

2. Play cannot be guaranteed to take place on any particular day or at any particular time and the club reserves the right to change its advertised fixtures without prior notice and without liability.
3. No refund of any cash admission charge paid at the ground turnstile will be made.
4. Refund will be made in respect of tickets bought in advance for a fixture that is subject to a postponement for any reason.
5. Unauthorised persons are not permitted to enter upon the field of play.
6. No recording, whether for radio or television, and whether for transmission or otherwise is permitted unless permission is specifically granted by the Barrow RFL club for such purpose. Such authorised will be issued in writing to the company/individual.
7. Only persons/organisations with the specific authorisation in writing from Barrow RLFC will be permitted to offer/distribute literature inside or outside of Craven Park, Barrow-in-Furness.

THE COACH COMMENTS

What a difference a week can make. After the Gateshead game a fortnight ago I was asking serious questions about myself and the players. It looked as if what I wanted to happen was not happening. No one was happy. The crowd were not happy and we want to please supporters.

Then came the win over Workington last Sunday. Wow. Right on top of the world. The players could stick their chests out with pride. I certainly wanted to.

The standing ovation at the end was a total lift.

But the players had worked really hard for it. It was a massive achievement. A reward for working hard on marker defence all week and on players defending off both shoulders.

I thought we did well in the first half as we completed 75 per cent of our tackle counts. But that was nothing compared with our outstanding defending in the second half.

In one spell we faced 18 tackles in a row on our own goal-line and they couldn't break us down. That takes some doing.

The only disappointment was that we only completed 40 per cent of our second half sets of six but that will come.

The outcome is a home Northern Rail tie against Widnes. What a great chance for our young players to take on a side of experienced pros.

Today's priority is taking on the challenge of Oldham in the Powergen Cup. I am grateful to Peter Roe for letting us have a tape of his Keighley's match against Oldham.

Steve Deakin is a coach I admire and he is doing a good job. But a good performance by our lads today will give us something major to take into what is going to be a tough league programme. Stick with us.







Today's visitors have known the highs and lows of modern day Rugby League - members of Super League to the brink of closure in less than ten years.

Excuse me if this week's column is personal - Oldham were my local club for more than 20 years. I even worked for them as media officer (unpaid) for a short spell.

Like Barrow, Oldham is what we in the press like to call "a rugby town" - a solid amateur set-up, a professional club with an illustrious past, pubs full of customers who love to talk about the game.

Unlike Barrow, Oldham has tasted the high life of Super League and paid the price. Less than ten years ago Oldham - then known as The Bears - were up with the full-time elite but life was anything but rosy. Gates hovered around the 4,000 mark - and the first 1,000 through the gate only paid for the rent of Boundary Park - and the team was filled with highly-paid Aussie journeymen and run of the mill British and Kiwi players.

Success was as far off as ever so it was little wonder that the Oldham public became disillusioned by a combination of inept management and poor results.

Gates slumped, Super League membership was lost and eventually the prickly relationship between soccer and rugby led to Oldham being made homeless.

They even had to play their home games out of town at nearby soccer grounds.


Present chairman Chris Hamilton started the uphill struggle to revive interest but he was starting almost from scratch. The old ground of Watersheddings had been sold with nothing to show for it other than a housing estate and the club were billeted on the opposite side of town - football territory. The fan base had shrunk to almost nothing and only the diehards remained.

And recent history shows that, like other former Super League clubs - Workington, Halifax, Sheffield and Gateshead - Oldham are finding life is even tougher among the have-nots of the lower divisions.

The Golden Age for Barrow and Oldham was back in the 1950s (anybody remember Swinton, 1952 and the Lancashire Cup final which Barrow won 13-2) so today's tie offers a taste of the past.

It is only the fourth Challenge Cup meeting between the sides with Oldham 2-1 ahead.

It is Barrow's chance to level the score and pull a money spinner out of the hat on Tuesday. With a deep affection for both clubs I can't lose whatever the result. So Come On Barrow/Oldham!

