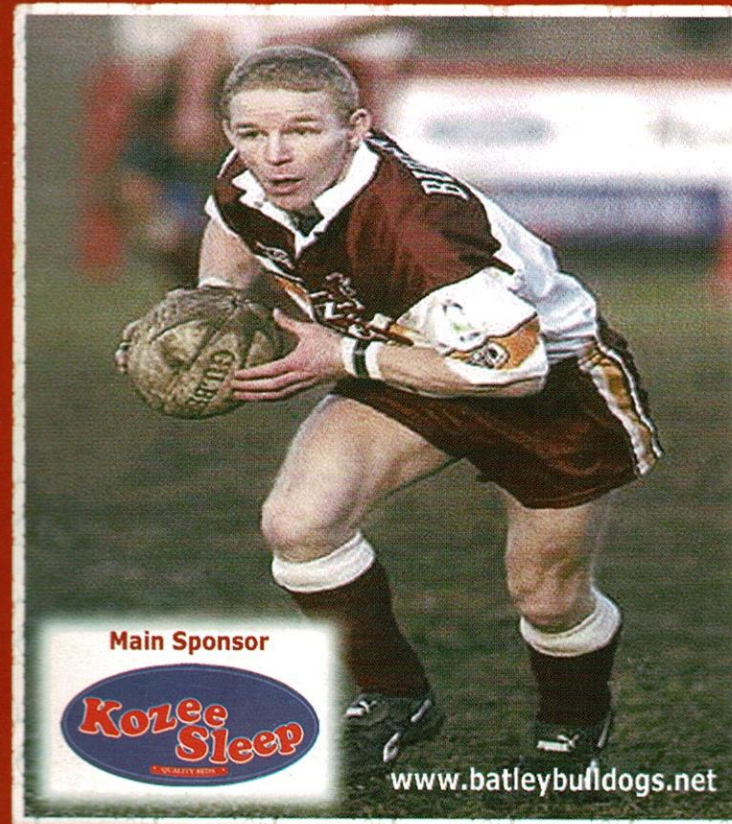

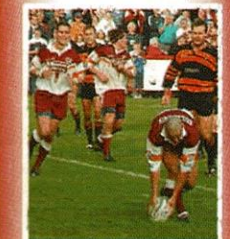

## "The Mount Scene"

The Rochdale game proved to be a major disappointment to all - A must win home game that sadly went totally wrong. Basic mistakes proved to be our undoing.

The following week and our Arriva Trains Cup Semi Final tie at Salford City Reds ended our involvement in the tournament as we were predictably outplayed by the Division's top team. A sound start degenerated into a one sided contest as Salford moved into the final against Leigh Centurians.

The serious business is now really underway and last week saw us make the short journey to the Lionheart Stadium for the local derby with Featherstone Rovers, another must win game which started off in tremendous fashion as we held a 10 - 0 lead, however, we let Rovers back in the game and eventually they took control and another 2 points went begging.

This emphasises the importance of today's game and the derby at Dewsbury next week - 2 games that we dare not lose otherwise things will be bleak in the extreme. So come on lads - wins are long overdue.

**Moving on and the current stats position for 2002 - 03 Season stands as follows;**

**Goal Kicking** - Barry Eaton has landed 83 goals from 111 attempts which provides a 75% success rate. Craig Booth missed with his only attempt at goal.

**Try scoring** - Leading try scorer is Craig Lingard with 16 followed by Mark Sibson, Mark Toohey and Chris Spurr who all stand on 8.

**Points scoring** - Barry Eaton is currently the outright leader with 174 points.

**Consecutive appearances** - The longest run of consecutive appearances is held by Paul Harrison who has featured in the last 42 matches. Ryan Horsley stands in second place on 32.

**Consecutive games scored in** - To date Barry Eaton has played and scored in all twenty two games this season. Incidentally following the Featherstone Rovers match, Barry remains the only player in professional Rugby League this season to have played and scored in every one of his team's competitive games - Well done Barry !

