
Their appointment of John Pendlebury was an excellent choice, John was always a dedicated

OLDHAM BIFFED

A performance for Hornets to remember

Abram's non-plussed view of the validity of pre-season friendlies, he'll be waking up this morning far happier than John Pendlebury, as his side smote Oldham with a performance that set Hornets fans poring over the Law Cup record books.

Between Maye's 17th minute effort and Wilkinson's 73rd minute consolation, Hornets steamed seven tries through an, at times, bemused Oldham defence.

After a tense opening quarter, Oldham's expansive game paid off; Maye's try trumping Danny Wood's earlier penalty to give the Roughyeds the lead.

Oldham strove to give the ball as much width as possible, and it took a superb last ditch tackle by Tommy Goulden to prevent another score.

But Hornets were making good yards up the middle as new boys Ryan Benjefield and Craig Robinson drove the Oldham defence backwards; and it was on this platform that Matt Firth fed Paul Anderson into space to score after 25 minutes.

The introduction of Sam Butterworth and Phil Cantillon

to the fray wreaked havoc in the Oldhan line - Cantillon's trademark darts from acting half and Butterworth's mercurial running leaving the Oldham defence clutching air.

On the half hour, Tommy Goulden backed up a good break down Oldham's right flank to score; and four minutes later, Sam Butterworth left Svabic flat-footed as he glided in direct from a scrum.


The half was capped by Robinson's shuddering tackle on Oldham full-back Gorey that had the main stand wincing.

Half time 20-4 and Hornets gaining shape, rhythm and momentum.

Indeed, Hornets began the second half with a real bang. Just four minutes in, Cantillon exploded through the heart of Oldham's defence; Butterworth appeared on his shoulder to carry the break upfield and he drew the cover perfectly to launch Chris Giles in under the black dot. Exquisite football.

Eight minutes later, Butterworth produced a carbon-copy of his first half try: this time Barber was the fall-guy as Sam ghosted in untouched.

Despite Mr Kirkpatrick's attempts to penalise the game to a pedantic standstill, Hornets continued to capitalise on their scraps of possession.



Having withstood an Oldham barrage (that twice ended with Oldham handing over on Hornets' line and three times with goal-line drop-outs) Hornets marched smartly upfield and worked the ball wide for Richard Varkulis to score.


The impressive Robinson capped a blockbusting debut with a well deserved try; crashing through tiring defenders to score.

But Oldham plugged away and, with their fans already streaming for the exits, worked the ball down the right wing where Svabic's grubber was flapped at by Mayberry and Wilkinson took advantage to touch down.

Despite the unlimited substitutions and ever-changing line-up, Over the 80 minutes Hornets did find cohesion and fluidity. There was always the sugestion that Darren Abram would have Hornets better drilled on defence and, for long periods in this game, both line and scrambling defence looked strong, willing and organised.

So, while the Law Cup is no real barometer for forthcoming performance, it does let us know the point we're starting from. And, on this performance, it's as good a start as we could expect.

Andy Gorski received the Law Cup from Ray Taylor's wife Barbara; and Matt Firth the Carl Marriott memorial trophy as Hornets' man of the match.

HORNETS can look forward to the new season with cautious optimism after Sunday's exhilarating victory against Oldham Roughyeds at Spotland.

And, despite a match littered with substitutions, the home team did enough to give their fans hope for what will be a tough campaign.

There were many excellent performances from the old hands and the new signings. Scrum half Matty Firth was lively and directed operations well. Prop forward Craig Robinson lived up to Darren Abram's pre-match billing of 'in the Mick Cassidy mode' with an all-action display. Chris Giles confidently handled everything thrown at him and linked well on attack, while loose forward Tommy Goulden hinted at his potential with a fine performance.

Hornets started slowly and were under the cosh in the early stages as unforced errors gave Oldham the initiative. Danny Wood gave the home team the lead with a penalty, but it was no surprise when the visitors took the lead, Chris Maye finishing off a fluent passing move.

The home team finally burst into life in the 27th minute, Paul Anderson providing the catalyst as he burst onto Firth's well-timed pass to score. Sam Butterworth converted.

Four minutes later Casey Mayberry and James Bunyan combined to send Goulden through a gap to touch down.

Butterworth was again on target with the kick.

