First of all, a big welcome to Makali Aizue after his arrival from Papua New Guinea to be here with us at Craven Park.

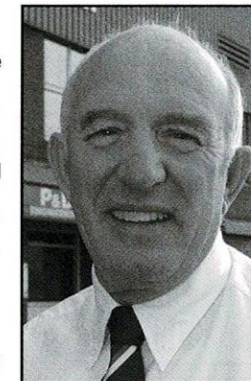

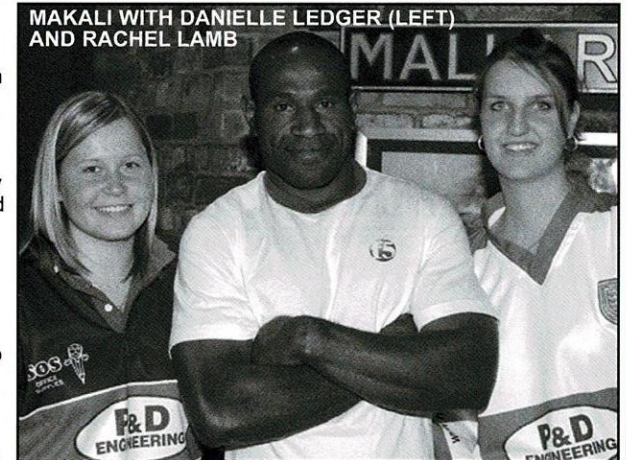


I am sure that you have all noticed our 'new look' programme with new advertising, additional editorial and up to date photographs.

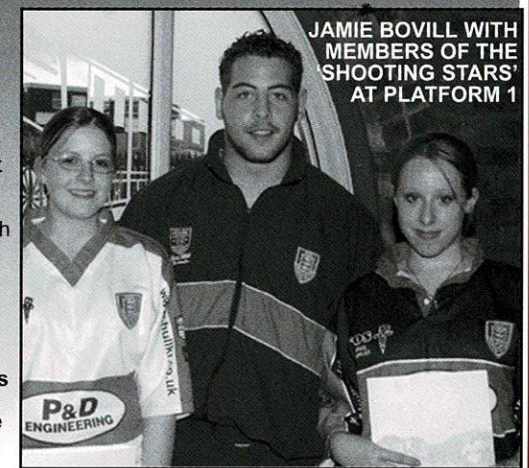
As part of their new 'On the Road' experience the Robins players will be visiting different places in and around the city to raise awareness and help to market the 'Craven Park' club in the local community.