The only other player to feature in all 22 competitive games is Ryan Horsley.

**Penalty count** - The season total stands at 185 to Batley and 164 to our combined opponents. The penalty count in the Rochdale game was 6 - 3 in our favour. At Salford it ended 4 - 14 against and the Featherstone game yielded 4 to us and 5 to Rovers.

# Oldham Roughyeds

A comprehensive report of the history between the 2 clubs, players who have played for both clubs, the most recent meeting between the teams and facts about the town of Oldham itself.

**History** - To date Batley have played Oldham 86 times. Batley have won 31 of these games and Oldham have won 45. In addition 10 games have ended in a draw. In total Batley have scored 840 points and Oldham have scored 1,203 points.

**Appeared for both clubs** - Several players have appeared for both clubs over the years here are some of them;

**Backs:** Probably the most famous being former Batley 'great', John Etty. Others include current Bulldogs, Anthony Gibbons, David Gibbons and Mark Sibson. In addition ex Doncaster scrum half Mick McCone, centre, Mick Parrish and wingman, Hugh Gumbs,

**Forwards:** Props, Jason Clegg, and former Batley club captain Gary Lord, hooker John Clarke, second row forward Craig Richards, former New Zealand International, Mike Kuiti and current Bulldog, Joe Naidole. Current Oldham coach, Steve Molloy, strangely enough represented both clubs as a player during season 2001 - 02.

**Last encounter** - Was on 29.9.2002 in the Northern Ford Premiership Minor Elimination Semi Final at Mount Pleasant. 2,838 spectators saw an epic struggle on a glorious day which Batley edged 26 -16 having led 18 - 8 at halftime. Dean Lawford landed 6 goals (including 2 drop goals) and tries were added by Craig Lingard, David Rourke, Glen Tomlinson and Paul Harrison.

**Facts about the town of Oldham** - Oldham is recognised as the greatest cotton spinning town in the world. In the centre of the town is Alexandra Park which was built in 1865. It lies in 72 acres of woodland and incorporates a boating lake and a pagoda which was built as a meteorological observatory in 1899.

The area of Tommyfield used to be famous in years gone by for holding fairs, sideshows and circuses. In the present day it is home to an outdoor permanent market - one of the largest in the North of England. In 1999 Oldham celebrated 150 years of municipal status and democratic heritages.

Famous people who were born and bred in Oldham include; Eric Sykes, Dora Bryan, Bernard Cribbins, Cannon & Ball, Sid Little, Philip Schofield, Anne Kirkbride plus the town was also home to the world's first test tube baby - Louise Brown.

# Oldham Roughyeds Player Profiles 2003

## Paul Anderson

Paul signed from Leigh Centurions for the beginning of the 2003 season. His preferred position is centre three-quarter but is not at a loss in the second row. A burly build enables him to make a try out of sheer strength. Was Leigh's leading try scorer the season before last, and is well known for his blockbusting runs. His previous clubs include St Helens and Sheffield Eagles.

## Gareth Barber

A 21-year-old Oldham born Halfback who was reared on rugby with his best pal, Leeds and Great Britain forward Kevin Sinfield. When Sinfield signed for the Rhinos, Barber signed for Warrington, but returned "home" to Oldham before the start of the 2000/2001 season. A promising young player who made the stand off position his own last season, was selected for the NFP under 21 squad who beat the Super League under 21's in 2001.

## Gavin Dodd

The former Royton Tigers youngster, who later had a spell with Bradford Bulls academy team, has new people to do battle with for the number 1 shirt this season after the departure of Mark Sibson. Fast on the break, yet unpredictable at times, Dodd scored some good tries for the team last season and made the full back position his own forcing Sibson out to a wing berth. Dodd represented Great Britain students in Australia and New Zealand two years ago, and was selected in the GB under 21 squad last season.