And with Oldham reeling, the mercurial Butterworth danced through a static defence for a try which he converted to give Hornets a 20-4 advantage at half time.

Hornets final try came from the dynamic Robinson who held off three would-be tacklers to force his way over the line. McCully banged over his third conversion.

Hornets were able to rest on their laurels after the match, but they will know their are sterner tests ahead, starting with a Northern Rail Cup match against Oldham on 12 February.



THE OPPOSITION OLDHAM RLFC

ANDY BAILEY - Signed during the close-season from Castleford Tigers. At 6'3" is an ideal build for a secondrow forward. Super League experience with Hull who signed him from Featherstone Rovers.

GARETH BARBER - A local born player who started his professional career with Warrington Wolves. Primarily a stand-off who can fill most positions in the back-line. In 2005 he was also used effectively at hooker. Represented the National League under 21 side that defeated their Super League counterparts in 2001.

MIKE CALLAN - A prop-forward who has had Super League experience with Warrington Wolves. Hoping to make a huge impact this season under the quidance of coach John Pendlebury.

GED CORCORAN - 23 year old propforward signed for the Roughyeds after spells with Halifax (where he gained Super League experience), Dewsbury Rams and French outfit Limoux. Started his rugby career with Royton Tigers.

WAYNE CORCORAN - 20-year-old Irish international forward. Recruited from Halifax where he gained first team experience.

CRAIG DEAN - Former Chorley Lynx, Haiffax and Leigh player who can turn out at full-back or in either half-back positions. Had a short spell with Saddleworth Rangers.

ANDY GOREY - A young full-back who is bursting with enthusiasm. He made 8 first team appearances last season albeit on the wing but is hoping to claim the number one jersey this term.

DEAN GORTON - Looking for regular first team action after spending two years in the Salford City Reds U21 side, where, in 2004, he picked up their Player of the Year award.

DANNY GUEST - A big prop who has just returned to Oldham after retiring at the end of the 2003 season following a serious knee ligament injury. Former Oldham Bear who has had experience with Keighley Cougers and Lancashire Lynx. This will be his fourth spell with Oldham.

ALAN HADCROFT - A robust centre who is known for his solid defence and strong running. Signed from Halifax for the 2006 season, Alan's previous club list includes Wests and his hometown side Leigh Centurions. Played for the National League against New Zealand 'A'.

GARETH HAYES - 20 year-old propforward signed from Salford City Reds during the close-season. He was voted Salford's U21 Player's Player of the Year in 2004. Leigh born Gareth stands at 6'3" tall and weighs 17 stone.

IAN HODSON - Signed initially on loan from Swinton Lions in 2005. After impressing he was given a contract for 2006. A hard worker who can handle the ball and who is equally at home in the second-row or at loose-forward.

CHRIS HOUGH - Oldham born halfback who excelled last season forming a great partnership with Marty Turner. A leader who knows how to galvanise his team-mates into action.

JOHN HOUGH - The first player to sign for his hometown club when it was reformed in1997. An hooker who has signed a contract to take him to the end of the 2007 season, which will allow him to complete 10 years with the club.

Signed from Warrington Wolves, he can also play at loose-forward and is excellent at acting half-back.

JAMES KIRKLAND - Ex Oldham academy. A young hooker who should go far in the game. Former Waterhead Junior and Wigan Warrior student. A tough tackler and excellent acting halfback.

CHRIS MAYE - A 21 year-old secondrow or centre signed from Swinton Lions for the 2006 season. Started his pro career at Wigan Warriors before moving to St Helens where he was on the verge of being selected for the England Academy side, but was thwarted by a wrist injury. Had a loan spell at Halifax where he gained Super Leaque experience.

DANNY NANYN - Injury brought to a halt this young prop's impressive start to the 2005 season, but then managed

to pick up where he left-off. Started well against Rochdale Hornets last week.

CHRIS PERCIVAL - Just returned to Oldham after a spell on-loan at the end of 2003. He played for Leigh Centurions for two season. A quick three-quarter who scored 20 tries in 20 games in his first season with Leigh but missed out in 2005 with a broken leg. Will be seeking to rekindle his try scoring feats this year.

