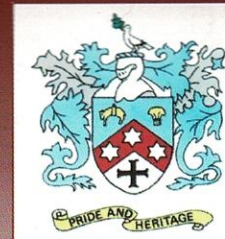

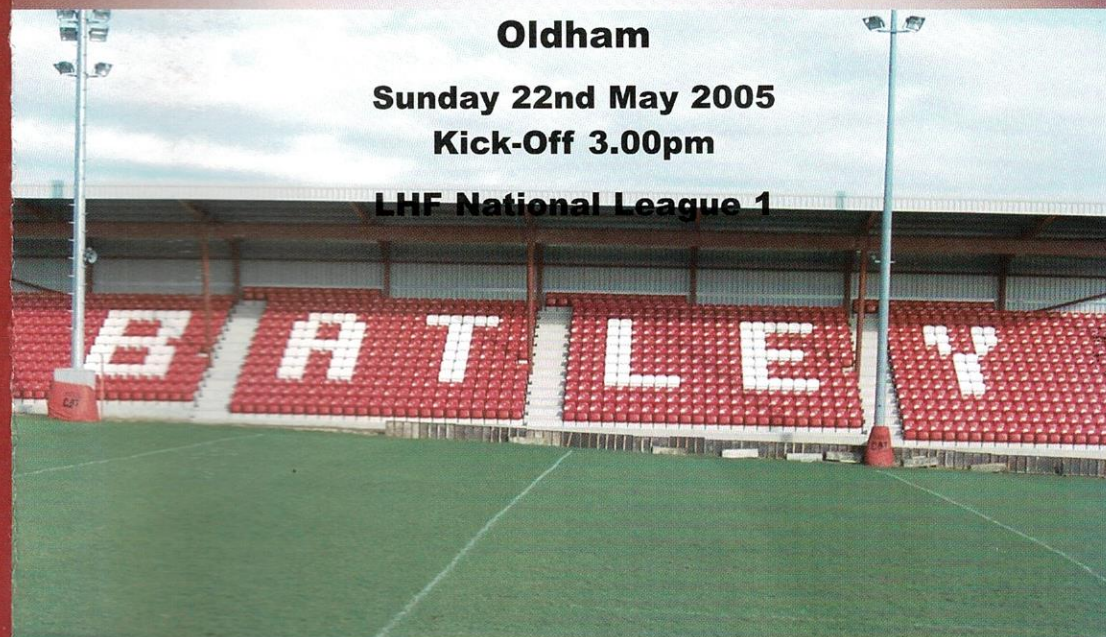

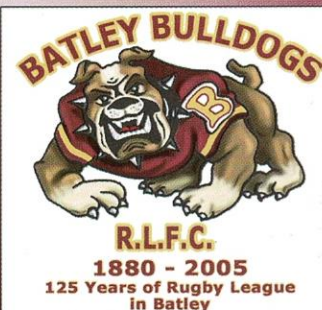

## IN THE CHAIR

Welcome today to our friends from Oldham. After we both lost last week we will be seeking desperately for a win today.

We're having a family fun day today thanks to members of the supporters club so let's hope the weather is fine and everyone enjoys themselves before, during and after the game.

Oldham's financial woes are well publicised whereas ours as yet are not so well known outside of Batley. We are looking to plug a black hole of at least £25,000 as best we can. Short term, we have no prospects of financial help from Kirklees but longer term there is a glimmer of hope. We are looking at all ways of raising money by improving income streams to the club but it's not easy.

The change in adult admission prices will be a small help but that mainly arose from our supporters meeting where it was suggested that instead of charging £2 for a seat transfer, we should charge £12 in and people can sit down, as this was similar to most other clubs. We have not gone the whole way as concessions and children prices have not increased but they can now sit in the stand at no extra cost and adults have only gone up £1 – an actual decrease in the seated price! Please now feel free to use our seated stands which give an excellent view.

We are in negotiations with the cricket club and bowling club for small rents which do not reflect what we put into the Mount Pleasant site to maintain it. Look at the new tarmac car park used by bowlers and all the cleaning and painting we do to



benefit everyone – bowlers, cricketers and us alike. We can no longer do it for 'free' and we are not being unreasonable. Hopefully we can resolve it amicably but it will be resolved one way or another with some benefit to us.

