



As 'outsiders' we were made very welcome and if Bramley are the template for a successful commmunity club, then the sooner we open up promotion from NL3, the better.



# Hornets 30 Featherstone 18 MINER IRRITATION

Hornets shake off niggling Rovers

The trouble with spoiling teams is that they drag you down to their level and then beat you with experience. Desperate for points, Featherstone came to do whatever was necessary to get something from this game - and, in the process, reduced this contest into a scrappy mess where cohesive football was at a premium.

Despite out-scoring Featherstone six tries to two, Hornets were repeatedly pegged back by a series of kickable penalties that kept David Hobbs' side in contention until the last minute.

Indeed, it was a penalty that gave Fev the lead after three minutes, but it was Hornets playing all the football in the opening exchanges.

Mark McCully's pass sent Dave Alstead away, but the Rovers defence scrambled back just in time; Chris Giles made the extra man in the line and he sent Andy Gorski on a run that was snuffed out by a good tackle rfrom Moss. But after 7 minutes, Hornets pressure - primarily up the right flank - told, and Richard Varkulis bounced through some flapping tackles to score. McCully added the extras.

Five minutes later, it was Lee Doran prising open Fev's left centre channel. With the ball worked into centre field, John Hill's dying pass to Jamie Durbin looked to be knocked on, but Mr Morris celebrated his 500th game in charge by claiming temporary blindness and Varkulis capitalised by running in for his second. The Rovers fans were incensed - and

Featherstone tried desperately to stem the flow - lying on and slowing down the play at every opportunity. But on repeating the idea, Hornets' Chris Giles was diapatched for ten minutes. Undeterred. Hornets. moved the ball around an, on 22 minutes, Chris Campbell ran a sublime angle onto a Radney Bowker pass and hit space in centre field: as he lined up the Rovers fullback, he launched a looping pass inside which found Alstead via a Rovers defender's hand and he steamed the ball in under the black dot

McCully converted and, at 16-2, Featherstone were way off the pace of the game.

On the half hour, Rovers launched their one meaningful attack of the half and, to their credit, it came good - Finn's handy pass in traffic putting Batty in at the corner. Finn added the touchline conversion and accepted a string of penalties to bring his side to within four points at the break.

Hornets began the second half with a bang: on the first possession, Radney Bowker's raking pass found Andy Gorski at pace and he found space to squeeze in at the corner.

Just on the hour, Featherstone hooker Evans was sin-binned for dissent and Hornets took the ball close to the Rovers line. Sam Butterworth took the ball from acting half and skipped across the line; his pass hit a Rovers defender en-route to Dave Alstead and, while

the defenders were busy appealing for a knock-on, he planted the ball for his second try.

New Fev coach David Hobbs made his view of the try known to Colin Morris - and he too was sent off from the dug-out; his side a scrambling, spoiling mess.

But for a team bereft of shape, Rovers hit back with a 90 metre individual try from winger Powell, who hit open field an won the foot-race to the other end. Finn added the two and - amazingly - Rovers were within a score with ten minutes to go.

Hornets lifted for one last push - and it paid off in the 78th minute when Mark McCully teased the Fev defence with a moment of sparkling ball work and sent Alstead away for his hat-trick. McCully converted and the job was done - albeit with some difficulty.

Bobbie Goulding was circumspect: "We were poor today, but we got a win and, at this stage of the season, we're happy with that."

But it was an ugly, scrappy affair against the least attractive footballing side we've seen at Spotland thus far. There's no doubt that David Hobbs will iron the wrinkles out of this Fev side, but it looks like a long job.

Hornets, on the other hand, can be reasonably pleased. With a team unbalanced by injuries to key forwards, it looked a lightweight 13 at times. And in the face of some uncompromising attention from the Fev front row, the pack stood up well.

The only real black-spot on the afternoon was the antics of the Featherstone supporters at the end - spitting at the officials in the tunnel is disgusting and bestial. Perhaps, a sabbatical in NL2 is just what they need.

#### Hornets 30 Featherstone 18 By Mike Floyd

HORNETS continued their Jekyll and Hyde season as they made hard work of beating National League One strugglers Featherstone Rovers, at Spotland on Sunday.

And, the Spotland outfit couldn't breathe easily until Dave Alstead completed his hat-trick, with a try in the last minute, to secure a 30-18 victory.

Hornets started like a train, but the visitors were first on the board with a Liam Finn penalty after two minutes. The home team hit back and Richard Varkulis broke through some weak tackling to touch down near the sticks, McCully converted. Varkulis then scored a second courtesy of Lee Doran's pass.

Alstead cashed in on excellent work by Radney Bowker and Chris Campbell to score his first and McCully was again on target and a cricket score looked likely.

But for no apparent reason the home team ran out of steam and the visitors took advantage. Nathan Batty crossed for a try, which Finn converted, before tagging on two penalties, to put his team four points behind at the break.

