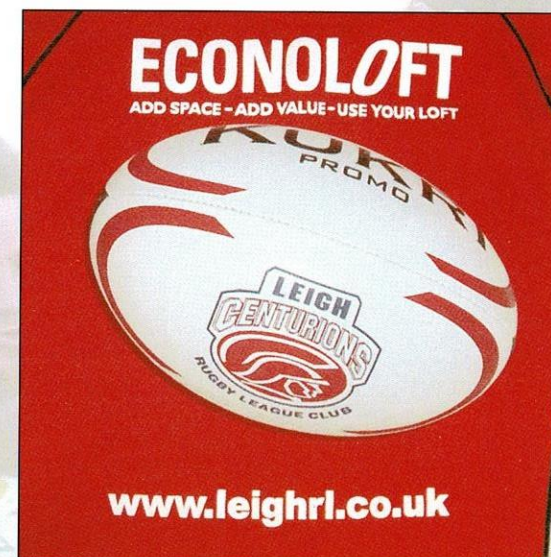

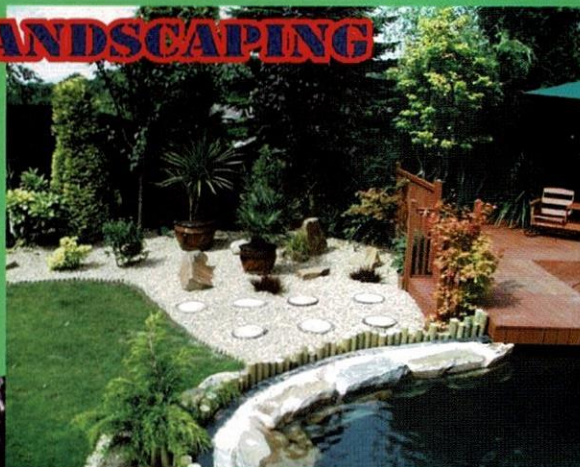

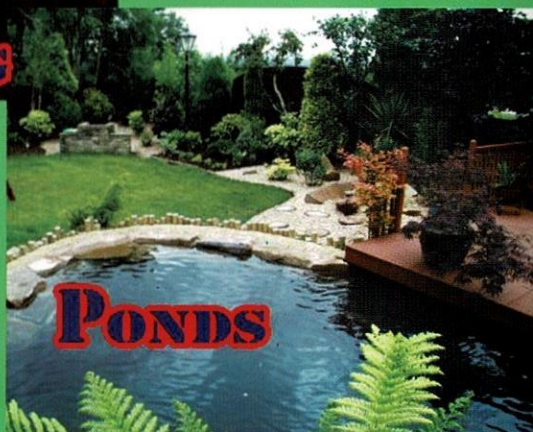

Here's a match report from the away game on the 2/5/04, Leigh beating Oldham 60-20.

THE Centurions appear to be over their opening day upset at Whitehaven. Now, just three games into the National League One season, they've moved ominously into third place and already are the division's top scorers.

But they were given a helping hand by Oldham who had two players dismissed as tempers boiled over on the Boundary Park sunshine.

Oldham's 100 per cent league record was immediately put on the line when Aussie second rower Dane Morgan was red carded in the 26th minute for an off the ball punch on Simon Knox. At that point they were only 12-8 behind but by the break Leigh were in total command at 18-8.

When Ian Watson became the second Oldham player dismissed, this time for a head butt on Paul Rowley, Leigh were cruising at 42-16. With Oldham stretched to breaking point, Leigh killed them off with three more tries.

As well as enjoying a runaway win, Leigh were able to welcome back long term injury casualties Richard Marshall and Willie Swann. Marshall had a fine game in the front row and Swann came off the bench to score one try himself and set up two more. John Duffy gave Leigh a flying start with a try inside two minutes with Neil Turley landing the first of 10 goals. The first of Nick Johnson's two tries and a Pat Rich conversion levelled matters before a Rich penalty put Oldham ahead.

Marshall scored from close in to restore Leigh's advantage and after Morgan had gone, Turley and Tommy Martyn touched down for a 24-8 half time lead. Johnson scored again to make it 24-12 before a burst of three tries in five minutes from Duffy, and Chris Percival (2), had Leigh well clear. Untidy defensive work let Oldham in twice through Farrimond and Farrell before Leigh provided the final gloss with tries from Swann, Radney Bowker and Steve Maden in the last six minutes.

Jon Goddard

Aged 20, Goddard came to Oldham on loan in the 2002 season on the high recommendation of Graham Steadman, Castleford boss. Goddard was reared in Castleford youth and schools rugby before going to The Jungle to play for the academy side. During his two seasons in their Alliance team he has played three times in Super League, against Wakefield at home two seasons before last and against Bradford and London, both away, in 2001.

