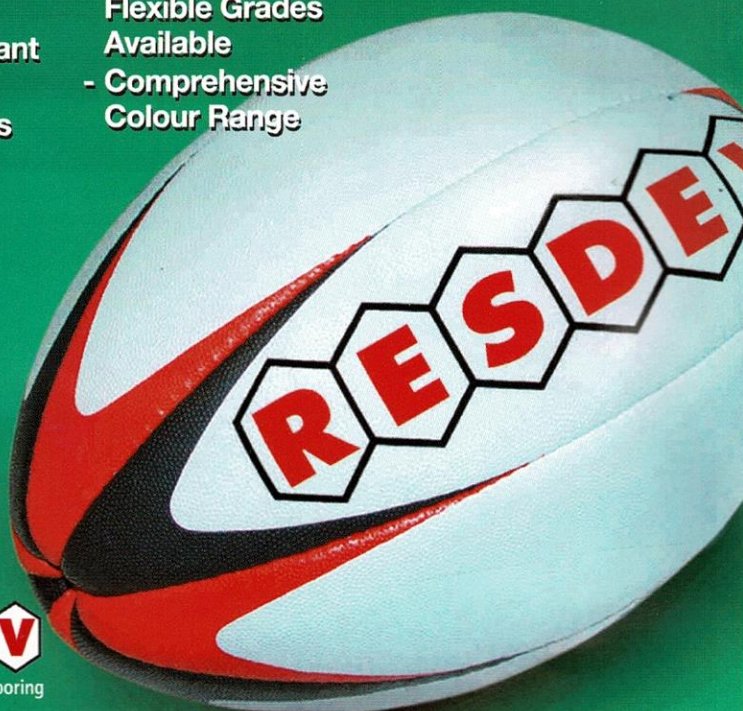

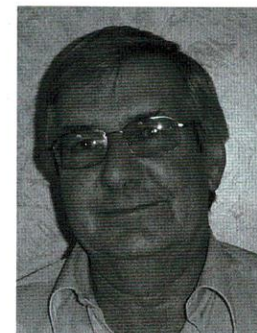

A big well done to all those who took part in last Sunday's sponsored walk from Doncaster to Castleford, their efforts have raised much needed finance for the club.

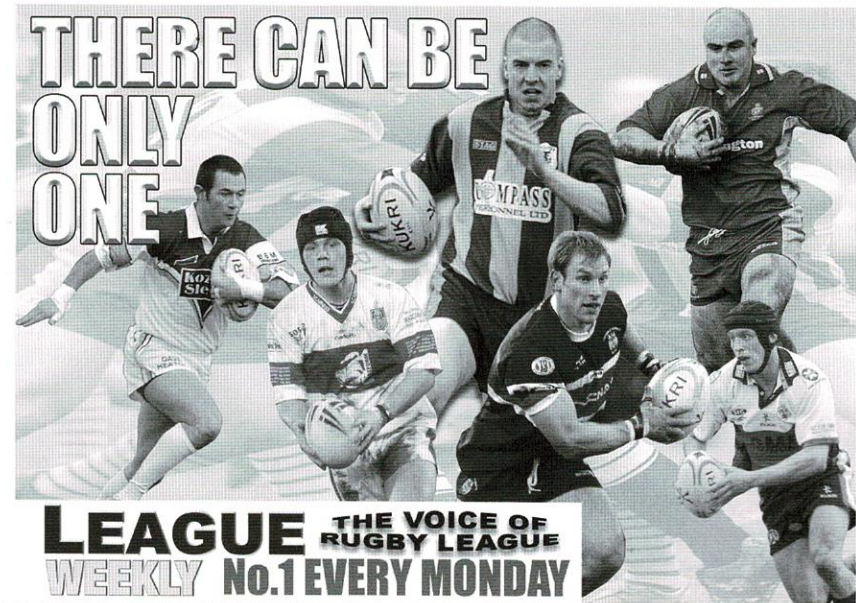

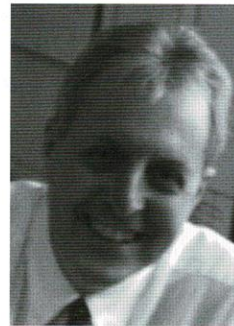

DONCASTER DRAGONS 4 CASTLEFORD TIGERS 78

(at Thornensians RUFC - 30/06/05)

Castleford Tigers were the visitors to Coulman Road (Thornensians RUFC) as the Dragons (Under 21s) Academy team looked to bounce back from a couple of heavy defeats against Leeds Rhinos and Huddersfield Giants. The visitors included former Don/Dragon Richard Hewitt as one of their over-age players and also included recent Dragons target Craig Poucher in a strong looking line-up.

The Tigers took an early lead when Dom Brambani scooted over after a scrum following a Dragons knock-on in their own '20', the scrum half also adding the extras. The next score came on the quarter hour mark when the Dragons were harshly penalised on the last tackle for an alleged ball steal, the visitors running the ball and ex Dragons Under 21 hooker Paul Brown touching down, Brambani again adding the conversion. Two minutes later and the Tigers extended their lead further with an unconverted Caldon Bravo try before the Dragons replied mid-way through the half, Kirk Netherton crashing over in the corner. The loose forward was then stretchered off only minutes later with a leg injury which looks set to keep him out of action for a month. Stuart Kain put the game beyond the Dragons reach with two similar tries in the run-up to half time, each time backing up good handling moves involving Richard Hewitt. Both conversions were added by Brambani and the visitors led 28-4 at the break.

