Oldham

Welcome to our visitors from Oldham for what promises to be a competitive and close contest as we have come expect between our two clubs in recent seasons.

The Roughyeds have a long and proud tradition dating back to the 1895 and beyond, they have at various eras been THE dominant force in the game. Their last great team was in the late 1950s when players such as Bernard Ganley, Derek Turner and Alan Davies drew big crowds and won all the honours the game had to offer though surprisingly not the challenge cup. Oldham being one of the few clubs never to have played at Wmebley all their Challenge cup Triumphs coming in the pre Wembley era.

Founder members of the Super league as Oldham Bears, the pressure of trying to maintain that status, as with other clubs, proved too great and after finishing botto of Super league in 1997 the club folded only to be reformed as Oldham RLFC 1997, under the leadership of current chairman Chris Hamilton.

Since then the club has made steady progress though the sale of the Watersheddings ground to cover the old clubs debts has been a major stumbling block to the club . Since its reformation the club has had no fewer than 4 different home grounds, while their current ground sharing arrangement with Oldham Athletic has and continues to be fraught with problems . Nontheless in 1991 the Roughyeds came ever so close to regaining their Super League place losing narrowly to Widnes Vikings in arguably one of the best ever APC grand finals.

The departure of Coach Mick Ford shortly after that final has heralded what can only be described as a frustrating period . Current coach Steve Malloy has strove to manfully to keep the club among the front runners in NL 1, playoff contenders for the last few seasons but not really threatening to make the big time . A big winter recruitment campaign raised hopes that this might just be there season , early season form was inconsistent but a win over Haven in June has started a run which sees then third in LHF NL 1 and looking at the play offs with confidence

Players to watch Will Cowell

Cowell has played 18 times in Super League for Warrington Wolves, mostly as a substitute.

The 23-year-old Cumbrian, a product of that prolific provider of rugby league players, Kells. He left Wilderspool permanently to join Oldham originally on a one-year contract which he has extended for another yearon two occasions.

He plays full-back, wing or centre, Although he preffers full-back he has shown great form in the early part of 2004 as a winger.

Gareth Barber A local born player, who started his professional career with Super League club Warrington Wolves before Oldham brought him back to his hometown. Primarily a stand off Gareth can fill most positions in the back line. He has been used effectively as an impact player coming off the bench to exploit tiring defences. Barber represented the National League under 21 side that defeated ther Super League counterparts in 2001

Simon Svabic Began his career with the former Oldham Bears club Academy side, where is half back partner was Bradford's Paul Deacon. Since those days he has played Super League with Salford and also at the top in the National League with Leigh Centurions. He signed for the Roughyeds to begin the 2003 campaign. His preffered pointion is stand off, where he can demonstrate his silky smooth ball skills, but he is also at home in the full back position

Jon Roper Recently signed, in a swap deal involving James Bunyan going to Halifax.

Jon has vast experience in the game. His preferred position is Centre but can also play in various roles.

He has the accolade as the Oldham player with the most

Super League appearances under his belt, most achieved whilst serving Warrington Wolves. He is a Cumbrian with a robust style of play and will cause most defences trouble with his strong running, and should produce a lot of chances for his winger with his ability with the ball. Jon has already shown he is an astute goal kicker if required to take on these duties.

lan Watson Has been a Welsh international since 1996 and is regarded to be a clever half back with a good kicking game, attributes with which he has tormented Oldham in the past. An experienced scrum half who has served Salford, Swinton, Widnes and Rochdale since his amatuer days with Eccles. An integral piece in the Oldham jigsaw, he provides the direction around the field that the team needs.

Paul Southern A Prop who has been signed on a twelve month contract. He has renewed acquaintances with lain Marsh, Simon Svabic and Ian Watson who he has played with in his spells at Salford and Rochdale. Paul showed great consistency playing for Hornets last season and this earned him a place in the fictitious NL1 form team of the year. From the Roughyeds point of view we hope he can continue that consistency.

He has been brought to the club with a view that he will influence the younger players with his good training and playing habits.

John Hough The first player to sign for his home town club when the new Roughyeds were formed by Chris Hamilton and his fellow directors in the autumn of 1997. He has just signed a new contract to take him to the end of the 2004 season. On his day one of the best hookers in the NFP a danger to any defence form acting half back.