Hello everyone,







TODAY'S VISITORS - OLDHAM

Andy Bailey Born: 15.10.82 Previous clubs: Featherstone, Hull FC, Castleford Tigers. Second-row forward signed from Castleford in the close season. Former Featherstone youngster who was brought to Hull FC by Shaun McRae at the age of 21, playing 10 Super League games for the Arlie Birds. Currently studying a law degree at Bradford University.

Gareth Barber Born: 15.12.80 Previous clubs: Warrington Wolves. Local lad who grew up playing alongside Leeds and Great Britain loose forward Kevin Sinfield. primarily a stand-off, but can fill in anywhere on the back line and also played regularly at hooker in 2005.

Mike Callan Born: 8.8.83 Previous clubs: Warrington Wolves, Leigh, Blackpool. Joined Blackpool in National League Two last year but was released mid-season due to financial difficulties at the club. Man-of-the-match in the game against Oldham in the group stages of the Northern Rail Cup last year.

Ged Corcoran Born: 28.3.83 Previous clubs: Halifax, Limoux, Dewsbury. Grafting forward and a full Irish international, reared at Halifax alongside brother Wayne. Moved across the channel after a contractual dispute but returned last year to help the Rams to the National League Two Grand Final.

Wayne Corcoran Born: 10.7.85 Previous clubs: Halifax. Irish international forward who made his Super League debut aged 18. Two shoulder operations have hampered his progress since, but has talent and could shine if given a run in the side.

Craig Dean Born: 20.10.76 Previous clubs: Halifax, Leigh, Swinton, Chorley. Experienced player who can operate at full-back as well as in the half-backs. Runs a business with team-mate Alan Hadcroft, and will be hoping to earn a contract stretching beyond the Northern Rail Cup.

Andy Gorey Born: 31.10.85 Young, enthusiastic full-back who made eight appearances on the wing last year and will be hoping to establish himself this time around. Former Royton Tigers youngster.

Dean Gorton Born: 16.1.84 Previous clubs: Salford. Back-row forward signed by then Salford academy boss Steve McCormack. Never played in Super League, though he was the club's under-21s player of the year in 2004. Can also play in the three-quarters.

Danny Guest Born: 20.4.77 Previous clubs: Oldham Bears, Keighley, Chorley. Huge 18-stone prop who made the return to Oldham after retiring at the end of the 2003 season following a serious knee ligament injury. Now in his fourth spell with the club.

Alan Hadcroft Born: 31.3.77 Previous clubs: Leigh, Halifax. Robust centre known for his solid defence and strong running, Hadcroft is seen as a ready-made replacement for Jon Goddard. Toured New Zealand with a BARLA youth squad when he was 17.

Gareth Hayes Born: 15.6.85 Previous clubs: Salford. Big Leigh-born prop who worked with John Pendlebury at Leigh under-18s. Went on the NW Counties under-16s Oceanic tour along with current team-mate Wayne Corcoran.

Ian Hodson Born: 23.10.81 Previous clubs: Leigh, Chorley, Swinton. A plumber by trade, Hodson played for BARLA's Great Britain under-18s side in France before turning pro for Leigh, aged 18. Signed initially on loan from Swinton in April 2005, Hodson is an 80-minute player who is happy in the back row and at loose forward.

Chris Hough Born: 30.8.81 Previous clubs: Rochdale, Doncaster, Swinton, Blackpool. Oldham-born scrum-half or stand-off who formed an excellent partnership with Marty Turner last season. Cousin of Roughyeds stalwart John.

John Hough Born: 14.4.76 Previous clubs: Warrington. First player to commit himself to the new club when it was reformed in 1997. The hooker's contract runs until 2007, which will allow him to complete 10 years with the club. Can also play at loose forward and is adept at acting half-back.

James Kirkland Born: 17.7.85 Previous clubs: Wigan. A product of the Oldham Academy, and a young hooker who should go far in the game. A former Waterhead junior and Wigan Warriors student, Kirkland is a tough tackler and excellent acting half-back.

