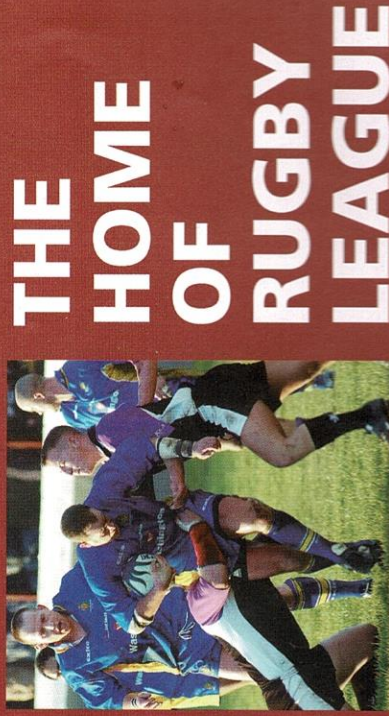

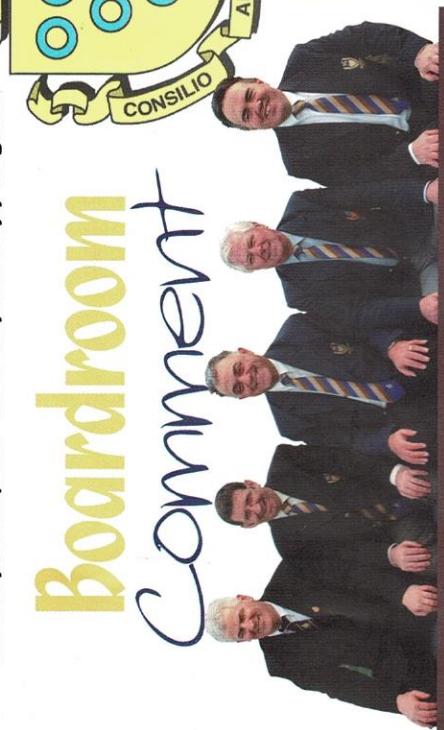

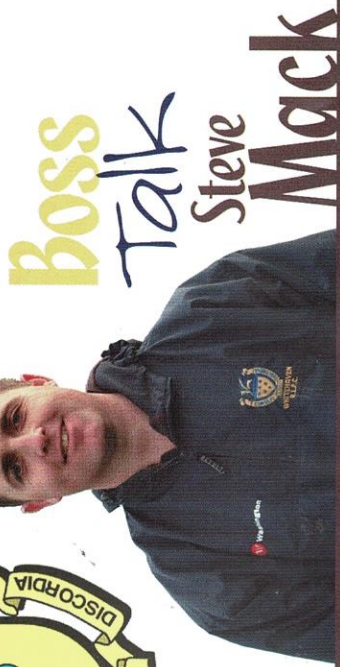

## Boss Talk Steve Mack

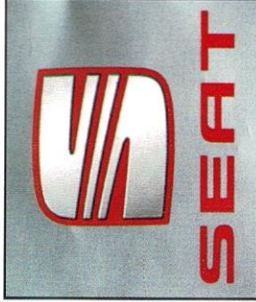

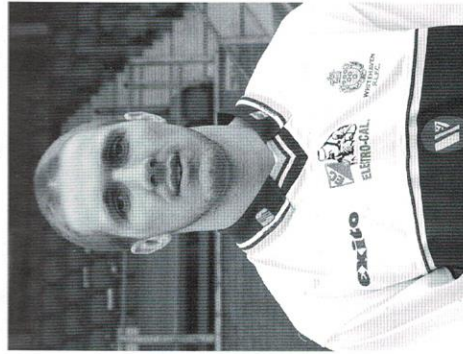

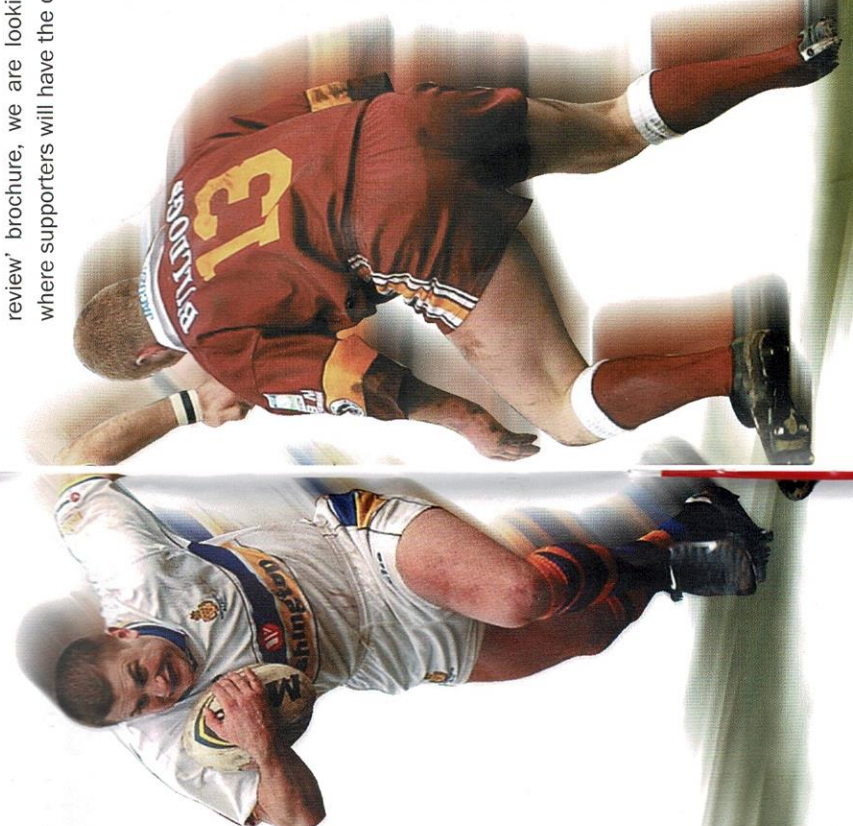

### TRY TIME AT EHENSIDE AS STUDENTS TAKE PRIDE IN IMPROVEMENTS

(editorial origin July 03)

Pride the Lion, mascot for Whitehaven Rugby League Club and symbol of the Pride in the Community ethos of the Whitehaven Rugby League Development Foundation was present at Ehside School with Scholarship Coaches Gary Hewer and Alan Davidson. They were there to present awards to pupils from Year 8 who had successfully completed a 'Try



Time Targets Project' organised by Connexions Cumbria.

Seven Year 8 boys took part in the programme which required them to improve certain parts of their approach to school life for which they were set targets. Teaching staff and Connexions Personal Advisers, who support young people in schools, checked on their progress over a 6 week period. During this period Connexions staff brought the youngsters one evening per week to the Recreation Ground where they had a motivational talk from coach Steve McCormack and were put through some tough rugby league coaching sessions with Gary Hewer and Alan Davidson from the Whitehaven Rugby League Development Foundation.

Coach Gary Hewer who also works for Home Housing Association as a Community Worker, who is a founder member of the foundation said "This is the sort of project we set the foundation up for. We are about encouraging young people to take part in sport and follow healthy lifestyles, We are also keen to use the power of sport and RL in particular as a motivational tool to help young people improve in school and in life and social skills."

The project was run by the Foundation in partnership with Connexions Cumbria. Area Manager for Connexions Mike Priestley said "The school staff we worked with in Ehside on this programme tell us that the young lads who have attended the sessions and worked towards their targets have definitely improved and that this has been a very positive experience for them. The message is that if you improve good things happen to you. The partnership between the school, the WRL Development Foundation and ourselves has been really worthwhile."

## Oldham

Today's visitors Oldham are one of the more successful clubs in the History of the game, being founder members of the game in 1895 they have in various eras dominated the game their last really great team being in the late 1950s when players like Bernard Ganley, Derek Turner and Charlie Winslade, wore the distinctive cherry and white jerseys with Navy Blue shorts at the famous Watersheddings Ground. They drew big crowds and won all the honours the game had to offer but surprisingly are still one of the few clubs never to have played at Wembley, their Challenge cup wins all coming in the pre Wembley era.

In more recent times the club has been striving to regain their former status being founder members of the Super League in 1995 as the Oldham Bears, by this point the club had sold the Watersheddings Ground and moved into Boundary Park the home of Oldham Athletic... The pressure of being in the elite, as with other clubs proved too great for them and after finishing bottom of Super league in 1997 the club folded with substantial debts.

