

Certainly bar management, turnstile operations, car parking and general traffic flow around the stadium are high on the list of priorities this week and next in the run up to that game.


I hardly think we can complain about our luck with cup draws this season. Warrington is obviously a daunting

Playing Matters

from Justin Morgan



AS USUAL first things first and a very warm welcome to Oldham players and fans alike for this afternoon's match at Craven Park.

And a special welcome to Oldham coach Steve Deakin who is an old friend not only from the time we were both in France together with our respective teams.

It is good see him back in the game coaching and with his home town club too. He did a great job in France and he will get the best out of Oldham too.

From a Rovers' point of view this weekend sees the start of a busy spell.

We have today's game, followed by the Challenge Cup tie against Warrington, then a mid-week match against Doncaster followed by a visit from Whitehaven.

Now is the time we will see the importance of having a full squad and it is also important the players take good care of themselves off the field to stay on top of things.

Last week we were a bit guilty of turning up with not quite the right attitude and maybe for the first 20 minutes you could say we hardly turned up at all.

But you can't play at your best every week. No team does that all through a season. What you need to do though is grind forward and end up with the win. And if ever proof was needed that a positive attitude works we all saw it by 4.20pm last Sunday.

One of the main problems was we did not build up as much pressure on the opposition as we have been doing. And when that happens the opposition starts to get a little more confident.

That is why it is important to start well against a side like Oldham. They are having it tough at the moment but if they are allowed to get some momentum going their confidence will grow and you can sometimes find teams like that can sneak up and grab a win.

I have spoken to the players about this and we have made a mental note about starting well. Right now, as you can imagine, there is a great spirit in the camp (as if there was not before) over reaching the quarter-finals of the Powergen Challenge Cup for the first in a long time.

However, apart from Oldham today and then Warrington, the next hurdle is that we have three matches in very close proximity to each other.

Having said that many of the problems are phsycological ones. It's like Easter where you play two matches in three or four days. If you say you can't do it, or it's going to be too hard, it will turn out that way.

The players have put in the hard work. They have prepared well. Physically they will be fine.

What we are trying to do is look at things logically. See what factors we can strip out so we don't have to think about them and so they don't start to cause uncertainty in our build-up.


It's like the mental work we have been doing on away games and which has enabled us to look at them as matches which are not played at home. The rules are the same, the pitch size is not all that different, there are the same numbers on both sides, and the weather is the same for both teams. And that takes a lot of the uncertainty out of things.

Apply the same sort of positive thinking to the issue of multiple games in a short time period and you can take the fear out of things.

We have a good enough squad and a big enough one to handle the situation.

Now we just have to stay positive and focussed and make the things we are aiming for happen.





FROM MIKE TO MATCHDAY PROGRAMME BBC RADIO HUMBERSIDE'S CHRIS PARK TAKES A LOOK AT THE ROBINS

Things are moving at quite a pace these days, here at Craven Park, and to be drawn at home against the Warrington Wolves in the Quarter Finals of the Powergen Challenge Cup, with the impending Northern Rail National Cup Semi Final and some big National League One clashes to come in the next few weeks, all this has no doubt cranked up the workload behind the scenes as well as placing the Club firmly in the public eye.

Heady times, then, and having broken one Club record two weeks ago, when Widnes were defeated on their own patch to give Rovers their fifteenth consecutive win and their best ever start to a season. The Robins take on Oldham this afternoon knowing that a win or draw today would enable the Club to equal their longest-ever sequence of matches unbeaten.

That's a record which goes back to the 1966-67 season when after winning their first league. game of the season at Hunslet, only to lose their second at Workington, the side embarked upon a run of 17 consecutive wins, from 22nd August to 19th November 1966 inclusive, winning the Yorkshire Cup on the way

It was a side which played some terrific football, and this will be regarded by many Rovers fans as the era when, after over thirty years in the doldrums, Hull Kingston Rovers started to make people sit up and take notice. Quite a few of the side which played in this most successful combination had joined the Club a few years earlier and were maturing steadily, and I hope to be able to pay proper tribute to this squad in the next programme.

Quite a few of that squad came to the Club from local amateur football, such a rich breeding ground for talent in years past. We owe the amateur game a lot, which is one reason that I really hope that this afternoon, regardless of their result in the GMB sponsored National Cup Final, which was played at Blackpool yesterday, that Rovers fans save a special cheer today for Skirlaugh ARLFC today, because they have done themselves and the local area proud in getting to that Final for a record SIXTH time. And that has to be an excellent achievement by any Club, amateur or professional,

DWAYNE BARKER

"MY big aim at the moment is to get back in the starting line-up," says former Leeds Rhinos man Dwayne Barker.

Barker, who was hitting form until suffering a spiral fracture in a hand which kept him out of the running for two months, is once again starting to look like the player he knows he can be.

The second thing he would like is to play regularly in the back row. Loose-forward was the preferred option but failing that the second-row.

And the 23-year old from Leeds, whose amateur clubs were Milford and Hunslet Parkside, is finding out that while versatility is a great gift to his club it is not quite as big a bonus when it comes to developing a career.

