# SETTING THE SCENE

Since our inaugural encounter in the 1896-97 season, we have met Oldham on 157 occasions in league fixtures and our visitors are some way ahead of us in total number of matches won. That first occasion at New Barnes saw Oldham gain a 9 points to nil victory and they

completed the double over us later that season with an 11 points to 3 scoreline. Oldham finished second in the league whilst Salford found themselves next to bottom! The following season enabled us to get off the mark with a 10-6 home victory but it was not until the 1902-03 campaign that we gained our first

double over Oldham. Whilst Oldham had things pretty much their own way in the 1920s it was a different story in the Lance Todd era. The past way

period saw the Roughyeds sweep all before them, especially in the 1950s.

A remarkable match took place at the Willows in 1986-87 when a total of 66 were scored, Salford edging home by 36 points to 30. In the 1988-89 season Oldham beat us at Watersheddings in a thriller by 23 points to 22 but the Reds won the encounter at the Willows by 38 points to 20.

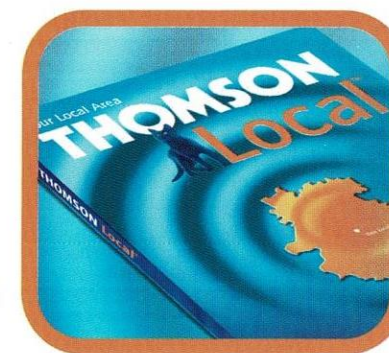
The last time we met them here in a league match was during the 1997 Super League campaign and Salford won by 35 points to 26; Steve Blakeley scoring a try to add to his 5 goals in the game.

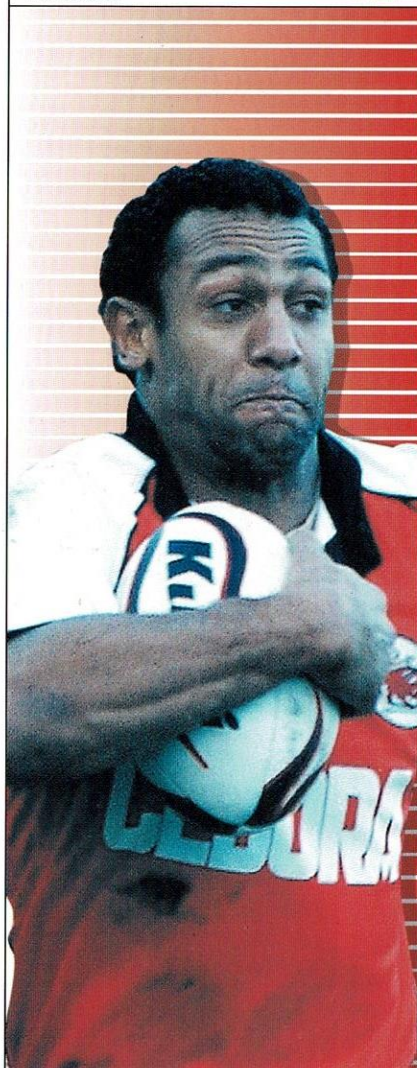

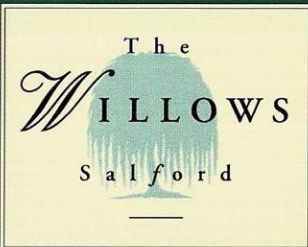
We have made a few changes to the overall schools programme and are finding that the primary schools are pleased with our new service. Maintaining the children's

It's only a month ago that Oldham were last at the Willows, and on that occasion in the Arriva Trains Cup, Salford ran out winners by 54 points to 12.

Our visitors will still be smarting from that defeat and Steve Molloy's side are sure to give us a harder game this afternoon. Steve, who is a former GB Test player and Down Under Tourist in 1996, is looking for a big season from his team and will be leading by example. His side have been beset with injuries so far but given a fully fit squad then Oldham could be a surprise package this term.

Up front with Steve Molloy could be Aussie DARREN SHAW who was released by Salford at the end of last season. A real grafter Darren has had spells with London Broncos, Sheffield Eagles and Castleford whilst Down Under he played for Brisbane Broncos and Canberra Raiders. Another Aussie, prop DANE MORGAN has created a big impression since

coming to Oldham. Former Warrington hooker JOHN HOUGH was virtually an ever present last term and he has been at Oldham for the past 5 years. Second row CHRIS MORLEY is a Welsh RL international who was signed from Leigh during the close season. Also played for Salford. Former Wigan Academy player MARTIN McLoughlin was signed from Barrow Raiders during the close season. Captain of the side is loose forward PHIL FARRELL who is the younger brother of GB captain Andy. Also in contention for a place are second row RYAN STAZICKER and scrum half KEITH BRENNAN.