The current Oldham club was re-formed by a group of Businessmen headed by Chris Hamilton who has shown himself to be one of the shrewdest chairmen in the Rugby league. Steady progress was made over the next few seasons culminating in 2001 when Oldham contested arguably the best ever NFP Grand final losing to Widnes in a pulsating game at Rochdale. Further progress could have been expected but things so far just haven't worked out for the club. Lasts season they had to play out of town after a dispute with Oldham Football club, thankfully they have located back there to take their place in NL 1. Their season so far has been inconsistent, like ourselves they have blown hot and cold but under the coaching of Steve Molloy there is no doubt Oldham can compete with the best. With both teams still having every chance of making the play off todays clash promises to be a cracking game.

**Jon Goddard** Aged 20, Jon came to Oldham on loan for the 2002 season on a high recommendation of Graham Steadman (Castleford Coach). He has recently signed a contract that will keep him at Oldham for the entire 2003 season, although a young novice, when first thrown into the first team, he has developed well and made the transition from full back to very competent centre.

**Will Cowell** Played 18 times in Super League for Warrington mostly as a sub. The 22yr old Cumbrian, a product of the prolific Kells club, left Widnespool to join Oldham. Former Warrington coach Daryl Van De Velde spoke well of him before the youngster was invited to join the 'roughyeds'.

**Iain Marsh** 22 year old goal kicking centre or winger signed from Barrow. Iain, a St Helens lad played for Salford for 5 years before signing for St Helens. Was Cameron Bells first signing at Barrow last season. Scored 12 tries in 32 appearances. A solid defender and a very strong finisher.

**Lee Doran** Another young player in whom Oldham have a lot of confidence. A Wiganer, Lee worked his way through the Academy and Alliance teams at Oldham and is now probably one of the first names on the Oldham team sheet. Good pace and robust defence give him all the assets required to make a top class second row forward.

**Gavin Dodd** Former Royton Tigers youngster who had a spell with Bradford Bulls Academy team. Fast on the break yet unpredictable at times, scored some good tries last season and made the full back position his own. Dodd represented GB students in Australia and New Zealand and has previously been selected for Great Britain under 21s.

**Simon Svabic** Signed from Leigh at the end of 2002, started his career in Oldham with the now defunct Bears. A stand off with great guile is an important playmaker in the squad.

**Neil Roden** Signed from hometown club Wigan, the son of Wigan's chief scout, has the scrum half jersey all to himself after winning the accolade of Oldham players player of the year 2002. One of the best scum half's outside Super League.

**Steve Molloy** Ex England captain, signed for his second spell at Oldham from Batley Bulldogs. Was the obvious choice as player/coach when previous coach



left mid season. A front row forward who has played for Featherstone, Sheffield, Warrington and Leeds. Local lad, made a big contribution to roughyeds excellent end of season run in which a place in National League One was secured.

**John Hough** First player to sign for his hometown club when Chris Hamilton and his fellow directors formed the new roughyeds in 1997. Signed a new contract to take him to the end of 2004 season. On his day, one of the best hookers in National League, a danger to any defence from acting full back.

**Dane Morgan** Young Australian come over on a one year contract, 24 years old and played previously for Melbourne Storm, West Tigers and North Sydney, plays prop or second row.

**Chris Morley** Older brother of GB star Adrian, like his brother, is a no nonsense second row forward. Signed from Leigh in time for 2003 season, Chris has the size and mean streak to stiffen up any back row.

**Lee Marsh** Recently signed on a months loan from Salford City Reds. Can play second row, centre, stand off or loose forward.

**Phil Farrell** Phil starting his fourth season with the roughyeds, has just been appointed club captain. Played most of his rugby at Oldham at second row but it looks like he will fit into loose forward role this season, a position his older brother Andy fills at Wigan. One of the youngest captains in the league, will not be fazed by the responsibility.

**Gareth Barber** A 21 year old Oldham born half back who was reared on rugby with his best pal, Leeds and GB ace Kevin Sinfield. A promising young players who made the stand off position his own last season.

**Martin McLaughlin** Big front row man who can also play second row. Signed from Barrow at the end of the 2002 season, during last season, was twice named in the NFP form team of the month.

**Gavin Johnson** A back row forward who can also fill in at centre or wing. Gavin has recently broken into the first team as a second row and scored his first senior points with a try against Keighley.

**Danny Guest** One of the roughyeds originals. Danny returned to the club three seasons ago, still a juggernaut weighing in at around 18st after shedding around 2st during close season. Still young by prop standards, he has pots of potential, used from the bench as an impact player most of last season, could play in a similar role in a formidable front row this year.

