


# Captain's



# OLDHAM VISITORS

Gareth Barber is a local born player, who started his professional career with Super League club Warrington Wolves before Oldham brought him back to his hometown. Primarily a stand off Gareth can fill most positions in the back line. He has been used effectively as an impact player coming off the bench to exploit tiring defences. Barber represented the National League under 21 side that defeated their Super League counterparts in 2001.

**Ricky Bibey** was a surprise signing for 2005 from Super League giants St Helens. Rick has a rugged style of play with a ruthless streak, just what is required for making inroads into the tough defences of National League One. At the tender age of 23, young by prop forward terms, Ricky already has two Challenge Cup winners medals, with the remarkable record of beating St Helens when with his former club Wigan, and then doing the reverse beating Wigan when with St Helens. He has also had a loan spell with his hometown club Leigh Centurions.

**Martin Elswood** Local 20 year old second row or centre Martin Elswood signed from Super League club Huddersfield Giants.

Martin who was on the verge of a first team call up last season when Steve Molloy first looked at him with regard to strengthening his squad for the run in to the play offs, but sadly injury dashed his chances. At around 6'4" and 16st Martin has power as well as pace, he his eager to further his career and for this reason wants to get some first team rugby under his belt.

Martin was brought up on a strong rugby background at North Chadderton school and was also reared in the Royton Tigers youth set up. **Gavin Dodd** A product of the Royton Tigers youth set up, who later had a spell with Bradford Bulls academy team. Gavin is primarily a Full Back,

but has established himself as a winger in the past couple of season's. Fast on the break, and unpredictable at times, makes Dodd a scorer of spectacular tries.

Gavin represented Great Britain students in Australia and New Zealand four years ago, and was selected in the GB under 21 squad two seasons ago.

Tere Glassie was signed at the begging of the 2005 season along with his fellow Cook Island internationals, Carlos Mataoro and Jonáthon Wilson. Tere has had experience in the top grade in Australia as well as the Batercard Cup Comp in New Zealand, he arrived at Oldham from the Newtown Jets, the team that Oldham Hall of Fame player Martin Murphy had a spell with. He has played most of his Rugby in the second row being a very mobile forward, but his versatility also ables him to play in the front row.

**Jon Goddard** came to Oldham on loan in the 2002 season on the high recommendation of Graham Steadman, the then Castleford boss.Goddard was reared in Castleford youth and schools rugby before going to Wheldon Road to play for the Tigers academy side.

During his two seasons in their Alliance team he played three times in Super League, against Wakefield at home and against Bradford and London, both away, in 2001. Jon swept the board at the Oldham awards last season taking all but the Roughyeds Kids player of the year award. A very competent Full Back who was selected in the 2004 mythical NL1 team for that position, he is equally at home in a centre berth.

Andy Gorey is completing the second year of a two year contract in the 2005 season. A versatile back who has played most of his rugby in the academy at full back, but he is also a competent half back. He is enjoying the more demanding training rigours of the first team squad and is itching for his first senior run out.

**John Hough** The first player to sign for his home town club when the new Roughyeds were formed by Chris Hamilton and his fellow directors in the autumn of 1997. He has just signed a new contract to take him to the end of the 2007 season, which will allow him to complete 10 years with the club.

John is an hooker well renown now in National League circles, he originally joined the Roughyeds from Warrington Wolves. An astute worker from acting half back, he is also capable of filling in at Loose Forward.

Nick Johnson signed for Oldham towards the end of the 2003 season for

the run in to the play offs, on a loan deal from Bradford Bulls. Nick is the younger brother of Gavin. He spent most of the 2003 season on long term loan to London Broncos. Nick smashed the Oldham Roughyeds try scoring record last season, beating the record set by Mark Sibson. He has pace to burn, a safe set of hands and is a dynamic finisher. No-one would be surprised to see him extend his try scoring record even further in the 2005 season.

**Carlos Mataora** is one of three Cook Island internationals brought to Oldham for the 2005 season. He played in the victorious Cook Island team which thrashed the NZ Maoris in the final of the Pacific Rim Cup. Carlos is equally at home in the stand off role or in the front row at hooker. Known in the Cook Island team for his robust style of play he is also an astute goal kicker.

**Damian Munro** is a quality addition to the Roughyeds 2005 squad. At 28 years old he has had plenty of experience both in Super League and at the upper end of the National League. He was with two National League 1 Grand Final winners sides, in Widnes and Leigh. Born in Oldham he is the son of former Oldham favourite Geoff, who is the only Oldham player to score a hatrick of hatricks. Damian is no stranger to try scoring himself as he notched up 42 in 46 games for the Centurions during a two year spell. He is equally at home in the centre, on the wing or at full back.

Paul Norman Although not the bulkiest of front row forwards, Paul is a player who always makes the gain line and is no stranger to the top end of a tackle count. He started his pro career with the Oldham Bears, where he made 12 appearances before the demise of the club in 1997. Since then he provided sterling service to Leigh Centurion. Always willing to do the hard graft required by the front row of the pack. Paul's experience will be invaluable to the Roughyeds in the 2005 season. He has an incredible work rate both in attack and defence.