Chris Maye Born: 28.2.84 Previous clubs: Wigan, St Helens, Halifax, Swinton. Gained Super League experience through a loan spell at Halifax. Was Swinton's top try-scorer in 2004 and he earned himself a spot in the National League division two dream team.

Danny Nanyin Born: 8.10.84 Injury brought a premature halt to the young Wigan-born prop's impressive start to the 2005 season, but the brother of last year's top National League One points scorer Mick Nanyin managed to pick up where he left off.

Chris Percival Born: 25.12.1979 Previous clubs: Widnes, Leigh. Played for Oldham in the last three games of the 2003 season before signing a two-year deal with Leigh. The centre or wing missed all last season with a broken leg, after scoring 20 tries in 20 games in 2004, six of them against Oldham. After 14 months out, will be looking to recapture his old form.

Mick Redford Born: 24.6.81 Previous clubs: Chorley, Blackpool. Originally from the Leigh East amateur club, Redford can play second row, prop or centre. A wholehearted, crowd-pleasing figure at Blackpool, Leigh-born Redford has played around 100 professional games.

Mark Roberts Born: 9.11.82 Previous clubs: Wigan, Warrington. Joined Oldham initially on

loan from Warrington at the back end of the 2004 season. Initially used at centre, where he displays a turn of pace, Roberts also has sufficient upper-body strength to enhance the back row of the pack. Had an injury-plagued season in 2005.

Simon Svabic Born: 18.1.80 Previous clubs: Oldham Bears, Salford, Leigh. Goalkicking, playmaking half-back who earned Great Britain Academy honours while at Salford. Had a big impact at loose forward last season, and spent time skipping the side.

Alex Wilkinson Born: 9.10.82 Previous clubs: Bradford, London Broncos, Hull FC. Locally-born 22-year-old centre, who has played nearly 40 Super League games. Played junior rugby with Royton Tigers before signing for Bradford Bulls. After a loan spell at Hull he was offered a two-year contract with the Arlie Birds, but chose to go part-time with his home-town club to complete his degree in sports science.

Lee Wingfield Born: 9.6.81 Second row, signed from amateur club Leigh East. gave up the game in his early teens but returned aged 18 and soon established himself in the first team at East, playing alongside Oldham boss John Pendlebury's brother Gary. As one of BARLA's top back-row forwards, Wingfield has earned four overseas trips - two to Moscow, one to France and one to Australia.

OLDHAM A BRIEF HISTORY

Oldham is a proud club with a great tradition. Founded in 1876 as a rugby union side, it grew swiftly and during just its third season John B. Rye became the first of many of its players to gain representative honours when he was selected for Lancashire. Oldham were the first Lancashire team to lift the Challenge Cup when Hunslet were beaten in 1899, the beginning of a truly golden era in the history of the club. For the next thirty years it would never be far away from the honours and included a sensational period during the 1920's when it appeared in four consecutive Challenge Cup finals. The skilful side of the 1950's is still fondly remembered, the names of Davies, Cracknell, Ganley, Winslade, Jackson, Little and Co., etched into the memory of those supporters who were amongst the 62,000 crowd at Odsal Stadium to watch the 'Roughyeds' beat Hull 15-14 and lift the 1957 Championship.


Remarkably, the team from the old cotton town, which has produced over 80 international players, has not won a major trophy since, despite, in 1996, being a founder member of Super League and the following year playing in Australia in the World Club Championships. Unfortunately, in 1997 pressing financial problems forced the club into liquidation.

Professional rugby league was not allowed to die in the town, however, and due to the efforts of a group of enthusiasts a new Oldham club was formed and entered into the Second Division Championship of 1998 eventually succeeding in reaching the 2001 Grand Final, albeit losing to Widnes Vikings 24-14.

Having led a somewhat nomadic existence the club (which strives to once again play in Super League) now plays its home matches at Boundary Park, the home of the town's soccer club, Oldham Athletic.
