

Born 25th July 1954.

Signed professional forms for Wigan in November 1974 from Kelso RU

Had brief spell as coach for Wigan between April 1980 and May 1981.

Signed for Hull Kingston Rovers from Wigan on June 7 1981 for a then world record fee of £72.500.

Debut v Huddersfield in Yorkshire Cup Round 1 game at Craven Park on Friday August 14 1981 kicking eight goals from eight attempts.

Final match v York at Ryedale Stadium Friday April 13 1990

om the chairman's desk

A warm welcome to everyone this afternoon and in particular to our friends from Oldham where their recent financial difficulties have been much documented.

From our own experiences we have a good deal of sympathy for Chris Hamilton and his colleagues and wish them well in their quest for survival.

No matter what is happening away from the field I am sure that Gary Mercer's side will provide us with a stiff test this afternoon. The closeness of their result last week with Castleford confirms they are a side who are more than capable of holding their own at this level. We just need to make sure it is not us who provide them with their first league win of the season. To do that we need to build on our recent form.

There are a number of pleasing aspects to the start of our league campaign. Not least of which was the attendance at our first fixture here against Featherstone. It was up 30% on last year even taking account of the competing "attractions" of F.C. being at home and Hull City hot on the promotion trail. Without those distractions we can hopefully pick up a few more floating supporters as well as returning fans and push towards a 3000 gate today. I have said it previously but I think if we are to be realistic in our Super League ambitions that is a figure that should be attainable on a regular basis.

On the day it was a game of fluctuating fortunes. We went out to a 34 - 0 halftime lead with a 3 try contribution from Byron Ford but then took our eye off the ball and

allowed Featherstone to gain respectability. Looking at the league table had we maintained our form over 80 minutes I expect we would have been sat at the top albeit on points difference only. Any win at Doncaster is obviously satisfying and last week was no exception. It was great to see Jon Steel get the opportunity of showing his paces with an 80 yard try of high quality. It might well be in the fullness of time that Jon also provides the answer to our current goal kicking dilemma. Overall, I thought it was a strong performance where we had to withstand a spirited comeback from Doncaster at the start of the second half. At one stage we had to withstand something like 30 tackles on our line. In similar fashion to the game with UTC we were also restricted in the bench players that were fit to return to action. It was good to see a strong late finish obviously testament to the amount of fitness work that has gone into our early season preparation.

I think it is worthy to record at this stage that we have already recorded with wins at Doncaster and Halifax the same number of league victories away from home as we achieved during the entire 2004 season.

I would like to welcome to the club today our match day sponsors and partners namely Swiss Cottage, Smailes Goldie Accountants, Waverley TBS and Scottish Newcastle.

THERE is little chance of us taking today's visitors lightly or any other team for that matter. You never know what strength team you are going to be able to put out and so you have to concentrate 100 per cent on the job in hand.

Everyone in the game seems to be picking up injuries at the moment, not just us.

But we have Neil Harmon back on the injured list with neck and hamstring injuries. The neck is not too bad and we took him off more as a precaution and we will have to wait and see how the hamstring goes. Obviously he will miss this week and could well be rested for the week after. And there are one or two others who might benefit from a couple of week's rest.

Long-term there is Jason Netherton whose injury is proving to be something of a problem. At the moment we are waiting for a decision on whether he will have to have an operation or not.

Hopefully that will have been resolved by the time this appears.

And then we have Dale Holdstock with his shoulder problem. But the thing there is we do not want to rush him back. There is little point in bringing him back until he is 100 per cent fit and that could be another couple of weeks or so. Hopefully he will be fit for the match against Castleford.

At the moment we are having to put out a patched-up side every week, but the boys are digging in and getting the points. One thing which is pleasing is that I think we won two away league matches last season.

This season so far we have played three league games, two of them away and won all three.

I think there are three words to describe the last three performances and that is positive, positive and positive again.

Three games, three wins. And that is far better than being negative on every possible occasion. This negativity from certain areas makes life difficult and also very frustrating because the comments get through to the players and I have to motivate them to perform again. So far they have responded each time and responded well.

