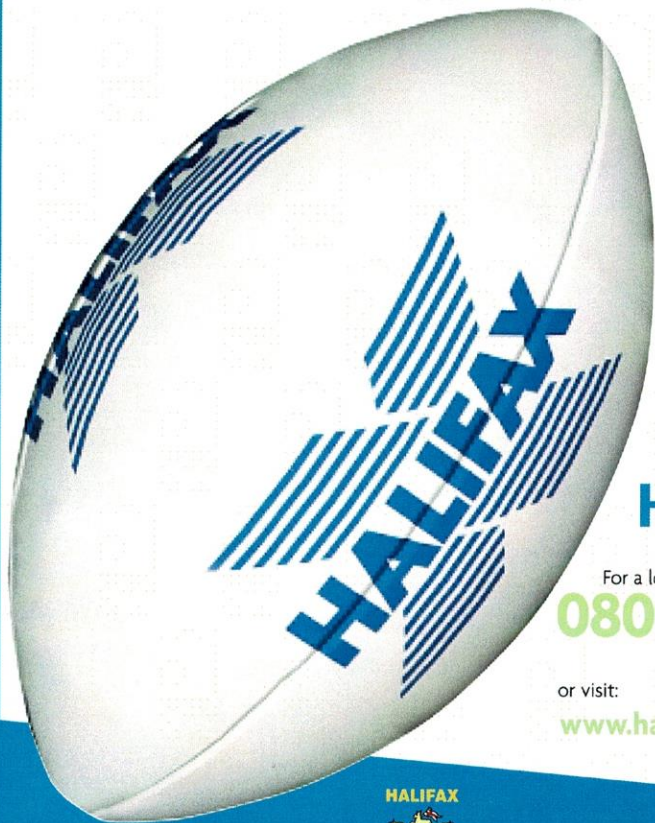

And at a time when current Super League sides will have finalised their contracts for the next season.

It wouldn't be easy as previous promoted teams have found out. Leigh last year are the example that any promoted side must avoid. If our game is to get stronger we need to support any club that's promoted in a similar fashion to the way that the new French side have been.

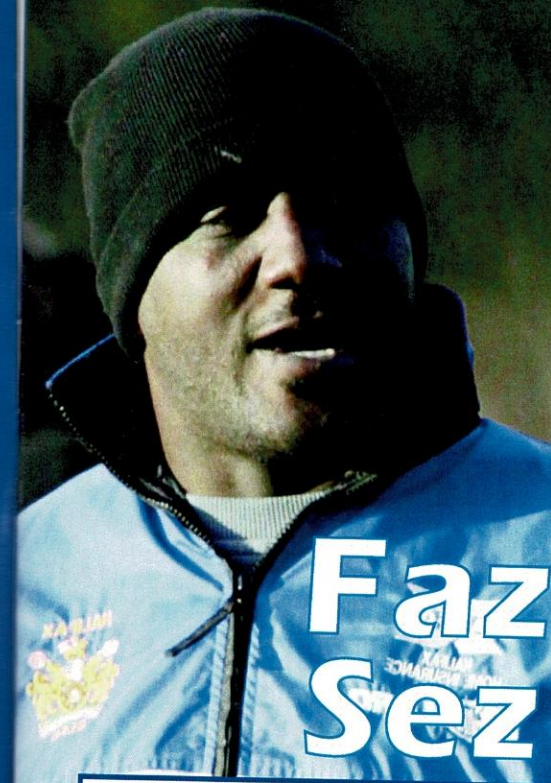

BECOME A MEMBER OF YOUR CLUB

On 2nd June 2005 Halifax RLFC held its second Annual General Meeting.

The fact that supporters of the Club are entitled to attend the meeting and to vote on the items under discussion as well as the election of Board Members separates Halifax RLFC from its past, and from other members of the Rugby Football League.

Achieving a broadly based membership and transparency between the Club and its supporters was one of the central objectives of the reconstitution of the Club started by Stephen Pearson in the wake of the financial problems which led to Administration and relegation from Super League.

But only 120 or so of you have joined.

How much better it would be if the Weavers was too small to host the meeting!

Halifax RLFC is a Company Limited by Guarantee. That means it costs nothing to join (except that non-season ticket holders are asked for a once and for all £10 contribution to the Administration costs). To join you sign the membership lists kept in the office. By signing you promise to pay up to £25 as your guarantee of the Club's debts. The £25 could be called in

if the Club became insolvent and was wound up while you were a member, or during the 2 years after your membership ended.

In exchange for that promise, you are entitled at least to notice of the Annual General Meeting, a copy of the Statutory accounts and directors reports, and have the right to attend and vote on the matters under discussion. But of course any member can stand for election to the Board. That can be in the categories of Employee Director (Paul Dixon elected this year), Supporters Director (David Durbin for election next year) or Sponsors Director (Don Fish for election in 2007) or as a representative of the membership as a whole (myself elected this year).

Please do join and participate in your Club.

Stephen's energy and vision is sadly missed. But we do have a clear idea of what he set out to achieve, with universal support from the Rugby League Community in Calderdale. The second anniversary of his passing coincides closely with the second anniversary of the creation of the Club he was responsible for. Please help it to succeed by participating as members in ever increasing numbers.

I know that fans must be frustrated at the apparent lack of progress on the development of the ground and the East Stand in particular. Although it may seem quiet and that little is happening, behind the scenes complex discussions are continuing in our efforts to complete the Stadium for both clubs and also as a Community facility.