Now in his second full season after joining Rovers from Leeds, Barker said when he made the move he never really imagined the atmosphere at the club being as it is today.

"I did think we should have got into Super League last season, but then things fell away a bit and if it had not been for James Webster, we may not even have done as well as we did. But we still ended up with the Northern Rail Cup.

I think going full time has made a massive difference, plus the fact we have had a good pre-season.

Obviously Justin Morgan coming has been a big plus and having Dean Sampson on board has been another massive bonus for us.

On top of that we are playing well and I think it's this year or never for us to some extent as far as Super League is concerned."

AIMING TO START

"Everyone wants to win every game. We come to work during the week and everyone is just focussed on winning. As soon as one game is over we really do start to think about the next one. And we try and work on making areas of poor performances better every week. That goes for the team and for individual players," he said.

Some people may wonder about the intensity of training and the facilities and ask how Rovers compare to Leeds.

Barker has little doubt: "Everything is about the same level. We are full time like Leeds. The facilities are as good and everyone wants to win. The atmosphere is similar too. Everything is right this year from training and playing right through to the pitch itself."

Like his team-mates, Barker is looking forward to the Challenge Cup quarter-final against Warrington.

"It's not just because we have got to that stage, but because it gives us a good side to judge ourselves by. It will give us a benchmark and something to go by for the rest of the season.

I think we will be ok. I know the Bradford match was a pre-season friendly but for the second half they put everybody out except for a couple of players and we did ok. We have now moved on a bit from there and I think we will play better against better sides. We have done that so far this season and I think we will continue to do that."

As far as his own form is concerned Barker, who stands 6ft 2ins and

turns the scales at 15st, says there is room for improvement.

"For a start I want to get in the starting line up. Everybody has been playing well and due to coming back from injury and things I have had to start off the bench. It's still good to be part of the side, but my aim is to get back in the starting players."

Asked what he thought about becoming known as Rovers' Mr Versatile. He grinned and said: "It's ok being Mr Versatile but I would like to cement the loose-forward spot, either that or second row."

Barker feels the squad has gone from strength to strength because good players have been brought in from other clubs. And more importantly they have all gelled and want to play for each other and achieve their Super League goal.

"That aspect of the game gets better every week," he said.

Are Rovers ready for Super League?

"I think we are but maybe we would

need to buy some experienced players. A lot of us are quite young even though most of us have played Super League. Maybe we would need one or two more experienced heads to see us through. But I don't think Rovers would be faced with having to buy virtually a new team to stay up.

"Who knows, the way things are going some of the clubs who let players come here might end up trying to get them back," he joked.





Andy Bailey -Second-row forward Signed from Castleford in the close season. Former Featherstone youngster who was brought to Hull FC by Shaun McRae at the age of 21, playing 10 Super League games for the Arlie Birds. Suffered a back injury at Barrow in the Challenge Cup.

Gareth **Barber** -stand-off Local lad who grew up playing alongside Leeds and Great Britain loose forward Kevin Sinfield. Primarily a stand-off, but can fill in anywhere on the back line and also played regularly at hooker in 2005; this year he has slotted in well at full-back.

Ged Corcoran -forward
Grafting forward and a full Irish
international, reared at Halifax
alongside brother Wayne. Moved
across the channel after a contractual dispute but returned last
year to help the Rams to the
National League Two Grand Final
The 23-year-old has had injury
problems, but he's been in good
form for Oldham when available.

Wayne Corcoran -loose forward/ stand-off. He made his Super League debut two years ago at the age of 18. Two shoulder operations have hampered his progress since, and a groin injury has meant his opportunities have been limited this term.

Andy Gorey -winger A slip of a winger whose enthusiasm makes up for his lack of weight. The former Royton Tigers youngster has scored five tries in his 10 appearances this season.

Dean Gorton -back-row forward Signed by then Salford academy boss Steve McCormack. Never played in Super League, though he was the club's under-21s player of the year in 2004, Gorton can also play in the three-quarters.

Gareth Hayes -prop
Big Leigh-born prop who has been
a regular starter in the front row in
recent weeks. Went on the NW
Counties under-16s Oceanic tour
along with current team-mate
Wayne Corcoran.

lan Hodson -back row/loose forward. A plumber by trade, Hodson turned pro for Leigh at the age of 18. Signed initially on loan from Swinton in April 2005, Hodson is an 80-minute player who is happy in the back row and at loose forward, though he has played at stand-off lately. An ever-present this season.

Chris Hough -scrum-half/stand-off He formed an excellent partnership with Matty Turner last season. Cousin of Roughyeds stalwart John, whose spot at hookerhe has recently been occupying.

John Hough -hooker First player to commit himself to the new club when it was reformed in 1997. The hooker's contract runs until 2007, which will allow him to complete 10 years with the club. Can also play at loose forward.

Chris Maye -second row/centre Young second row or centre. Was on the verge of being selected for the England Academy side while at St Helens, but was thwarted by a wrist injury. Was Swinton's top try-scorer in 2004 and he earned himself a spot in the National League division two dream team.