Hornets started the second half strongly and it took Alstead just four minutes to find a hole in the Rovers' defence and touch down. But they were unable to rest on their Laurels as Bryn Powell raced the length of the field to score the try of the match. Finn added the extras.

Hornets pressed in the error-ridden closing stages, but they had to wait for Alstead's late try, converted by McCully, before they could finally relax.

# THE OPPOSITION OLDHAM RLFC

**GARETH BARBER:** Now one of the longer serving Oldham players, local lad Barber began his rugby league career at Warrington and joined the Roughyeds in the early days of the Mike Ford era.

RICKY BIBEY: Former Wigan and St Helens prop. Signed for Oldham just before the start of the 2005 season. He has also had a spell on loan at Leigh, for whom he played in a National League first division grand final.

WILL COWELL: Somewhat unlucky with injuries, yet this popular Cumbrian -- a native of Whitehaven and reared in rugby league at Kells -- has still played 60 senior competitive games for the Roughyeds after joining the club from Warrington at the start of the 2002 season.

**GAVIN DODD:** Favourite position, full-back, but also able to play centre and wing. Played mainly wing in the last two seasons because of the outstanding form at No 1 of Jon Goddard.

MARTIN ELSWOOD: Another local lad, and yet another who came home via a Super League club. Only 20, he signed for Huddersfield Giants from Royton Tigers and is now starting his second season with the Oldham club that he and his family have supported all their lives.

**CRAIG FARRIMOND:** A Wiganer, he was snapped up by Warrington as a youngster and it was from the Warriors that he joined Oldham for the start of the 2004 season.

**TERE GLASSIE:** Auckland-born, he has lived in Australia for most of his life and has played at various levels in various competitions in New South Wales. Recommended to Oldham by ex-Kiwi Test star Kevin Iro after he helped Cook Islands to a Pacific Cup victory over NZ Maoris in the final of the 2004 competition.

JON GODDARD: Played in 32 of Oldham's 33 games that season and was man of the match in many of them. A Castleford lad, he signed originally for his hometown club, but he joined Oldham three seasons ago and he has never looked back after being switched from centre to his favourite No 1 job.

**ANDY GOREY:** A scrum-half who has also done well at full-back in under-21s rugby, he too has been unlucky with injuries.

SIMON HAUGHTON: Joined Oldham in mid-December, 2004 and was certainly Mercer's highest-profile capture. He played mainly in the backs with Orrell, but Mercer plans to use him as Wigan did --- as a wide-running second-row forward with a thirst for tries.

JOHN HOUGH: A hooker, John is unique in Roughyeds folklore. He made local rugby league history in early December, 1997 when he signed for the newly-formed club as a free agent from Warrington Wolves to become the Roughyeds' first ever signing.

ANDY ISHERWOOD: Andy signed for Wigan as a youngster before joining Leigh and then moving back to Super League with Widnes. He helped Leigh to qualify for Super League in 2004. He opted to stay part-time in 2005 so Leigh's loss was Oldham's gain. A rugged back-row forward.

NICK JOHNSON: An old-style winger who loves to hug the touchline, Oldham-born Nick played in all 33 Oldham games in 2004 and scored 26 tries to set a club record for most tries in a season.

JAMES KIRKLAND: Another 19 year old, James is a hooker who has worked his way up through Oldham's junior and senior academy teams of the past three years.

CARLOS MATAORA: Another Cook Islands international. Another Kevin Iro recommendation, this 21 year old can play hooker, loose-forward or half-back, a very versatile performer of whom exciting things are expected in 2005.

**DAMIAN MUNRO:** He has come home to Oldham to play essentially in the centre and there are some who feel he could rival Johnson this year in the race to become the club's top try scorer.

**DANNY NANYN:** Younger brother of Whitehaven points machine Mick Nanyn, he is expected this year to give Oldham's more experienced

and established props a good run for their money when front-row places are up for grabs.

PAUL NORMAN: Back in his younger days, Paul used to play for the former Oldham club, mainly in the 'A' team in those formative days of his rugby league career. When that club went into liquidation in 1997, he moved on to Leigh where he had several good seasons and became one of the most reliable front-row forwards in the National Leagues.

MARK ROBERTS: Mark impressed at Oldham while on loan from Warrington at the end of the 2004 season. The management, and Mercer, had no hesitation in going for him again for 2005.

ADAM SHARPLES: Another young prop, Adam gave up a promising future in swimming to concentrate on rugby league. He toured Fiji, Auckland and Australia with NW Counties under-16s in 2001 and has come on in leaps and bounds since, already possessing more than ten senior outings.

**SIMON SYABIC:** Now in his third year with the club, he is a midfield tactician with good hands, a rugby brain and a kicking game.

MARTY TURNER: A 23-year-old New Zealander, Marty is the club's overseas quota player for 2005. He will operate at scrum-half and will have the additional responsibilities of goalkicker. It will be his job to take the team around the field.