Although a young novice when first thrown into the first team he has developed well and made the transission from a full back to a very competent centre.

Gavin Dodd

The former Royton Tigers youngster, who later had a spell with Bradford Bulls academy team, has new people to do battle with for the number 1 shirt this season after the departure of Mark Sibson. Fast on the break, yet unpredictable at times, Dodd scored some good tries for the team last season and made the full back position his own forcing Sibson out to a wing berth.

Dodd represented Great Britain students in Australia and New Zealand two years ago, and was selected in the GB under 21 squad last season.

Iain Marsh

Iain is a 22 year old goal kicking centre or winger signed from Barrow Border Raiders.

Iain a St Helens lad played for Salford for 5 years including some Super League appearances. Then went to St Helens the season before last. He was Cameron Bells first signing for Barrow last season, and mainly played as a centre alongside kiwi Cliff Beverley, and scored 12 tries in 32 appearances. A solid defender and very strong finisher.

He is the biggest outside back we have had at Oldham for quite some time and continues the policy of adding size strength and a mean streak to the side from last season.

Pat Rich

Pat Rich is no stranger to the Oldham ranks. Pat played in the successful 1991 Grand Final team and still holds the club points scoring record for his achievements during that season. Pat plays centre, and is renown for his copy book tackling and his prolific goal kicking which enabled him to gain the point scoring record. From the North East of England Pat had a welcome return to the Roughyeds, taking part in the 56 points to 12 demolition of Rochdale.

Nicky Johnson

Nicky signed for Oldham towards the end of the 2003 season for the run in to the play offs on a loan deal from Bradford Bulls. Nick is the younger brother of Gavin. He has been on long term loan to London Broncos.

He has played four full first team games for the Broncos, one of them being the Challenge Cup victory against Oldham. Nick is a winger and was a member of the Bradford Academy team which won the Super League Academy Championship.

An Oldham lad he is keen to play for his own town team and had a good debut scoring a try against Whitehaven in Cumbria.

Simon Svabic

Simon Svabic began his career with the former Oldham Bears club Academy side, where is half back partner was Bradford's Paul Deacon. Since those days he has played Super League with Salford and also at the top in the National League with Leigh Centurions. He signed for the Roughyeds to begin the 2003 campaign. His preferred poition is stand off, where he can demonstrate his silky smooth ball skills, but he is also at home in the full back position.

Ian Watson

Ian has been a Welsh international since 1996 and is regarded to be a clever half back with a good kicking game.

An experienced scrum half who has served Salford, Swinton, Widnes and Rochdale since his amatuer days with Eccles.

An integral piece in the Oldham jigsaw, he provides the direction around the field that the team needs.

Paul Southern

Paul who is 27 years old has been signed on a twelve month contract. He has renewed acquaintances with Iain Marsh, Simon

Svabic and Ian Watson who he has played with in his spells at Salford and Rochdale.

Paul showed great consistency playing for Hornets last season and this earned him a place in the fictitious NLI form team of the year. From the Roughyeds point of view we hope he can continue that consistency.

He has been brought to the club with a view that he will influence the younger players with his good training and playing habits.

Keith Brennan

Keith is a product of Amateur Rugby League in the Oldham area, playing for both Higginshaw and Shaw Rhinos before signing for his home town club.

Scrum Half is his preferred position but he has filled in in many places, most notably as hooker whilst deputising for John Hough. He had a brief spell out of the game in 2003 but the lure of matchday was too much to resist, and the Roughyeds were more than happy to have him back in the fold.

Dane Morgan

Dane Morgan is a leviathan of a man, standing at 6'5" and weighing around 17 and a half stone, the 24 year old second row or prop forward has a brilliant pedigree. He has played for North Sydney and was a try scoring member of the World Club Championship winners Melbourne Storm who beat St Helens for the title.