MICK REDFORD - Signed for the Roughyeds during the close-season from Blackpool Panthers. Originally from the Leigh East amateur club, has also played for Chorley Lynx. Was a crowd-pleaser at Blackpool where he played prop, second- row or centre.

MARK ROBERTS - Joined Oldham on loan from Warrington Wolves towards the end of the 2004 season.Initially used as a centre, where he can display a turn of pace. Also has sufficiant upper-body strength to enhance the back-row of the pack.

After an injury plagued season in 2005 is keen to put things right in 2006.

SIMON SVABIC - Footballing halfback who made a huge impact for the Roughyeds in the second half of the 2005 season at loose-forward. Former Oldham Bear, Salford and Leigh player.

ALEX WILKINSON - Local born Alex, toured with Great Britain schoolboys to Australia in 1999 and with the England Academy to New Zealand and Australia in 2001. Had a loan spell with Hull F.C. where he impressed the Humberside high-flyers sufficiantly for them to offer him a two year contract. Alex decided he wanted to complete his degree and when part-time rugby was the right option he chose his hometown club. Can play both centre and wing.

LEE WINGFIELD - 24 year-old second-row signed from amateur club Leigh Easts. He has been selected for the BARLA Great Britain team for three successive seasons, and toured both Australia and Russia. Signed a two year contract that commences with the start of the 2006 campaign.

His no nonsense approach was appreciated by the Hornets fans and his experience was vital at certain times of the season. Rob is another no nonsense model professional. He made 22 appearances in 2005. Previous clubs are Wigan and Leigh.

Ryan Benjafield (PROP); Ryan is in his second spell in England having previously played for Hull F.C. and York City Knights. He has been playing in Australia for Asquith Magpies in the Jim Beam Cup but was keen to have another go in England. Can either play in the front or back row and comes very highly rated by the Coaches at both his previous English Clubs.

James Bunyan (CENTRE / SECOND ROW); Another player in his second spell at the club after playing the last couple of seasons at Halifax, this was after spending a short but unhappy spell at Oldham. One of James's great assets is his versatility being at home at either centre or back row. James is renowned for his tough tackling and strong running and has always had a good tries to games ratio. James is another player on his way back to full fitness after having closed season surgery. Previous clubs include Doncaster and Huddersfield.

Sam Butterworth (STAND OFF); Rochdale born Sam is certain to continue his love affair with Hornets supporters in 2006 having enjoyed a highly successful 2005 season scoring some brilliant tries and displaying excellent individual skills. Sam's pace is electric and he is always willing to try the unorthodox and has pulled Hornets out of many a sticky situation. Sam is now in his third season at the Club and is enjoying every minute of it. For the record Sam scored 9 tries in 2005.

Chris Campbell (WING); Chris has been a consistent performer since joining the Club in 2004. His electric pace always puts him amongst Hornets leading scorers every season and last year he scored 14 in 22 appearances. He previously had spells with Oldham and Whitehaven

Dave was another player who didn't really enjoy the best of fitness in 2005 but after a good preseason under his belt he will no doubt soon rediscover the performance that made him one of the stand players of 2004.

Lee Doran (SECOND ROW); Lee was voted the Club's player of the year at the end of last season, an award he richly deserved and in doing so quickly became a firm fans' favourite. He frequently busted the opposition's line, with his trademark line breaking busts. Lee was also a solid performer in defence frequently topping the tackle count. He made 28 appearances in 2005

scoring 6 tries. His previous club was Oldham.

Phil Farrell (LOOSE FORWARD); Phil was plagued with a knee injury during the 2005 season which he will now hoping to have fully recovered from. A tough back row forward with an exceptional work rate Phil leads from the front at all times and is a very constructive leader both on and off the pitch. He made 21 appearances in 2005. Phil joined from Oldham in December 2004 having previously played for his hometown club Wigan Warriors

Matty Firth (SCRUM HALF); Matt opted for a move to National League one after enjoying a hugely successful 2005 season with Keighley Cougars. Matt will be hoping to make an immediate impact due to the injury to Lee Sanderson. A classy half back Matt has a great kicking game and scores his fair share of tries. Matt came to Hornets via Keighley, Halifax and Wakefield. In 2005 Matt scored 4 tries in 23 matches for Keighley.