On the rugby front we went to Doncaster and scored 28 points but we lost. It was a good performance in many respects. We should have won but for our errors and a couple of wrong refereeing decisions, although, to be fair, they were made after consultation with the touch judges. There is no point in crucifying individuals - who I am sure are not happy with themselves - but we need to put it behind us and cut out these silly errors which amount to charitable gifts to the opposition. So let's get behind our team and all our players and let's see what we can do today.

After today, good luck to Oldham in their taxman difficulties. I am sure they will work out a solution for rugby league in Oldham and we will see them at their place in August.

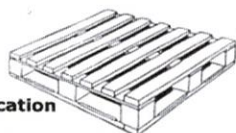

# THE MOUNT SCENE

The last home game against Featherstone Rovers proved to be a major disappointment - my day only got better when I found out that Dewsbury Rams had lost 74 - 12 at York City Knights and whilst it did not help our situation it amused me no end! What did not amuse me was our pathetic performance at Swinton Lions in the Northern Rail Cup Tie - No excuses will be offered by me for attempts of this nature.

Last Sunday at Doncaster proved to be unlucky as an under-strength Batley team fought back well in the second half only to lose out late on (a ground that has seen many Batley below par performances in recent years incidentally). At least pride and hope for the future was restored on this occasion.

Today's task is simple - nothing less than victory will suffice. Over to the boys to produce the required business.

**The stats position for 2005 Season currently stands as follows;**

**Goal Kicking** - Barry Eaton has landed 50 placed goals from 70 attempts. This equates to a 71% success rate.

**Try scoring** - The leading try scorer's for season 2005 so far are Craig Lingard with 7 followed by Adrian Flynn and Neil Roden with 6 each and then Shad Royston who has registered 5.

**Points scoring** - Barry Eaton has currently scored 113 points from 14 games played in season 2005 for an average of 8.07 points per game.

**Consecutive appearances** - Barry Eaton has currently appeared in 79 consecutive matches with Sean Richardson standing in second place on 16.

**Tries scored so far this season** - 56.

**Goals / Drop goals scored so far this season** - 51.

**Points scored so far this season (all games, currently 11 played)** - 325.

**Tries conceded so far this season** - 64.

**Goals / Drop goals conceded so far this season** - 54.

**Points conceded so far this season (all games)** - 366.

**Consecutive games scored in** - Barry Eaton has currently scored in 5 consecutive games.

**Penalty count** - So far this season stands at 127 to Batley and 120 to our combined opponents. The total at Doncaster was 2 - 3 in the Dragons favour.

**Attendances** - For home games this season totals 6,289. The average home crowd (All official games) is 898. (7 home games to date). The average home league crowd (2 games) is 768. Aggregate home gates total 1,535.

**Coaching Record** - The coaching duo of Gary Thornton and Paul Harrison have returned a 43% success rate with six victories from fourteen matches so far in Season 2005.

## OLDHAM PEN PICS

**GARETH BARBER:** Now one of the longer serving Oldham players, local lad Barber began his rugby league career at Warrington and joined the Roughyeds in the early days of the Mike Ford era. Basically a stand-off, but also able to play at hooker in the 'new' game, Gareth has played more than 100 senior games for his home-town club. He holds the club record for the most points in a single match — 26 from three tries and seven goals in a 47-12 defeat of Dewsbury at Hurst Cross in April, 2002.

**RICKY BIBBY:** Former Wigan and St Helens prop. Signed for Oldham just before the start of the 2005 season. He has also had a spell on loan at Leigh, for whom he played in a National League first division grand final. Aged 23, he has more than 50 Super League appearances behind him and he has the rare distinction of having won a Challenge Cup winners' medal for Wigan against St Helens and also for St Helens against Wigan.

**GAVIN DODD:** Favourite position, full-back, but also able to play centre and wing. Played mainly wing in the last two seasons because of the outstanding form at No 1 of Jon Goddard. Strong runner, quick too and capable of scoring tries from deep inside his own half. Made his debut five years ago and has an excellent try-scoring record — 44 in 110 senior appearances.

**TERE GLASSIE:** The most experienced of Oldham's three new Cook Island internationals. 27-year-old Tere has played all over the park in his years in Australia. These days he will operate mainly at prop or second-row. Auckland-born, he has lived in Australia for most of his life and has played at various levels in various competitions in New South Wales. Recommended to Oldham by ex-Kiwi Test star Kevin Iro after he helped Cook Islands to a Pacific Cup victory over NZ Maoris in the final of the 2004 competition.