## Lee Doran

Another young player in whom Oldham have a lot of confidence. A Wiganer, Lee has worked his way through the Oldham academy and alliance sides and is now probably one of the first names on the first team sheet each week. Good pace and robust defence give him all the assets required to make a top class second row forward showed up well in the NFP under 21's, in 2001. One of five Oldham players in the squad.

## Phil Farrell

Phil starting his fourth season at Oldham has just been appointed as club captain. Played a lot of his rugby with Oldham at second row but it looks like he will fit into the loose forward role this season, a position his older brother Andy fills for Wigan. One of the youngest captains in the league he will not be phased by the responsibility.

## Jon Goddard

Aged 20, Goddard came to Oldham on loan in the 2002 season on the high recommendation of Graham Steadman, Castleford boss. Goddard was reared in Castleford youth and schools rugby before going to The Jungle to play for the academy side. During his two seasons in their Alliance team he has played three times in Super League, against Wakefield at home two seasons before last and against Bradford and London, both away, in 2001. He has recently signed a contract that will keep him with the Roughyeds for the 2003 season. Although a young

novice when first thrown into the first team he has developed well and made the transission from a full back to a very competant centre.

## John Hough

The first player to sign for his hometown club when the new Roughyeds were formed by Chris Hamilton and his fellow directors in the autumn of 1997. He has just signed a new contract to take him to the end of the 2004 season. On his day one of the best hookers in the NFP a danger to any defence form acting half back. At the end of the 2002 season John had made 152 appearances for Oldham, 37 of them in the 2002 season. Last year saw him cross the whitewash on ten occasions second only to Lee Doran in the forward try scoring charts.

## Iain Marsh

Iain is a 22-year-old goal kicking centre or winger signed from Barrow Border Raiders. Iain a St Helens lad played for Salford for 5years including some Super League appearances. Then went to St Helens the season before last. He was Cameron Bells first signing for Barrow last season, and mainly played as a centre alongside kiwi Cliff Beverley, and scored 12 tries in 32 appearances. A solid defender and very strong finisher. He is the biggest outside back we have had at Oldham for quite some time and continues the policy of adding size strength and a mean streak to the side from last season.

## Steve Molloy

The experienced 33 year old Steve Molloy, ex England captain. Molloy who signed for his second spell at Oldham from Batley Bulldogs was the obvious choice as player coach when the previous coach left mid season. A front row forward who has also played for Featherstone, Sheffield, Warrington, Huddersfield and Leeds, Molloy is from Oldham and indeed had a loan spell with us at the end of the 2000 season and made a big contribution to our excellent end of season run.

## Martin McGloughlin

Martin fits the Oldham ethos of big front row men, he can also play second row. Signed from Barrow at the end of the 2002 season, during the year with the Cumbrian club he twice managed to get his name into the NFP form team of the month.

## Chris Morley

Chris is the older brother of Great Britain's Adrian. Like his brother Chris is a no nonsense second row forward. He was signed from Leigh Centurions to start the Roughyeds 2003 campaign. Chris has the size and mean streak to stiffen up the Oldham back row.

## Neil Roden

Signed from his own town club Wigan, the son of Wigan's chief scout now has the scrum half jersey to himself, after winning the accolade of Players Player of the Year in 2002. He has shown improvement in the three seasons with the Roughyeds and is one of the best scrum-halves outside Super League.

## FRANK GALLAGHER

Frank Gallagher is one of only four players who have represented Great Britain whilst being a current Batley player.

He made his Batley debut on 21st October 1922, scoring 2 tries in a 21 - 5 home victory over Oldham. He was purchased for £600 from Dewsbury - a club record fee at the time and missed the club's only ever Championship win in Season 1923 - 24 as he was touring Australia with the Great Britain Lions.

He played his last game for Batley on 14th April 1928 in a 2 - 34 defeat at Featherstone Rovers. He left the club to join Leeds.

