DONCASTER DRAGONS 52 KEIGHLEY COUGARS 30

Doncaster Dragons moved level on points with co-leaders Whitehaven and Leigh with a convincing victory over strugglers Keighley Cougars.

The Dragons, who are now well placed in the play-off race, started off strongly and were soon on the score sheet. Stand Off Graham Holroyd sent in Johnny Woodcock with a fine long range pass. Woodcock failed with the conversion, but made no mistake minutes later, converting Horne's try, who was also sent in by Holroyd. Holroyd was in the thick of the action at this stage and his excellent 40/20 gave Doncaster the platform to score their second try.

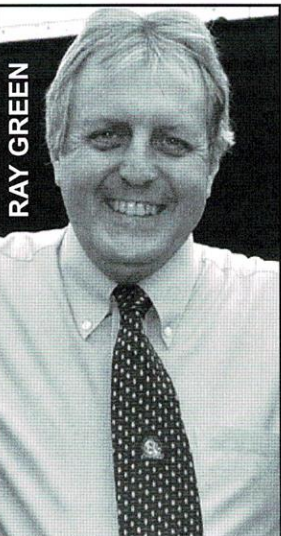
At this stage Doncaster led 10-0, which was the same margin that they led Rochdale the previous week, before taking their foot off the gas. But there was no sign of a drop in intensity this time, as the Dragons continued to dominate. Keighley's cause wasn't helped in the 16 minute when experienced prop Stevenson was sent off for a high tackle on Dragons prop Gareth Handford. Chris Hough then darted over from close range and when James Walker barged over 4 minutes later, things looked ominous for the Cougars.

With Woodcock in fine kicking form the score had moved to 22-0.

In the 34th minute Keighley opened their account with a excellent team try, they moved the ball out to left, where Beever did well to slip the inside ball to the supporting Mitchell who dived over out wide. Mitchell converted his own try to narrow the deficit to 16 points. But before halftime Peter Green was put through a gap by Craig Cook and normal service was resumed. Woodcock added the conversion, and the Dragons went in 28-6 to the good. Ex Doncaster back, Matty Foster, who made his debut for the Dons on Boxing day 1994 at the age of 17, scored a trademark try just after the re start. He jumped the highest to reach Matty Firth's cross field kick and touched down out wide. Mithcell again was successful with the kick. In the 48th minute, James Walker's second try ensured that there was only going to be one winner when he crashed over. Johnny Woodcock then scored the try of the game. Holroyd released Craig Horne who in turn, got his pass away to Woodcock who side-stepped his man and then dummied the full back to score beside the posts. The reliable Woodcock added both conversions. And on the hour mark Chris Hough, who had his best game for the club, picked up a loose ball and raced 40 metres to score, Woodcock converted and the Dragons led 46-12.

The last quarter must have been a disappointment for Dragons coach St John Ellis, as Keighley out scored Doncaster 3 tries to 1. Nipperess converted tries by Hoyle, D. Foster and Matty Foster's second. In between, Martin Moana marked his return to the club with a try, barging his way past at least four would be tacklers. Woodcock again added the conversion.

All in all this was another good performance, and the boys could now enjoy their blank weekend, before preparing for another stern test against Oldham Roughyeds today.

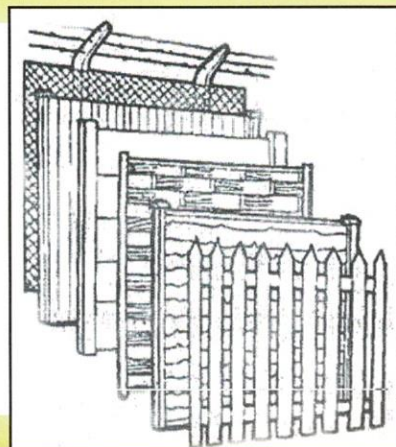

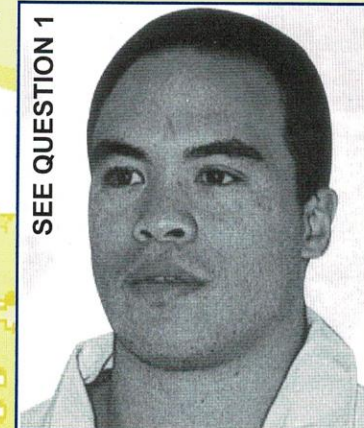

TODAY'S VISITORS...