Two Castleford tries from Bravo and Jason Mossop plus another Brambani conversion in the first seven minutes of the second period took the score to 38-4. Wayne Green and Dean Andrews were then withdrawn (almost certainly to be included in the squad for Sunday's first team fixture at the Jungle) before the Tigers let loose with 4 tries in a seven minute spell. Ryan Boyle crossed after an unselfish pass from stand off Danny Grice near the line, Michael Knowles and Tim Robinson added tries before Grice himself got over for a well deserved score. Brambani

added three of the goal kicks and the 60-point mark had been reached. The inexperienced Dragons team were finding it extremely tough going but Lee West, Jason Eagle and Mix-Alis Moulavassillis continued to fight hard for the cause up front. The gulf in experience was then highlighted further when ex Super League player Craig Poucher, who had otherwise had a quiet game, popped up for a try, Brambani again adding the extras. The scrum half then converted his own try after he was put in by Bravo and added the conversion to a late Boyle try to take his personal tally for the night to 30 points.

Doncaster Dragons are surviving purely because of loans made by Resdev Limited to the tune of about £200,000 each year.

Despite this considerable contribution, the Dragons still do not have enough funds to compete at the level of some of our opposition in National League One. Some supporters have shown a desire to contribute what they can afford, and the 'Owners Club' is a means of doing so.

OWNERS CLUB

The aim of the Owners Club is to create a mechanism by which any donations by supporters made to the Dragons can earn the supporters a share in the club - with the long term aim of returning the club into the ownership of the Doncaster public.

CURRENT DONATIONS

The club currently receives donation through the Breathing Fire Club, the Squadbuilder Fund and various other donations from individuals and supporter groups.

The Breathing Fire Club and Squadbuilder Fund will be closed down at the end of October 2005 and it is hoped that those supporters paying into these schemes will embrace the Owners Club and adjust their donations to suit.

LOAN ACCOUNTS

All donations will be treated as loans to Doncaster Dragons RLFC (2001) Ltd, with a loan account being created in the name of individuals or supporter groups. The donations will not be repayable but may be exchanged for shares in the club at a time in the future when the club has traded successfully for three consecutive years.

DONATION METHOD

Donations monthly by standing order, credit transfer, cheque or cash are preferred, although weekly donations are acceptable.

The concept was founded on a weekly payment of £10 (£45 per month), but payment at any level will obviously help the club.

A minimum payment of £180 per year (£15 per month) [£90 a year (£7.50 per month) for concessions] is required, reviewable in the future.

News and Views from the world of Rugby League

Must start this piece by congratulating all those who took part in the 'sponsored walk' to Castleford for last weekends fixture at the Jungle.

At the time of writing, it is not clear exactly how much has been raised and I understand that as well as the bucket collection last week and the sponsorships, there will be a further collection at todays game so please give generously as all proceeds are to be presented to the Club. As I said, a big 'well done' to the walking party who had to get up at the 'crack of dawn' on Sunday before completing a 20-mile trek from Tattersfield to The Jungle at Castleford. I spoke to a number of the people at the match who had done the walk and although their were one or two aches and pains they remained in good spirits and seemed quite rightly proud of what they had done for the Club.

The match itself, to this observer at least, was a curious affair with no less than 27 penalties in a match where far too often the 'whistle-blower' was the centre of attention. It made for something of a 'stop-start' afternoon where although the full-timers from Castleford were always likely to come out on top against an injury-ravaged Dragons side, there were only odd flashes of brilliance from the side destined for Super League. The players that did represent the Dragons gave a good account of themselves and as in the earlier match between the two sides at the Earth Stadium, the final score (40-16 to the Tigers) did not fully reflect the effort put in by them.

With Whitehaven and Hull KR also recording victories on Sunday, a gap has opened up

between the top three and the chasing group led by Halifax and the Dragons. For the record, Whitehaven hammered Cumbrian rivals Barrow Raiders 56-6 with Mick Nanyn scoring 28 of the home sides points and Hull KR edged a 68-point thriller at Craven Park, former Dragon Leroy Rivett amongst the try-scorers as the Robins won 38-30. In the other NL1 matches, a Bobbie Goulding inspired Rochdale Hornets won 40-24 at Batley and todays visitors Oldham continued their recent improvement with a 42-20 victory over Featherstone, a result which prompted Rovers Head Coach Gary Price to resign.

In Super League, Leeds and St Helens continue to lead the way and both were victorious again last week, the Rhinos accounting for local rivals Bradford Bulls 36-26 and Saints winning 38-26 at Wakefield. Keith Senior and Danny McGuire each scored twice in the Rhinos Headingley victory and Jon Wilkin also notched a double for the Saints against the Wildcats. At the other end of the table it is looking increasingly difficult for Leigh Centurions who are currently eight points adrift of a safety berth and were beaten at home by Wigan Warriors last weekend. That 30-22 win for Ian Millward's men gave them a welcome lift after they had suffered a couple of recent hammerings at the hands of Leeds and St Helens. The second relegation place now looks between Widnes Vikings (beaten 25-24 at home in the 'derby' match against Warrington Wolves), Wakefield Trinity Wildcats and Salford City Reds (who recorded a priceless win against the visiting Huddersfield Giants last Saturday). The Reds entertain Widnes this weekend in what looks a key relegation fixture.