When you motivate a side and they are winning the last thing you expect is to find negativity around. If there's a negative element around when we have yet to be beaten in the league what will happen when we do lose a match?


Going back to last week's game I told the boys I wanted them to forget all the hype about what had gone on last season. I told them I wanted them to get out there, ambush Doncaster, and come away with the points - and that's what they did. I was not bothered about whether it was pretty or not - we just wanted to come away with the two points.


As I said earlier I am having to move players around due to injuries. In the Northern Rail Cup I was experimenting but now in the league it is something which is being forced on me. But we are still gathering momentum. The sides selected so far have not let anyone down.

One thing is for sure, we have not seen the full potential of this side yet.

It takes time for everyone to gel and bring out the best in each other.
Rovers still have some way to go before we reach that point but everyone wants to get there.




Ground Safety!

CONFIDENCE can be the key to many things in life and it is certainly the key to the present form of prop Makali Aizue.

Since joining Hull KR for the 2003 season the man from Goroka in Papua New Guinea has become a firm favourite with his powerhouse dashes and has been known to put in some big hits too. His play has steadily improved in the time he has been at Craven Park and he puts all this down to more confidence in his own ability.

"It was a very big step for me to make to come over here. Then I had to get to know a lot of new players all at once. But now I am used to most of them and when new faces are coming in I am one of those people they have to meet," said "Makka" before a morning training session at the JJB gym at Holderness Road, Hull.

 $^{\circ}$ I still need to talk more on the field. I know I don't do enough in that respect and that is something I am working on. But my general confidence is much higher than when I came to this country for the first time.

"But you can't do anything but improve when you have players like James Webster, Michael Smith and David Tangata-Toa around. And the rest of the side has loads of enthusiasm too. Then we are all working for each other and that is good," said Aizue.

One thing he does miss is his family and with an eight-hour time gap between here and home he keeps a close eye on the clock so he can manage a chat with his wife and family.

"I try and speak to my son either before he goes to school or when he gets home in an evening and I speak to them every day," added the Papua double rugby league and union international.

As far as Rovers are concerned Aizue feels, like many others, this could be the big season the Robins have been chasing for seasons.

"I know people have been saying that ever since I came to the club and probably a year or two before that. But the way we are playing and the way the guys all play for each other makes me think we can win promotion this year," he added.

Away from the playing field Makali is one of the club's development workers, and does one day a week in and around the local community usually on a Thursday with his pal Jamie Bovill.

"Jamie was one of the first people to show me round here when I arrived and since then he has become a good mate," added Makali

"And that is another reason why my confidence has grown.

But putting aside the fact he joined the club in 2003, "Makka" still has not got used to the British weather.

"I like walking but here it is cold for a lot of the time. But I walk a lot round East Park, and if the weather is good I walk most places locally," he said.

But there is another side to this easy going man from the other side of the world.

 $^{\circ}$ I can be lazy and if there is nothing for me to do I can stay in bed and take things easy. But I like really to be out and about doing things," he said.

From a club and coach point of view Makali felt the club was going well, with coach Harvey Howard doing a good job and the players all working for each other.

"Everybody is very happy at the moment. We have won all three league games we have played. OK they have not been perfect wins but we are going quite well and there is more to come." he added.

The most recent victory at Doncaster was very welcome he said because lots of people had been using that as some sort of benchmark to measure Rovers, performance by.

"Now, like most of the guys, I am looking forward to the Northern Rail Cup closing stages and also doing the best I can for Hull KR," he added.

And with all the top teams in the competition there is quite-enough going on to keep a 30-year-old on his toes says Seibs.


WHAT A JOURNEY-MAN!

AS we are entertaining our friends from Oldham today we will look back at a fixture played at their traditional Watersheddings home on Sunday October 7 1990. This was a league match in Division 1, which Rovers had just returned to by winning the second division title the previous season. Oldham went into the game unbeaten in their last 23 home matches.

The Robins had Wayne Parker as captain in the absence of Bryan Niebling and winger Steve Hadi was making his debut. Oldham took an early lead thanks to two goals by Duncan Platt and a try by winger Paul Lord to two goals by Graeme Hallas making it 8 points to 4 to the home side. However a Paul Lyman try made by Parker and converted by Hallas put the Robins in front by two points only for Tommy Martyn to level matters off with a penalty at 10 points each.