JON GODDARD

Jon came to Oldham on loan in the 2002 season on the high recommendation of Graham Steadman the former Castleford boss. He was reared in Castleford youth and schools rugby before going to 'The Jungle' to play for the academy side. During his two seasons in their Alliance team he played three times in Super League, against Wakefield, Bradford and London. Has developed into a competent full back or centre.

WILL COWELL

Cowell has played 18 times in Super League for Warrington Wolves, mostly as a substitute. The 22-year-old Cumbrian, a product of that prolific provider of rugby league players, Kelis, he left Wilderspool permanently to join Oldham originally on a one-year contract which he has recently extended for another year. He plays full-back, wing or centre, preferring full-back his chances to impress the coach will probably be as a winger or centre. Former Warrington coach Daryl van de Velde, spoke well of Cowell before the youngster was invited to join the Roughyeds.

JAMES BUNYAN

Second row or centre James Bunyan was from local rivals Rochdale Hornets. He has been brought in particularly to stiffen up the defence on the fringes. He is one of those players who is a quiet achiever rather than a star performer, but in the same vein he is a player who is highly respected by his fellow professionals. He comes with a wealth of experience and is again somebody who is very keen to be playing at the highest possible level, which of course concurs with the clubs ambitions of reaching Super League. His previous clubs also include Huddersfield Giants and Doncaster Dragons.

PAT RICH

Pat Rich is no stranger to the Oldham ranks. He played in the successful 1991 Grand Final team and still holds the club points scoring record for his achievements during that season. Pat plays centre, and is renown for his copy book tackling and his prolific goal kicking which enabled him to gain the point scoring record.

NICKY JOHNSON

Nicky signed for Oldham towards the end of the 2003 season for the run in to the play offs on a loan deal from Bradford Bulls.

Nick is the younger brother of Gavin. He has been on long term loan to London, where he played four full first team games for the Broncos, one of them being the Challenge Cup victory against Oldham.

Nick is a winger and was a member of the Bradford Academy team which won the Super League Academy Championship.

An Oldham lad he is keen to play for his own town team.

NEIL RODEN

Signed from his own town club Wigan, the son of Wigan's chief scout now has the scrum half jersey to himself, after winning the accolade of Players Player of the Year in 2002. He has shown improvement in the three seasons with the Roughyeds and is one of the best scrum-halves outside Super League.

IAN WATSON

Scrum-half Ian Watson was signed from local rivals Rochdale Hornets.

Ian has been a Welsh international since 1996 and is regarded to be a clever half back with a good kicking game, attributes with which he has tormented Oldham in the past.

An experienced player who has served Salford, Swinton, Widnes and Rochdale since his amateur days with Eccles

STEVE MOLLOY

The vastly experienced Steve Molloy hails from Oldham and is an ex England captain. Molloy who signed for his second spell at Oldham from Batley Bulldogs was the obvious choice as player coach when the previous coach left mid season 2002.

A front row forward who has also played for Featherstone, Sheffield, Warrington, Huddersfield and Leeds.

KEITH BRENNAN

Keith is a product of Amateur Rugby League in the Oldham area, playing for both Higginshaw and Shaw Rhinos before signing for his home town club. Scrum half is his preferred position but he has filled in in many positions, most notably as hooker whilst deputising for John Hough. Keith decided to hang up his boots at the end of the 2002 season, but after the start of the 2003 campaign the lure of Rugby League was too much to resist and Keith signed on again.

PAUL SOUTHERN

Experienced prop forward Paul Southern was also signed from local rivals Rochdale Hornets. Paul who is 27 years old has been signed on a twelve month contract. He will be renewing acquaintances with Iain Marsh, Simon Svabic and Ian Watson who he has played with in his spells at Salford and Rochdale.

Paul showed great consistency playing for Hornets last season and this earned him a place in the NL1 form team of the year. From the Roughyeds point of view we hope he can continue that consistency.

He has been brought to the club with a view that he will influence the younger players with his good training and playing habits.

OLDHAM

DANE MORGAN

Dane is a leviathan of a man, standing at 6'5" and weighing around 17 and a half stones, the second row or prop forward has a brilliant pedigree. He has played for North Sydney and was a try scoring member of the World Club Championship winners Melbourne Storm who beat St Helens for the title.