Dane Morgan Standing at 6'5" and weighing around 17 and a half stone, the 24 year old second row or prop forward has a brilliant pedigree. He has played for North Sydney and was a try scoring member of the World Club Championship winners Melbourne Storm who beat St Helens for the title. Dane has come to Britain with an ambition to play in Super League, hopefully he can achieve this ambition with the Roughyeds. Already in games this season he has shown he is not a forward you can take liberty's with.

Phil Farrell One of the youngest captains in the league he will not be phased by the responsibility.
Phil starting his fourth season at Oldham has just been appointed as

Lee Marsh Signed from Salford City Reds, 21 year old Lee Marsh is wise beyond his years on a Rugby field. He came to Oldham with a utility tag and has indeed servered the club at second row, centre and would not be at a loss at centre. But the early season absense of Phil Farrell allowed him to make a claim for the loose forward iersey and it is this position he has stamped his authority on, with his astute ball play and forcfull runs and rugged tackling. Lee is also available as a goalkicker if needed

Steve McCormack quite rightly considers the league will look after itself but following Leigh's unexpected defeat at Halifax last weekend, Haven have moved two points clear in the race for the coveted 1st place in NL1 and the all important home game in the end of season play-offs.

In our last home game played on 15th August we completed the double over Martin Hall's Hull KR, running out convincing winners by 38-8. By the 10th minute, Haven had established an early lead courtesy of two tries from Howard Hill and Craig Walsh, one of which was converted by Mick Nanyn. The game then went through a bit of a stale period as Rovers, who had captain and influential prop Jamie Bovill missing through injury, managed to keep Haven's potent attacking force at bay. Any attacks that Rovers did muster almost inevitably ended with a handling error that must have left coach Hall tearing his hair out, and it was through another unforced error that Haven claimed their third try of the afternoon. During a rare forage into the Haven 22 metre zone, loose forward Damian Ball knocked-on a Frank Watene offload which was seized on by Sam Obst. With the Rovers defence caught napping, Sam raced away to score an almost identical try to the one against Doncaster in round 12 of the competition. The Robins finally got themselves on the scoreboard late in the first half as Haven failed to deal with a Paul Mansson kick under pressure from Andy Smith. Mansson and Smith then combined to send Paul Parker in at the corner of the Kells End.

A 16-4 interval lead seemed scant reward for Haven's territorial dominance but things moved up a gear in the second-half. After an early Rovers flourish in which scrum-half Phil Hasty went half the length of the field only to be stopped in his tracks by an excellent Craig Walsh cover tackle, Haven took a stranglehold on the game. A Mick Nanyn penalty, after Rovers were penalised for offside, extended the lead to 18-6 before Craig Calvert scored one of the finest individual tries ever seen on the Recreation Ground. Fielding the ball outside the in-goal area Craig's momentum then took him back over the line where he turned to avoided the advancing

Rovers defence. Most supporters, and indeed Steve McCormack, would probably have been pleased just to see him clear his defensive line. However, after seeing a chink of daylight the official second fastest man in British RL set off on an amazing 100 metre solo run that had the Recre crowd on their feet and left the Rovers defence in taffers.

Further tries by Spencer Miller, Craig Walsh and Ryan Tandy, two of which were converted by Mick Nanyn, completed the Haven scoring with winger Nick Pinkney adding a 72nd minute consolation try for the Robins. Other

games in round 12 of NL1 resulted in wins for today's visitors Oldham over Batley, Featherstone, Leigh and Rochdale

Last weekend we travelled to Batley for the third time this season and came away with our fourth win against the Bulldogs this season. Batley started the season in inspired form but, despite being contenders for a top 4 finish at one time have fell away badly in recent weeks and are now in danger of finishing in the

bottom two places in the league for the second consecutive season.

The game was effectively over after the first thirteen minutes by which time Haven had amassed a formidable 22-0 lead. Mick Nanyn, who looks to be on course to break most of Haven's scoring records this season, blazed in for a hat-trick to go along side a 6th minute try from Craig Walsh. Further firsthalf tries from Craig Calvert and Spencer Miller, along with six Nanyn goals, gave Haven a remarkable 36-0 half-time lead. Whether it was playing up the notorious Mount Pleasant slope in the second-half that had an effect or just simply easing off the gas, Haven failed to make the same impact and were restricted to two further tries from Mick Nanyn and Craig Walsh. With Mick kicking a further two goals he took his points tally for the match to 32 points, which broke the previous points in a game record of 30 points for the club, set by Lee Anderson in 1995. Four second half-tries for the Bulldogs may have seemed scant consolation to coach Gary Thornton, who signalled out substitute Craig Wright as one of the few who produced the goods on the day. Steve McCormack as usual felt that there was still room for improvement and was disappointed at the 22 second half points that we conceded.