Rovers ex-Welsh Rugby Union star David Bishop, playing at fullback, was then sent off in the 35th minute for an alleged high tackle on Oldham forward Charlie McAllister. Shortly before the break, Oldham's Mike Ford took advantage of the extra man to cross for a try, which was goaled by Martyn to send Oldham in 16 points to 10 in front at halftime.

It did not take long before things were all square again as Dave Watson and Jimmy Irvine created space for Anthony Sullivan to score with Hallas again kicking the conversion. A Martyn one-pointer nudged the home side ahead before Paul Round crossed for an unconverted try putting Oldham 21 points to 16 in front.

Things looked bleak for the Robins however, Irvine put Paul Vannett over and with the Hallas goal, Rovers had regained the lead by a point. There were just five minutes left on the clock when acting skipper Wayne Parker scored a magnificent solo try from 75 yards out which with the inevitable Hallas conversion made it 28 points to 21 in Rovers' favour. Round scored a late consolation try for Oldham but it did not matter, as the Robins were victorious by 28 points to 25.





Profiles

GARY MERCER (head coach): One of the most consistently good and honest forwards of the past 20 years. Record proves his durability. 21 Tests for New Zealand ex-captain of Leeds former player-coach of Halifax. Won most of the honours available after spells with Bradford, Warrington (twice), Leeds (twice) and Halifax. Was No 2 and then head coach at Castleford last year and now coaching at National League level for the first time.

GARETH BARBER: Now one of the longer serving Oldham players, local lad Barber began his rugby league career at Warrington and joined the Roughveds in the early days of the Mike Ford era. Basically a stand-off, but also able to play at hooker in the 'new' game, Gareth has played more than 100 senior games for his home-town club. He holds the club record for the most points in a single match -26 from three tries and seven goals in a 47-12 defeat of Dewsbury at Hurst Cross in April.

RICKY BIBEY: Former Wigan and St Helens prop. Signed for Oldham just before the start of the 2005 season. He has also had a spell on loan at Leigh, for whom he played in a National League first division grand final. Aged 23, he has more than 50 Super League appearances behind him and he has the rare distinction of having won a Challenge Cup winners' medal for Wigan against St Helens and also for St Helens against Wigan.

JOHN HOUGH: A hooker, John is unique in Roughyeds folklore. He made local rugby league history in early December, 1997 when he signed for the newly-formed club as a free agent from Warrington Wolves to become the Roughyeds' first ever signing. Since then he has been a magnificent servant which was rewarded in November 2004 when he was offered and accepted a three-year

contract to take him up to retirement. He has played

in 194 senior games for the Roughyeds more than any other player.

TERE GLASSIE: The most experienced of Oldham's three new Cook Island internationals, 27-year-old Tere has played all over the park in his years in Australia. These days he will operate mainly at prop or second-row. Auckland-born, he has lived in Australia for most of his life and has played at various levels in various competitions in New South Wales. Recommended to Oldham by ex-Kiwi Test star Kevin Iro after he helped Cook Islands to a Pacific Cup victory over NZ Maoris in the final of the 2004 competition.

JON GODDARD: Walked off with all Oldham's major player-of-the-year titles in 2004 after a brilliant season. Was also named as one of the LHF Healthplan National League first division's top three full-backs. Played in 32 of Oldham's 33 games that season and was man of the match in many of them. A Castleford lad, he signed originally for his hometown club, but he joined Oldham three seasons ago and he has never looked back after being switched from centre to his favourite No

SIMON HAUGHTON: Formerly with Wigan Warriors and then Orrell RU Club, Simon won many medals and honours with the crack Wigan side, often playing second-row alongside Denis Betts and matching Betts in the try-scoring charts. Joined Oldham in mid-December, 2004 and was certainly

Mercer's highest-profile capture. He played mainly in the backs with Orrell, but Mercer plans to use him as Wigan did- as a widerunning second-row forward with a thirst