ALEX WILKINSON: Another former Royton Tiger, Alex signed for Bradford as a youngster and he has a fair bit of Super League experience under his belt, having played out on loan for London Broncos and Hull FC, for whom he later signed permanently.

**DANA WILSON:** He made a big impression for the Cooks in the Pacific Cup and the Cooks manager, Kevin Iro, felt he was ready for the next stage of his development — a trip to the UK to try his hand with Oldham in the National League.








### **Rugby Talk**

HAT'S that I hear at the back of the stand? If not quite a fat lady singing, it's certainly the croaking of a big lass with a touch of laryngitis. And she's warbling down the flue pipe that feeds straight into the Widnes changing room.

The niceties of statistical possibilities apart, if the Vikings lose this weekend's game at home to Wigan, entire choirs of roly-polys can break into relieved renditions of 'I Will Survive' upon the terraces of Salford, and to a lesser extent Wakefield. Five points behind with four to play, and Salford having Leigh on their schedule, would make the 'fait' pretty much 'accompli' for the genial Frank Endacott and Co.

I think it's fair to say that the engage Super League won't be quite the same without the grand old Widnes club - even if only for a season - and the biggest question for the board at the Halton Stadium will be whether or not to stay full time. As the seasons pass, and the gulf between the top flight and the rest inexorably widens, the best chance of a quick return depends greatly upon maintaining Super League attitudes and disciplines, if not quite budgets.

I recall writing that last year was a good one to be relegated. That might sound a bit Irish, but at least only one club would go down to take on the ambitious part-timers in the LHF National League. Next season will see two ex-Super League clubs scrapping it out with the tough NL boys. Bouncing back will be proportionately more difficult.

But those pesky little statistics don't lie, and Widnes, who finished 11th last year, have had a revolving door recruitment policy akin to Leigh's in the frantic scramble for survival. The grim reaper, however, is a tough hombre to shake off. The Halton Stadium, and a club of Widnes's stature and support, belong in Super League, but if a bright long term future is to be secured, there are lessons to be learned.

Everything ultimately feeds down from the boardroom and the management team. In recent seasons Salford and Huddersfield have put faith in relatively young, previously unproven coaches (and hasn't that boy Tony Smith done well?), but also to a large extent stuck with the hard core of players who brought them up, and built on them.

Leigh, after probably a three-day knees-up last October, basically threw their champions' contracts out of the window and sat down with a phone and a telephone book to try to put a squad together.

You can't imagine that that could work, so no surprise that it didn't. But it's a situation that Widnes may soon find themselves in – just going the other way. Once the painful death throes of Super League X have dimmed, and the fat lady has sung her song, it will be time for this grand club to start afresh. The men at the top have to start building from the ground up. Because as this season has shown us, there are no short cuts to success.



WITH GARETH WALKER OF RUGBY LEAGUER & LEAGUE EXPRESS

#### A GREAT BREEDING GROUND

IN the wake of recent Northern Rail Cup Final, there was plenty of talk about players, such as Hull Kingston Rovers' Andy Raleigh, who could make the step up to Super League.

One look at the teams in the top flight shows that it's a path that has been well trodden in recent years.

One of the outstanding performers in Super League over the past few weeks has been Wakefield's halfback or hooker Sam Obst, who made his name in this country at Whitehaven. Obst was the NL1 Player of the Year in 2004 after a sparkling campaign at the Recreation Ground.

The Wildcats also regularly field former Dewsbury and Hunslet winger Michael Wainwright, ex-Featherstone stand off Jamie Rooney, and Jason Demetriou, who started out with the now defunct Lancashire Lynx and then Rochdale.

Hull have been as successful as anyone in this field - just look at the impact that Richard Whiting (ex-Featherstone), Richie Barnett (Gateshead) and Danny Brough (York) are having on a weekly basis at the KC Stadium.

Similarly, St Helens' Ade Gardner, Jon Wilkin and Mick Higham were rising stars at Barrow, Hull KR and Leigh respectively before making the move to Super League, while Wigan's Danny Sculthorpe was a stand-out at Rochdale.

Huddersfield Giants spotted the potential of Sculthorpe's Hornets team-mate Paul Smith, and Salford of Hull KR's Chris Charles. Both are now Super League regulars.

Leigh Centurions obviously have a host of players who started off at the lower levels, with just one example being second rower Oliver Wilkes, who first caught the eye at Keighley Cougars.

London Broncos have shown a constant willingness to look at all levels of the sport for new signings, and ex-Whitehaven loose forward Rob Purdham has been one of a number of shrewd

So who will be the next to be cherry picked? As mentioned above, Raleigh is not short of admirers, though the Robins are understandably keen to hang onto him.

You can go almost every team in the National Leagues and spot players with the potential to become full-time professionals.

Don't be surprised to see a Super League coach at one of your team's matches in the future.