In his time at Batley he played for Yorkshire on 8 occasions, England 7 times and toured Australia in 1924 making 3 Great Britain Test Match appearances. He became the first Batley player to tour Australia (Joe Oliver emulating the feat in 1928). Predominantly a Loose Forward, Frank turned out at Stand Off Half on the tour and reports state that he had a 'blinder'.

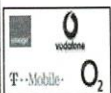

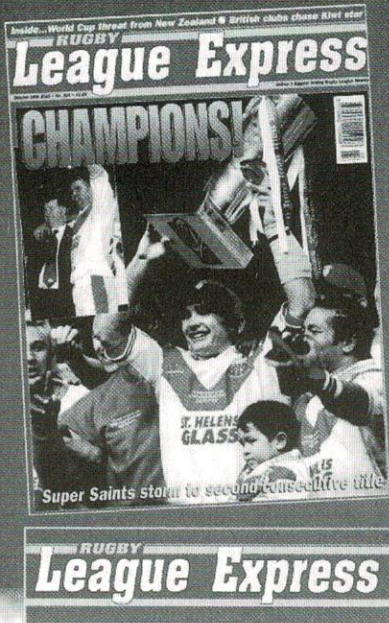

He will be best remembered at 'The Mount' for his tackling stints and non stop all round effort.

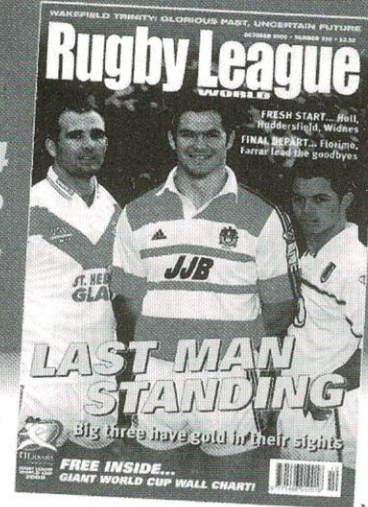

Time for TV talks outside Super League

RUGBY LEAGUE'S new television deal has certainly attracted plenty of column inches in the past week, but one important detail has been almost overlooked – where do the National League clubs stand in all of this?

Well, from the original deal put on the table by Sky that was still being mulled over as this piece is written, they would stand in exactly the same position. Sky would again hold all the rights, but as we all know, are unlikely to utilise them for anything more extensive than brief weekly highlights from one game and perhaps the NLI Grand Final.

Crucially though, when Sky hold the rights, other companies have to seek permission to televise any kind of action from this level.

In the past Sky have allowed Yorkshire Television to film their award winning series "Rugby League Raw", and in 2001 even to screen the Grand Final live on a Saturday afternoon – something that was seen as a great success at the time.

Last year, however, the game was back to Saturday evening on Sky, with much fewer viewers tuning in.

It's weekly terrestrial exposure that the game at this level needs.

Sources close to the RFL claim that they had a high-profile sponsor lined up for the National League competitions this season, but the lack of television exposure proved a real turn-off.

As a result, the National Leagues, unbelievably, have no title sponsor this year.

Even if it was simply a half-hour weekly spot on late night ITV (as "Rugby League Raw" was), it would prove immensely beneficial to Rugby League at this level.

Not only would it be easier to attract title sponsors to the competition, but also sponsorship at each individual club would be more lucrative if their team was regularly on television. Clubs would be able to put together more attractive packages for local companies.

And don't let anyone tell you there wouldn't be an audience for such a show. The figures for "RL Raw" even after 11pm, were tremendous at times.

So here's hoping that common sense prevails and the RFL ensure that the National Leagues are allowed to negotiate their own television deal and give themselves some much-needed exposure.

That may have been agreed midweek, of course. Let's hope so.

Everyone who watches the game at this level knows that the quality of action on the field merits it.

So let's take the National Leagues to a wider audience, rather than hiding it away.