SIMON SVABIC: Stand-off Simon began his career with the old Oldham club, moved on to Salford and then Leigh and then came back to Oldham for the start of the 2003 campaign. Now in his third year with the club, he is a midfield tactician with good hands, a rugby brain and a kicking game

NICK JOHNSON: An old-style winger who loves to hug the touchline, Oldham-born Nick played in all 33 Oldham games in 2004 and scored 26 tries to set a club record for most tries in a season. Formerly with Bradford, last season was his first full campaign with the Roughyeds and he got off to a flier by scoring 15 tries in the first 13 games. I

CARLOS MATAORA: Another Cook Islands international. Like Tere Glassie and Dana Wilson, he played in the Pacific Cup campaign for the Cooks, who beat Tonga and Fiji on their way to the final in which they conquered the Maoris. Another Kevin Iro recommendation, this 21 year old can play hooker, loose-forward or half-back, a very versatile performer of whom exciting things are expected in2005.

DAMIAN MUNRO: Son of Geoff Munro, who made a name for himself with the old Oldham Bears club as a high-scoring and strong-running wing. Damian scored 32 tries for Leigh in 2003, mainly from the wing, and proved to be one of the most exciting finishers over distance outside Super League. He has come 'home' to Oldham to play essentially in the centre.

DANNY NANYN: A 19-year-old prop, pocket-battleship Danny has burst on to the Oldham scene this season and has impressed Mercer with his all-action performances in pre-season. He also won a man of the match award on the opening day of the season in the 22-20 win over Blackpool. Younger brother of Whitehaven points machine Mick Nanyn.



GAVIN DODD: Favourite position, full-back, but also able to play centre and wing. Played mainly wing in the last two seasons because of the outstanding form at No 1 of Jon Goddard, Strong runner, quick too and capable of scoring tries from deep inside his own half. Made his debut five years ago and has an excellent try-scoring record- 44 in 110 senior appearances

MARTY TURNER: A 23-year-old New Zealander, Marty is the club's overseas guota player for 2005. He will operate at scrum-half and will have the additional responsibilities of goalkicker. It will be his ich to take the team around the field. He has played most of his rugby in Australia and comes to Oldham on the recommendation of his fellow Kiwi and Widnes coach Frank Endacott. The tip was so strong that Mercer felt he had no alternative but to unload Aussie forward Dane Morgan to make way for his playmaker on the quota.

ALEX WILKINSON: Another former Royton Tiger, Alex signed for Bradford as a youngster and he has a fair bit of Super League experience under his belt, having played out on loan for London Broncos and Hull FC, for whom he later signed permanently. Full time rugby and physiotherapy studies at Huddersfield didn't mix so he got his release and signed for his home town club, where his father used to be the club doctor. Younger brother also played for the Roughyeds until injury put paid to his hopes of a career in the sport.

DANA WILSON: A 21-year -old prop from the southern hemisphere, Dana was born in Auckland of a Cook Islands mother and a Samoan father. He played for the Marist club in Auckland and then, last year, moved to Australia to play for a club in the Manly competition on the outskirts of Sydney. He made a big impression for the Cooks in the Pacific Cup and the Cooks manager, Kevin Iro, felt he was ready for the next stage of his development -a trip to the UK to try his hand with Oldham in

You enter the seated area through the ground admission turnstile and then transfer.

There is disabled area in front of the main stand.

Car Parking costs £3 and is situated around the perimeter of the training ground which is adjacent to the main ground. Bars open to All supporters are Tigers Bar (Under the main stand), the Marquee Bar (opposite Tigers Bar). There is also a small bar, from where drinks can be taken onto the terrace, in the Princes Street stand (facing the main stand). Food is available from various catering outlets around the ground.

Children: Tiger Town, just beyond the Marquee Bar, features children's rides. (Fee payable for rides).

Prices for ground: Prices for Seating: Adults £12 OAP/Students £6 Under 16 £3 if they do not have the RFL under 16 season ticket.

There is a car park on the private road into the ground, but it is not owned by Whitehaven and they have informed me that they think the owner charges 50p to park there. In good weather they arrange for tables outside and