Alex Wilkinson -centre Locally-born 22-year-old centre, who has played nearly 40 Super League games. Played junior rugby with Royton Tigers before signing for Bradford Bulls. After a loan spell at Hull he was offered a two-year contract with the Arlie

Signed up for a second month on loan with Oldham prior to the Whitehaven game two weeks ago. A second row or loose forward brought in from Warrington's under-21s side, Baines has shown a good work ethic during his time with the Roughyeds.

David Best -prop forward
The 27-year-old prop forward was
brought to the club from amateur
side Oldham St Anne's, initially as
a trialist, but after some powerful
performances was signed up for
the season. Has played under
coach Steve Deakin at both his
previous clubs.

Matt Bottom -forward
Oldham-born forward with good
ball skills, the highly-rated 20
year-old is on a month's loan with
the Roughyeds. Formerly an
amateur with Saddleworth
Rangers

Tom Kilgannon -second-row forward.
Formerly a member of Oldham's academy squad, Kilgannon's impressive form for National Conference side Saddleworth Rangers prompted coach, Steve Deakin to snap up the second-row forward until the end of the season.

Carl Jones -utility back, BARLA international utility back, signed on a contract until the end of the 2007 season. Jones, who has turned out for Leigh under-21s this year, is hoping to make his mark in the professional game and could make his debut today.

Desi Williams -winger Arrived on loan until the end of the season after finding his opportunities limited at Craven Park. The 20-year-old winger played for Rovers against Oldham at Boundary Park earlier in the season.

THE respective LHF Healthplan National League seasons are around a third of the way through already and both competitions have begun to take shape.

In NL1, Hull Kingston Rovers remain the only team in the Rugby League still undefeated, and are on the crest of a club record winning run. Also in the quarter-finals of the Powergen Challenge Cup and the last four of the Northern Rail Cup, their status as promotion status is well placed. But the Robins themselves will know as well as anybody that they can take nothing for granted at this stage of the

Second placed Leigh Centurions, only blip in the league so far came when their patched-up team lost at Craven Park, and Tony Benson,s side cannot be discounted. Whitehaven have been decimated by injuries so far and could still come good again, while pre-season favourites Widnes will be hoping that their stirring Challenge Cup display against Catalans can kick-start their troubled campaign.

Three other teams are currently vying for the top six in Rochdale Hornets, Halifax and Doncaster Lakers, and little looks to separate them at present. Upcoming matches against each other will be crucial. At the bottom end, it looks like two out of Batley, York and Oldham for relegation. The Bulldogs host the Knights at Mount Pleasant this weekend in what already looks like a vital clash.

In NL2, Dewsbury Rams, dramatic late win at Swinton last week has taken them clear at the top, and puts them in pole position for the one automatic promotion

The Lions and Sheffield are tied together on ten points just behind them, followed by Celtic Crusaders on nine. The Welsh have made an eye-catching start to life in the professional game, though at present they appear far stronger at home than they are away. Hunslet Hawks have moved up to fifth after a couple of impressive results under caretaker coach Mark Cass, and are level with Featherstone Rovers, who have been somewhat inconsistent to date.

Gateshead Thunder make up what is now a top seven, with Cumbrians Barrow Raiders and Workington Town both who have had excellent wins to date just behind them. Keighley Cougars, London Skolars and Blackpool Panthers are a little off the pace at present, though all three have recorded a win. Each team is also in its formative stage under new coaches ^ and like everybody else in the National Leagues, has much to play for during the remainder of the campaign.





Today as we are entertaining Oldham we will look back to a match against our visitors dating back to Sunday 7th January 1974. This was a Division 1 league fixture, which was played at the Watersheddings Oldham's spiritual home. The Robins went into the match fighting hard to avoid relegation.

To attempt to strengthen the team Rovers had signed experienced forward Terry Ramshaw from Salford during the week for the sum of £1,000, and he was making his debut. Roger Millward was still missing due to an Achilles tendon problem, although he was also interesting Leeds at the time, as Alan Hardisty was due to have a spell in Australia. Included in the Oldham side that day was ex Craven Park favourite Terry Clawson, and two recent signings in David Treasure and Ian Holland, who they had paid big fees to sign on.

The Robins went ahead after 18 minutes when a move started by hooker Peter Flanagan with a long pass which enabled Ramshaw to draw his man and send Ged Dunn racing towards the line, he in turn put Australian winger Ross Birrell over for an unconverted try. Oldham came close to scoring when Ian Holland crossed, but Flanagan pulled of a superb tackle to prevent him grounding the ball.

John Millington almost got Mike Stephenson over, before on the stroke halftime Clawson broke the line for David Treasure to race 30 yards to the posts. Phil Larder converted to give the home side a 5 points to 3 advantage at the inter-

On the resumption the Robins had a spell of pressure which led to them regaining the lead on 50 minutes when John Moore playing at centre and Flanagan put Millington over for an unconverted try. This made it 6 points to 5 in favour of the visitors. The Robins defended their line heroically for most of the remainder of the match and Oldham try as they may never looked like breaching Rovers watertight defence.

Terry Ramshaw Rovers new signing was arguably their best player on the day as he gave the pack leadership which they had lacked previously, with Terry Hudson the pick of the back division.