The result of last weekend was undoubtedly Halifax's 58-30 defeat of Leigh at the Shay. In a result that has put Haven two points clear at the top of the league, Leigh were reportedly awful and the four tries they scored in the last ten minutes flattered the score-line. Veteran playmaker Tommy Martyn left the game with a suspected broken arm, which may now bring a premature end to his playing career. One other result of note from round 15 was form club Rochdale's 52-18 victory over Doncaster. In a few weeks the Hornets have gone from relegation contenders to top six hopefuls and I for one wouldn't be surprised if they make a significant impact on the

play-offs.



Ryan Tandy (Haven) & Steve Malloy (Oldham)

HEAD TO HEAD

This weekend we focus on the front-row as Haven's new Australian import Ryan Tandy goes 'Head to Head' with Oldham's vastly experienced player coach Steve Molloy.

22-yr-old Ryan was born on Australia's Central Coast and started playing rugby league for the local junior team Kincumber Colts at the age of 5. He continued to play through the age groups with Kincumber before signing for the North Sydney Bears as a 16-yr-old. Other players of note in the same age group were Australian and State of Origin players Mark Gasnier and Jamie Lyon.


Ryan represented the Junior Kangaroo's against the Junior Kiwi's, and also played for New South Wales U19 team that played Queensland in 2000. After the demise of North Sydney he joined St George Illawarra Dragons for the 2002 season where he played 12 times in the NRL, which is recognised as the toughest league in the world. With Australian test players Jason Ryles and Luke Bailey occupying the prop positions, 1st grade opportunities at St George were limited and Ryan left to join South Sydney mid way through the 2003 season, where he played 6 first grade games for the Rabbitohs.


Ryan wasn't enjoying his rugby with South's and was keen to try his luck in Super League and at the start of this season he was attracting the interest of Wigan. With that move failing to materialise Ryan's agent in Australia, Sam Abe, suggested talking to Haven who are widely recognised as one of the strongest teams outside Super League. This led him to join us for the remainder of the season.

35-yr-old Steve was born in Manchester but moved to the Oldham area when he was a youngster. He started playing rugby league at the age of 9 for his school team Fitton Hill before joining the Oldham St Ann's amateur side as a teenager. At the age of 17 Steve captained the GB U19 side against France in 1986, and on his 18th birthday he signed professional forms for Warrington. He played a total of 50 games for the Wire between August 1998 and April 1990, which included a Lancashire Cup final win over his present club Oldham in October 1989. Despite playing in the semi-final of the Challenge cup the following year; Steve disappointingly failed to make the Warrington team that lost to Wigan in the 1990 Challenge Cup final at Wembley.

The following season Steve joined Leeds where he played over 60 games for the Loiners and where he gained his first GB cap in 1993. In 1996 he joined Featherstone Rovers where, as well as captaining England, he went on to tour the South Pacific with Great Britain. In 1998 he joined Sheffield Eagles where he once again missed out on a challenge cup appearance when the Eagles defeated Wigan, although this time he was cup-tied.

For the 2002 season Steve joined Batley where he made just eleven appearances before moving to his current club Oldham as a player. The 2003 season saw Oldham player-coach Mike Ford leave the club to take up a coaching position with the Irish national team. Shortly afterwards his successor John Harbin also left to take up a fitness coaching role with Oldham Athletic FC. Following Harbin's departure Steve was appointed player coach for the remainder of the 2003 season from where he guided the Roughyeds to a position just outside the playoffs.

NATIONAL LEAGUE TALK

LOAN RANGERS!

AS the LHF National League season reaches boiling point, a cluster of players on loan at various clubs have crucial roles to

With some squads in the Nationals Leagues seemingly stretched from day one, several clubs have sought to "borrow" players from elsewhere.

There are obvious positive and negatives to this scenario - but in many cases it's been a case of "needs must", and there are certainly a host of quality players on loan who can have a major say in the rest of the season.