**Last Time at the Recre:** 21 July 2001 Haven 20 Oldham 17

Rob Jackson ran from deep inside his own half to score a dramatic try seconds from time to earn Whitehaven a 20-17 victory against Oldham. Whitehaven were trailing 16-17 to a Neil Roden drop goal 10 minutes from the end and looked to be heading for a fourth successive defeat. Haven led 10-6 at half-time with tries by Warren Stevens and Spencer Miller, one converted by Steve Kirkbride.

Oldham's Lee Doran went over in first-half stoppage time with Gareth Barber converting. In the second-half, Kirkbride improved Aaron Lester's try for Haven and Joey Hayes and Jon Goddard got tries for Oldham. Barber converting one before Roden's drop. However, Jackson had the final say as he eluded Hayes and swerved unattended to the line. Kirkbride missed the kick as the final hooter sounded.

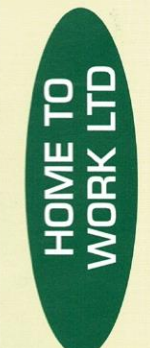

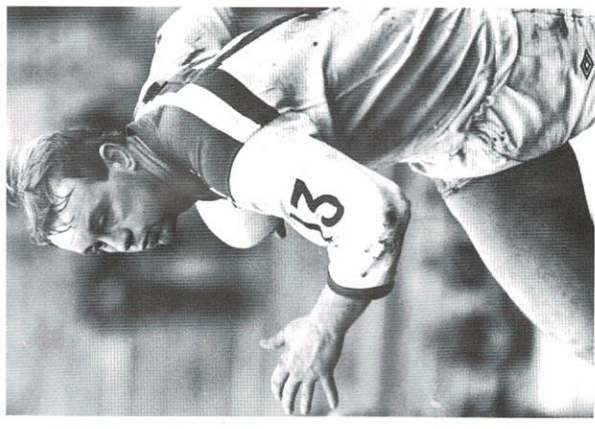

In what proved to be the clubs last taste of life amongst the games elite, the 1983/84 season saw Haven finish bottom of the 1st division with a paltry three wins from 30 matches. Despite Haven's swift return to the 2nd division the directors kept faith with Frank Foster - the former Barrow and Hull KR legend who had taken up the coaching reins at the start of 83/84 following Tommy Dawe's return to Barrow. The Haven squad at this time was quite a good blend of youth and experience. Youngsters Milton Huddart, Jimmy Dalton and Vince Gribbin joined seasoned professionals such as Alan Banks, John Hartley and Colin Hall in a team that was seen as more than capable of making an instant return to the 1st division. Close season signings for the club in 84/85 were Kells and BARLA hooker Frank Johnston, Hensingham's Paul Miller and the Egremont pair, Steve Burney and David Lightfoot. A third member of the Egremont side, centre Mark Beckwith, would also join the side in the early weeks of the season. Despite not having the benefit of a second team that had been disbanded in an effort to save money, Foster would still have a squad of around 28 players from which to choose his team. With the reluctance of the local amateur league to lift its ban on permit players, Frank's biggest problem would be giving everyone valuable game time. Despite having a twenty team 2nd division that included reformed sides Bridgend and Southend Invicta, clubs were restricted to twenty-eight league fixtures. With not all clubs playing each other, and some having 'easier' fixtures than others, this was always going to be a controversial way to decide the four promotion places. Haven's first game was a home match with Saiford, who like Haven had been relegated from the 1st division the previous season but were hot favourites to make a speedy return. With regular prop Neil Frazer sitting out a four-match ban from the previous season, Foster was forced to throw rookie forward Steve Burney straight into the front row. Burney had a fine game on his debut but the plaudits justifiably went to loose forward Milton Huddart, who's superb kicking game helped Haven to an 18-8 victory. Milton, who was forever being compared with his Father Dick - the Haven, St Helens and St George legend, was fast developing into an astute player in his own right and was deservedly named as part of the England squad to play Wales in October. Originally selected as a substitute, Huddart was handed the no. 13 shirt after the late withdrawal of Hull's Gary Divorty and played a useful part in England's 28-9 victory.