## CONNECTIONS

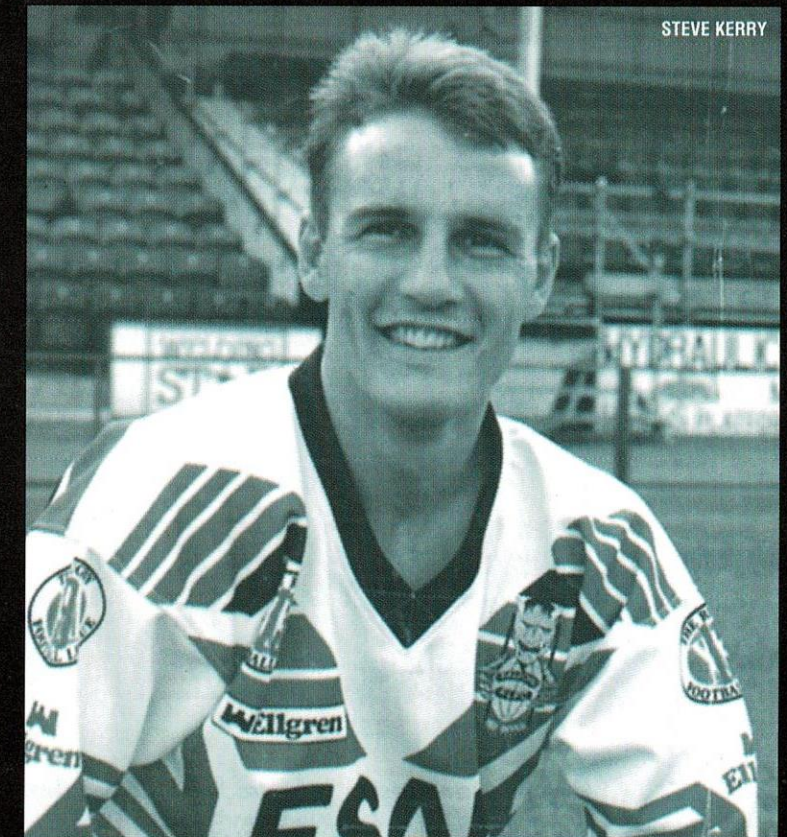
Several players have been involved with both clubs over the years.

The legendary JAMES LOMAS spent over nine years at Salford and in that time he played in three Challenge Cup Finals and finished on the losing team on each occasion. He captained the GB side on their first ever tour of Australia in 1910 before being transferred to Oldham for a then record £300 fee. He helped Oldham carry off the Championship trophy and continued to assist them until the end of the 1912-13 season. Stand off FRANK STIRRUP who only made a dozen appearances for Leigh prior to his move to the Willows in 1947, played 78 games for the Reds before joining Oldham, who he was later to Coach.

In the sixties, Salford bolstered their side with the addition of STUART WHITEHEAD, CHARLIE BOTT and PETER SMETHURST. Whitehead began his career at Oldham in 1961 and as a second rower was the only local in the side that just failed to reach their first Wembley final in 1964, losing out to a semi final, second replay. He moved to Salford and switched to centre, helping Salford reach Wembley in 1969, only to lose to Castleford. However, he gained a Lancashire Cup winners medal with Salford in 1972 but later moved on to Rochdale Hornets. Charlie Bott, played for Oldham against the Aussies in 1963 and the Kiwis in 1965 and also assisted the Roughyeds to the Second Division Championship in the 1963-64

season. Following his move to Salford the prop forward played for the Reds in that 1969 Wembley Challenge Cup Final. After 160 appearances for the club he emigrated to Australia in 1971. Never say die performer Peter Smethurst was one of the most respected players in the game and he served Oldham with distinction without winning any honours. He was transferred to Salford for a £3000 fee in September 1967 but when the Reds reached Wembley in 1969, he was a non playing

substitute. He always gave 100% but after making 124 appearances for Salford, he joined Leigh. In November 1991, IAN SHERRATT was transferred back to Oldham in exchange for AUSTIN DONEGAN. Scrum half STEVE KERRY left the Willows for Oldham in October 1992 after making a total of 105 appearances for the Reds in which time he amassed a total of 812 points, comprising 47 tries, 306 goals and 12 drop goals. He was the RL top points scorer in the 1990-91 season with 427 points.

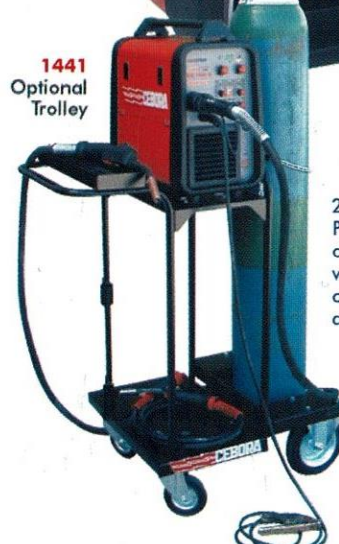

# DRILL OF THE WEEK

This game is played along the same lines as baseball.

