

Dean Gorton

21 year old 2nd Row or Loose Forward signed from Salford City Reds for the 2006 season. He was on the books at Salford for five years of which 3 were as a full time professional. Did not manage to break into the Salford Super League team even though he was recommended for a Super League squad number by former coach Steve McCormack. He joined Salford from the Folly lane junior club.

lan signed originally on loan from Swinton Lions during an early season injury crisis in 2005. After a number of impressive shows the Roughyeds completed his capture with a contract for the rest of the season. He is equally at home in the second row or his favoured Loose Forward position. Ian has a top quality work rate. Signed a new twelve month contract for the 2006 season on his 24th

Signed for the Roughyeds to start the 2006 season from Blackpool Panthers. Originally from the Leigh East amateur club, has also served Chorley Lynx as well as the Panthers. Mick was a major crowd pleaser at Blackpool where he filled either prop Forward/Second Row or Centre. He weighs in at 15 and half stone and is 6'3" tall.

20 year old winger from London who has played two games in Super League for Wigan as well as for Hull KR whom he joined us from on loan for the remainder of the 2006 season. Desi has pace to burn and has been clocked over 40 metres at 4.9 seconds. Will add much needed pace to the 2006 Roughyeds line up.

Ged Corcoran

23 year old signed for the Roughyeds for the 2006 season after spells with Dewsbury Rams and French outfit Limoux. Is more famed for his time with Halifax where he had over 30 first team outings including some in Super league. A Prop Forward who has a fair bit of experience for someone so young. He played his junior Rugby at Royton Tigers.

Chris joined his hometown club from Blackpool after the start of the 2005 season. He has struck up a good halfback partnership with Marty Turner and has proved to be a very good motivator on the field. Chris was one of the first to sign on the dotted line for the 2006 season. He is well travelled for his 24 years, having had spells with Rochdale Hornets, Swinton, Doncaster, Batley as well as Blackpool.

Mark joined Oldham on loan from Warrington Wolves at the end of the 2004 season. He was then the first player to commit to the Roughyeds for the 2005 season. Initially used in 2004 as a centre, where he can display his devastating turn of pace, he also has the upper body strength to enhance the back row of the pack. After an injury plagued season in 2005 is keen to put things right in 2006.

24 year old Second Row Forward, signed from amateur team Leigh Easts. He has been selected for the BARLA Great Britain team for three successive seasons, and toured both Australia and Russia with them. Signed a two year contract beginning with the 2006 campaign.

Alan Hadcroft

A robust centre who is renown for his solid defence and strong running. Signed from Halifax for the 2006 season. Alan's previous clubs also list Wests, as well as his hometown Leigh Centurions where he provided many years service. Played representative Rugby for the National League against the New Zealand A team whilst he was at Leigh. Alan has been chosen as the Roughyeds 2006 team

The first player to sign for his hometown club when the new Roughyeds were formed by Chris Hamilton and his fellow directors in the autumn of 1997. He has signed a contract to take him to the end of the 2007 season, which will allow him to complete 10 years with the club. John is an hooker well renown now in National League circles, he originally joined the Roughyeds from Warrington Wolves. An astute worker from acting half back, he is also capable of filling in at Loose

21 year old 2nd Row or Centre signed from Swinton Lions for the 2006 season. Chris started his pro career at Wigan before moving to St Helens where he was on the verge of being selected for England Academy side, but was thwarted by a wrist injury. Had a loan spell at Halifax where he got some Super League experience. He is 6'2" and weighs 14 and a half stone. Chris had a really good try scoring record at Swinton.

Simon Svabic

Began his career with the former Oldham Bears club Academy side, where is half back partner was Bradford 's Paul Deacon. Since those days he has played Super League with Salford and also at the top in the National League with Leigh Centurions. He signed for the Roughyeds to begin the 2003 campaign. His preferred position is stand off, where he can demonstrate his silky smooth ball skills, but he is also at home in the full back position. During the 2005 campaign was used effectively by Gary Mercer as a loose forward, where his guile added an extra dimension to the Roughyeds play. Will be completing his fourth season with the club in 2006.