Haven's good start to the season continued with seven straight league wins before a 22-12 reversal in the return fixture at Saiford. However, November was to prove the most successful month of the season when as well as topping the league, Haven inflicted a then club record 64-0 defeat on Doncaster in the John Player Cup. Making his debut in the Doncaster game was Les Gorley, the former Town and Widnes

forward. At 33yrs of age Gorley had achieved immense success in the game having appeared in three Wembley and premiership finals as well as making four appearances for GB. Despite facing stiff competition from both Barrow and his former club Town, Frank Foster managed to attract the seasoned campaigner to the Recre for a £4,000 fee. While all eyes may have been on Gorley for the Doncaster game, it was Vince Gribbin who was making the headlines. The young centre bagged 6 tries to set both a new club and competition record. Vince's exploits had captured the attention of GB boss Maurice Bamford, when along with winger Jimmy Dalton he was named in the U21 squad for a two test series against the French. Vince played in both internationals with the added distinction of scoring the only try in the return game in France. Jimmy Dalton, for the time being at least, wasn't as fortunate. After failing to make the 1st test match the elusive winger had played his way into the reckoning only to dislocate a shoulder a fortnight before the 2nd test. When interviewed Jimmy for the match programme some 15 years later he proudly showed me a letter from Maurice Bamford telling him to get fit, play well for his club and he would do the rest. True to his word Bamford would indeed give Jimmy another chance at U21 level the following season and, but for an illness that would end his relatively short career, he would probably have gone on to full international honours.

Fresh from his success with the U21 side, Gribbin had impressed the wily Bamford and at just 19yrs of age he was selected for the senior GB side to play France at Headingley in February 1985. Vince, who was part of a team that included fellow debutants Sean Edwards and Ellery Hanley, scored a superb 40 yard try in a formidable 50-4 GB victory. An injury picked up in a 17-17 draw with Swinton, however, robbed Vince of a second test appearance and the prestigious international cap that would have accompanied it.

Despite the success of Gribbin and Huddart at international level the cracks were starting to appear in Haven's league form. A disillusioned Huddart was transferred, listed and eventually sold to neighbours Carlisle, whilst a surprise 7-6 defeat against Blackpool and three drawn games meant Haven were starting to fall off the pace in the quest for a top four finish. In what was indeed a season of two halves, Haven lost six of their last twelve games to finish in a disappointing sixth place. For the record, Haven won 16 drew 3 and lost 9 of their 28 league fixtures. Vince Gribbin was the top try scorer with 25 tries whilst Graham Cameron was the top kicker with 39 goals.

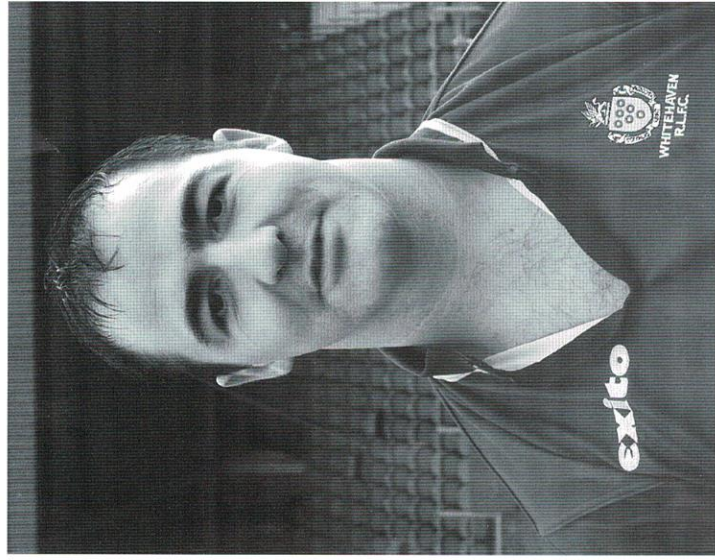

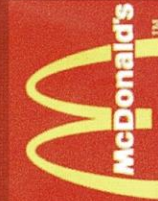

## NATIONAL LEAGUE TALK

WITH GARETH WALKER OF RUGBY LEAGUER & LEAGUE EXPRESS



### Eaton deserves the accolades

NATIONAL League One staged the establishment of a significant new world record last weekend.

Batley Bulldogs' scrum half Barry Eaton established a new mark for successful consecutive goal kicks when he slotted his 36th straight kick against Rochdale on Sunday.