**JON GODDARD:** Walked off with all Oldham's major player-of-the-year titles in 2004 after a brilliant season. Was also named as one of the LHF Healthplan National League first division's top three full-backs. Played in 32 of Oldham's 33 games that season and was man of the match in many of them. A Castleford lad, he signed originally for his hometown club, but he joined Oldham three seasons ago and he has never looked back after being switched from centre to his favourite No 1 job.

**SIMON HAUGHTON:** Formerly with Wigan Warriors and then Orrell RU Club, Simon won many medals and honours with the crack Wigan side, often playing second-row alongside Denis Betts and matching Betts in the try-scoring charts. Joined Oldham in mid-December, 2004 and was certainly Mercer's highest-profile capture. He played mainly in the backs with Orrell, but Mercer plans to use him as Wigan did — as a wide-running second-row forward with a thirst for tries.

**JOHN HOUGH:** A hooker, John is unique in Roughyeds folklore. He made local rugby league history in early December, 1997 when he signed for the newly-formed club as a free agent from Warrington Wolves to become the Roughyeds' first ever signing. Since then he has been a magnificent servant which was rewarded in November, 2004 when he was offered and accepted a three-year contract to take him up to retirement. He has played in 194 senior games for the Roughyeds — more than any other player.

**NICK JOHNSON:** An old-style winger who loves to hug the touchline. Oldham-born Nick played in all 33 Oldham games in 2004 and scored 26 tries to set a club record for most tries in a season. Formerly with Bradford, last season was his first full campaign with the Roughyeds and he got off to a flier by scoring 15 tries in the first 13 games. In a purple patch last March and April he scored ten tries in five games against Warrington (cup), Chorley, Rochdale twice and Swinton.

**CARLOS MATAORA:** Another Cook Islands international. Like Tere Glassie and Dana Wilson, he played in the Pacific Cup campaign for the Cooks, who beat Tonga and Fiji on their way to the final in which they conquered the Maoris. Another

Kevin Iro recommendation, this 21 year old can play hooker, loose-forward or half-back, a very versatile performer of whom exciting things are expected in 2005.

**DAMIAN MUNRO:** Son of Geoff Munro, who made a name for himself with the old Oldham Bears club as a high-scoring and strong-running wing. Damian scored 32 tries for Leigh in 2003, mainly from the wing, and proved to be one of the most exciting finishers over distance outside Super League. He has come 'home' to Oldham to play essentially in the centre and there are some who feel he could rival Johnson this year in the race to become the club's top try scorer.

**MARK ROBERTS:** Mark impressed at Oldham while on loan from Warrington at the end of the 2004 season. The management, and Mercer, had no hesitation in going for him again for 2005, this time on a more permanent basis. Like all the other senior players, with the exception of John Hough, he is on a one-year contract. Mark proved his value last year and he is expected to have a good season in the back row of the pack.

**ADAM SHARPLES:** Another young prop, Adam gave up a promising future in swimming to concentrate on rugby league. He toured Fiji, Auckland and Australia with NW Counties under-16s in 2001 and has come on in leaps and bounds since, already possessing more than ten senior outings. Dedicated, and a hard worker in the gym and the training field, he is currently battling back to fitness after suffering a recurrence of a knee injury in pre-season. A student of sports science at Alsagar College, Crewe.

**SIMON SVABIC:** Stand-off Simon began his career with the old Oldham club, moved on to Salford and then Leigh and then came back to Oldham for the start of the 2003 campaign. Now in his third year with the club, he is a midfield tactician with good hands, a rugby brain and a kicking game.

**MARTY TURNER:** A 23-year-old New Zealander, Marty is the club's overseas quota player for 2005. He will operate at scrum-half and will have the additional responsibilities of goalkicker. It will be his job to take the team around the field. He has played most of his rugby in Australia and comes to Oldham on the recommendation of his fellow Kiwi and Widnes coach Frank Endacott. The tip was so strong that Mercer felt he had no alternative but to unload Aussie forward Dane Morgan to make way for his playmaker on the quota.