Hull Kingston Rovers have moved for several loan players all season to cover a small squad. Leeds duo Jason Netherton and Dwayne Barker look set to remain at the club for the rest of the campaign as the Robins look to push up the table.

Rochdale Hornets are another side to have borrowed extensively from elsewhere. Three members of their three quarter line against Doncaster last weekend are on loan -Richard Varkulis from Warrington, and Leigh duo Dave Alstead and Mark McCully - with all of them having made a major contribution. But there is the possibility that the Centurions could call Alstead and McCully back before this weekend - which could impact on both clubs' campaigns.

Leigh have allowed a number of their large squad to go out on loan all year - another is Mick Coates at NL2 side Swinton, while Dale Cardoza has been to both Featherstone and York.

Fev themselves have Castleford youngster Dean Ripley on a temporary basis, while Halifax's flying winger Rikki Sheriffe is on a season-long loan from Super League side Huddersfield Giants. Batley Bulldogs have Bryn Powell from Salford and Halifax's David Bates, while their own Andy Rice is spending time at Sheffield. Chorley Lynx have Halifax's Danny Arnold.

And Barrow Raiders coach Peter Roe has been as prominent in the transfer market as anyone in recent weeks. He moved to quell an injury crisis at the club by bringing in Whitehaven duo Ryan Campbell and Tony Cunningham, as well as flying Leeds winger Matt Gardner, who had an immediate impact with two tries on his debut at Chorley.

We've seen a similar scenario in Super League - no less than seven of Leeds Rhinos' first team squad has been out on loan at some stage this year.

And no doubt there will have been a few more movements ahead of Friday's transfer deadline day.

Some observers will criticise loan signings and say they are not aiding the long-term future of a club.

But these players undoubtedly have massive roles to play between now and the end of the campaign - and could score the try or kick the goals that shape's your club's season.

While Whitehaven were going top of the LHF Healthplan National League One last Sunday I was in the Workington Town pressbox covering what by their standards was a wonderful 80-8 victory over Gateshead Thunder.

I nearly got thrown out, however, when I suggested that we play a different game at Whitehaven. Being used to watching Sam Obst's neat little kicks to the line for someone to run in and score, I was a little bemused when Town's eventual man of the match Tane Manihera tried to execute a kick through and nearly put a window

Seriously though, I wish Town all the best as they strive to either join us in National League One or replace us as we step up to Super

While many of their fans agree that they will need strengthening if they do go up, they mischieviously believe Whitehaven can give them them that strength.

There is much talk around jam-eaters land that if we do attain our goal and have go full time professional to maintain status, the question is posed as to whether present players in good jobs at the likes of Sellafield could afford to give them up to risk the insecurity of Super League, which may last only one season. What then?

There is a trend of thought that the truly part-timers among our ranks would seek a game 'down the road', giving the Derwent Park folk quite a useful side in what they hope would be the First Division. As I posed the last time I penned these notes, are we ready for the climb? Certainly not with the ground as it stands, although Chief Executive John Cox informs me plans are in hand to meet all the Super League criteria, including a close season quick built 550 seat stand at the Railway End.

If that did not materialise, my guess is that we could finish up ground sharing with Town, where facilities would not need as much up dating as at the Recreation Ground or even Barrow, who have a smarter set-up than both of us.

But I don't think our fans would relish a bus trip to Craven Park for each home game and judging by our enthusiasm and present gates, we would need quite a few buses and it would be a different story from the buses that did not run from Carlisle when Barrow merged with Raiders.

It all needs carefully thinking out. Our Chairman Barry says "we have got to go for it". Let us remember the age old proverb that 'only fools rush in. Let us go in sensibly, responsibly and at the right time. But that does not hide the fact that I, too, would love to be reporting on Super League at Whitehaven instead of the LHF Healthplan National League One.

When I put the idea of ground sharing at the 10,000 capacity Derwent Park to Town Chairman Dave Bowden, his immediate reply was that he although it could be a matter for consideration, he could not contemplate Whitehaven fans wanting to ground share with his club, such is the rivalry.

So as our Chief Executive puts our Super League application in the post, let us hope the Railway End stand can be put up in time and the controversy that the ground share suggestion would create is eliminated. But we have to win the Grand Final first!