Chris Giles (FULL BACK / WING) A real stand out performer for Hornets during 2005 at either Full Back or on the Wing. John Hill (PROP); After signing from Blackpool in May 2005 John made a disastrous start to his Hornets career by getting dismissed five minutes into his debut at Featherstone. After that blip John had a really successful season and was a top performer in the Hornets pack. Used mainly off the bench John always had an impact and will again be a major component in the Hornets pack in 2006. John made 12 appearances in 2005

Casey Mayberry (WING); In his second spell at Hornets having previously served Halifax twice and Hull KR. Casey's first spell at the club was interrupted by injury and he will be hoping for an injury free 2006. Casey has got pace to burn and will for sure be amongst the division's leading try scorers if he stays injury free. Casey's tries always seem to be of the spectacular variety and Hornets fans will be looking forward to tries such as the one against Workington during the 2003 season

Mark McCully (CENTRE); Another player who enjoyed a really successful 2005 season topping Hornets points scoring chart in the process. Mark also had a very successful season with the kicking boot and was amongst the leading kickers in National League one. In 2005 Mark made 26 appearances scoring 13 tries and 71 goals for a total of 194 points. Mark launched his career at St Helens before moving onto Chorley and then Leigh.

Paul Norman (PROP) Paul signed for Hornets from Local rivals Oldham in December 2005. Regarded as one of the most consistent front row forwards in National League one with a huge work rate ethic. A very experienced campaigner Paul's other clubs include Leigh. His tough tackling style and his willingness to do the "hard yards" will quickly make him a fans' favourite.

Paul Owen (FULL BACK) Paul will be hoping for a better 2006 after spending the majority of time sidelined in the 2005 season with a foot injury. He is in his second spell at Hornets after having a brief spell away from the club in 2004 at Hull KR. He will be hoping to recapture the form he showed in his first spell at the Club where he was generally regarded as the best Full Back at National League one level. Paul started his career at Leeds before moving onto Keighley.

with GARETH WALKER of RUGBY LEAGUER & LEAGUE EXPRESS

STEAMING AHEAD!

THE Northern Rail Cup pulls out of its station this weekend to launch another fascinating National League campaign.

With a settled slot at the beginning of the season and a memorable final day at Blackpool to reflect on from last year, the competition continues to grow in

Today sees the start of the group stage, which promises to provide a wealth of entertainment.

An intriguing Group One sees Welsh newcomers Celtic Crusaders make their professional bow against a London Skolars side eager to progress from the disappointments of 2005. Throw in two ambitious NL3 clubs in Hemel Hempstead and St Albans Centurions, and the pool provides plenty of hope for the future.

In Group Two, Whitehaven will again be the clear favourites to finish top, as they have done for the past two seasons. But runners-up spot is more difficult call, though Workington Town would appear to have the edge on recently relegated Barrow Raiders and the ever-improving Gateshead Thunder.

All four clubs in Group Three will fancy their chances of progression. With Doncaster Lakers and Batley Bulldogs expected to be in the lower half of NL1 later in the year, and Dewsbury Rams and Hunslet Hawks set to challenge for promotion, nothing will be take for granted in a fascinating pool.

Expect fireworks in Group Four, where the two

favourites for National League One, Leigh Centurions and Widnes Vikings, clash twice early on. They look certain qualifiers, though don't rule out a shock from Swinton at Park Lane, while Blackpool will be keen to use a difficult group as a positive starting point under new coach Simon Knox.

Group Five is of the most difficult to call, being the only one with three NL1 clubs in it. Halifax will be slight favourites, but both Rochdale and Oldham have much to prove under their respective new coaches, and Keighley will be keen to cause a shock or two under the returning Peter Roe.

Group Six is another tough one to predict, with no apparent weak club. Holders Hull Kingston Rovers look well placed to finish top, but there promises to be a real scramble for second, with the newlypromoted York City Knights taking on two teams expected to be at the forefront of NL2 in Sheffield Eagles and Featherstone Rovers.

With progressive NL3 clubs Bramley Buffaloes. Dewsbury Celtic and Warrington Wizards making up Group Seven, the NRC provides League outside the top flight with much to be positive about.

"I think it's a great concept, and a nice introduction to the season," Justin Morgan, coach of holders Hull KR concludes.

"It's certainly a major objective of ours to do well in the competition."