Dane came to Britain with an ambition to play in Super League, hopefully he can achieve this ambition with the Roughyeds. Already he has shown he is not a forward you can take liberties with.

GAVIN JOHNSON

A back row forward who can also fill in at centre or wing, Oldhamer, Gavin spent two seasons at Odsal in the Bradford Academy side and made the occasional appearance for the Bulls in the Alliance Championship. Spent almost a season earning his Oldham spurs in the Alliance team.

MARTIN McLOUGHLIN

Martin fits the Oldham ethos of big front row men, he can also play second row. Signed from Barrow at the end of the 2002 season, during the year with the Cumbrian club he twice managed to get his name into the NFP form team of the month.

MARTIN ELSWOOD

Local, 20 year old second row or centre Martin Elsworth was signed from Super League club Huddersfield Giants. Martin who was on the verge of a first team call up last season when Steve Molloy first looked at him with regard to strengthening his squad for the run in to the play offs, but sadly injury dashed his chances, Steve opted instead for Craig McDowell.

At around 6'4" and 16st Martin has power as well as pace. He is eager to further his career and for this reason wants to get some first team rugby under his belt. Martin was brought up on a strong rugby background at North Chadderton school and progressed through the Royton Tigers youth set up.

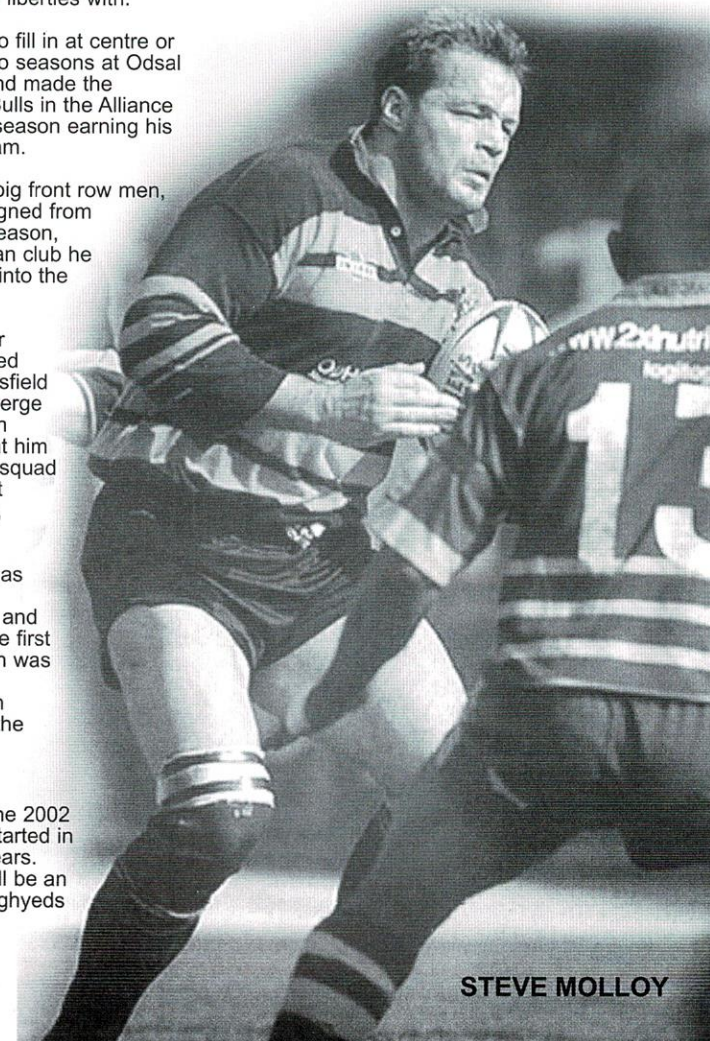
SIMON SVABIC

Played a lot of his rugby with Oldham at second row but it looks like he will fit into the loose forward role this season, a position his older brother Andy fills for Wigan. One of the youngest captains in the league, he will not be phased by the responsibility.

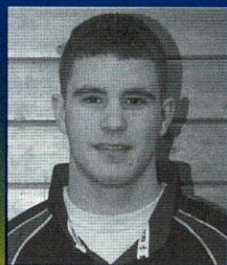

MATCH PREVIEW

BIG BROTHER'S LITTLE BROTHERS

Few Rugby League players can have gone through the trials of Paul and Neil Thorman to play the game they love.