Paul Ashton

26 year old half back son of former Oldham favourite Ray. Paul has played for

Keighley Leigh and Rochdale Hornets, but was at local amateur club St Annes when Steve Deakin brought him back into the professional ranks at Oldham. He comfortably wears the cheeky half back tag and has demonstrated this in the past by back heeling goal kicks over.

27 year old Prop Forward. Plucked from local amateur side St Annes, Best has had two previous spells as a professional. In his first spell he played for Rochdale Hornets and Keighley "Cougars before being reinstated as an amateur with St Anne's. In his second stint he went across the Channel to play under Steve Deakin for UTC in France's Elite League. A robust forward with a good set of hands will not be found wanting at this level.

Andy was the first player to sign a contract for the 2006 season, after John Hough who was already entering the second year of a 3 year deal. A versatile back who has played most of his rugby in the academy at full back. But he is also a competent half back. He managed 8 first team appearances in the 2005 season on the wing, and he is enjoying the more demanding training rigours of the first

20 year old Prop Forward signed from Salford City Reds for the 2006 season. Gareth was offered a one year contract with a further one year option. He was voted Salford 's under 21 Players Player of the Year in 2004. Leigh born Gareth stands at 6'3" tall and weighs 17 stone.

Local born Alex, toured with the Great Britain schoolboys to Australia in 1999 and with the England Academy to New Zealand and Australia in 2001. He played his junior rugby with the Royton Tigers club and was snapped up by Super League giants, Bradford Bulls. Whilst at the Bulls he had a loan spell with London Broncos where he chalked up 6 Super League appearances, before going on loan to Huddersfield where he added another 13 SL games to his tally, he had a similar amount of games on loan at Hull F.C. where he impressed the Humberside high flyers enough for them to offer him a two year contract. Alex decided he wanted to complete his degree and when part time rugby was the only option he chose his home town club. Primarily a centre he produced

many barnstorming runs as well as stern defence last season. Signed another twelve month deal to keep him at Oldham for 2006.

JOHN JAMES MCKEOWN

Ask anyone to name a great player in Haven's history and one of the first names on anyone's list would be John James McKeown. JJ or Mac as he was called signed for Haven in 1948 from Risehow ARLFC. He made his debut for Whitehaven on the 21st August 1948 against Hull in the clubs very first game which they won 5-0. He became a regular in the team and although he did not score in that first game he went on to kick 1050 goals in his

thirteen years at the Recreation Ground. During that time he also made 417 appearances for the club which remains a record today. It should be remembered that he kicked those goals in an age of winter rugby when they played with a leather ball that would soon get heavy in wet conditions and without the aid of any kicking tees. The qualities of JJ McKeown were probably best described by Walter Thompson in the Whitehaven News in 1956 who wrote, "Remorseless in defence, impeccable in fielding, astute in touch finding and at times devastating in linking up McKeown may not be the fastest full-back playing football but he wouldn't be boasting to call himself the best all rounder."


In 1949 he made his debut for Cumberland against Lancashire on the 12th October at Derwent Park. He was the only Haven player in the team and as in his debut for Haven he failed to kick a goal in a 22-11 win. Over the next eleven seasons he kicked 39 goals for Cumberland in 15 games. In his last game for the county he set a record by kicking eight goals in a game against Yorkshire in a 43-19 win at the Recreation Ground.

John McKeown was the first Haven player to receive international honours when he was selected for the Great Britain team to play France in a floodlit match at Bradford on the 11th April 1956. He kicked three goals in an 18-10 victory for Great Britain.

John was selected as member of the Haven Immortals Team in 1998 and was the first player to be inducted into the Haven Vice Presidents Hall of Fame. He played his final game for Whitehaven at Rochdale on 11th November 1961. His total of goals kicked is a club record as are the number of appearances he made for the club. He topped the hundred mark during a number

of seasons and the most goals he kicked in a game was nine against York in a 51-12 win at the Recreation Ground on the 16th August 1958.

