



Leigh Centurions 2004 Welcoming Oldham

Today we welcome Oldham for our first (propper) home game of the season. It was the same last season when we met in our first Arriva Trains Cup of last season. He is the match report from Leythers.co.uk.

Leigh Centurions 22, Oldham 14

Leigh took to the field in their 1st competitive game at the recently rebranded coliseum and emerged victorious against a stubborn Oldham side.

Leigh looked a bit rusty in attack but good defence ensured that Oldham created very little in way of attack and soon started trying to slow the game

Leigh started like a house on fire when 2 of the new boys created to score the 1st try just a few minutes into the game. The field position was set up by a great run by Adam Bristow. Then the 2 ex Widnes players combined as Sean Richardson sent over Damien Munro for a great try. Lee Sanderson was just wide with the goal kick.

Oldham hit back with a penalty goal through Simon Svabic.

On the half hour mark Lee Sanderson added another goal after having the ball ripped out in the tackle. It was the 3rd such offence in a matter of minutes but ref Peter Taberner felt it deserved no more than a talking to.

Oldham looked very tired now and seems intent on trying to slow the game down at every chance. If their big forwards cant handle the game now, then they will really struggle when the pitches dry out.

2 Minutes later though Mr Taberner remembered he had brought his cards and he dispatched an Oldham player for lying on.

Lee Sanderson then added his 2nd penalty goal this time for lying on again. But Mr Taberner evened things up with a penalty that Simon Svabic getting a penalty for offside on the last tackle.

Both teams started the 2nd half on fire. Oldham looked to have scored but were called back for a forward pass. Then Damien Munro went close after an intelligent kick from Adam Bristow.

Oldham then did score with a good try as they moved the ball along the line and created a gap out wide for Gavin Dodd's to just evade a last gasp tackle from Mike watts who chased him down from the opposite wing. Oldham missed the kick to tie the scores.

Lee Sanderson then missed a penalty yet again for lying on.

John Hamilton then restored Leigh's lead as they ran the ball on the 5th tackle and surprised Oldham. Sean Richardson passed in the tackle and released Munro on a short run where he drew the fullback and sent John Hamilton over unopposed. Sandy added the goal.

The coliseum then saw a rare sight as a Leigh player broke in their own half and had enough pace to cross the line. Damien Munro broke the line and just went like a rocket having far to much pace for the Oldham defence. Sandy unfortunately missed the goal.

Both sides were then reduced to 12 men as Paul Rowley appeared to take exception to something in the tackle and started trading punches with Oldham boss Steve Molloy both were yellow carded and the incident placed on report.

With 5 minutes left Leigh let in a soft try as an Oldham kick was allowed to bounce and Oldham pounced for an easy try that was converted to narrow the gap to just 4 points.

Leigh weren't going to let this one slip and up the field they marched again. This time again scoring on the 5th tackle. Pat Weisner looked to have taken the wrong option when he ran the ball and looked to be wrapped up. But he showed all the strength his stocky build gives him and he released a perfect pass to the supporting Dave Alstead who powered over from 25 yards out taking 3 defenders with him. Sandy missed the kick.

Dane Morgan

Oldham's big Aussie prop or second rower joined the Roughyeds in February 2003 and has recently extended his contract until the end of the 2004 season. He has a burning ambition to lay in Super League and has represented West Tigers, North Sydney and Melbourne Storm for whom he scored a try when they defeated St. Helens in the World Cup Championship at the JJB Stadium. He hit a rich vein of form at the end of last season and proved to be one of the best off loaders of a ball outside of Super League. Recently married, he lives in Oldham and works part-time for the local newspaper, the Oldham Evening Chronicle. Was voted the Junior Roughyeds Player of the Year in 2003.

Neil Roden

Joined the Roughyeds along with Phil Farrell from Wigan in April 2000 after serving a month on loan. He is the son of Wigan's chief scout and quickly made the scrum half spot his own. Very popular with his team mates, he was Player's Player of the Year in 2002 when he was also the club's leading try scorer. Has a phenomenal record at Oldham playing in 118 games out of a possible 126 in three and a half season, scoring 50 tries and 18 drop goals a total of 218 points. Surely one of the best scrum halfs outside of Super League.

Paul Southern

26 year old front row forward who, like fan Watson, was also a major influence last year in the Rochdale Hornets camp. Big and strong he is known to be a clever ball handler and alongside Dane Morgan Oldham must have two of the best ball handling props in the business. Spent most of his career with Salford - much of it in Super League - and comes to Oldham to "prop-up" the front row following the departures of Paul Norton, Jason Clegg and Danny Guest.