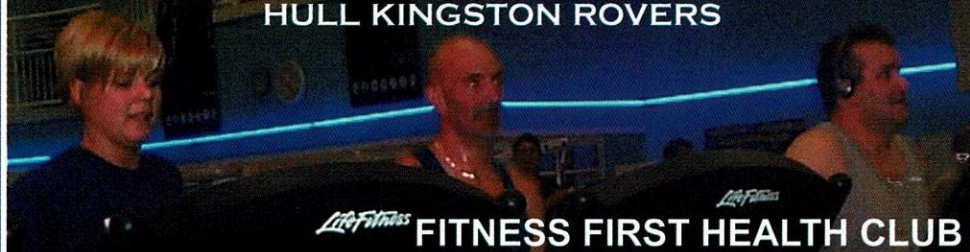

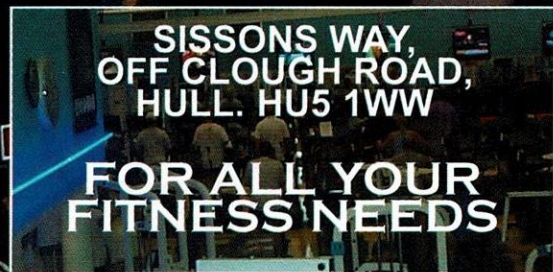

TEAM TALK WITH COACH STEVE LINNANE

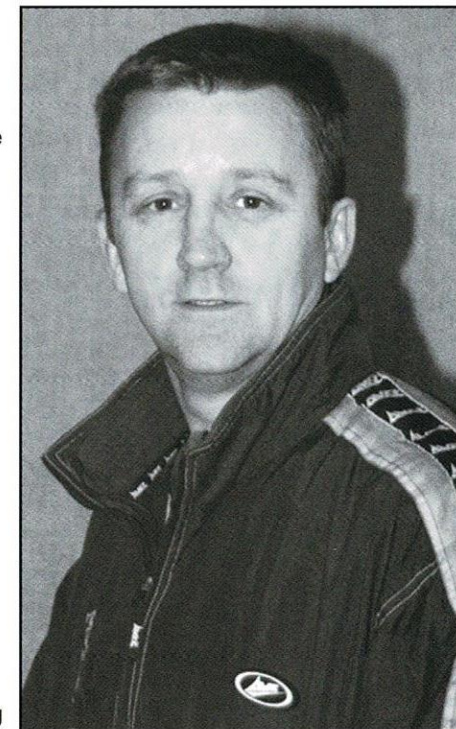
A big welcome to the players, officials and supporters of the Oldham club here today for what should be an excellent game of rugby league football.

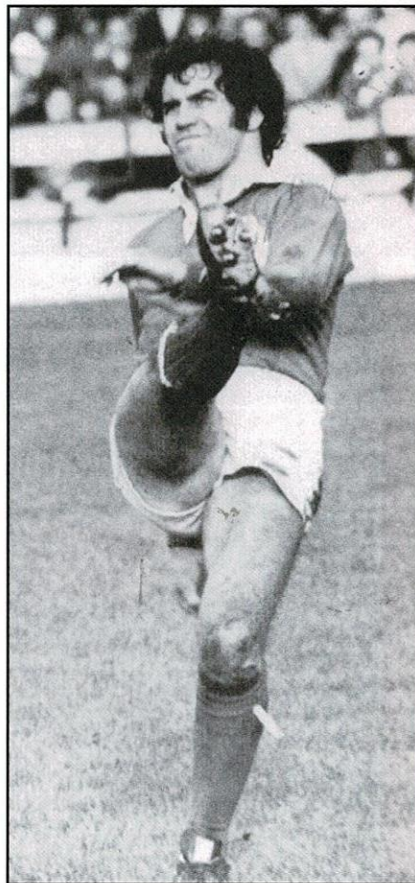

TODAY'S VISITORS

JON GODDARD

Aged 20, Goddard came to Oldham on loan in the 2002 season on the high recommendation of Castleford boss, Graham Steadman. Goddard was reared in Castleford youth and schools rugby before going to The Jungle to play for the academy side. During his two seasons in their Alliance team he has played three times in Super League, against Wakefield at home two seasons before last and against Bradford and London, both away, in 2001. He has recently signed a contract that will keep him with the Roughyeds for the 2003 season. Although a young novice when first thrown into the first team he has developed well and made the transission from a full back to a very competent centre.

CHRIS CAMPBELL

Chris started as an amateur with the Crossfield club and then joined Warrington as a 17 year old. In his first season he was the Alliance top try scorer with 26 tries from the full back position. He played 10 games for Warrington in Super League, mainly as a winger and scored 3 tries. He moved to Whitehaven on a full time contract with Paul Cullen. Whitehaven offered him a new contract if he would move into the area. This was not to Chris' liking and he had trials with Widnes, but the lack of an Alliance side meant he felt his opportunities would be limited. This is when the Roughyeds moved in. Chris, the son of ex referee David Campbell, trained with the Roughyeds and instantly impressed the coaching team and a deal was completed.

PAUL ANDERSON

Paul signed from Leigh Centurions for the beginning of the 2003 season. His preferred position is centre threequarter but is not at a loss in the second row. A burly build enables him to make a try out of sheer strength. Was Leigh's leading try scorer the season before last, and is well known for his blockbusting runs. His previous clubs include St Helens and Sheffield Eagles.