The last time Eaton missed a kick was against Oldham on June 22. Since then his tally has been seven out of seven at Dewsbury, four against Doncaster and Salford, five against Leigh, Hull KR and Whitehaven, and six at Rochdale.

His new record surpassed the mark of 35 set by Bradford's Henry Paul, and Hazem El Masri of Australian side the Bulldogs. El Masri had actually equalled Paul's record just hours before Eaton, though the Lebanese winger went onto miss a kick and his run has now ended.

That is not the case with Eaton, who has the chance to extend his total in the game against Featherstone Rovers this afternoon.

Let's hope then that Eaton gets the full credit he deserves. He may not be playing in Super League or the NRL, but then goal kicks are no easier at a lower level are they? In fact, it could be argued that many of Eaton's efforts, on the notorious Mount Pleasant slope, were much harder than the plush services that Paul and El Masri will be accustomed to.

For Eaton's part, he simply reflected: "They all just seem to be going over at the moment. Sometimes you have a good run like this."

There are certainly a few other NLI sides that would welcome a kicker of Eaton's accuracy as the season nears its exciting climax.

Speaking of which, how good is the race for the National League Two play-offs? Currently, just five points separate the top seven sides in the competition, as they bid for the six available play-off places.

Top of the pile before this weekend's games is Chorley, who continued their remarkable resurgence under rookie coach Darren Abram with a superb win over fellow title contenders Sheffield last week.

The Eagles take on Keighley this weekend in a game crucial to the top two shake-up.

Those are the only three sides who currently look top six certainties, with the remaining four teams (Hunslet, Barrow, York and Swinton) scrapping for the remaining three places.

With each sides still having games left against fellow play-off pretenders, there will be plenty of movement among them still to come.

Which all goes to show how successful splitting the old NFP has been on the field at least (those crowds are still not what they should be). The likes of Chorley, Hunslet and Barrow have spent several years in the lower reaches, losing more games than they won.

Now they have winning sides on the field, and the prospect of winning some silverware.

That is one of the greatest justifications for splitting the old 19-team competition.

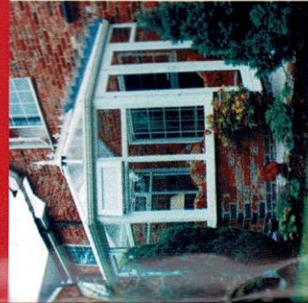

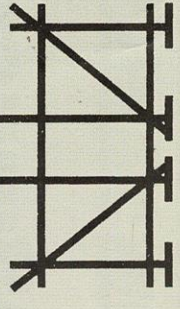

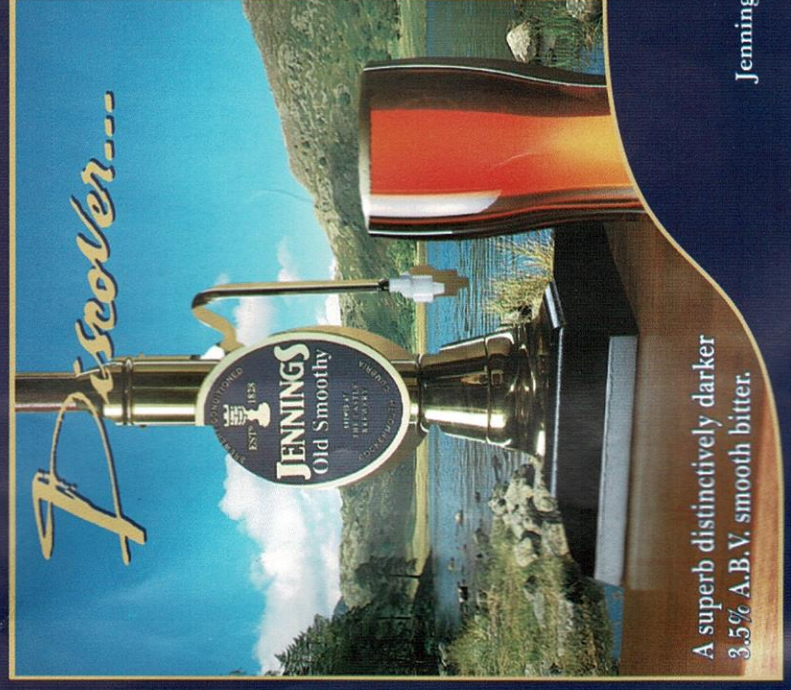
