7000 gate.

On that occasion Oldham sported a new strip of red and white hoops, a sharp contrast to the previous colours of black and amber. When the "split" occurred in 1895, Oldham were one of the pioneer members and in that managerial season, they finished fourth behind Manningham, Halifax and Runcorn (a powerful side in those days). Two seasons later Oldham were Champions of the Lancashire Senior Competition. In 1899,

they won the N.U. Challenge Cup, beating Hunslet by 19 points to 9 at Fallowfield, Manchester and in doing so they became the first Lancashire club to lift the trophy. Although Oldham have subsequently won the Challenge Cup in 1925 and 1927 and been runners up on four occasions, they have never appeared at Wembley. Oldham's glory days came in the 1950s when they were the king pins of the league. In that period they were constantly high up in the table and in 1956-57 they ended the season with a commanding six points lead over Hull, a side they also defeated in the Championship Final. Their 15-14 victory was achieved at Odsal, in front of 62,000 spectators. Oldham won the league the following season and went on to land a hat trick of successive Lancashire Cup Final victories. During 1957-58, Bernard Ganley set up a new goalkicking record with 200 for Oldham and 19 for GB. Other well known stars of that period were internationals. Frank Pitchford, Syd Little, Charlie Winslade, Alan Davies, Derek Turner, Ken Jackson and Ike Southward, who was a record £10,650 signing from Workington Town.



IKE SOUTHWARD

The first floodlit match at Watersheddings took place on October 26th 1965 when GB Under 24s beat France by 12 points to 5. In 1969-70 the club suffered a set back when they were relegated, the team failing to secure a victory in five months of rugby! Oldham bounced back with a couple of Division Two Championship and Premiership wins but they have not won a major trophy since 1958-59 when they landed the Lancashire Cup. They moved ground to share with the local soccer team at Boundary Park and have since played at Hurst Cross the home of Ashton United Football Club. However, they have now returned to Boundary Park and hopefully a stable base for the club.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

WITH CRAIG BLACKBURN



A number of the schools we've been working with in conjunction with Salford and Trafford Healthy Schools Scheme on a project called "Fitbods". This is a supervised physical activity project which aims to increase physical activity levels amongst Primary school children by providing a wide range of supervised activities and games during lunchtimes. The project is designed to encourage all children, whatever their ability, to enjoy physical activity whilst gaining obvious health benefits. The scheme came about after growing concerns about the low levels of physical

activity amongst our children. Levels of childhood obesity have risen dramatically over the last 10 years and many young people are adopting an increasing sedentary lifestyle. There is a danger that children are storing up health problems for the future. By encouraging the children to take part in the "Fitbods" activities we are putting the play back into the playground. Today's half time display shows some of the games we've been playing in the "Fitbods" sessions.



DRILL OF THE WEEK

The "field" for this game is set up as shown in the diagram.

Rules

Each team has 2 attackers, 2 defenders and 1 player who is positioned on a "link pad" who can join the attack when he receives the ball. The attackers must stay in their team's attacking half and

similarly the defenders must stay in their team's defensive half. Passes can be made in any direction. Refer to the diagram. Here the play was started with the ball being given by the coach to the yellow (defensive) players on the left. They have worked the ball to the yellow link player who has joined the other two players (attackers) to contest a 3 v 2 and attempt to score the try.



Once the try is scored, the blue defenders on the right immediately take possession of the ball and try to work their passes to the blue link man so as to set him free to join the two

blue team's attackers in the other half and so on!
After a few minutes nominate a new link man for each team and rearrange the attackers and defenders. Hope this doesn't sound too complicated because the game really is not!

- This is a super game involving lots of energy, ball movement, evasive work and plenty of communication.
- Teamwork is vital for any team to be successful. This drill brings in all the necessary teamwork elements.
- Once the players fully understand the game, the coach should sit back and observe. In such a condensed, high tempo game such as this it is amazing how much there is to be learnt about players skill levels, their sense of urgency, their option taking ability, their fitness, communication, determination - the list goes on!

REDS UNVEIL STADIUM PLANS

Salford City Reds today unveiled their plans for a proposed new stadium on vacant land in Barton. The futuristic £35 million development is the product of four years planning work and a formal planning application has been

submitted to the City council today. Top architects, Arup, who have also been responsible for Cardiff's Millennium stadium, Sydney Stadium and the City of Manchester Stadium are working on the project. The City Of Salford stadium will

be a highly visible new landmark for the City, with over 200,000 people passing the site every day over the M60 Barton flyover. The 20,000 capacity stadium itself will house a 200 bedroom hotel, conference and banqueting facilities and

62 corporate hospitality boxes. In contrast to many other modern stadia it will not be an all seater facility but will contain an approved "safe standing" area to house the faithful army of fans who currently occupy the terracing at the

club's current home, the Willows. Salford City Reds Chief Executive, David Tarry explained, "the stadium was conceived to provide revenue streams that will allow the club to compete at the highest level in the game." "Our relationship with the developers and other partners in the scheme gives plenty of scope for the club to generate substantial income that will ensure that

the club can compete financially with any other team in the sport." The scheme also includes a shopping mall and casino, and additional road, rail and

metrolink extensions are likely to serve the site, thus creating more investment for the area. City council Chief Executive, John Willis said "In principle, the council is keen to support any development that will bring new investment and

opportunities to Salford." "We understand what the club is trying to achieve in keeping professional sport alive in this city in a brand new stadium which is also available to local people. This sort of new facility will benefit the City in all kinds of ways." Salford Chairman John Wilkinson said "This is further proof that Salford is leading the way when it comes to exciting and innovative plans that benefit the City and its residents."

"The council have been totally supportive and have shared our vision of bringing 2,000 jobs to the area, regenerating the wider site and raising the profile of the City with a revitalised and successful rugby team."

The Arriva Trains Cup pulls in at the last station of its group stage journey this weekend. And there are several fascinating permutations as to which sides will progress to the quarter-finals.

Only three teams are currently mathematically certain of making the last eight - Whitehaven, the only team with a 100 per cent record, plus Salford and Leigh from the West Group. A total of nine teams are vying for the remaining six places.

The West Group is all sewn up, but in the North, both Chorley and Barrow have a chance of following 'Haven into the knockout stages.

The Lynx's stunning defeat of Leigh last weekend has given them a genuine chance of progression. They are currently second in the North, level with Barrow but 35 points better off in the points difference stakes. Today, the Lynx travel to take on Workington while Barrow entertain Gateshead. It could hardly be more delicately poised.

In the East, Featherstone Rovers, Doncaster Dragons and Hull KR are all tied on 12 points from their nine games,

Crucially, the quartet all play each other - Batley host the Cougars while Dewsbury travel to Hunslet. The only way the Rams could be eliminated is if they lose by more than 27 points, but that possibility cannot be totally ruled out against a Hawks side that beat Super League Huddersfield at the South Leeds Stadium not so long ago.

Confused? Hopefully not, but if you are, the current tables and today's fixtures might help. Enjoy the game - whatever the permutations of the result.