These discussions include talks with Calderdale Council, who as our landlords have a significant say in what happens here at the Shay. We are however encouraged by the support that the Shay Stadium Trust is receiving from the Council, and we are confident that there WILL be a partnership developed between the Stadium Trust and the Council, which will lead to a development benefiting both the clubs and also the wider community.

Our first target is to complete the East Stand and several ideas and options are under consideration, both for funding the development and for ideas in which we can best use the finished stand. Members of the Stadium Trust have been to several new stadia recently to see what works best and there are some excellent

ideas that we can "borrow" to make sure we have one of the best developments in the future.

However as you'll appreciate money is always tight and since its inception The Stadium Trust has been existing on a shoestring with minimal staffing.

Speaking of staffing, I must mention the efforts of our ground staff, Graham Osbourne and Mark Hans who week in and week out give us a pitch that is one of the best in any division of the Rugby League. When you think that the pitch is used for the equivalent of 75 matches each year, both winter and summer you realise just how much hard work has been put in.

In closing I am confident that in the not too distant future we will have a stadium that will make us all proud to say we support Halifax.

So please be patient for just a little longer and continue support the teams. We'll certainly be doing our best to support them by bringing the discussions and then the development to a satisfactory conclusion.

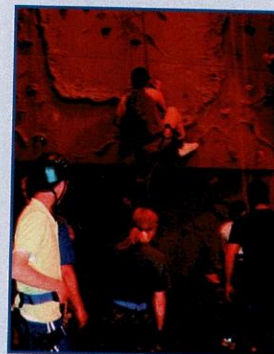

She has a 16 month old son, Kai, and she's married to "Morgo" an Australian (we can't be completely perfect), who was at school with Gibbo.

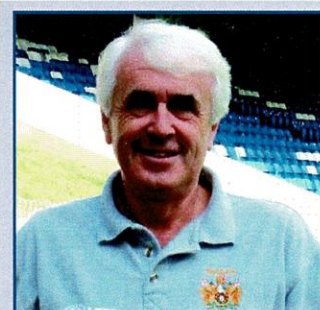
Sarah sorts out just about everything in the office including finance and sorting out all the players issues, which range from losing their clothes in the Laundromat to locking themselves out of their cars.

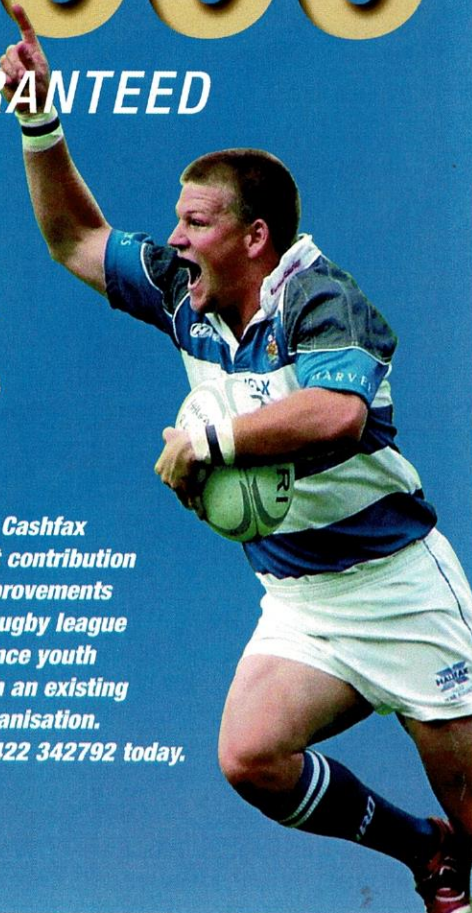

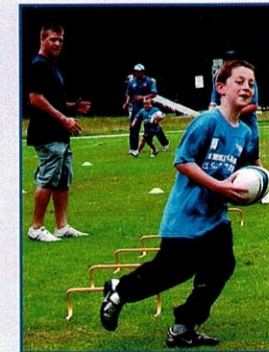

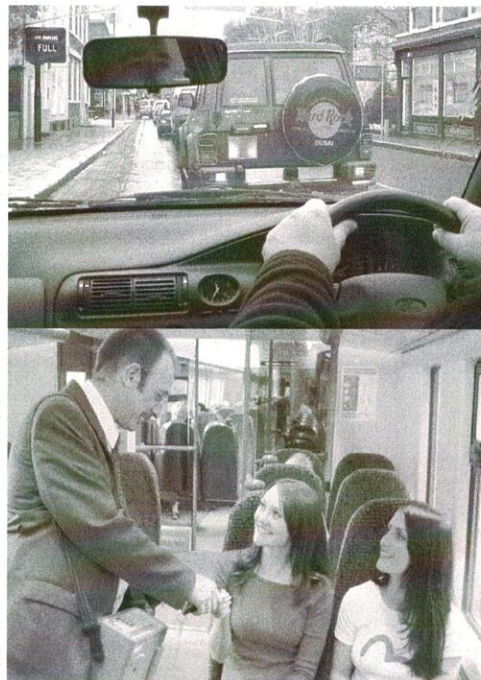

Continuing our theme of introducing our fans, today we focus on Ian Griffiths. Ian is the Managing Director of MortgageSearch UK, a name most of our fans ought to be familiar with. What is Cashfax?