John was a quiet spoken, proud gentleman who died in the West Cumberland Hospital this week aged eighty years. Our thoughts are with his family at this sad time, no doubt John will be looking down on the Recreation Ground today shouting the lads on. He will be remembered as one of the favourite sons of Haven, a club legend.

2002, the final season of the Northern Ford premiership brought mixed fortunes for Haven. Notable achievements saw David Seeds break winger Bill Smith's 40-yr-old try scoring record of 148 career tries, whilst an injury hit side came within seconds of beating Leigh in the RL challenge cup at Hilton Park. A victory that would have set up a quarter-final tie at home to Wigan. However, indifferent league performances meant that qualification for the end of season play-offs and the new National League One in 2003, meant that the 2002 season would go down to

the wire. As we can see from the following edited match report, written and reproduced by kind permission of Martin Morgan, today's visitors Oldham very nearly put paid to Haven's chances.

Forget EastEnders, Haven produced drama today the like of which no TV soap could match. Rob Jackson, on-loan from Wigan via London Broncos, in the last minute of possibly his final game for Haven produced a try that Martin Offiah in his pomp would have been proud to claim.

When Jackson collected the ball from Leroy Joe deep in his own half, 30 seconds remained on the clock, as

confirmed later by the timekeeper. Faced with a wall of Oldham defenders and one point down, it appeared all was lost for the hosts. However, Jackson had failed to read the script and in a flash went outside the defence and sprinted down the touchline. Still, it seemed he would not make it, with former St Helens flyer Joey Hayes among those haring after him. But Jackson had the pace to hold off the cover to cross in the corner for a scintillating 70-metre effort.

The Haven crowd erupted and even coach Paul Cullen jumped up and down in joy. No one could blame him; it was a try out of the top drawer. As Steve Kirkbride's conversion attempt went wide the hooter sounded and another round of crowd celebrations started.

Such a close finish had looked unlikely in the opening half-hour, with Haven well on top, but unable to turn possession into points. Warren Stevens put Haven in front after 10 minutes, following an Aaron Lester pass from dummy-half on their first major attack. Steve Kirkbride added the extras.

Due to injuries, Lester has not enjoyed the best of seasons by his own high standards, but there were positive signs today that he is on the way back after creating Haven's next try on fourteen minutes. He drew two defenders on an arcing run to the right, his inside ball to Spencer Miller putting the back-rower into space to score.

Chances for both sides were scarce. Lester was unable to hold a difficult over-the-shoulder pass from Joe in the shadow of the Oldham posts. While Bryan Henare produced a 50-metre break to put the hosts under pressure, but stand-off Neil Roden, involved in most of Oldham's better moves then lost the ball three metres out. The

visitors finally crossed five minutes before the break, WHITEHAVEN RLFC second-rower Lee Doran touching down after good work around the ruck by hooker John Hough. Gareth Barber converted and Haven were soon under the cosh again, but a Lester break relieved the pressure to maintain their lead at half-time. A great effort from Joe, Paul O'Neil, Gary Purdham and Howard Hill early in the second-half to force an Oldham attacker back behind his try line paid off for Haven, when Lester produced a try from dummy-half. Kirkbride converted to make it 16-6.

> However, Oldham showed character to bounce back. Hayes crossed in the corner on

63 minutes with Barber adding the extras. Winger Joe McNicholas then injected pace down the short side for Jon Goddard to score and level the scores at 16-16. The conversion attempt was missed, but Roden's 76th minute drop-goal had appeared to win it until Rob Jackson popped up with his wonder try. Rough on the Roughyeds, but heavenly for Haven.



TALKING TO Spencer Miller

Spencer, when did you start playing rugby league and which clubs have you played for?

I started playing with the Kells ARL club when I was about ten-yrs-of-age. I played right through the age groups at a time when lan Gainford and Alan Boadle were the youth coaches at the club. I remember making my debut as a sixteen-yr-old for the second team against Egremont, in the 1997/98 season. The fixture was played on a Friday night and I must have impressed, because Alan Davidson called me up for the first team the following day.