GARETH BARBER

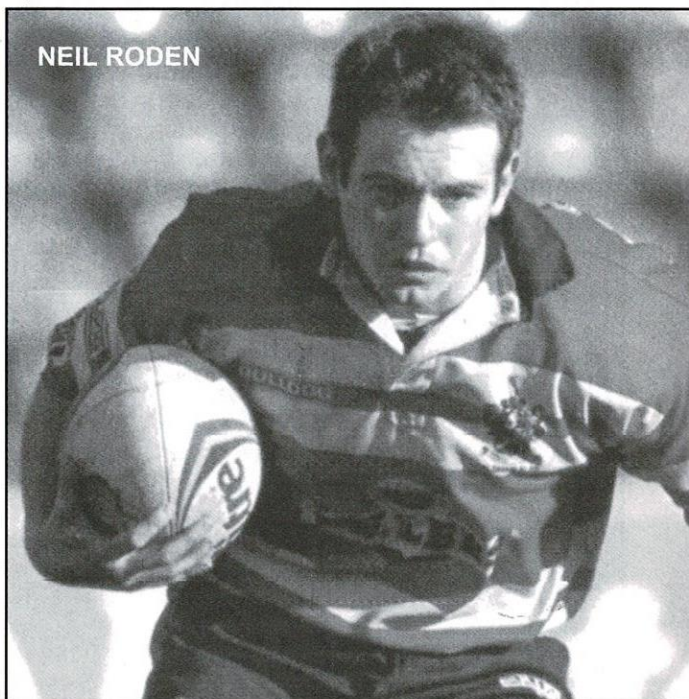
A 21 year old Oldham born Half back who was reared on rugby with his best pal, Leeds and Great Britain forward Kevin Sinfield. When Sinfield signed for the Rhinos, Barber signed for Warrington, but returned "home" to Oldham before the start of the 2000/2001 season. A promising young player who made the stand off position his own last season, was selected for the NFP under 21 squad who beat the Super League under 21's in 2001.

GAVIN DODD

The former Royton Tigers youngster, who later had a spell with Bradford Bulls academy team, has new people to do battle with for the number one shirt this season after the departure of Mark Sibson. Fast on the break, yet unpredictable at times, Dodd scored some good tries for the team last season and made the full back position his own forcing Sibson out to a wing berth. Dodd represented G.B. students in Australia and New Zealand two years ago, and was selected in the GB under 21 squad last season.

NEIL RODEN

Signed from his own town club Wigan, the son of Wigan's chief scout now has the scrum half jersey to himself, after winning the accolade of Players' Player of the Year in 2002. He has shown improvement in the three seasons with the Roughyeds and is one of the best number sevens outside Super League.

SIMON SVABIC

Simon is another one of the players signed from the Centurions at the end of the 2002 campaign, although his career started in Oldham with the now defunct Bears. A stand off half of great guile, who will be an important play-maker in the Roughyeds' armoury this year.

KEITH BRENNAN

Keith is a product of Amateur Rugby League in the Oldham area, playing for both Higginshaw and Shaw Rhinos before signing for his home town club. Scrum Half is his preferred position but he has filled in in many places, most notably as hooker whilst deputising for John Hough. Brennan decided to hang up his boots at the end of the 2002 season, but after the start of the 2003 campaign the lure of Rugby League was too much to resist, and Keith signed on again this time on amateur forms.