Simon Svabic

Signed from Leigh at the end of the 2002 campaign. Simon battled for the standoff and goal kicking spot with Gareth Barber last season. Simon started his rugby league career with the now defunct Oldham Bears and has proved himself a skilful play worker and consistently good goal kicker. Also played at full back for Leigh. Showed great guile at times last season and is now part of one of the league's strongest half back squads consisting of Barber, Brennan, Roden, Watson and Simon himself.

lan Watson

Aged 27, lan is one of the most experienced scrumhalves in the game. Capped numerous times for Wales, he played most of his career with Salford City Reds, with whom he had considerable experience in Super League. A playmaker and midfield organiser, he was a key man in the Rochdale Hornets team that finished third in National League Division One last term. His last appearance for Wales was against the touring Australians at Bridgend in the autumn of 2003. He was picked at hooker and did enough to be named the best player in a red jersey.

Martin Elswood

Tall and fast, 20 year old Martin is an Oldham lad who lives in Shaw.
Played soccer in his schoolboy days and was snapped up by Oldham Athletic on

schoolboy forms. When things didn't work out, he turned to rugby league, started to play for Royton Tigers and was quickly invited to the McAlpine Stadium for trials with Huddersfield. The Giants signed him on and he was there for a couple of season, mainly in the academy and alliance teams, until he snapped up the chance of a move to his hometown club in the autumn of 2003. Originally a centre, he now plays in the second row and that is where he sees his future.

Phil Farrell

At 23 Phil is one of the youngest club captains in the game. Brother of Wigan and GB captain Andy Farrell he joined Oldham from Wigan in March 2000 where he began a remarkable unbroken run of 67 matches - an almost impossible feat in modern day rugby. Played most of his career at second row but was converted to loose forward by Steve Molloy last season. Had surgery on his shoulder in the close season, but hopes to be back early in the 2004 season to lead Oldham from the front. Was voted the Players Player of the Year in 2003.

Craig Farrimond

Became a Roughyed on his 21st birthday at the end of the 2003 season. The club hopes this will be a good luck omen. Craig plays second row or loose forward. A Wiganer, who played his early rugby with Ince Rose Bridge before turning pro for Warrington Wolves. He captained the academy and then the alliance sides at Wilderspool before coming to Oldham highly recommended. He represented Super League under 21's last season against National League U21's at Leigh. He was picked at hooker and had a sound game.

on Goddard

Still only 21, Jon came to us on loan in 2002 on the recommendation of Castleford coach Graham Steadman. Signed a full time contract in 2003 and was one of the most consistent players all season, winning the Coach's choice as Player of the Year. Jon was reared in Castleford Youth & Schools rugby before going to the Jungle. Played three times in Super League for Castleford. Played most of his rugby at Oldham in the centre, but when Steve Molloy switched him to his favourite position of full back half way through last season he thrived and made the position his own.

John Hough

On his day seen by many as best hooker outside Super League and as good as many in it. "Scruff" was born in Oldham but signed for Warrington as a youngster. He, however, was the first player to sign for the newly formed "Roughyeds" in 1997 and has since played over 170 matches and scored over 50 tries. He was on the team sheet for 82 consecutive months between February 1999 and April 16th 2001. Is at present the club's vice captain.

Gavin Iohnson

A back row forward who can also fill in at centre or wing. He has been joined this season by brother Nik who has joined the club from Bradford Bulls. Gavin also spent two seasons with the Bradford academy side before joining Oldham in 2000. He signed a two year contract in 2001 and has recently reviewed it for another year. He broke into the first team in 2002 but has made most of his appearances from the bench. Hoping to break into the first team proper this season.



Leigh Centurions 2004 Behind The Sticks

with Mike Hulme of the Leigh Journal

BskyB are to continue to pour their millions into rugby league over the next five years in exchange for all rights to broadcast Super League and international matches.

The expectation is that the BBC will now broadcast the Powergen Challenge Cup competition live over a similar period and to include the Super League play-offs and Tri-Nations tournament in a national highlights programme on Grandstand.

And for all this exposure RL bosses have even managed to negotiate a £7million increase in television income.

The League recently unveiled a new five-year broadcast agreement worth £53million with Sky Sports for coverage of the Tetley's Super League and the international game until the end of the 2008 season. The last contract, which ran out in November, was worth £46million.