I was lucky to play alongside some good players during my early days in the first team. The likes of Stuart Seagar and ex Haven player Billy Fisher were still playing at that time and they were a great help to me as a young player. As an amateur, I represented the Cumbrian open age team that won the county championship in 1999 and the BARLA U23 side that played the Combined Services at York in the same year.

I signed for Haven midway through the 2000 season and made my first team debut, under Kevin Tamati away to Featherstone in April of that year. Along with ex team-mate Rob Purdham, I played in the National League side that played a two match series against Super League U21's in 2002 and have represented Scotland on four occasions during the 2003 & 2004 seasons.

You've battled back from a career threatening eye injury sustained earlier in the season. How did it happen and did you fear your playing days were over?

It happened in the first game of the season against Workington. I've been told it could have been due to either a blow to my head or eye, but I can't recall a specific moment in the game when it may have happened. The injury didn't cause me any problems during the game, it was only afterwards when I couldn't see out of one eye that I realised I had a problem. At first, and due to the amount of blood in my eye the specialist was unsure as to the extent of the injury. He didn't know if it was a burst a blood vessel behind the eye, or whether it was a detached retina that was causing the injury. It later turned out to be a burst optic nerve and I was advised at that time to give up any physical activity that may make the situation worse. I ended up taking four months off, a time in which I didn't do any training, going to the gym or playing. After three months there was no change at all and I was beginning to fear that my career was over, but all of a sudden I started to regain my sight. As the eye started to recover the specialist was able to make a more accurate diagnosis. However, he still recommended taking the rest of the season off with a view to coming back next year. I've been back for regular scans, which haven't revealed any long-term weakness and I'm one of those people who hates watching from the sidelines, so I made the decision to start playing again.

Your brother Dexter is now a regular in the Workington Town side. Do you share a healthy rivalry?

Of course we do! The only time that we've played against each other

professionally though was in this year's derby game at the Recre, the game in which I got the eye injury. This was also the game that Fats and Aaron Lester picked up broken arms and I believe Aaron broke his on Dexter's head. It just goes to prove how thick his head is!

I went through to watch him play a few times when I was injured, but generally he's found his own way in the game and he's really enjoying it. He went up there at the end of last season when his Kells commitments were finished and he done enough to earn a contract. We've both had great support off Mam and Dad who now watch both teams, but would never admit it. Some people ask if we'd like to play in the same team together, but hopefully he'll stay there for a bit and guarantee me the bragging rights in the family!

Who's the best player(s) you've ever played with and against?

The best player I've played with has to be Aaron Lester. He so got a great all-round game and has probably been the player with the biggest influence on how we've played, during my time at the club. It was no surprise to me that our form has picked up since he came back from injury. He's the sort of player that commands respect in the dressing room, a player that others will sit up and listen to. Even when he's not at his best the fact that he's on the field gives the team a lift.

The best, or certainly the most skilful player that I've ever played against would probably be Stanley Gene at Huddersfield. It was 2002; the year they'd dropped out of Super League and we'd drew 12-12 with them at the Recre earlier in the season. When we played them at the McAlpine Stadium they hammered us 86-10 and Stanley got four tries, all of which came through me!

We've reached the NL1 final in the last two seasons. Are we capable of going one step further this year?

I wouldn't be playing if I didn't believe it. Ok, Hull KR have been the form team this season, but finishing top doesn't necessarily mean that you've an automatic right to anything, as we found to our cost last year. Bradford came from third last season to win Super League on the back of something like twelve victories, whilst Wests Tigers came from fourth to win the Australian Grand Final. As well as us, the one team that's hitting a bit of form at the moment is Widnes and in a one-off game any of the top for sides are capable of winning it

Although I've missed the best part of the season, it's pretty evident that the full-time teams Hull KR, Widnes and Leigh have a big advantage over the others in NL1, even if it's just from a preparation point of view. What we've always found though, this is something that brings out the best in us. We consistently perform better against the top club's in the league.