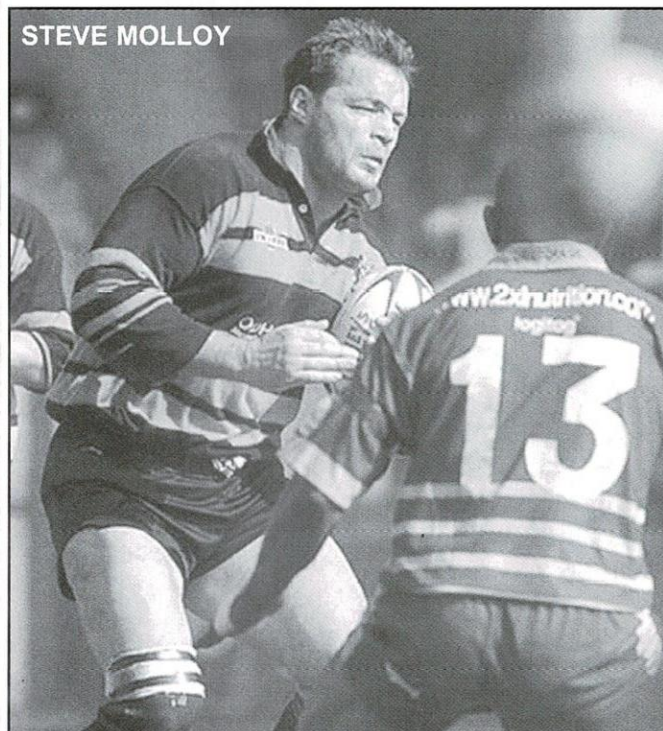
CHRIS IRWIN

Another player signed from Leigh Centurions at the end of the 2002 season. Chris is happy on the wing or at fullback. He has natural pace and will be a great asset to the Oldham back line wherever he is chosen to play.

PEN PICS - 2003

STEVE MOLLOY

The experienced 33 year old, ex England captain, who signed for his second spell at Oldham from Batley Bulldogs was the obvious choice as player coach when the previous coach left mid season. A front row forward who has also played for Featherstone, Sheffield, Warrington, Huddersfield and Leeds, Molloy is from Oldham and indeed had a loan spell with us at the end of the 2000 season and made a big contribution to our excellent end of season run.

DANE MORGAN

Dane Morgan is a leviathan of a man, standing at 6'5" and weighing around 17 and a half stone, the 24 year old second row or prop forward has a brilliant pedigree. He has played for North Sydney and was a try scoring member of the World Club Championship winners Melbourne Storm who beat St Helens for the title. Dane has come to Britain with an ambition to play in Super League, hopefully he can achieve this ambition with the Roughyeds. Already in games this season he has shown he is not a forward you can take liberty's with.

CHRIS MORLEY

Chris is the older brother of Great Britain's Adrian. Like his brother Chris is a no nonsense second row forward. He was signed from Leigh Centurions to start the Roughyeds 2003 campaign. Chris has the size and mean streak to stiffen up the Oldham back row.

OLDHAM

PAUL NORTON

Paul (Knocker) Norton fits into the unsung hero bracket. His tireless work rate often has him top of the tackle count, and he will take the ball up all day long given the chance. Signed from the unfashionable Chorley Lynx it was definitely a major gain for Oldham. Plays mainly as a prop forward but has also been used in the second row, he has signed an extension to his contract to keep him with the club for 2003.

GAVIN JOHNSON

A back row forward who can also fill in at centre or wing, Oldhamer, Gavin spent two seasons at Odsal in the Bradford Academy side and made the occasional appearance for the Bulls in the Alliance championship. Spent almost a season earning his Oldham spurs in the Alliance team before signing a two-year deal in September 2001. Gavin has recently broken into the first team as a second row and scored his first senior points with a try against Keighley.

LEE DORAN

Another young player in whom Oldham have a lot of confidence. A Wiganer, Lee has worked his way through the Oldham academy and alliance sides and is now probably one of the first names on the first team sheet each week. Good pace and robust defence give him all the assets required to make a top class second row forward. Showed up well in the NFP under 21's, in 2001. One of five Oldham players in the squad.