The League have not broken down the new deal but it is thought clubs will receive around £700,000 a year, which is well down on the near £1million they received from the initial £87million deal in 1995 when rugby league agreed to switch to summer, but an increase on the current deal.

And there's even good news for clubs like Leigh. The Super League clubs have agreed to donate £250,000 between them over the next two years to the 20 National League clubs who are no longer part of the deal with Sky Sports. Thanks guys — it's not great but it's better than the kick in the nether regions we usually get.

Love it or loathe it, the game needs Sky's commitment and with the BBC seemingly ready to commit long term, the game should be able to make a double-pronged, and nationwide, attack via both satellite and terrestrial TV. It should further raise the profile of the game and as a consequence help with sponsorship and advertising opportunities.

But that's all well and good at the top end of the tree. What about those lower down the scale

The National Leagues have done their utmost to raise their profile in recent seasons but still the competition can't attract a major sponsor. OK Arriva have their brand name attached to the old Trans-Pennine Trophy but the National Leagues still don't have a big business backer.

Why? Simple. No exposure. Companies will only spend their advertising budgets on things they think will bring a return i.e. televised games.

Now the National Leagues are free of the Sky TV handcuffs they should be free to negotiate their own TV deal. Whether they ever will or not is another matter. All I know is that it's something Red Hall should be pursuing as a matter of urgency.

ALTHOUGH we're only a couple of weeks into the season I've been quite pleased with the way the squad is starting to blend and gel.

What we musn't forget is that during the close season we had a huge turnover of staff, including myself, and it will take some time for all the pieces in the jigsaw to fit together. We've introduced new styles of play and it will take several games for these to bed in properly. One thing that happens when fatigue sets in is that players tend to slip back into their old ways and patterns; that's something we're addressing and will put right.

One area we have improved significantly is on our disciple. Over the close season the Community department has doubled in size.

We now offer not only a Primary Schools Touch Rugby Programme and a Numeracy through Rugby Programme but also a Secondary Schools and After Schools Programme.

In order to run all of these programmes we have had to recruit more staff so this season there are a few new faces in the community department some you will automatically recognize as we have been fortunate enough to secure the services of First Team Players Paul Rowley and Richard Marshall.

A new full-time member of staff, Craig Blackburn in, joins Paul going into Primary schools in the area and teaching children aged 4 years old to 11 years old in the non-contact form of Rugby - Touch Rugby.

So far the programme has visited 13 schools within the Leigh area and taught over 1000 children, by September 2005 Leigh Centurions

Community department will have entered all Primary Schools within

Leigh and surrounding areas.

Richard has the task of teaching Secondary School children in the area, the basics in Rugby. This programme was launched a month ago and has been very successful so far. The department aim to increase the programme over the next couple of months to include all young adults whether they are in mainstream education or not.

After the Half Term the community department will be in the following schools: St Peters, Garrett Hall, Sacred Heart Hindley Green, St Josephs Catholic Primary, Hesketh Fletcher Secondary School, Lowton Community High and Westleigh High school.

The program will be delivered by a first team player Richard Marshall

After participating in the program the children will be competent in the basic skills of rugby league and able to play the game, there will also be the opportunity for children who want to play the game to exit the program to local clubs.

The basic layout of the program is the same although the drills and way that the skills are acquired and perfected will very according to the age and the ability of the group.



The Leigh club sends their deepest sympathies to both the family and friends.






Peter Lloyd (21/1/24 - 2/2/04) (above right)

Swinton's season had started with something of a bang despite a home defeat to Leigh Centurions - but losing to East Hull was a major set back. Rookie coach Paul Kidd has an early test of his credentials as he takes his side up to Whitehaven.

Big things have been predicted of Hull KR this season - but losing at home to French outfit UTC was not part of the plan. They face a tough trip to Featherstone, whose form to date has been highly promising.

Barrow will be looking to make amends for their close defeat to Pia Donkeys by winning at Chorley. And while Gateshead,s loss to Limoux may not have been totally unexpected, they need to start hitting the winning track, although York at home today will be far from easy.

Elsewhere they are a handful of potentially cracking matches and bumper crowds - particularly at Leigh, who entertain Oldham in a match that will go a long way to deciding who tops the West ATC Group.

After today, there is another weekend of ATC action before the next stage of the Powergen Challenge Cup.

But while some clubs will already be looking forward to that, for others, this weekend is all about extinguishing the memories of some painful defeats. Enjoy the game.