## Modified Rules

- The "batting" team punt kicks, grubber kicks or drop kicks the football after having it passed to him by the "pitcher".
- The pitcher can pass the ball (with two hands - no overhead gridiron style passes) as hard as he likes but the pass

must be over the base and between knee and head height. Should the "batter" drop a legitimate pass he is out!

- The "batter" is allowed a count of two before he must kick the ball.
- The ball may be kicked or passed in from the "outfield". A fielder cannot run the ball in himself, but two players passing the ball together may run the ball in.

- On the first base the baseman must have his foot on the base to run the "batter" out.

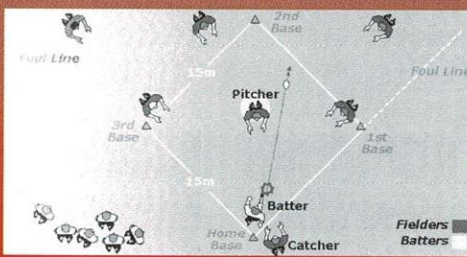
- "Batters" on 2nd, 3rd and home base must be tagged before they are out.

- A foul occurs if the football is kicked outside the foul line on the full.

- Once three "batters" are out, the fielding team becomes the "batting" team.

## Variations

- Arrange a play the ball situation for the batting team at the "pitchers" spot. The ball is played then passed to the "batter".
- Add the above variation by adding a marker from the fielding team who can advance and harass the batter after the batter receives the pass.
- The size of the playing field can and should be varied depending on the age level of the players.
- The type of kick used should be nominated by the coach. For older and more powerful players, the punt kick gives the batter too much of an advantage - the grubber kick would be more suitable. If wanting to restrict the punt kick, perhaps an outer zone could be marked out so that all kicks must land within it's confines.

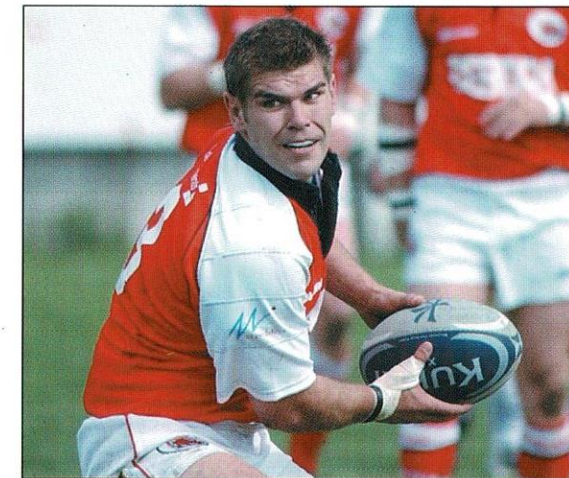

Soft tissue mobilisation is one technique used to assist full recovery of the injury site and prevent any complications such as tight scar tissue or adhesions being formed. Massage is a basic component for soft tissue sports injury treatment and also for pre-match warm up of muscles. This is so the player is less likely to strain muscles and to

alleviate muscle cramps, increasing circulation for the game working together with stretching and a good warm up. Different types of massage are off leverage which is a guiding movement over the skin from down to up the limb to help the flow of lymph and for lactic acid to be removed. It also aids circulation and can be deep or superficial, slow or fast. Petrissage includes wringing, kneading and picking up techniques working the opposite way to offleverage. This helps healing and improves joint mobility. Tapotment is a stimulatory technique which makes a

sound over the skin, it also includes clapping and hacking. This improves the energy supply to the muscles. Other massage techniques which can mobilise ligamentous tissue is frictions. This is done with fingers or thumbs applying a deep force. Transverse frictions are applied across the lines of the ligament tissue deep under the skin. This aids the collagen fibres to heal in correct alignment, help mobilise sticky tissue and reduce the formation of scar tissue and of

course to reduce pain. All these soft tissue techniques are used and others include PNF (Proprioceptive neuromuscular facilitation) and SSTM (specific soft tissue mobilisation) to help the player return to the field of play following a soft tissue injury.