PHIL FARRELL

Phil starting his fourth season at Oldham has just been appointed as club captain. Played a lot of his rugby with Oldham at second row but it looks like he will fit into the loose forward role this season, a position his older brother Andy fills for Wigan. One of the youngest captains in the league he will not be phased by the responsibility.

DANNY GUEST

One of the Roughyeds originals. Danny returned to the club three seasons ago, and has signed a contract to keep him at Oldham for the whole of this season. Danny is still a Juggernaut weighing in

somewhere around the 18 stone mark, after shedding somewhere around the two stone mark during the close season. Still young by props' standards he has pots of potential. Used from the bench as an impact player most of last season, I can see him playing a similar role in a formidable front row this year.

JOHN HOUGH

The first player to sign for his home town club when the new Roughyeds were formed by Chris Hamilton and his fellow directors in the autumn of 1997. He has just signed a new contract to take him to the end of the 2004 season. On his day one of the best hookers in the NFP a danger to any defence form acting half back. At the end of the 2002 season John had made 152 appearances for Oldham, 37 of them in the 2002 season. Last year saw him cross the whitewash on ten occasions second only to Lee Doran in the forward try scoring charts.

As we are entertaining our friends from Oldham today we shall concentrate on some of the past league fixtures between our two clubs, as we've already covered Challenge Cupties and play-off matches in previous home programmes against Oldham. In the league it was the 1967/1968 season before Rovers' came away from Oldham with any league points, this after 23 consecutive losses in Lancashire. The match that broke this sequence of defeats took place on Tuesday 3rd October 1967. The match only went ahead after strenuous efforts from the Robins' Chairman at that time, Wilf Spaven, as Oldham wanted the game postponed, as after continuous heavy rain in the area for several days they considered their Watersheddings pitch unfit. However the match referee Eric Clay agreed that the pitch was playable and the game duly went ahead.

It was the proverbial game of two halves with Oldham looking the better side in the first half due in no small part to the efforts of their pack, and this despite an outstanding display from Bill Holliday who was the Robins best player on the night. Oldham went in at the break leading by 7 points to 2 with full back Brian Curry scoring their points and Cyril Kellett kicking a lone goal for the visitors. However Rovers made tactical changes at the interval with Phil Lowe being switched to his more normal position in the forwards, he had played left centre in the opening half, Alan Burwell moving from wing to centre and Brian Brook coming in on the wing. All this meant that Gordon Young did not reappear for the second half. In the second period Rovers gradually got on top, as the Oldham pack seemed to tire. However it took a remarkable try from David Elliott to win the match. Oldham's full back Brian Curry made a clearance kick from inside his own quarter which Elliott took on the full, the ball coming to him at some pace, and raced unopposed to the sticks which with Kellett's conversion and a late penalty from the same player, secured the Robins a 9 points to 7 victory. Tries still worth only three points in those days.



WILF SPAVEN

The Robins had gone into the match minus Roger Millward, Chris Young and Terry Major who had all been selected to play for Yorkshire against the Australian tourists the following night. The two sides lined up as follows Oldham: Curry, Elliott, Donovan, McCormack, Murphy, Broomhead, Canning, Ogden, Smith, Wilson, Irving, Hill and Maders. Hull Kingston Rovers: Kellett, Coupland, Moore, Lowe, Burwell, Elliott, Cooper, Holliday, Flanagan, Taylor, Hickson, Mennell and Young (G) Sub: Brook. This win took the Robins to third in the league table, then made up of thirty clubs.

As to the last league draw between the two clubs we do not have to go too far back, it took place on Wednesday 17th March 1999 and was played here at Craven Park. The original fixture having been postponed due to the Craven Park pitch being unfit.

The Robins went into this match without Stanley Gene a late withdrawal due to an ankle injury and also missing Mike Dixon and David Luckwell. The first half was a very dour affair the only score being a penalty goal from Oldham forward Quinlan in the third minute.