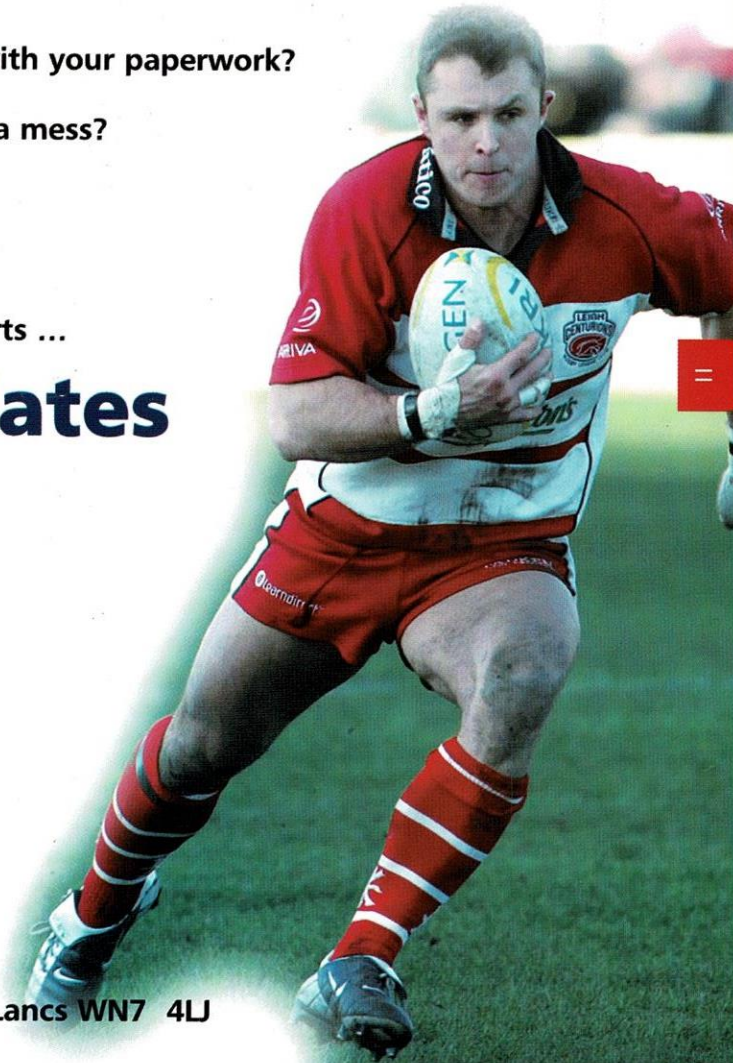

THE absurdity of Super League's contrived fixture format is set to come sharply into focus as the regular season builds to an exciting climax.

The controversial set of additional matches tagged on to the end of the 22 home and away fixtures could have far-reaching consequences this year at both ends of the Super League table.

London Broncos, three points ahead of bottom club Castleford, may appear safe from relegation but seven of their 10 remaining fixtures are against the big four of Leeds, St Helens, Wigan and Bradford. Conversely, the Tigers meet only three of the big four during a run-in that offers them real hope of avoiding the drop. The Broncos are paying the price for their own success. Their remarkable achievement in securing a fifth-place finish in 2003 landed them with a tougher fixture list this time. It is a farcical system that hampers the efforts of a club seeking to make the big breakthrough while at the same time rewarding failure. Warrington, who also made the play-offs for the first time last September, are similarly being punished while Hull, like Castleford, have been handed an easier run-in due to their failure to make the top six. Huddersfield, Wakefield and Warrington are the clubs vying for the last play-off spot, which is seen as something of a poisoned chalice. The kudos gained from claiming a top-six place, and with it a tough away tie in the first round of the play-offs, is offset by a cruel handicap next time around. Even Hull director of rugby Shaun McKee, one of the chief beneficiaries of the ludicrous system, accepts that it is time to think again and he is in good company.

Super League coaches are virtually unanimous in condemning the artificial nature of the fixture format but they are in direct conflict

with their own administrators who insist clubs cannot survive on 11 home League "gates". There are, however, a host of alternatives, the most obvious of which would be to increase the number of teams who then simply play each other home and away. The arrival of Perpignan in 2006 would take the number to 13 and Widnes have proposed admitting another new club to make it 14 and produce 26 fixtures in the regular season, just two fewer than at present. But that would result in a reduced distribution of television funding and, with that in mind, club representatives have already voted to stick with 12 clubs.

There are, however, other ways of generating additional income through the turnstiles while operating a 22-match League programme. St Helens coach Ian Millward has proposed an expanded World Club Challenge to kick off the new season. His idea is to involve the four top teams from both Super League and Australia's National Rugby League. Apart from the difficulty in selling the idea to the Aussies, the tournament would completely ignore two thirds of the Super League clubs and, in all probability, increase the gap between the haves and have-nots. A more practical idea is to bring back the old county cups which at one time enjoyed huge popularity and, if taken seriously by Super League clubs, could provide a mouth-watering curtain-raiser to the season. The competition could be organised on a round-robin basis to ensure clubs have more than one match and would take the place of the comparatively meaningless friendlies arranged for that time of year.

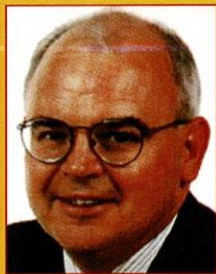
Apart from providing useful match practice before the start of Super League, the Yorkshire and Lancashire Cups would give National League clubs the rare opportunity to mix it with the big boys. And they would both generate revenue and fill the void created by moving the Challenge Cup to later in the year.