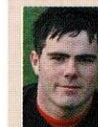

# LEAGUE GOES TRULY NATIONAL

They say a chain is only as strong as its weakest link, and that adage has often been applied to Rugby League. How pleasing, then, to witness last weekend's launch of the game's first-ever truly national structure. From the 'big four' riding high in Super League, there is now a defined pyramid reaching down to the grassroots in all four corners of the country. If you only ever concentrate on Super League, take a moment to study the results section in Monday's Rugby League Express. Flying the flag is Super League, followed by the new National Leagues One and Two packed with famous old traditional clubs. Then comes National

League Three, putting some relatively new Rugby League towns on the map, followed by an amazing 52 clubs in the TotalRL.com Conference taking their place alongside the BARLA regional leagues. And it looks as though the clubs outside the heartlands will, for the most part, be competitive with those in Rugby League's more established towns, with three of the the opening day's fixtures providing very tight scorelines, and two teams from the heartland going under to teams from the South and Midlands. South London's defeat of Underbank was particularly impressive, given that the Londoners had only come into the competition late on,

when Crawley Jets decided they couldn't afford the travelling. Then they had a player sent off in the first minute, but still managed to defeat the club from Holmfirth. London now has clubs in Super League, and National Leagues Two and Three. It would have been unthinkable even three years ago. Coventry's defeat of Woolston was equally impressive. The West Midlands club has already made it clear that it sees the chance of progressing via National Leagues Two and One into Super League. Next year they will be moving to a brand new stadium with a capacity of 10,000, and who is to say they won't achieve their ambition?

It all points to a great future for Rugby League, and is a great tribute to the tremendous work done by so many people for Rugby League at the grassroots in the last ten years. When you see names like Coventry, St Albans, Teesside, Hemel, and South London, you realise that Rugby League will surely never be the same again. I hope that the geographical spread of Rugby League will be noticed by the national media - and in particular the TV companies. After a tremendous Challenge Cup Final, and growing TV audiences, it would be good to see some recognition that the game is now a national, rather than a regional one.

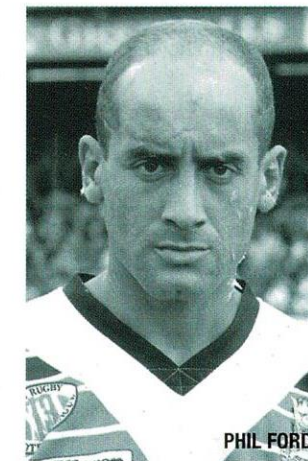

Salford gained two valuable league points at a snow covered Watersheddings on Boxing Day and with Featherstone Rovers and Hull both losing, the Reds moved within striking distance of a top eight place. It was never going to be easy on a treacherous surface though, but Salford were in no mood to let this one slip and they came strong in the second half to take the spoils against a side which lacked the Reds inventiveness. However, it was the home side that seized the initiative in only two minutes when TOPPING landed a penalty goal after Salford had been pulled up for a foul on Clarke. BLAKELEY missed a kickable penalty in the 5th minute but atoned for it eight minutes later when Tauro was held down by Gibson, after making good

yardage (2-2). Oldham hit back strongly and Ford was forced to kick dead after a kick through by Crompton put the Reds under pressure. Then in the 22nd minute the home side regained the lead through another TOPPING penalty goal after Lee was penalised for 'feet up' at a play the ball (4-2). There following a bizarre accident involving full backs Jack and Gibson who traded each others kicks for position on a couple of occasions, something that had been a rarity for many year's but on this occasion the tricky conditions underfoot probably warranted it. Topping missed a penalty attempt in the 25th minute but the Reds came back to pressurise Oldham and forced them into conceding a penalty that BLAKELEY easily converted (4-4). Just

before the interval both sides threatened to score but it remained all square at the break. Within two minutes of the restart Salford took the lead for the first time in the match and it came from a bit of Gregory magic. The Reds scrum half chipped over the Oldham cover for FORD to race up and beat Gibson to the touch. BLAKELEY added a good conversion to make it 10-4 for Salford, a lead we never relinquished. We got a shock three minutes later though when Gibson's solo effort enabled JONES to dive over in the corner for an unconverted try (8-10). It was anybody's game again until the hour when WILLIAMS chipped over a static defence and followed up his own kick to score wide out. BLAKELEY landed a superb touchline kick to put the Reds back in

the driving seat again (8-16). By this time MARSDEN had replaced O'Connor and the former Oldham player forced his way over to put Salford even further in front in the 71st minute. This time Blakeley missed the conversion attempt but it mattered little as the Reds were well in command at the final whistle.

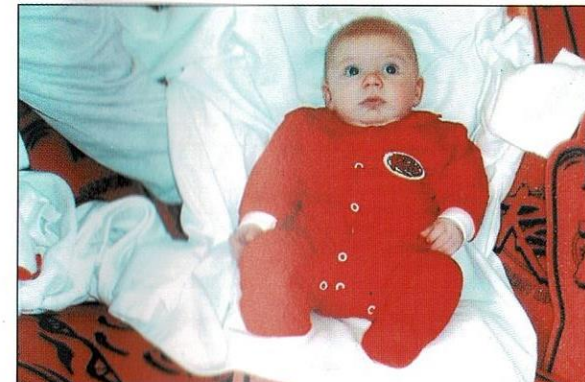