It was nearly an hour before the first try arrived and it went to Rovers with Robert Danby creating a try for Ian Hughes to make it 4 points to 2 in the home sides' favour. Then centre Josh

Bostock scored a try for Oldham converted by ex "Roverite" Daniel Brown to put the visitors in front by 8 points to 4.

However with fifteen minutes left on the clock Chris Kitching scored an unconverted try for the home side to level the scores and with that being the last score the match it ended 8 points all.

The two teams were as follows, Hull Kingston Rovers: Smith (R); Rouse, Danby, Taewa, Wray, Kitching, Gray, Dannatt, Chamberlain, Thompson, Smith (A), Fletcher and Charles. Subs. Bibby, Harrison, Hardy and Hughes. Oldham: Minut, Meade, Leulia, Bostock, McNicholas, Crook, Brown, Casey, Hough, Clegg, Shaw, Quinlan and Martindale. Subs. Coulter, Perrett, Peralta and Prescott. The Man of the Match was considered to be Paul Fletcher and an attendance of 2,080 watched the game, the Robins having gone into the match at the top of the Northern Ford Premiership table with 6 points from 3 games.

LOOKING BACK

Going back to the 15th October 1960 the Robins' were involved in another draw with Oldham this time the match being played at Craven Park on Holdemess Road. It was one

of the rare occasions they came up against what was arguably the finest Oldham side of all time, although by the time this match was played stars such as our former player Derek Turner and Don Vines had left the club for "pastures new" at Wakefield Trinity. However they still paraded the likes of Bernard Ganley, Ike Southward, Alan Davies and Charlie Winslade in their side.

The Robins were first on the scoreboard thanks to an interception try from Arthur Bunting goaled by Cyril Kellett to put them 5 points to 0 up. However winger Ike Southward at that time on the transfer list at £13,500 scored in the corner, and shortly after he got another this one made by Johnny Noon and Davies, full back Ganley goaled the second to give Oldham an 8 points to 5 lead. Cyril Kellett pulled back 2 points with a penalty when Frank Pitchford was penalised, before on the stroke of halftime Southward completed his hat-trick with a classic move direct from a scrum. Oldham therefore went in at the break leading by 11 points to 7.

Rovers however were not to be denied and two more Kellett penalties in the second half secured the draw, the latter when Bunting was obstructed, and serious claims for a penalty try were turned down. Over 7,000 fans, Rovers best home gate so far that season watched the match.

The two sides were Hull Kingston Rovers: Kellett, Harris, Riley, Clark, Burwell, Paul, Bunting, Grice, Flanagan, Coverdale, Kingsbury, Taylor and Last. Oldham: Ganley, Southward, Davies, Noon, Patterson, Kellett, Pitchford, Payne, McIntyre, Goddard, Winslade, Duffy and Robinson. Alvin Ackerley Rovers first choice hooker had missed the game due to a bout of 'flu and in the Oldham side at No.9 was Len McIntyre later to drop a match saving goal for Oldham in the first of those three epic cup semi-finals in 1964.

Indeed if you had not known you could have been forgiven for thinking it was the champions playing in Black and White and not Ian Millward's lads.

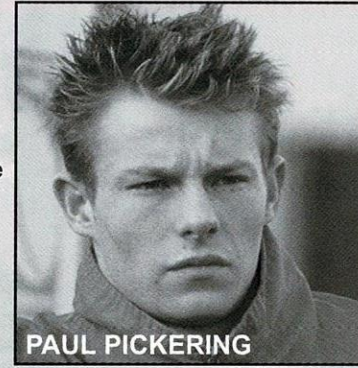
There's another tough task coming up today with the visit of Oldham, but after last weekend's battling display you would have to fancy Rovers on their home ground.

If everyone puts the same effort in to their work today as they did at the Lionheart, Rovers should pick up two more points.