Adam Sharples is another of Oldham's academy team production line. A front row forward who made a couple of handfulls of appearances in the first team in 2004, he was not found wanting even when up against the so called more experienced men in the National League 1. A late comer to the game of Rugby, he has applied his studious mind to the technicalitys of the sport and his physique is not found lacking. Adam is also expected to add to his tally of first team run outs in 2005.

Marty Turner joined Oldham for the start of the 2005 season. He is a 23 year old scrum half signed from North Queensland Devils the Melbourne Storm feeder team in Australia. Indeed he had just broken into the Storm first team deputising for the impressive Matt Orford, when he and a team mate suffered injuries in a road traffic accident. Since his recovery Marty showed up well again for the Devils earning himself the tag of "Best Back" for the season. Being a New Zealander he has also had Bartercard Cup experience. He is the clubs overseas quota player for 2005. The Roughyeds hope he will be a star of National League one this year.

Alex Wilkinson Local born Alex, toured with the Great Britain schoolboys to Australia in 1999 and with the England Academy to New Zealand and Australia in 2001. He played his junior rugby with the Royton Tigers club and was snapped up by Super League giants, Bradford Bulls. Whilst at the Bulls he had a loan spell with London Broncos where he chalked up 6 Super League appearances, before going on loan to Huddersfield where he added another 13 SL games to his tally, he had a similar amount of games on loan at Hull FC where he impressed the Humberside high flyers enough for them to offer him a two year contract. Alex decided he wanted to complete his degree and when part time rugby was the only option he chose his own town club. Primarily a centre he has linked up previously with Oldham wing flyer Nick Johnson during his spell with the Bulls academy.

Jonathon 'Dana' Wilson 21 year old "Dana" is the third of Oldham's Cook Island internationals. He played alongside, team mates Carlos Mataora and Tere Glassie in the successful Cook Island team which won the Pacific Rim Cup, thrashing the New Zealand Maori's in the final, after also beating Tonga and Fiji on the way. He has played Rugby League since he was twelve and always in the front row, where he says he enjoys the physical confrontations. He is expected to provide the Roughyeds side with go forward in what should be a formidable pack in 2005.

You think the Aussie administrators won't allow that? Wake up and smell the roses, sunshine! The Aussies will allow anything at all that makes Britain look desperate - which of course we usually are where matters antipodean are concerned.

But back to the real world...

Don't get me wrong - I'm as intrigued as anyone to see Andrew Johns on his whistlestop tour of the M62. I wish every time I went on holiday in my playing days someone had dropped me the thick end of 10 grand a game in order to bring my boots and have a few run-outs. Because however you choose to dress up the drapes on The Joey Show, that is the bottom line.

The Warrington Wolves are to be applauded for their derring-do and eye for a media opportunity, above all else. It's tough to imagine any team with the capacity in their salary cap and the spare place on their overseas quota from resisting the temptation to field the best player on the planet for a few games.

But without blowing out the candles on the Wolves' cake before the party's even started, it does beg a few questions – like just how late in the season can you bring a bona fide superstar in on such an obvious-

ly temporary arrangement? Could Widnes buy seven or eight 'Lurpak' NRL players for six weeks, to effect a miraculous escape?

Like all rugby fans I'm excited at the prospect of seeing Andrew Johns in our domestic competition, and applaud Warrington for their vision. But it raises questions Red Hall have to answer. And I can't help but wonder ... would Tony Smith or Daniel Anderson accept a few weeks of the Great One's services? Somehow, I don't think so.



• The biggest news in RL circles this week is undoubtedly Warrington's capture of Andrew Johns. The 31-year-old Australian Test star has agreed to end his career with Newcastle Knights, but will also realise his dream of playing in England after securing a short-term deal with the Wolves.

Newcastle, who have secured the services of their inspirational captain until the end of the 2008 season, have agreed to release him to play up to six matches for Warrington from early September.

He will fly over to England once Newcastle's season is over and play the last two games of the regular Super League campaign, and up to four play-off ties, depending on how successful the Wolves are in their bid to reach the Grand Final.

Johns was snapped up by the Knights in 1989 but took five years before making his first-team appearance. When the breakthrough came, it came in some style, with Johns scoring 23 points - a record for a player making his first Premiership debut. He followed that up with an even more impressive international debut, albeit against South Africa, scoring a record 30 points. From there, his career took off. He played a key role at the 1995 World Cup, where Australia won the title and Johns the player of the tournament award. He was once again at the hub of things when Australia retained the title in 2000. Johns, who is certain to be included in the Australian squad for this year's Tri-Nations Series, has twice been voted the world's best player and amassed 1,950 points in 220 matches in the NRL Premiership. But his tally of international caps stands at just 18, chiefly a result of the injuries he has suffered in his playing career. His list of career threatening injuries includes a broken back in 2002, a neck injury in 2003, a nasty knee injury in 2004 and a broken jaw earlier this year. Johns will follow in the footsteps of another Australian half-back legend, Allan Langer, who made 47 appearances for Warrington from 2000-01.