WHAT can I say about our performance in the Arriva Trains Final against Hull KR last weekend except that it was everything we'd planned and worked for.

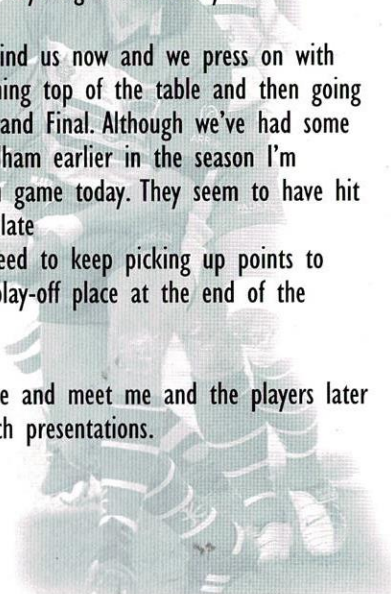

Leigh Centurions 2004 National League Talk

with Gareth Walker of Rugby Leaguer & League Express



Rugby League needs NL3's national profile
MARTYN SADLER, the editor of 'Rugby Leaguer & League Express', reflects on the success of one of Rugby League's newest competitions.

Coventry Bears, South London Storm, St Albans Centurions and Birmingham Bulldogs are probably not names you would have heard of at the turn of the Millennium just four years ago.

Since the creation of National League 3, however, these names are just four out of 14 that appear in the league table for that competition. Other clubs, if you hadn't noticed, include Manchester Knights, Gateshead Storm, Hemel Hempstead and Essex Eels, as well as Bramley Buffaloes and Carlisle Centurions - the re-birth of two Rugby League clubs that went out of business at the end of the 1999 and 1997 seasons respectively. There are also several amateur clubs from the game's heartland, including Woolston from Warrington, Dudley Hill from Bradford, Underbank from Huddersfield, and Hillsborough from Sheffield.

Of all the leading Rugby League competitions in this country, National League 3 has the greatest claim to having a national profile, with eight clubs in the north of England, and six in the rest of the country, including two in the west midlands and four in the south-east.

National League 3 was created with ten clubs in 2003, and that number rose to 14 this year. But the real question is whether we are going to see the most successful clubs in that competition gradually rising up the Rugby League

hierarchy, into National League 2 and beyond; perhaps, in the long term, into Super League.

If any club is to start on that journey, and change from being an amateur to a part-time club in the first instance, they will have to satisfy the Rugby Football League that they are well organised, with adequate financial backing, and that they have something genuine to offer the higher competition.

The club that seems more likely than any of the others to be able to do this is Coventry, who will be playing in a brand new stadium next season that is currently being built for the Coventry rugby union club. The Coventry union club is anxious to gain promotion into the Zurich Premiership, and it is equally ambitious for its Rugby League club to make it to Super League one day.

The fact is that Super League needs a club like Coventry in the Midlands if we are to convincingly present our leading competition as a national league.

The difference between the Zurich Premiership and the Tetley's Super League is about £5 million, if you compare the amounts that the two sponsors pay for the privilege of adding their names to the competition. Zurich pay around £6 million, while Tetley's pay around £700,000, because the union competition involves teams from most parts of the country.

We may think that Rugby League competitions are better than union ones. But until all our major competitions have the geographical spreads like the union ones, we won't get the sort of money that union does.

A full report of today's game will appear in Monday's edition of 'Rugby Leaguer & League Express'.

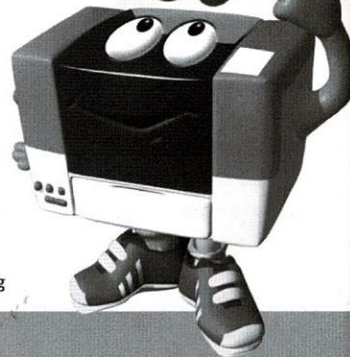

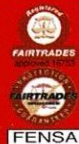
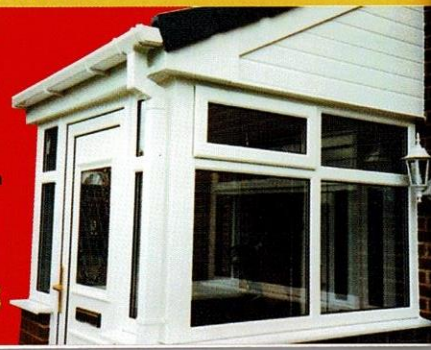