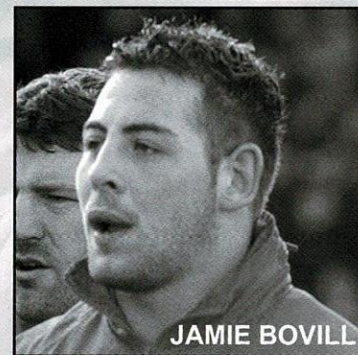

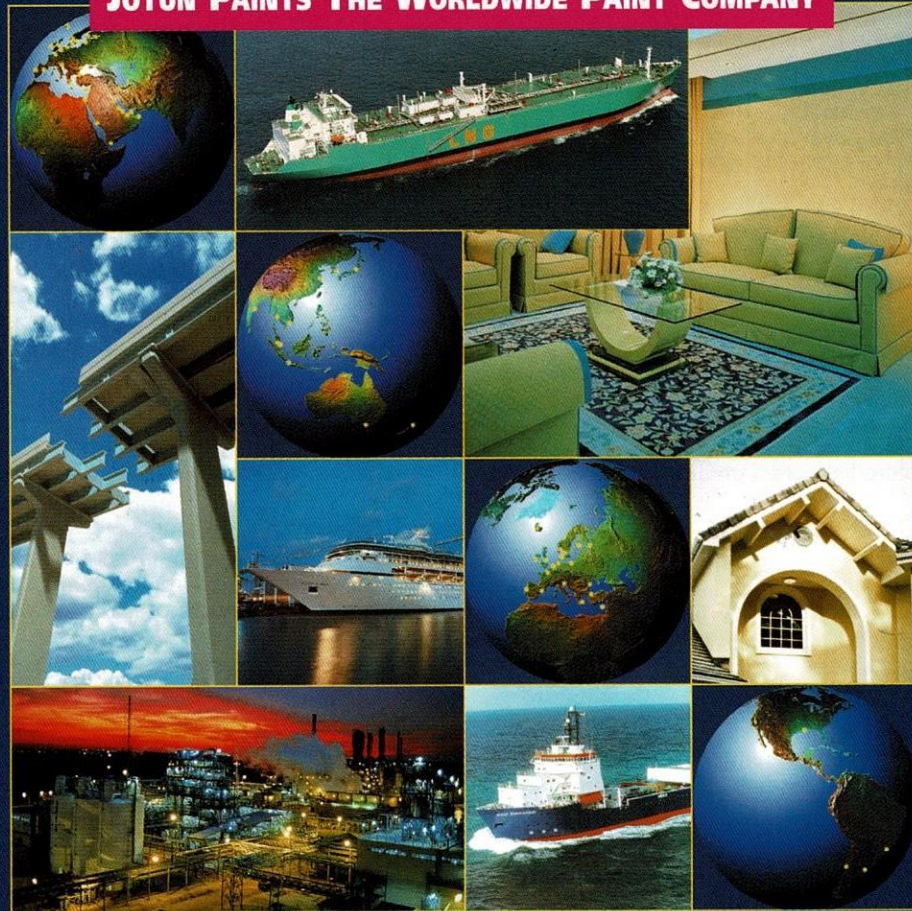

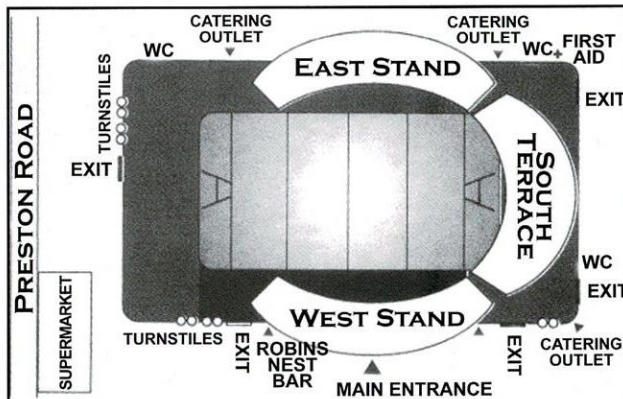