 Darren Abram is the latest coaching casualty of the 2005 season. Leigh's 2004 promotion-winning coach parted company with the club by mutual consent after a season which has seen Leigh struggle at the foot of Super League. Abram took over at The Coliseum from Paul Terzis in October 2003 and ended the club's 10-year absence from the top flight by guiding them to promotion to Super League last year.

With very little time to prepare following last seasons Grand Final win over Haven, Super League has proved to be too tough for the Centurions', and they will be relegated if they loose to high flying Leeds this weekend. In the event of relegation Leigh announced recently that they would revert to a part-time playing staff for 2006, whilst Abram, who previously worked as a marketing consultant, had hoped to stay with the club in an attempt to win immediate promotion from NL1.

· London Broncos announcement that they had formed a partnership arrangement, (is that not just another way of saying takeover?) with Harlequins RU club for

2006 marks yet another chapter in the often turbulent history of the club. They will adopt the Harlequins' famous pastel colours and the jester logo when they rename themselves next year. Harlequins RL will become their fourth name and their switch to the renamed Twickenham Stoop will be their ninth semi-permanent ground in 25 years.

The Fulham club was formed in 1980 and played its games at the football club's Craven Cottage. Pictured, is a programme from that first season when a Haven team including Ray Dutton and Arnold Walker were the



visitors and the club were averaging crowds around the 6,000 mark. They moved on to Crystal Palace in 1984, beginning a tour of the capital that would take them to Chiswick Polytechnic, back to Crystal Palace, Barnet, The Valley (twice), The Stoop and then Griffin Park. Their history - which also includes a spell when they were known as London Crusaders - has largely been fraught, with the exception of a period in the mid-1990s when they were elevated to the top flight as part of Super League's expansionist ideal, when the competition was formed in 1996. They finished second in 1997, were taken over by Richard Branson's Virgin Group and reached the Challenge Cup final in 1999. Following Branson's departure in 2001 the club were forced to find new backers and earlier this season they reached an all-time low when, with £3million of debt, the Inland Revenue forced them into liquidation. They were wound up but controversially re-emerged as a new debt free company when the existing Super League clubs agreed by a narrow majority to continue their membership.

shine in a resurgent Wakefield team. Under former Trinity coach Sean McNally, la'al Sam was never a regular starter and had to be content with the occasional run off the bench. Trinity's third win on the trot virtually assures them of Super League survival for 2006 and, if they can keep the momentum going, a play-off place isn't beyond their reach. After being linked with the coach's job at Hull KR, former coach McNally will shortly return to Australia to pursue the next stage of his career.



with GARETH WALKER of RUGBY LEAGUER & LEAGUE EXPRESS



#### REWARDING TIMES

WITH the end of the campaign drawing close, it,s time to turn attentions to the end of season National League awards.

There are no shortage of contenders in both NL1 and NL2.

Who is in pole position for the NL1 Coach of the Year? Castleford boss Dave Woods must be a contender, despite the Tigers, recent lapses. Woods joined an almost entirely new squad, and has gelled them together to become the Minor Premiership favourites.

Whitehaven,s Steve McCormack - last year,s winner - has maintained the Cumbrians' challenge at the top, and mention must also be made of the likes of Doncaster,s St John Ellis, Anthony Farrell of Halifax, and Rochdale player coach Bobbie Goulding.

coach Bobbie Goulding.
Hull Kingston Rovers have achieved much this year, though the mid-season departure of Harvey Howard makes it difficult for them to put forward a coaching candidate. But Australian James Webster, a revelation in his spell as caretaker, must be among the favourites for the Player of the Year prize.

Others that could challenge for that award include Andy Raleigh (Hull KR), Andrew Henderson (Castleford), Michael Platt (Castleford), Gary Broadbent (Whitehaven) and Ben Fisher (Halifax) - though it genuinely is wide open at this stage.

Then there is the Young Player award. Halifax,s James Haley has been outstanding throughout the year, while Ben Cockayne has burst onto the professional scene at Doncaster. Whitehaven loose forward Carl Rudd has also had an impressive debut campaign, and watch out too for Craig Huby (Castleford), James Garmston (Hull KR) and Michael Shenton (Castleford).

Moving onto NL2, Mick Cook has had a fine start as coach of York City Knights, though he will face challenges from the likes of Andy Kelly (Dewsbury), Ged Stokes (Workington) and Paul Kidd (Swinton).

But in arguably the widest open of all the categories, there are two genuine outsiders. Dean Thomas has worked a minor miracle to turn around Gateshead,s fortunes, while Hunslet Hawks have been equally impressive under the guidance of Roy Sampson.

As for NL2 Player of the Year, there are candidates across the competition. Francis Maloney (Dewsbury), George Raynor (Hunslet), Wade Liddell (Gateshead), Ian Watson (Swinton), Wayne English (Swinton) and Jonny Limmer (Workington) are among a host of players that could figure.

York winger Peter Fox, on a season,s loan from Leeds, must be a leading contender for the Young Player prize, though again, expect several others to push to prominence. As always, the awards will be voted for by the men who know both competitions best - the coaches in National League One and Two. It will be fascinating to see who emerges as the eventual winners.
