

team and we were all forced to dig deep but as always there were a few players that




The trust will produce and develop programmes focussing around Rugby League working with partners various in the community. I will be working a lot with schools setting Rugby coaching programmes and competitions and









NL2 race faces crucial spell

THE race for the LHF Healthplan NL2 title will be decided over the coming weeks- with some massive matches ahead.

They start with a mouth-watering clash in South Wales on Sunday, when thirdplaced Celtic Crusaders entertain front runners Dewsbury Rams.

If ever there was a "four-point" game, this is it. The Welsh newcomers need victory to maintain any hope of catching the high-flying Rams.

Defeat to Dewsbury would see the Crusaders seven points adrift with just five league games left to play.

Victory though would close the gap to three - with the added knowledge that the Rams have some titanic matches still to

Next weekend they entertain Barrow Raiders at the Tetley's Stadium - then it's away to second placed Sheffield, and home to Swinton Lions, who are currently fifth with a game in hand.

That run of matches will effectively shape the season of the Rams, whose consistency to date has allowed them to establish a four-point cushion at the top.

Sheffield will still believe they have

a chance of toppling Andy Kelly's side especially knowing that they still have to visit the Don Valley Stadium.

In the meantime the Eagles need to keep winning - starting with another crunch match, at home to Swinton Lions this weekend.

Both Swinton and Featherstone still have outside chances of finishing top - though they would both need a remarkable run of results to go their way for that to happen.

Instead, they can start to plan for the play-offs at the end of the league

First place is so important now as it ensures automatic promotion to National League One.

But there is still a second promotion place available to the winners of the NL2 play-offs.

And remember that this season, there is no NL1 team dropping down to take part in those play-offs.

It is simply the teams from two to seven in NL2 - with the bottom two in NL dropping down automatically.

It should all be fascinating stuff over the next few weeks.



I'VE waxed lyrical in the past regarding the magic powder the Rugby League Gods appear to sprinkle across the M6 motorway, right around where it meets the A590 and A65. It remains unnoticed to most travellers, but has alarming powers when falling upon a coach load of rugby league players.

For those heading north, there are decades of anecdotal evidence that it affects their eyesight. When they arrive at their destination their opponents, to a man, appear to stand 6ft 6ins tall. Scrum halves have the stature – and fierce demeanour – of a cross between an all-in wrestler and a gladiator. Tall men have to reach high above their heads to hang their coats up in the changing rooms. Are they truly in a land of giants?

Judging by last week's events, it would appear those Rugby Gods have been tampering with their formula. And whatever they put in it has plainly got in the eyes of the executives of the Rugby Football League. If northern travellers used to see giants, the burghers of Red Hall now see a ramshackle, tired old rugby ground in Whitehaven, where a scant 12 months past they fondly imagined a palace of Super League worthiness.

Having had their plans for a place in the elite division passed as suitable last season, Whitehaven have now had their promotion contingencies thrown back at them.

Of course there is the little matter of Hull Kingston Rovers, Widnes and Leigh between them and such a scenario, though if season 2006 has taught us anything, it is not to count chickens before mama hen has even rubbed beaks with papa cockerel.

Haven chairman Des Byrne has made

ominous noises about court challenges. Save the money and the bluster Des. It's a costly battle that you really can't win.

It is a disappointing outcome for the Recreation Grounders. It's also difficult for we RL pundits to comment on it - because the RFL hasn't explained the position publicly yet. I thought Red Hall had smartened up its communication act, and it's disappointing that they have tacitly opened themselves up to this public salvo, because of a lack of explanation.

In the longer term, Whitehaven at least know what will be required of them when Super League opens up to expansion in another two years or so. They, and others, have been served notice that to get in, you need to have structures in place – and not just plans to finance them with the dividends that membership of Super League brings.

In the short term, don't be surprised to see lots of Wakefield and Wigan fans cheering Whitehaven on in the LHF Healthplan National League One playoffs.

News and Views from the world of Rugby League

It has certainly been an interesting few weeks on the Lakers front with a number of personnel coming into the Club and a number leaving.

Recent arrivals on the playing staff are Josh Weedon, Jason Mossop and Chris Buttery. Half-Back or Loose-Forward Weedon, tracked by the Club since leaving Featherstone Rovers some weeks ago, certainly looks a useful acquisition. The other two are young utility backs who have come with good reputations from Super League Academy Teams and have a chance to establish themselves at First Team level albeit in National League One. Only time will tell if they are capable of cementing positions at the Lakers.

Still on the playing front, Caldon Bravo who always looked an excellent prospect in Castleford's Under 21's but couldn't break into the Lakers starting seventeen with any regularity has moved down the road to join up with a number of ex Dragons at Sheffield Eagles. Prior to this weekend, he had played three times scoring five tries and picking up one Man-of-the Match award. Also moving out of Belle Vue was Australian Prop-Forward Paul McNicholas who seemed to struggle with injuries and failed to produce the form which had seen him play in the Super League with Hull.

Quite understandably, the biggest news in this period was the decision of the Club to release Head Coach Tony Miller. A former player, Academy Coach, Assistant Coach and from the beginning of this year following the death of St John Ellis, Head Coach, Tony has been a popular personality at the Club over the years and regardless of supporters opinions on the rights and wrongs of the 'sacking' or it's timing,


will be fondly remembered by those who have followed the Club through 'thick and thin'.

Of course what follows is the speculation as to who will succeed Tony as Head Coach and take the Lakers forward and into the new stadium in 2007? A number of high-profile names have been mentioned. John Kear was originally linked to the post but has subsequently taken over the reins at Wakefield Trinity Wildcats and has the unenviable task of trying to keep them afloat in Super League. It has become apparent that had Brian McDermott not been approached by Harlequins, he would have been odds-on for the position. Other names touted by the press initially included ex Great Britain Scrum-Half Bobby Goulding and former Castleford Coach Dave Woods. Brad Davis and Dean Sampson are other names which have been put forward whilst caretaker Coach Graham Holroyd has distanced himself for the time being, pledging to play on and learn under another Coach.

One of the names that won't go away however is that of ex Bradford Bulls and Great Britain hooker James Lowes currently on the Coaching staff at Salford City Reds and the appointment of Allan Hunte (also currently on the payroll at The Willows) to assist on matchdays has added weight to the theory that Lowes may be the man. Whoever does ultimately get the job, will have the benefit of a new state-of-the-art stadium and the promise of additional funds that have not recently been available. Lets hope that we get the right man and that success is not that far away.