**ALEX WILKINSON:** Another former Royton Tiger, Alex signed for Bradford as a youngster and he has a fair bit of Super League experience under his belt, having played out on loan for London Broncos and Hull FC, for whom he later signed permanently. Full time rugby and physiotherapy studies at Huddersfield didn't mix so he got his release and signed for his home town club, where his father used to be the club doctor. Younger brother also played for the Roughyeds until injury put paid to his hopes of a career in the sport.

**DANA WILSON:** A 21 year old prop from the southern hemisphere, Dana was born in Auckland of a Cook Islands mother and a Samoan father. He played for the Marist club in Auckland and then, last year, moved to Australia to play for a club in the Manly competition on the outskirts of Sydney. He made a big impression for the Cooks in the Pacific Cup and the Cooks manager, Kevin Iro, felt he was ready for the next stage of his development — a trip to the UK to try his hand with Oldham in the National League.

**ROB MILLS** 26 year old local amateur from Shaw Rhinos who impressed on wing in game against Oldham. Prolific try scorer in amateur game. Signed on trial.

**GARY MERCER** (head coach): One of the most consistently good and honest forwards of the past 20 years. Record proves his durability — 21 Tests for New Zealand, ex-captain of Leeds, former player-coach of Halifax. Won most of the honours available after spells with Bradford, Warrington (twice), Leeds (twice) and Halifax. Was No 2 and then head coach at Castleford last year and now coaching at National League level for the first time.

# From the Archives

**9th December 1990 – Regal Trophy Round 2 –  
Batley 20 Oldham 16 HT 4 – 10  
Att 2054**

On a snow bound pitch Batley produced the shock of the round in knocking out their First Division opponents from across the Pennines with a stunning hat-trick of tries by player-coach Keith Rayne.

Despite being behind at halftime 4 – 10 and playing up the slope in the second half the Gallant Youths stuck to their task despite giving a huge weight deficit against the massive Oldham pack and in the later stages tempers were fraught as Andy Williams and Charlie McAllister were sin binned and Oldham's Australian loose forward John Cogger was dismissed for fighting.

Time was running out as Batley planned one final assault on the Oldham line and Rayne forced his way over for the match clinching score. The final hooter led to wild celebrations in the Batley camp.

This win resulted in Batley travelling to Widnes in the Quarter Final and being featured on ITV's 'Scrumdown' programme.

## Rugby Talk

**T**HE disappointing attendances at the last two rounds of the Powergen Challenge Cup have certainly provided food for thought. I think it's fair to say that the Hull-Bradford game was the first 'blockbuster', certainly in pitting sides from the top echelons of Super League against each other, but despite the fact that it was a televised match, Hull would undoubtedly have been disappointed with a 10,000-ish crowd.

The following day, Salford vs London was always going to be a test of the BBC production team in their brave attempts to make it look like the massed burghers of Manchester were remotely interested in proceedings. If the people in the stands were indeed passionate about the matter – and they were – their heroes on the paddock didn't particularly emulate their mood; not on that occasion at least.

And it hasn't just been a one or two off. The Leeds Rhinos, who we'd begun to think could fill Headingley for a touch and pass session on a Wednesday afternoon, have struggled to drag fans into see their cup games. So what's the problem? Has the public turned off the idea of a midsummer Challenge Cup?

Timing's not the main concern to me – at least not in terms of the season.

It may be that a Saturday afternoon no longer appeals to families who have other things to do – in Hull FC's case at least, a certain Hull City AFC might have been an alternative draw at that time of day.

The TV factor might be a consideration too.

Despite the growth of Sky's popularity, a BBC terrestrial live broadcast will still multiply the viewing figures by as much as twenty-fold. And that, compounded by what I think is the bigger problem, is at the root of the woe.

Super League has been a marketing sensation in building its family audience, and has cleverly done it on the back of the season ticket. That's still a considerable outlay, but one which diehard fans can budget for.

Suddenly the same family can be asked to stump up the thick end of sixty-quid to watch a cup game, because their season ticket status means nothing. Lump the car parking, a programme, lottery ticket, hot dogs and a couple of drinks all round on top of that and a family of four can be waving bye-bye to the best part of a ton (pause for deep intake of breath).

Meanwhile with the way the sport is polarizing between the haves and have-nots, there's little dramatic anticipation in a Leeds-Pia, or St Helens-York fixture. Not a hundred sovereigns' worth anyway. Or at least not for everyone.

It's something the chief execs of the game might do well to ponder on for next year's Cup.