Permanent fixtures at the most traumatised club of recent years, Gateshead Thunder, the brothers have battled against adversity throughout their careers.

From being junior players at the ill-fated Super League Thunder to members of the virtual Academy side that helped the club battle through the second half of 2002, the Thormans have seen their local club stutter from one disaster to another.

But, spurred on by the amazing success story of elder brother Chris, who left his North East roots at 16 and has gone on to be one of only two Englishmen currently playing in the NRL, Paul and Neil continue to follow their League dreams.

They are mainstays, and stand-outs, of a Thunder side in the midst of a record losing run at present. And with mum Phyllis a key figure in keeping the club going during its darkest hours - at least until a recent acrimonious boardroom departure, - they are something of a Geordie version of the Mylers or Sullivans, a mini-Rugby League dynasty.

It's certainly been a roller coaster ride.

"Thunder wouldn't be Thunder without a few incidents throughout the season," says Paul.

"We've come to expect it really - it's been a bit of a soap opera."

Neil stresses that he has never considered quitting the game altogether, despite the constant tribulations at Thunder, though Paul, slightly more experienced and having gone through a couple more ordeals than his brother, admits it "crossed his mind" a couple of times.

Both are now keen to further their League careers, and have aspirations of following Chris into both Super League and the NRL. There have been approaches from other clubs in the past - both as a pair and individually - though their studies in Newcastle made staying in the area the more sensible option.

But if the duo did come to leave, what would the future hold for the club?

"I think the Super League season showed there is scope to have a successful professional Rugby League team here," Paul adds.

"It's just that no-one's come up with the formula of how to work it yet, how to finance it, where to get the playing personnel.

"People are still fiddling with it and trying to make it work, and hopefully one day they'll come up with something that works."

PROMOTION A MUST

LHF National League One joint leaders Doncaster Dragons must win promotion to Super League if the club are to move forward, according to their outspoken Chairman, John Wright.

The Dragons, who have beaten all the big guns in the League at home, are only averaging gates of around 1,000, which according to Wright, is about half the crowd required for the club to be self supporting.

"Since I took over the reins at the club in 2001, we have tried everything to attract the Rugby League supporters in the town, but nothing seems to work. I can only conclude that the last financial disaster was one too many, and that the people have lost belief in the club completely.

A question I am often asked is why I am putting so much money into the club, as if I had to have some sort of angle, or gain to make. The truth is, I am a Rugby League fanatic, and I feel it a great honour to be trusted with the fortunes of the Doncaster Dragons. I also firmly believe that everything is right at Doncaster for success to happen, with the new stadium and a great catchment area for support on the doorstep. I don't want anyone to think my comments are about finance, they are not. I am backing the club financially, and will continue to do so for as long as is required.

The hard facts appear to be that the Rugby League supporters of Doncaster have had enough of being losers, and who can blame them. It is my job to make the Dragons winners, and I know I can. That is why promotion is a must," says Wright.

The Dragons have already beaten odds on promotion favourites Leigh and second favourites Whitehaven at home in the League, and if they can carry that form with them away, promotion looks a real possibility.

Despite his dissatisfaction with the gates, the Chairman signed loose forward Martin Moana from Super League club Salford last week, so it looks as though he clearly believes that 2004 will be the year of the Dragons.

NEWS & VIEWS FROM THE WORLD OF RUGBY LEAGUE

Hull KR and Leigh Centurions emerged triumphant in last Sunday's Arriva Trains National League Cup Semi Finals and will now meet at Rochdale's Spotland ground on Sunday 18 July 2004.

Hull KR were comfortable 32-0 home winners over injury-hit York City Knights who thus far had been the surprise package of the tournament.

A number of former Dragons were on show at Craven Park with the Robins seventeen including Marvin Golden, Lynton Stott and Paul Mansson as well as one-time loanee Dean Andrews and the Knights fielding Craig Forsyth. 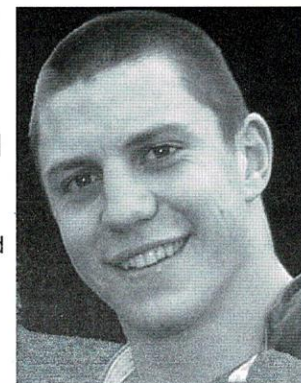
